REPORT ON AERIAL OBJECT OBSERVED

1. Enclosed is a report of an aerial object observed by Plt Off P.J. Price of RAAF Base Richmond.
2. It will be noted that the object was observed by 10-12 persons and that no natural phenomenon is suggested by the unit concerned (Q27 and Q29) in explanation of the sighting. Further enquiries reveal that an aircraft did take off during the sighting period, climbed on 030 radial to 8000 ft at 12 miles, but no sighting of the object was made. The phenomenon was visible therefore from the ground only; furthermore all the observers were in the vicinity of the control tower, this does suggest a form of refracted light.
3. Whilst the report states that no temperature inversion was present, the possibility of an inversion cannot be completely discounted. If there was an inversion, with variance in level, causing an increase in wind velocity sufficient to induce a decrease in temperature and so cause the formation of ice crystals, then it is possible that refraction through the ice crystals occurred.
4. The refraction and reflection of ground lights, possibly from the Castle Hill area, could have been sighted from the ground near the control tower but not visible from the air.
5. No other explanation can be offered.

Re: Sighting U.F.O.

I hasten to assure you that I am in no ways the hysterical type and the following information is being forwarded to you to use as you wish. The only thing I do ask is that you do not mention my name at all. People out here are quite sceptical about U.F.O.'s.

About a month ago I observed what I thought could have been either a very bright star or a satellite and did not take very much notice at the time. Since then I have made observations at the dates and times given.

Friday 2/4/71. Light Northerly breeze. Watched from 11.30 p.m. to 12.30 am. In that time this object, which still appeared to be like very bright star showing flashes of blue/green, yellow and white followed an erratic course. I take bearings against a tree and electric light fixtures in the street but am not well enough up in the sciences to make use of instruments.

Friday 9th April, 1971. Little or no wind. No cloud. Watched from midnight to 12.30 am. Object still appeared to have flashes of coloured lights and again followed an erratic course. Always appears in about the same place (in Western sky).

Monday 12th April, 1971. Light breeze/scattered cloud. 10.30 p.m. About 18 inches above light wire in street and still well out in western sky. 10.45 p.m. directly level with wire. 10.48 1 foot below wire. 10.50 it had dropped to about 2 feet below wire. Then lost in cloud.

1230 -

I realise that this could quite possibly be a rather balloon as the erratic movements appear to be like those of a balloon caught in the air currents. What attracted my attention to it in the first place was that it appears to be brighter than any other stars and the colours it seems to emit.

I will still keep watching for this thing and will make notes accordingly but am afraid they will be of little scientific value as I can only gauge the movements of it against the fixtures outside. The only thing I can assure you of is that whatever it is :

It is quite bright.
It appears to emit coloured lights.
It appears in the Western sky (quite high)
It follows a very erratic course....sometimes still and then a sudden jerky or circular movement. Sometimes to right and sometimes to left.

Am not sure whether I am even sending this letter to the relevant department but would be grateful if you could forward to the one that handles reported sightings of U.F.O's.

The last two observations were made with another person who can verify. We would be very pleased to have your comments in due course.

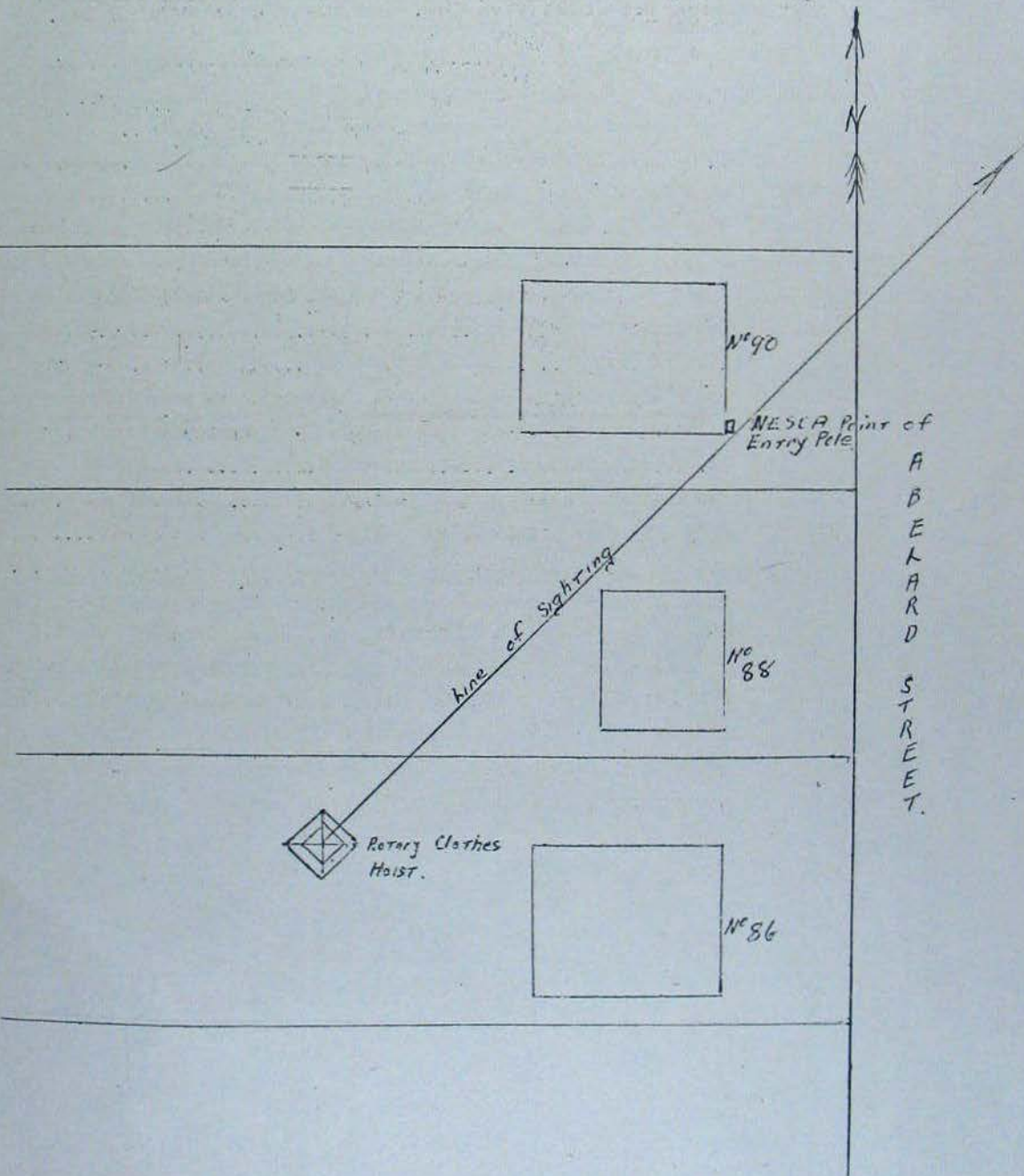
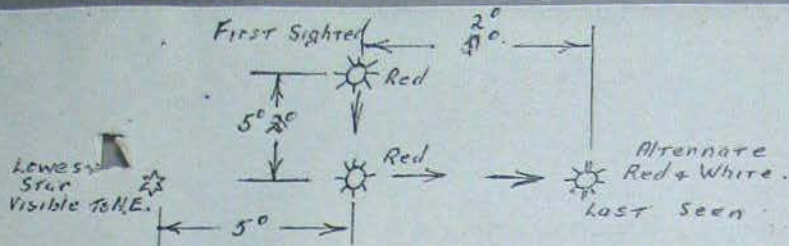

'Attack by Lights' reported

PERTH, Tuesday. — A Perth motorist and his wife described today how two unidentified flying objects attacked their car as they were driving down the South-Western Highway.

Mr Geoff Richards, 28, and his wife Toni, 26, of the Perth suburb of Woodlands, said the 10-minute attack came about 4.45am on a long straight stretch of highway leading out of Brunswick Junction, about 100 miles south of Perth.

Mr Richards said he noticed a light in the rear vision mirror, shortly after passing through Brunswick. "Suddenly the light came racing up to the car", he

said. "It appeared to be going about 300 miles an hour."

"My wife screamed that it was going to hit us. Then it just stopped."

He said "The light stayed behind, for a few seconds then shot back on to the horizon behind the car."

"This happened about four times, then I looked in front and there was another light there", he said.

"It shot forward at us, about head height, at the same time as the one from the back was coming forward again."

"The one in front came at us three times and each time pulled up just short and darted back, sometimes disappearing".

UFOs going unreported

Unidentified flying objects were sighted regularly over the ACT, but people failed to report them through fear of being "indiscreet".

This was claimed today by the president of the Canberra UFO Research Society, Mr J. Drake.

Mr Drake was contacted for comment on an incident involving UFOs yesterday near the Western Australian coal mining town of Collie.

A Perth motorist and his wife said they were "attacked" by two strange flying objects as they drove along a highway.

The last reported UFO sighting was made in Canberra late last year, but Mr Drake said today this did not indicate any "tailing off" of activity.

"We are led to believe sightings are made regu-

larly in the ACT", he said.

"The problem is people are hesitant about reporting them, through fear of being indiscreet".

He knew of at least one unreported sighting in Canberra this year.

It had been made by three policemen while they were on duty late at night.

Mr Drake said he had found out about the sighting from another policeman who had sought information from the society on what the object could have been.

"But the men themselves would not come forward, so the sighting could not be confirmed", he said.

"We believe this sort of thing happens quite frequently".

Mr Drake laid the blame for this type of attitude on the US Department of Air committee which investigated UFO sightings over a period of three years.

"After spending a total of \$US313,000 on its investigations, the committee released a report in 1969 which stated broadly that UFOs didn't exist and that anyone who believed they had seen one was a little peculiar", he said.

"Despite this the report has been widely derided in scientific circles; its effect has been to stop people reporting sightings through fear of being embarrassed".

The Canberra UFO Research Society has about 50 active members and meets regularly.

Its next meeting on April 20, will be addressed by Dr Herbison-Evans of the Chatterbox Agency, Department of

Defence, Canberra. It will discuss the possibility of UFO sightings from a scientific viewpoint.

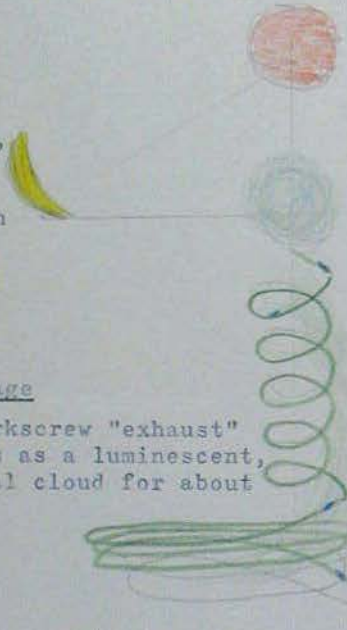

At 8.20 p.m. in the evening of March 2, 1971, we were just at Waimea gates on North Murrawong Road, 32 miles north of Kaniva on the 36th parallel.

It was dark except for a crescent moon about 60 degrees above the western horizon. The sun had set about an hour before and all after-glow was gone. The sky was cloudless and stars were everywhere.

Dorothy first saw this luminous orb, red like the sun through dust or smoke haze, but with a ~~bx~~ lemon green corona. It was above and to the right of the moon. For a moment she thought it was the sun before realising that the sun had set an hour or more before and we had been driving the last of the sheep in the dark. "What's that thing" She asked pointing it out to Arnold and I.

I switched off the lights. By this time the orb was level with the moon and changing color from a bright orange red to green and blue, all three colors being present for a time before the red faded leaving green and blue together. These changed to a lemony blue as the orb turned to a horizontal plane and descended in increasing anticlock wise spirals towards the earth, leaving behind a spiral shaped vapor trail on the way down. When about 15 degrees above the horizon the object stopped spiralling, went into a wide circuit and travelled out of sight to the north.

The object was visible for about 6 or 7 minutes. The vapor trail slowly dissipating was visible for a further 10 to 15 minutes.

There was plenty of time to get our monocular from the car boot. With this Arnold and I viewed the orb in turn, each confirming to the others that we were seeing the same things and sighting a genuine unidentified flying object of quite spectacular aspect.

The orb looked relatively the same size as the moon. This might indicate that it was relatively close to us.

I would describe the colors as the luminescent after glow of cadmium sulfide (red) zinc sulfide (green) and silver sulfide (blue).

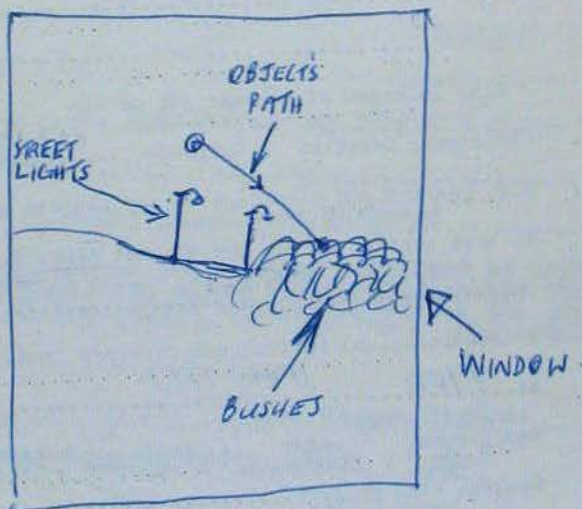

Saucer seers will show science the sightings

UFO

The Australian and New Zealand Association for the Advancement of Science has decided to hold a seminar on "the unidentified flying object problem".

It has thus gained the everlasting gratitude of the Canberra UFO Research Society.

According to the society's president, Mr John Drake, it is at last recognition by the world of science there is more to UFOs than meets the eye.

So he and several other members of the society are going to make an effort to attend the seminar in Adelaide on October 30.

They have been offered an opportunity to present details of outstanding UFO sightings ("with slides where possible").

The ACT has had an

increasing level of sightings in recent years and the society has tried to document them exhaustively.

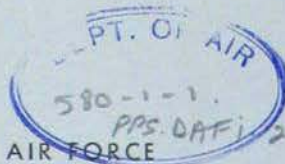
Through checking with tracking stations, radar installations, and astronomers, the society has been able to weed out most sightings as being things like aircraft, weather balloons, and satellites.

But there have still been sightings, like one last year of an intensely bright sphere of light moving rapidly through untracked bush, which no one could explain.

The Adelaide seminar will include explanations of sightings by an RAAF investigations officer, discourse on meteorological phenomena by an aeronomist-aerodynamicist, and a talk by a biologist entitled "Can Life Exist on the Planets?".

Mr Drake said one of the main problems in compiling evidence about UFOs was the often doubtful quality of photographs.

Unscrupulous people had capitalised on the curiosity value of UFOs by faking large numbers of photographs.

I wear glasses in the evening and looking at the object it appeared to me as the following sketch shows:



However on consulting my wife and children who have excellent eyesight it appeared to them as following sketch shows:



As I went into the back yard of my house on 26th February 1971 about 10 p.m. and looked up at the stars, I saw an object of grey matter moving fast from south east to north easterly direction. It disappeared into the glow of city lights. I kept on watching the sky and the object reappeared at the point where I first saw it, out of the glow of city lights. When it appeared for the third time I called out to my wife and children and they all saw it in turn.

The object kept on making these circles in the sky disappearing and reappearing out of the glow of city lights. It did not change its course during about 20 circles it made before completely disappearing into the glow of city lights. It made about 20 circles inbetween 7 to 10 minutes. It looked like a transparent cloud but covered the stars if it passed under them. The size of the circle the object was travelling, was twice the size of the "heart", an aeroplane made in the sky on St. Valentine's day on 14th of February.



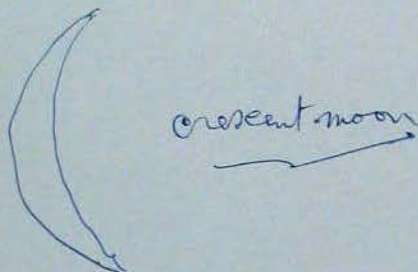

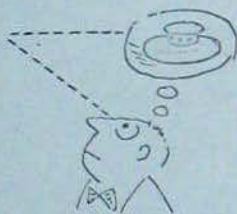

UFOs in the eyes of educated misfits

According to a poll taken in the US four years ago, flying saucers are popular. Ninety five per cent of Americans have heard of them and about half of the population believe that they are real. Furthermore, about one person in 20 claim to have seen one. With this wealth of data, in hand, Donald I. Warren, a sociologist from the University of Michigan set aside the matter of the physical reality of flying saucers and asked the question: "Who reports UFO sightings?" The main purpose of his analysis was to check a sociological hypothesis known as "status inconsistency theory".

A status inconsistent person exhibits some dissonance between his age, race, sex, income, education and job classification. Thus a Negro physician would have high status inconsistency, whereas a white

Protestant executive or a semi-skilled Catholic blue-collar worker would have high status consistency. Warren postulated that flying saucer sightings are linked to status frustration and hence to an opportunity for escape from a harsh and alien social system.

In order to find a positive correlation Warren has to eliminate all of the testimony from both women and blacks. Women have an imposed status which is ambiguous and anomalous; do they assume their husbands' status or their own, or a hybrid of the two? As a reflection of their mixed-up state, women are twice as likely as men to report UFO sightings irrespective of other factors. Since all blacks have a basic inconsistent status—being black in white society—their response was also deleted. The final sample consisted of white males over the age of 20. Warren used education, income and occupation as the basis of his status analysis. In all possible groupings, status inconsistent males reported more UFO sightings—in agreement with the hypothesis. But the most amazing finding is that the best educated among the inconsistent are the most susceptible. "It is not, therefore, the uneducated credulous or the uninformed who report saucers" (*Science*, vol.170, p.599). Perhaps the frustrated male whose job expectations are not living up to his educational investment thinks things will be better on Mars.



After driving back to "Rock-helm" Inset House Point-Lonsdale, I switched on Radio to hear 10 P.M. News; the announcer stated on the final item, many residents living in the Northern suburbs of New York had reported seeing an unusual object, and the Observatory said it was a satellite; since this is man-made, shines like a star, & moves around the Earth at exactly the same elevation, it has no relation to our viewing.

There was a tanker heading toward the Rip at the time, & surely both the Queenscliff & Port-Lonsdale Light-houses should have seen it from such advantageous vantage points.

In conclusion we thought the principal highlights were the objects torque acceleration from the first hovering, & the return at greatly reduced speed to virtually the same position for the second sharper hover before taking off & disappearing in direction mentioned on Question 23.

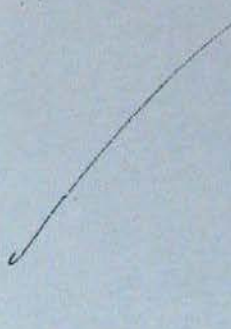

1. Herewith attached is a report on an unusual aerial sighting received from a Sister Mary V.R. Wiseman of Flat 4, 97 Childers Street, North Adelaide, SA 5006.
2. Part 2 - Unit Evaluation has not been completed because of the following reasons:
 - a. The observer appeared to be slightly neurotic when being interviewed.
 - b. Although the Report was signed by the observer as V.R. WISEMAN, she also uses the names MR REID, Valda Rosamond Shearing, and is considering changing her name by deed poll to "Banks".
 - c. Although question 4 of the report states "Certain" in relation to the date, this information took about a quarter of an hour to extract.
 - d. When asked to explain the answer to question 9, the observer replied that she had attended the Police Barracks for lectures on nuclear explosions. She is a member of the Civil Defence Organization.
 - e. Upon reaching the above conclusion at the time of the sighting she stated that she went inside the hospital (private) and told the nurse to shut all doors and windows, pull the blinds as "there was nothing we can do now - we can only wait".
3. Under the above circumstances it is considered unnecessary to process the report. However, Part 1 is being forwarded for information in case this observer reports other observations in the future.

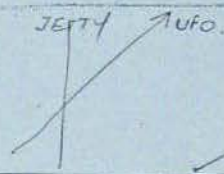

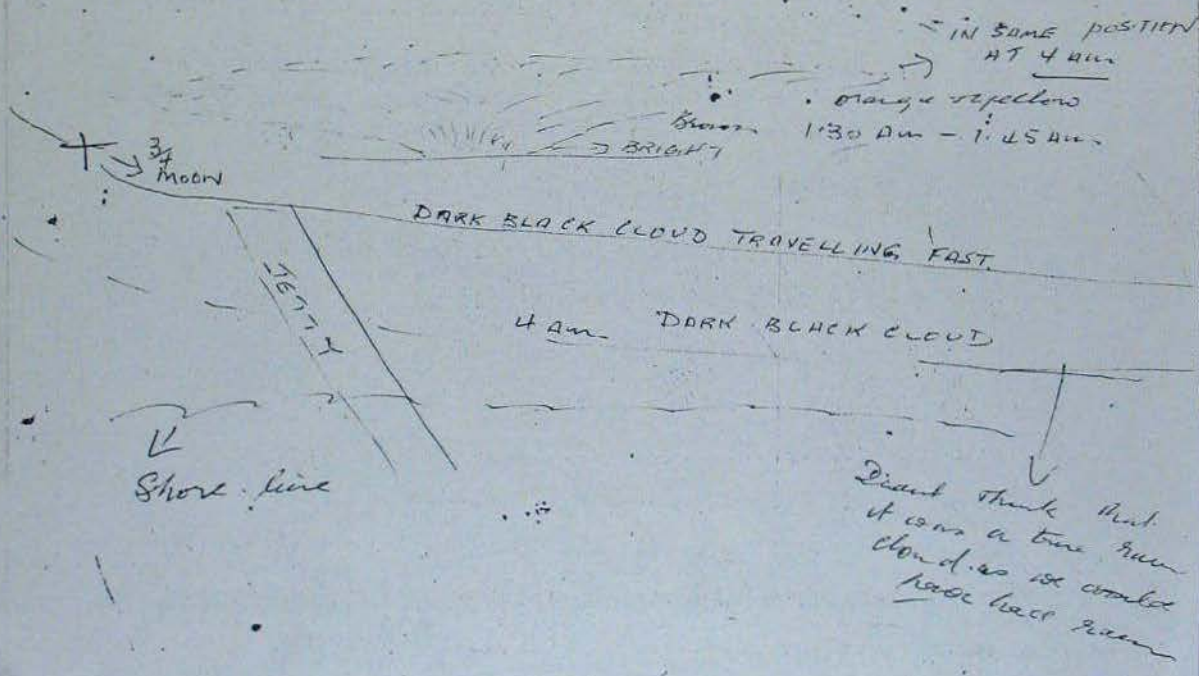


Dear Sir,

It was suggested by one of your officers that I make a written report on an unusual sighting of a U.F.O.

Myself and a friend (Mr. Rex Free) were fishing on Wednesday evening 16/12/70 in Ralphs Bay midway between Drouthy Point and Maria Point. Water calm, no moon, slight cloud towards Mt. Wellington in the west and also to south east the rest of the sky clear.

The object sighted, (a bright yellow white pulsing light, slightly bigger than the largest star) at approximately 50° elevation, raced across the sky from west to east and diminished in size and disappeared at about 40° elevation. It was very difficult to estimate the height but would have been well above cloud level. Time of sighting was 12 minutes past 10.00 p.m. The object was visible 15 - 20 seconds.

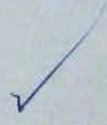

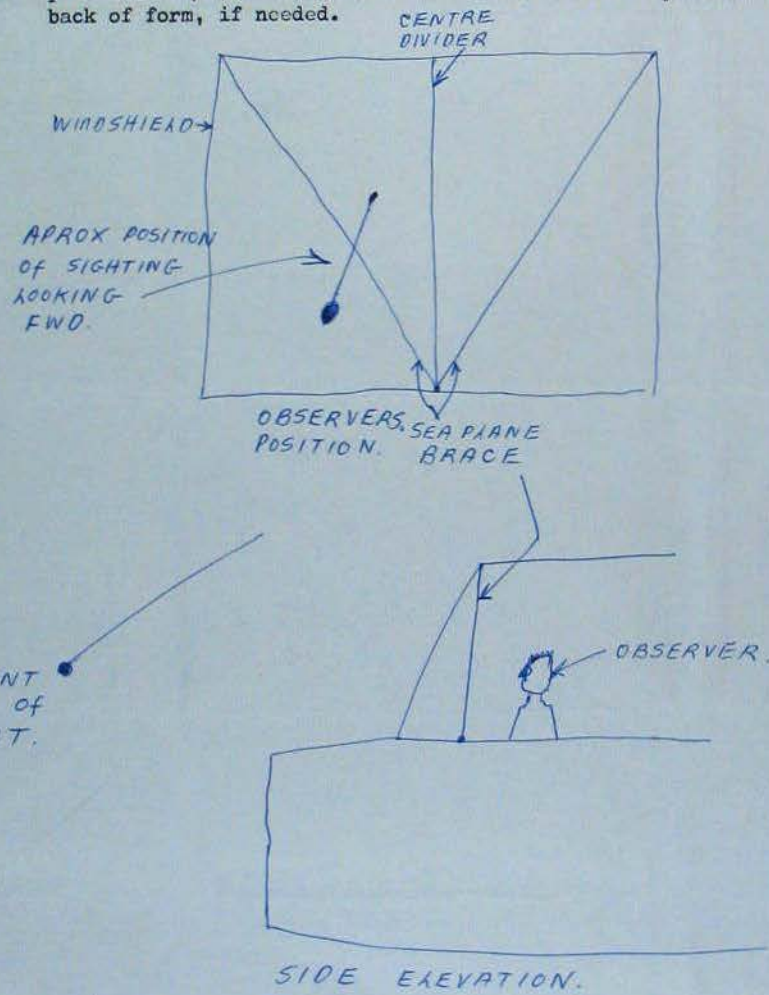

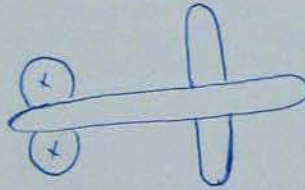

SIGHTING OF UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECT

At approximately 9.20 a.m. on Monday, November 2, 1970, coming from Coonabarabran just at the point near where the Mendooran Road turns off the Oxley Highway, my wife and I sighted a strange flying object in the sky. It was shaped like a horse-shoe magnet or an old-fashioned hairpin, with the blunt end down towards the horizon, the parallel arms being of equal length and equal width, with a space of equal width between them filled with blue sky. The object looked as though it were made of thick cream or frost - a dense white. It was a very clear morning. The object was about 40° off the road and about 30° into the sky and appeared at that distance about 3/4" long. It appeared to be moving fast, either towards the horizon or away to the left - it was very difficult to tell.

We at first thought it was a vapour trail from a plane, but it had no fading tail, the object being of uniform density throughout its whole structure and it had no object at the front that looked like a plane. It could not have been a reflection in the windscreen because we both saw it from different angles and when the car veered to the right, the object appeared to move to the left; in other words, maintained its own position. We saw it for about a minute or a minute and a half and it disappeared behind a wooded hill.

Comment:

Siding Springs Mountain Solar Observatory is not far from here so possibly the object could be some kind of meteorological balloon or something from the Observatory; also, there are airports at Coolah and Coonabarabran and it could have been something from there. It did not look like any object I have ever seen, in the sky or otherwise, and it did not look like any vapour trail I have ever seen.
