I have searched for time tables of flight plans for International Space Station, Satellite, Comets and Meteorite events for this time at night and found nothing.

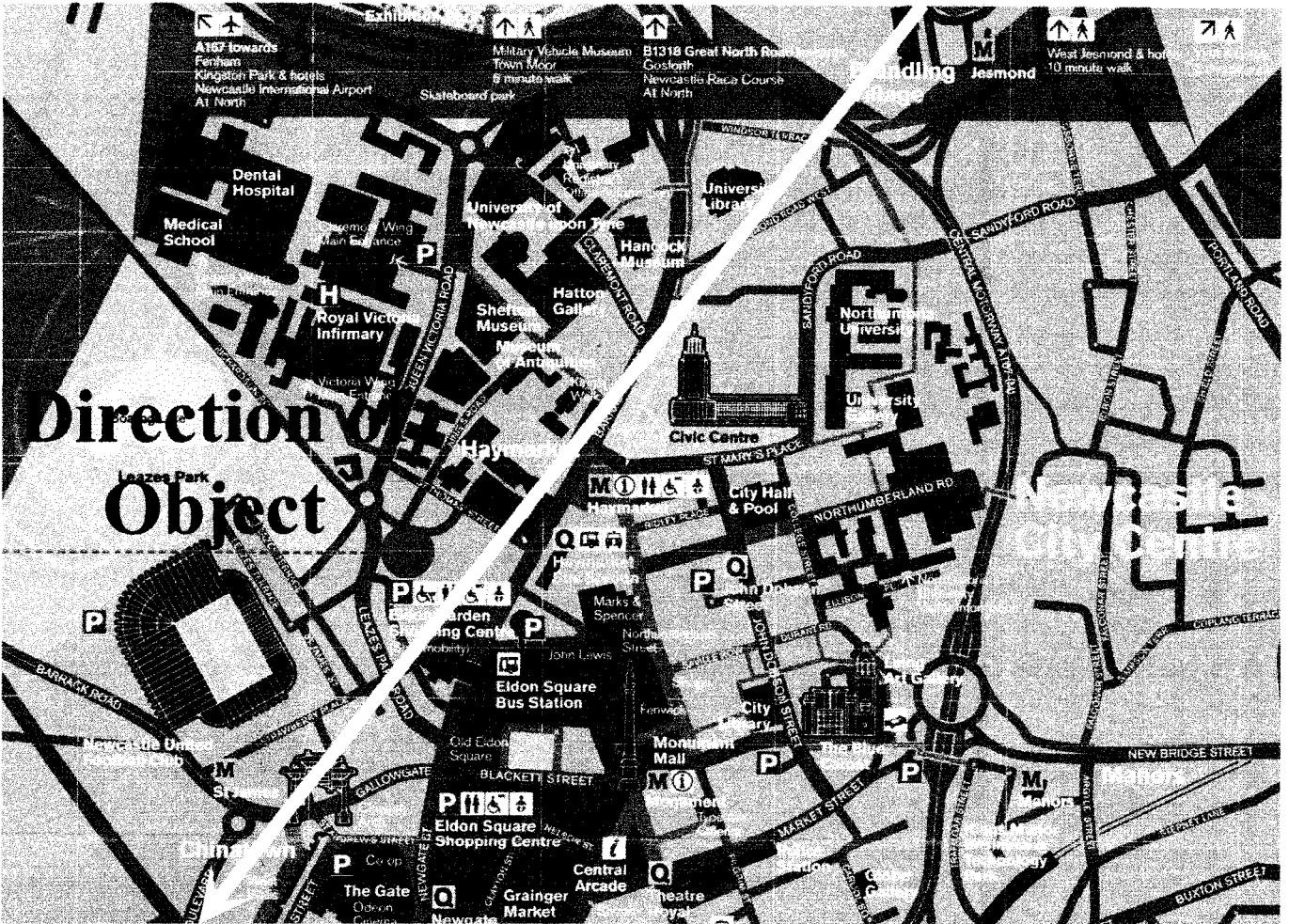
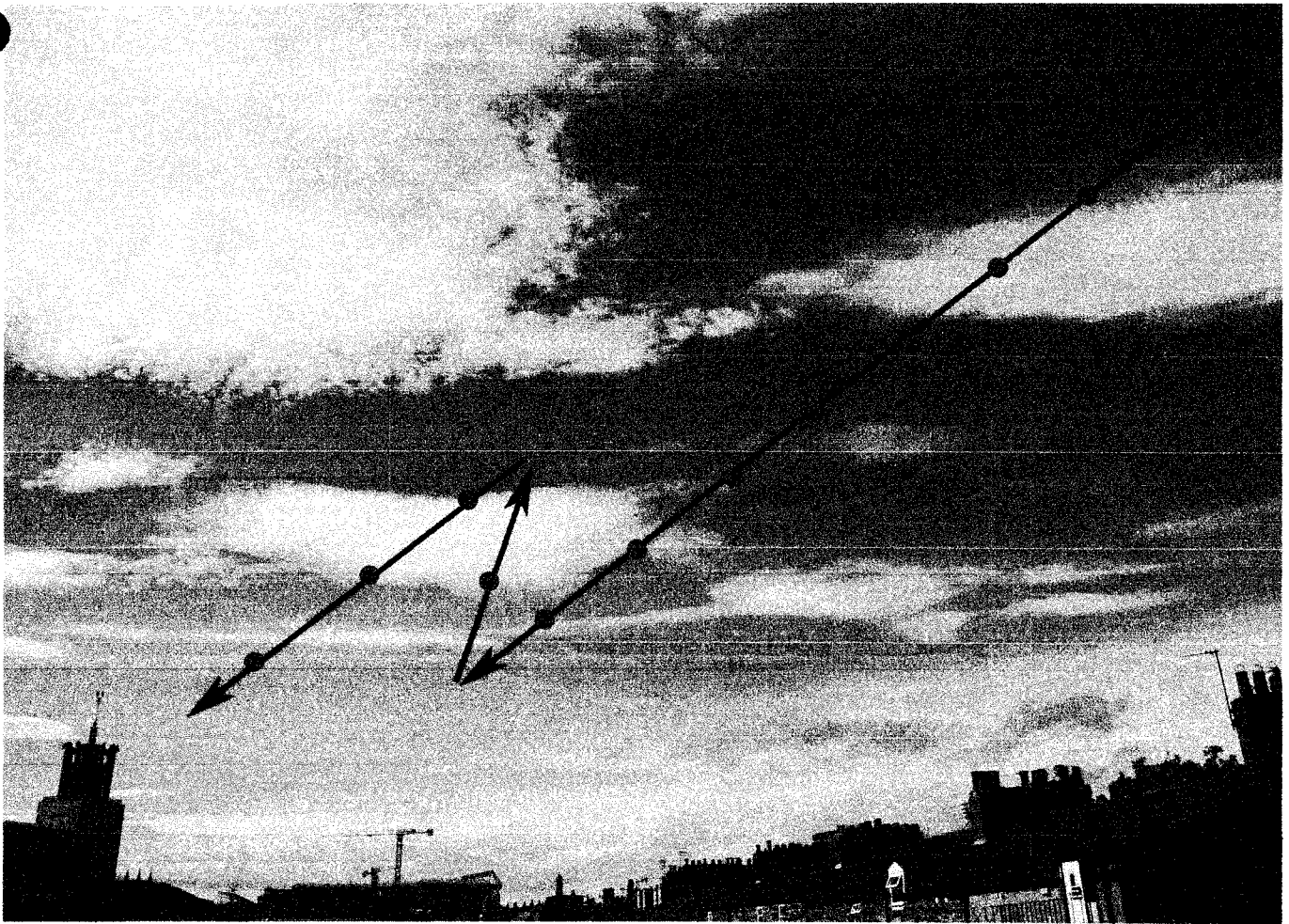
