
1. The reference A nomination of LCol Parslow of my staff as the military operational representative and the permanent DND member to the NRC Associate Committee on Meteorites was made on the assumption that the subject of UFO's was an integral part of this committee's studies. Attendance at the 14 November meeting and discussions with the committee executive disclosed that this group's activities are limited to the study of meteorites and consequently discussions were on a very highly technical and scientific level. It was the Committee's intention that Dr. G.H. Jones of DRB would hopefully serve as the sole DND representative. The only operational role envisaged by this committee would be the possible use of CF aircraft in searching for meteorite falls in remote areas. It was generally agreed that Dr. Jones could relay these requirements to the air tasking section of this Branch and therefore no further DND representation is required.
2. In 1968 it was agreed that this dept's files on UFO's as well as all subsequently received reports would be forwarded to NRC. The forwarding of reports received from CF units to NRC represents this dept's sole involvement in this subject.
3. Discussions with Dr. Peter Millman, the former head of the NRC division involved with this subject, disclosed that while some scientists are generally prepared to accept the likelihood of other forms of life existing within the galaxies there is, following well over fifty years of personal observation on his part, no pattern of physical and scientific events that suggest the existence of alien UFO's. Acceptance of Dr. Millman's explanations would indicate that no major changes to the current DND/NRC arrangements are necessary.
4. I should point out that this view is not shared by all scientists.

believes that Canada needs a much more systematic study of these reports than is currently provided. Nevertheless in view of the fiscal restraints facing this department and the expenditures of resources and funds that would be required to undertake such a study, it is recommended that no changes be made to the current DND/NRC procedures. Nevertheless it is understood that the reporting procedures outlined in reference B require updating to achieve standardization and to eliminate duplication.

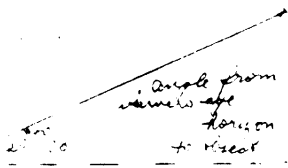
Dear Sir

Can you advise if there has been any positive identification of the object sighted on Tuesday evening 10th June
I myself observed this object for well over an hour from around 8-30 pm to 9⁴⁵ or so at which time it was beginning to lose the reflected light from the sun. I observed it through a tripod mounted spotting scope which I customarily use on the Squaw Point rifle range. Object was observed with a 20 power and also a 48 power eye piece.

At these magnifications the object was very bright & clear & distinct & defined. I enclose a few sketches which may be of interest as well as a little data on the sighting. As the Squaw Point area has been very high as reports of sightings come in from as far as the Galapagos.

The object was perfectly upright & aligned like a bullet except for a curved section of a Spitzer point with a sharp point. I have with me put it "like an end gate of a bullet" which is yellow with reflected sunlight except for a small dark area AA in the sketch. The whole thing which glows somewhat more brightly than the rest of the object as electric bulb. I do could have been a small section of a wire or cable of some sort. The area marked "A" has a "drapery" effect at the base - probably a small section of a wire.

The object was apparently stationary but it was not perfectly stationary from the right top corner to the lower left corner. It was roughly in the NE to SW. By judging motion against a background of the horizon an apparent distance of 1 foot in 1 1/2 hours. As the time came towards the horizon the light reflected from the object changed to a slightly reddish old gold colour (no doubt the earth's atmosphere was filtering the light) until it finally assumed the rather "lilac yellowish white" light like the moon seen in daylight. The behaviour was that of a high altitude balloon but the shape & distinctness of line was unlike any object I have ever observed before.

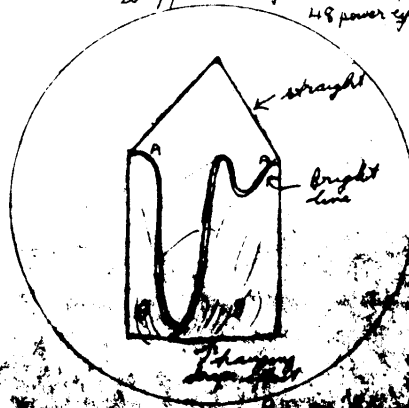
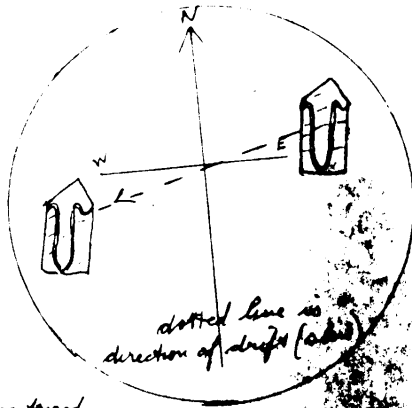

Dear Sir:

I am enclosing a copy of a letter which has been forwarded to the Ontario Provincial Police at Stayner, Ontario, and would appreciate it very much if you find the time to read it, and the contents of this letter to you.

Being a concerned citizen, I would very much like to know about these so called U.F.O.'s and what the Air Force is doing about them.

It may also be of interest to you, that On November 27th, 1972, at about 10:10 P.M., my family and I were travelling south of Little Britain and we watched a red speck of light descend from a pin point from the south-western sky. As it gradually descended at a fantastic speed towards earth it became larger. It hovered over the north-western tip of Lake Scugog being the next concession over from where we 2 then and for about 20 minutes it glowed red brightly and fading and glowing brightly again. It was about the size of a water tower cut in half as we viewed it across the fields, until it suddenly disappeared!

Again on January 8th, 1973, my two daughters and I were driving in an easterly direction towards Lindsay from Little Britain at about 5:00 P.M. when the sky was clear and a pale blue in colour, when all of a sudden a brilliant white light appeared before us on the north side of the road. I remembered reading somewhere that someone flashed a flashlight at one and it had flashed back so I thought I would do the same thing. I put on my car lights on and off three times and in return, the huge bright light flashed back at us three times where I immediately pulled over to the side of the road and stopped the car. Two other cars sped by us and they obviously saw the same thing we did but as I opened the door of the car and stood up, the light moved faster than we could follow it, over to the south of us which was on our right almost over our car. We were unable to determine its shape but did observe that it made no sound, and was about the size again of the top half of a water tower and then it completely disappeared.

I have often seen these strange lights in the skies at all hours of the night in particular, and have seen their erratic behavioural patterns, along with others I have known and of whom did not report to the police. I reported sightings to the A.P.R.O. at Tuscon, Arizona, and to the Orillia radio station and this last one to the O.P.P. at Stayner and Lindsay. It is one thing to view these strange craft at a distance but to have one as near to my family and I as the one at Stayner, it is a much different matter.

Also, one evening this January 18th, my 10 year old daughter was found in shock when I arrived home from work at about 9:20 P.M. She was white in colour and couldn't speak and it took me almost 1½ hours to get her to talk to me what had happened. Apparently she saw a "cigar-shaped" object hovering at tree top level out in front of our place where we ② o in Lindsay. The flashing blue lights drew her attention to look at what it was. She stated that the lights were "twirling". It sounds similiar to what ② saw of whom lives at ② She also told me all about her experience withn objects of this nature. A couple I was acquainted with from Little Britian told me that they were followed three times by a brilliant white light from Markham to just north of Port Perry and I know others, many others, who have related their encounters with U.F.O.'s.

I want to know why the public isn't being told or informed about these and why stories in the newspapers or reports on the radio are being "hushed up" so to speak on something that is obviously the greatest discovery of our time.

Your kind attention to this very serious matter would be greatly appreciated and I remain,
