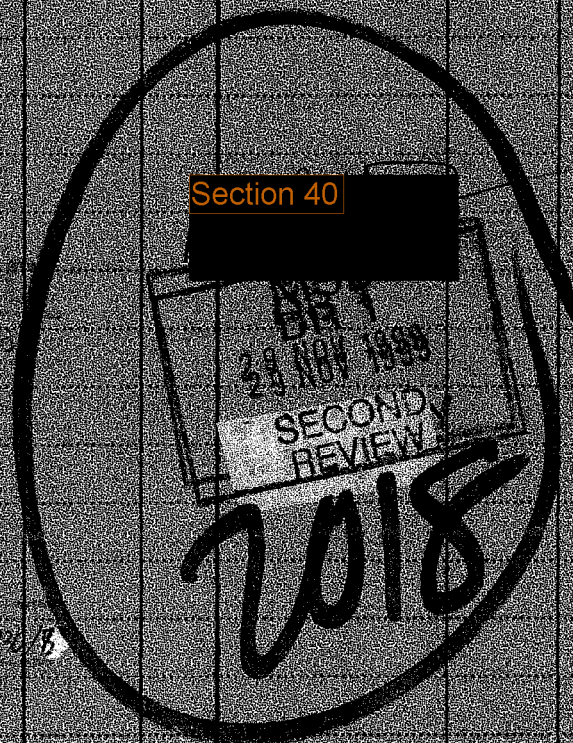

SUBJECT: REPORT OF UNIDENTIFIED LIGHT IN SKY

1. At about 18.10 hours, Friday, 10th December 1993, Section 40 [redacted] Stone, reported seeing a large flash in the sky and something coming down like a meteorite.
2. The following information was obtained and is set out in the format used by the Department of Trade and Industry, National Air Traffic Control Services.
3. (a) Date/Time/Duration of Sighting: 18.10 hrs. Friday 10/12/93 for about a second.
(b) Description of Object: One ball of light, white in colour, with a little tail that may have been more reddish in colour.
(c) Exact position observed: Observer indoors sitting facing westerly direction. Object seen moving downwards at about 60° to horizontal, sloping to the south. Map Reference SJ 913332.
(d) How observed: By naked eye.
(e) Direction in which object was first seen: Seen up in sky travelling downwards with no landmarks to assist.
(f) Angle of sight: Seen through window looking upwards from about 40° down to 30° angle of sight of observer.
(g) Distance: Unable to offer any estimate.
(h) Movements: No change in downwards trajectory.
(j) Meteorological condition: Dark/night-time but clear skies, stars visible.
(k) Nearby objects: No particular objects in area of sight.

Family sees strangers in the night

LITHE green men could be set to land in the area, after a number of "strange" sightings in the skies.

The Neal family from Scawby saw what they believe to be an unidentified flying object on Friday evening.

And a Crosby woman has also reported seeing a strange object in the skies - also spotted in the Glanford area by her relatives.

Checks to local RAF bases reveal no aircraft reported flying in the area on Friday night and so the strange sightings remain a mystery.

Council worker Stephen Neal and his

wife Sallianne, of St Martin's Crescent, Scawby, said they were driving their two daughters Louise (12) and Victoria (nine), to the library in Brigg when Louise spotted the object.

"She said what's that stick in the sky, mum?" said Sallianne, who thought at first Louise had seen a plane or something similar.

Sallianne described the object as quite a big stick of light that looked like the edge of a saucer.

It was moving slowly, said Sallianne and the family headed towards Kirton Lind-

sey to get a better view. But before they got there it seemed to turn and disappeared, she said.

"I can't explain what we saw," she said. "It wasn't a bird and it wasn't a plane. We just couldn't describe it."

Now the family are hoping Evening Telegraph readers may have seen something similar on Friday night or that experts may be able to explain what they saw.

"I'm always sceptical about these things," she added. "Whether it was the light playing tricks, I don't know."

"It would be interesting to find out what it was."

Local police said they had not had any reports of UFO sightings over the weekend.

Mystery object was cigar-shaped

A CROSBY woman who believes she saw an unidentified flying object in Scunthorpe on Friday night has learned she is one of a growing number of people who have had sightings in the area.

The woman, who does not wish to be named, was called outside by her partner when he got home from work at around 10pm.

He had seen the object as he came home from work.

She said the cigar-shaped craft had small wings on it but not at right angles like an plane.

There was no plane noise and there were lights underneath it, she said.

According to the woman, the object was stationary for a while before moving off very quickly.

found that her stepson had seen a similar object as he drove from Barrow to Barton at about the same time on Friday.

"It was very strange," said the woman. "I wondered if anyone else had seen anything."

Now a national expert has added weight to the claim, saying that the number of UFO sightings across the country has risen significantly in the last few weeks.

Phillip Mantle of the British UFO Research Association, said that 95 per cent of sightings turn out to have a logical explanation such as weather phenomena or planes but that a small percentage seem to have no explanation at all.

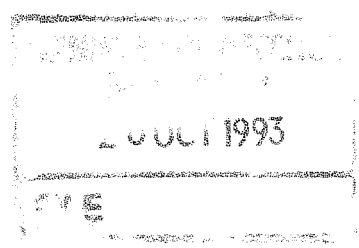

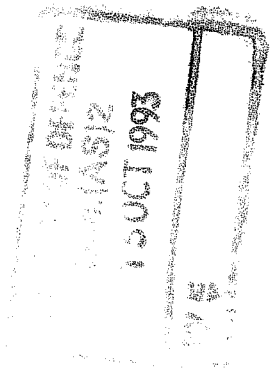

Close encounter scares witnesses

UFO

A mother and her 20-year-old daughter this week claimed to have been frightened after a strange silent craft followed them down Green Road. Their encounter lasted about an hour and a half. The two, who live in the Derby Road area of Ashbourne, became aware of an elongated H shape in the sky on their right as they passed the Little Chef travelling the A52 towards Ashbourne. It was about 9.10pm.

"It was not a plane or a helicopter and had lights at the bottom like strobe lights moving around very slowly," recalled the mother. "It was square shape and very large in the sky."

"I wanted to go home when we got to Ashbourne but my daughter said to go to Green Road, where I knew that we should see it."

"Against my better judgment we went although I was frightened because I knew it would be there."

"Just past the Grammar School my daughter shouted that it was there on the left above the houses."

"I had already locked the car doors and drove up Green Road to about ten houses before the end, and stopped."

"Now it seemed to have lost shape and was replaced by a bright flashing star which we felt compelled to focus on."

"We were quiet, and kept looking for about five minutes and then suddenly there it was above us."

"I leaned forward and looked through the windscreen and directly above us was this saucer

the valley they saw the H shape still over Green Road and arriving home the woman got her husband to go back with them.

They followed the strange craft up to Kniveton, and saw it flashing again before it shot over towards Hognaston.

"My husband works in the aerospace industry," said the woman, "and had never seen anything like it. It was like nothing I had ever seen either."

The woman admitted she had been very disturbed by the experience and said it would take a long time to get over it.

"Although I am pleased to have seen it and wonder why it came to us, I never thought I was going to make it home. I thought life was going to disappear and me with it."

In July when a woman on the Green Road area was also frightened by a strange huge disc shaped object, several *News Telegraph* readers suggested it was a Chinook helicopter.

But when the *News Telegraph* described the experience and description to RAF Strike Command at High Wycombe, spokesman Dale Donovan said it did not sound at all like a helicopter.

"The Chinook, while being 99 feet long including the rotor at each end, is a very loud aeroplane making a very distinctive vibrating noise."

"It also has a considerable down-draught. "I think you are talking here of something more than a helicopter."

At the Ministry of Defence in Whitehall, UFO sightings are dealt with by Mr Nick Pope who has asked that the women in question should send him full details of the incident and a sketch of the craft.

"Ninety-five per cent of reports we receive can be explained in terms of known objects or phenomena," explained Mr Pope.

"Satellites, aircraft, weather balloons, meteorites and so on. But we accept five per cent of sightings do appear to defy explanation and on which we are open minded and have no better idea than the next person."

Last year Mr Pope received 147 reports from members of the public, usually via the local police.

So far he has received no reports for Tuesday evening last week.

UFO sightings in the Ashbourne area have continued to be reported to the News Telegraph by mystified members of the public.

In the latest incident, a family from Ellastone spotted a mysterious craft in the sky above their home and even set off in their car to find it when it went out of sight.

"It was a massive triangular object with flashing lights all around it," said Mrs Jackie Chown of Churchfields Cottage, Ellastone.

It was very big, made no noise, and seemed to be coming down over Back Lane travelling towards Uttoxeter.

Her son Dave then jumped into his car along with family friend Mr Jim Chapman who went in search of the strange craft.

"He went round the whole Ellastone and Wootton area but couldn't find a thing," said Mrs Wootton.

Mr Chapman, who has a good knowledge of planes, could offer no explanation as to what they had seen and became even more intrigued

when his mother in Derby rang with a sighting of her own.

She independently described this triangular object with flashing lights that had flown over her house on Tuesday night as well.

And a couple in Wootton have spoken to Mrs Chown saying that they were woken later that night by a very strong light over nearby Darley Moor.

The Ashbourne News Telegraph has reported many UFO sightings over the years with the most recent just before Christmas.

Our special UFO file shows sightings occur in the winter months November-February.

Some people suggest that what people are actually witnessing are the Northern Lights quite often visible at this time of year, rather than little green men from outer space.

But Mrs Chown refutes that: "It was definitely nothing like that and it certainly was not a helicopter or plane as it made no noise but I can not explain what it was."

Strange craft was no 'copter - says woman

An Ashbourne woman was left frightened and shaken after a "close encounter" in the Green Road area of Ashbourne last Wednesday evening.

It was the latest in a number of UFO sightings reported locally this year.

The woman, who has asked not to be named and for the exact location not to be given, was returning home alone in her car soon after 11pm.

"Suddenly I became aware of this thing stationary above the houses, my attention drawn to it by its whirring and the lights which suddenly flashed on, lighting up the whole road.

"I couldn't believe what I was seeing.

"It was disc shaped with a dome on the top and red and yellow lights all round coming on and off, and with the black outline of a door.

"It was quite low down, about the height of two houses above the roofs and about three buses long.

"I was terrified. It was as though it was staring at me, the lights going on and off.

"I stopped and looked at it for a few moments, and as I got out of the car it started to move off quite slowly up towards Greenway and over towards Windmill Lane."

Various suggestions have been put to the woman as to what the object might have been, but she is adamant this was unlike anything she had seen before.

"I know what a helicopter looks like and what it sounds like, and this was no helicopter," she said.

Should anyone else have seen anything that night, the Ashbourne News Telegraph would like to hear.

Looking towards the cloudy sky, Mr Lees said he then saw how: "A moving object came into view which, as it got nearer, I first took it to be a helicopter."

"However, as it became closer, its shape was something I had never seen before. I rushed out of the house to view it as it passed by."

Mr Lees said he expected to hear the noise of an engine but didn't, as it appeared to be silent.

Added Mr Lees: "It was moving beneath the cloud at quite a high speed on a direct easterly course."

Woman sees 'second UFO'

An Ashbourne woman who claims to have seen a UFO in the sky over Ednaston last December has reported seeing another in a 'carbon copy' incident.

The woman, who does not want to be named, claims she saw the strange craft on Monday night last week while travelling between Derby and Ashbourne at 9.45pm.

"It was in exactly the same place, at

the same time and it looked the same," she said. "It was a complete carbon copy of the other sighting." 6/5/93

The UFO was strangely lit up and moved too fast to be either a helicopter or plane. It also made no noise. The woman now thinks that little green men may be after her because she knows too much. "I have got visions of coming home and finding aliens there saying 'You have seen us twice so we have come to take you away,'" she joked.

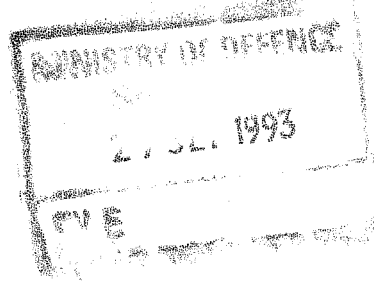

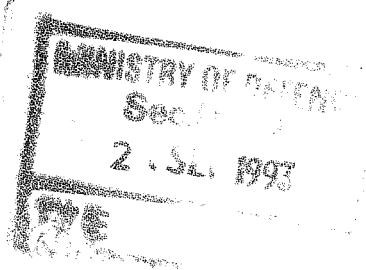

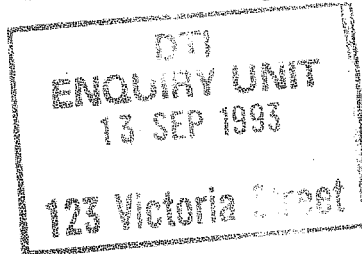

STANDING ORDER E4

REPORTING OF UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS (E:1:1)

National Air Traffic Control Service

1. The Department of Trade and Industry, National Air Traffic Control Services, are required to advise the Military Aeronautical Information Service of all reports of unidentified flying objects and/or similar phenomena coming to their notice. To be of the greatest value, these reports are required in a standard form, giving as much information as possible. When a member of the general public reports such a sighting to the police, it may help them to give the required information if they can be prompted by the correct questions.
2. Set out below is the format to be used as the basis of any notification to the Department of Trade and Industry when any sighting is reported to the police:-

I mentioned to him that the objects he saw last Saturday might have been airships — but he didn't seem to be too convinced. I said that we (that means you!) could check to see if any were in the area at that time + that we (you) would let him know. I also said that we could let him know if we had received any other reports. He asked if we could check radar tapes — I said possibly.

Could you get back to him next week — I promised you would!

P.S. I forgot to give him the names of the **Section 40** approved UFO groups — something also you can cheer him up with.

Spoke to **Section 40**, but although their airship has been in the London area recently, it hasn't been over Redworn.
