Given the conclusion it was decided that there was no such requirement and, since December 2000, UFO reports have not been forwarded to the DIS. We appreciate that there may be those who disagree with the report's findings, but the MOD is satisfied that its conclusions are sufficient for defence needs.

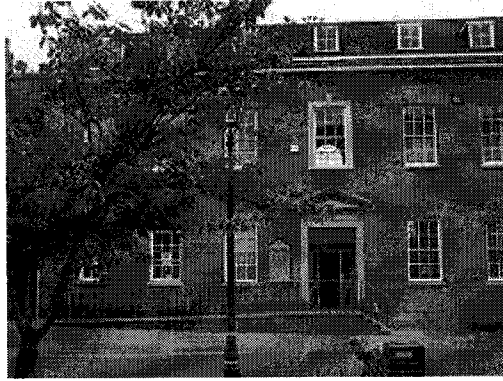

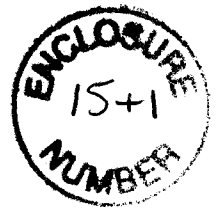

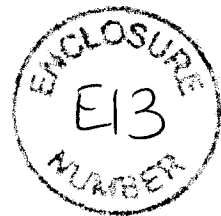

News of the World Article on UFOs.

We spoke yesterday about the attached article. I have since instituted investigations and attach a press line and Q&A brief which I propose sending to the DPO. This will hopefully put them on the right track should there be further inquiries.

The News of the World story appears to be one fabrication after another. Lt. Col. Halt has not spoken to anyone from the News of the World nor has he been told his career would be in jeopardy if he talked about the incident. The report has not been classified top secret by the USAF. The only report prepared by the USAF is that contained on our files and which is unclassified!

The alleged interview with Sqn. Ldr. Moreland is also a fabrication. He stated that "to the best of my knowledge Lt. Col. Halt is a very genuine person" but gave no details of any conversation he had had with Halt nor did he say "Whatever it was, it was able to perform feats in the air which no known aircraft is capable of doing."

As regards the information allegedly provided by the former security policeman this is completely untrue. The personnel who went into the forest to investigate the lights went on foot - not in a jeep. Only three patrolmen entered the forest, contrary to the report of more than 200 RAF and USAF personnel being present. There was never any question of alien beings. Nor is there any truth in the statement that "Art Wallace" and others were interviewed.

US authorities did not carry out any such investigations but left MOD to carry out its own investigations.

Ops (GR) has checked the question of radar traces with NATO who have informally stated that nothing was seen on any radar recordings although they did receive a report of a sighting from a civil aircraft.

The unfortunate point about the article is the fact that MOD refused to comment on the grounds that it was a matter for the USAF while USAF were saying it was a matter for MOD - an ideal support to the theory of a MOD cover up!

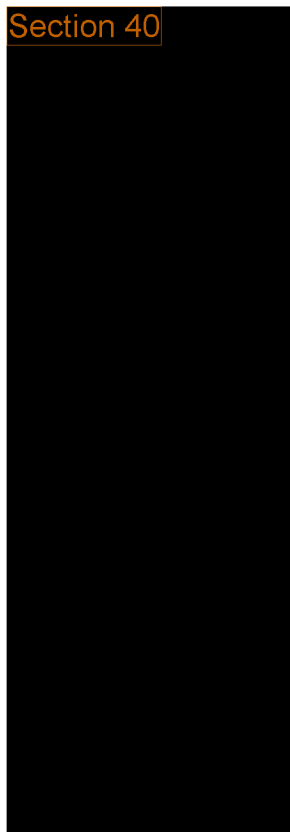

I am writing concerning your Freedom of Information request regarding reports of UFOs spotted in Scotland. Your request has been passed to this Department as we are the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence regarding UFOs. I apologise for the delay in sending this response. I have sent this request as a hard copy, as your e.mail address no longer works.

I should inform you that the files the MOD holds on UFOs were routinely destroyed after 5 years until 1967 when they were generally preserved for The National Archives. A few have survived before 1967 and these together with records up to 1977 are now available for viewing. The National Archives can be contacted at Ruskin Avenue, Kew, Richmond, Surrey TW9 4DU or telephone 020 8876 3444. The National Archives also have a website containing an on-line catalogue of the records they hold and how to access them. This can be found on the internet at <http://www.nationalarchives.gov.uk>.

Details of UFO sightings reported to the MOD and public correspondence about UFOs (some of which also contain sighting reports) from 1978 to date are currently held by the MOD. These records are not held electronically, but are filed on paper files in the order in which they are received. They are not segregated by geographical area. In order to identify the reports from Scotland for this entire period, it would be necessary to conduct a manual search of thousands of paper records and the costs of such an exercise would exceed the permitted £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the Ministry of Defence is not obliged to comply with your request. However, we can advise you that in order to assist the public, we are compiling a database of UFO sightings reported to the MOD which we intend to publish in the near future. To date, we have completed this for the years 2002-2005 and to date in 2006, and a search of these records has revealed 61 sightings from Scotland during this period. I note that you requested copies of this information, but I should advise you that before we release this information all personal details about the individuals would have to be removed in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998. I estimate that the cost to do this for all 61 records would also exceed the permitted limits. However, for your information I have prepared a table for each year, containing brief details of each sighting, as follows:-
