I report that on 31st August 1992, I visited Section 40 at his home address of Section 40 regarding a call made regarding strange lights in the sky. I report the following information with reference to SO 36/81.

The sighting occurred at 1950 hrs on Sunday 30th August 1992. He saw initially 7 points of yellow light in a group but all moving relative to each other. This lasted for about one minute. He then saw 3 points of light in a fixed triangular position. This lasted for about 20 seconds. There was no sound. He stated that the lights had the intensity of an aircraft light seen at night.

Section 40 was in the house at Section 40 facing south. When the lights started he went out into the garden. They were observed by the naked eye. They were seen to be moving east to west at a low elevation (about 5 to 10 degrees from the horizon). He could not estimate distance from him.

At the time the sun was setting. There were light and dark clouds against a light blue sky. The lights were seen against dark clouds. There were no nearby objects such as power lines or factories, etc.

Section 40 reported the incident at about 2100 hours to Police. His mother, Section 40 and his two small children, also witnessed the incident.

Further to the above, a call was received at Harlow Police Station from Section 40. She had heard about this incident and recalled that at the time and location above she saw a flock of black tipped seagulls. She suggested that light shimmering from their wings would give the impression of moving lights.

 The Paula Carr centre, at the William Harvey Hospital, was set up in memory of Paula, 12, of Orion Way, Willshoborough, who died of diabetes in April 1988.
 A £250,000 trust fund was launched in March 1989 by Cllr John Simpson who was Deputy Mayor of Ashford at the time.

Mr Simpson, also a diabetic, started the fund to build the centre for more than 4,500 diabetics in the South East.
 Thanks to various fundraising schemes from local people, the centre was finished last September.
 Mr Simpson said: "We are all thrilled that the Princess is coming to officially open the centre. It's a tremendous honour for Ashford."
 "I believe the people that have worked so hard to get this scheme off the ground deserve this, it's the highest honour that can be given."
 Janet Carr, Paula's mother, hopes to meet the Princess.
 She said: "It really is marvellous that she is coming to visit us, it really wasn't expected at all. It proves something good has come out of Paula's death."
 The Princess is set to give the Heart of Kent Hospice at Aylesford the Royal seal of approval by performing an official opening ceremony.
 The Princess, who is known to take a great interest in the hospice movement, is expected to spend some time chatting with patients when she visits the unit at Preston Hall, Aylesford, to unveil a plaque.
 Matron Linda Hodgson said she and the unit's staff were thrilled to hear about the Royal visit, which had been arranged by the hospice's patron, the Viscountess Monckton of Breanchley.

UFO fails to live up to its promise

News hounds track a strange object over Gatwick, but **Harvey Elliott** concludes that the silly season has arrived early

THE silly season came early to what used to be Fleet Street yesterday as news desks from Canary Wharf to Kensington loosed their news hounds on the great UFO mystery.

The Civil Aviation Authority had incautiously reported, in an official publication, that a Boeing 737 had come near to an "unidentified object" as it was approaching Gatwick. Once the "UFO buzzes pilots" report appeared — describing how a black lozenge shaped object missed the jet by an estimated 100 yards — the telephone lines to both the CAA and the airline, Britannia, were hot with calls as convinced UFO believers rang with other sightings or confidently predicted that it presaged a full scale invasion by extra-terrestrial beings.

The CAA and the airline were unconvinced, however, and between answering the flood of calls could only speculate that a mete-

orological balloon had somehow drifted high or even that a black plastic bag had been blown high into the air.

Even the British UFO Research Association quashed the excited imaginings of its most avid followers. "We remain convinced that something is out there," a spokesman, Robin Lindsey, said. "Unfortunately we are not being visited at the rate that these people claim. We believe it was likely to have been a balloon."

The association has already had to accept that many sightings of glowing objects tracking aircraft at high speed and then disappearing were nothing more than plasma bolides, a meteorological phenomenon whose significance has only recently been appreciated.

Britannia said: "By definition what our pilot saw was an unidentified flying object. This does not mean that we are about to be visited by little green men."

PART A: SUMMARY OF INFORMATION REPORTED TO JAS

THE B737 PILOT reports that he was inbound to Gatwick and in communication with London control on 128.4 while squawking with Mode C. He was heading 308° and descending through FL 140 at 355 kt with visibility in the region of 40 km. His FO saw a small black lozenge shaped object about 500 m ahead of the ac and at the same level. Within the space of about 1.5 sec it passed very close, less than 100 yd away, down the port side of the ac and, at the most, 30 ft above the level of the wing. He informed London Control, via the RT, who reported seeing a small primary radar contact astern of the ac. No impact or disturbance was felt on the ac and no damage was observed during a post flight inspection. He assessed the risk of collision as high.

ATC AT LATCC reports that during a moderate traffic loading on the BIG/EAS CCF sector the B737 pilot reported an object passing his ac in the opposite direction at a high closing speed. The B737 was inbound to Gatwick via the Eastwood stack and passing the BEXIL way point. He was descending through 15,000 ft and thought the object may have been a balloon, or part of, describing it as black and about 18 inches wide. The SC reports that a primary return was seen about 10 NM behind the B737 heading SE at about 100 kt. A following ac was given traffic information and avoiding turns to the left to avoid the primary return, which had appeared to change heading towards it, but its pilot reported seeing nothing. The DVR CSC was also advised of the facts in order that inbound traffic could be given vectors to avoid the area.

JAS Notes:

- 1 A Meteorological balloon was released from Crawley at 1719 on this particular day, it was light brown in colour and was trailing a silvery mesh triangle. Twenty six minutes after release (1745) it was at 27,000 ft bearing 085.76° and at a range of 30 km from Crawley. It ascended through 15,000 ft 13 min after release (1732) when it was bearing 097.6° and at a range of 17 km. There was a sharp inversion between 4000-5000 ft where the temperature rose from +8° to +12°. The top of convection was at 4500 ft, above this was a very dry area up to about 15,000 ft. Wind velocity at 14,000 ft - 305/25, 10,000 ft - 295/25.
- 2 AIS(Mil) undertook very thorough tracing action but could reach no positive conclusion. Their radar replay did show a primary return in the general area but it was seen to move about like a light ac or helicopter at low level. No Met or other balloons could be traced which having been released could have reached this area/time nor which could have appeared black. The only possible exception to this was that some hot-air balloon pilots launch small balloons which can be followed with a device called a 'Wind Tracker'. One balloon pilot contacted had released

balloons on the 6th/7th July but then not again until the 19th. On the 21st he tracked one of his black balloons to 7200 ft before he lost sight of it and he assumed they could go much higher than this. The CAA SRG is well aware of this use of balloons; they and others of similar size (less than 2 m) are exempted from most restrictions of the ANO by Article 109(a). The object seen by the B737 pilot must be considered as untraced.

PART B: SUMMARY OF THE WORKING GROUP'S DISCUSSIONS

The only information available to the Working Group was the report from the pilot of the B737, photographs from the radar recordings, and reports from the appropriate ATC and operating authorities.

A member commented that the number of sightings of balloons and other unidentified objects seem to have become more prevalent in the S and SE of the country. Members took note of the AIS(M) comment on the primary return seen in the general area of the airmiss as being more akin to the movement of a light ac or helicopter at low level. They were at a loss to identify the reported object since its shape and behaviour did not seem to fit any recognisable piece of aviation equipment, while the temperature inversion made it unlikely that something like a piece of black polythene could have been carried to that level. It was agreed that this airmiss was best described as a confliction between the B737 and the unidentified object. Whilst members were unsure what damage could have occurred had the object struck the B737 the general opinion was that there had been a possible risk of collision.

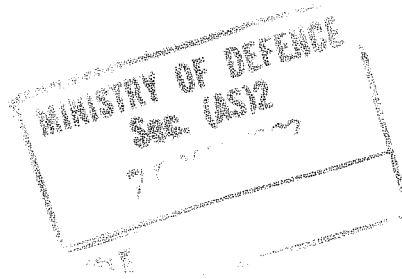

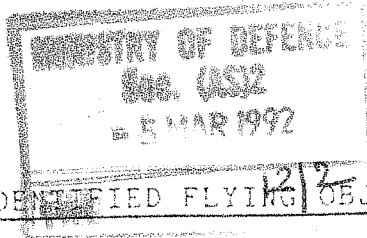

RECENT UFO SIGHTINGS OVER LONDON

1. Many addressees will be aware that there has been a recent spate of UFO sightings over the London area. Witnesses describe a large saucer or cigar-shaped luminous object, with a red flashing light underneath. Some witnesses also report having heard the sound of an engine.

2. Any report that fits this pattern is almost certain to have been the airship that has been flying over London recently - the main body of which is strongly illuminated. I have actually seen it myself from a number of angles and distances, and can appreciate why many people are filing UFO reports.


3. Whilst we have standard lines to take on UFOs, it is perfectly acceptable to suggest any logical explanation for a sighting to a caller, and in this instance I suspect it might put a few people's minds at rest to suggest that - if the details fit - the object that they saw was this airship.

4. I hope this is helpful.
