PRINCE GEORGE CITY DETACHMENT CASE. (ORG)

25 AUG 70

1. At approximately 9:00 PM, this date KEITH reported to this office that he had been watching an unidentified flying object for the past hour. He advised that he had reported this to the local Air Force Base (CFB Baldy Hughes) who were unable to pick this up on their radar.

2. KEITH was interviewed in this regard by myself and found to be a normal, sane person and considered to be reliable in this instance. Upon contacting the Baldy Hughes Air Force Base they advised that they in turn were checking on this sighting and had the object in sight. As per Telex POC 1255 and Operational Manual CO-AIR please be advised as follows:

- (A) 1st sightings: 22-8-70 - 9:00 to 10:00 PM, Pacific Time Zone
2nd sightings: 23-8-70 - 9:00 to 11:00 PM, Pacific Time Zone
- (B) Sky clear at time of sighting
- (C) Allen KEITH - (Private Citizen)
- (D) 276 Ogilvie Street, Prince George, B.C.
- (E) Pvt. D.K. LORRECHAMPS - CFB Baldy Hughes
- (F) One object, round and red flashing. Approximately 45 degrees above horizon, slow moving from east to west with up and down movement like a kite.
- (G) One hour 1st sighting, and two hours 2nd sighting.
- (H) Identified as a satellite.

3. Private LORRECHAMPS was again contacted and he advised that this sighting had been passed onto McCord Airforce Base, Seattle, Washington, U.S.A. McCord Airforce Base had advised him that this was a satellite and they were tracking same. LORRECHAMPS did not elaborate on the same etc. of the satellite but advised that they were continuing observation in conjunction with McCord Airforce Base. Complaint was notified as to the identity of the object and satisfied. Copies in duplicate of this report sent to Comdantor, Ottawa. Extra copies attached.

Fireball Sighting - Little Hearts Ease,
T. Bay, Newfoundland, - 14 AUG 70

1. Receipt is acknowledged of Form A-151-1 from O.C. St. John's Sub/Division, dated 15 SEPT 70.

14 AUG 70

2. At 9:00 p.m., a phone call was received from Mr. Ernest NORRIS of Little Hearts Ease, Nfld. He advised that he and his family had just seen an object fall out of the sky and it looked to them as if it was a plane or something similar and it was on fire.

3. An immediate patrol was made to the scene by the undersigned and the NORRIS family was contacted. They advised me that their attention had first been attracted to the object by the rushing sort of noise it gave off. When they saw it, it was travelling in a North Easterly direction. It passed directly over the settlement of Little Hearts Ease at a height of approximately 1/2 mile and then it abruptly crashed into the mouth of the harbour. Just prior to crashing, it commenced a wobbling sort of motion and pieces seemed to fly off it. They described it as being about eight to ten feet in length, with a tail extending several feet beyond this. It was described as being blood red in colour, with the tail being a lighter shade of red. As it passed over the settlement, it gave out sufficient light to light up the settlement and distinct shadows could be seen.

4. The weather conditions and visibility at the time were very good. The sky was starlit and dark had fallen. Shortly after my arrival at the scene, a patrol was made by boat to the crash site and the area was completely searched. Nothing was found anywhere in the area. Mr. NORRIS advised me that he would be fishing in the area the next day and he would bring it to the attention of others fishing in the area and should they find anything, they would notify me immediately. This search was made by them, but nothing was found.

5. The information obtained on the immediate patrol was passed on to Sgt. A.O. MacPHEE via radio and he made a check with the Air Terminal in Gander. After a short time, they were able to advise us that no planes were overdue or missing anywhere in the Province of Newfoundland.

6. Further enquiries in the St. Jones Within area revealed a full confirmation of the sighting. The description given and the time of sighting matched in every detail. The persons making this sighting were the local Post-Mistress, and her husband, Mr. and Mrs. William ROBBINS.

7. Further enquiries were conducted in the little Hearts

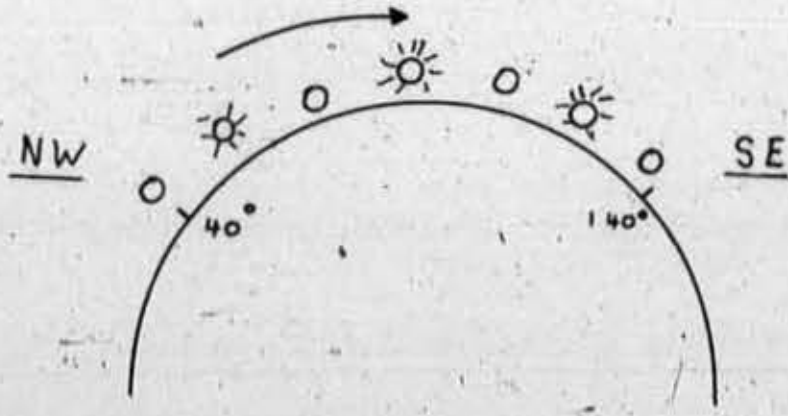

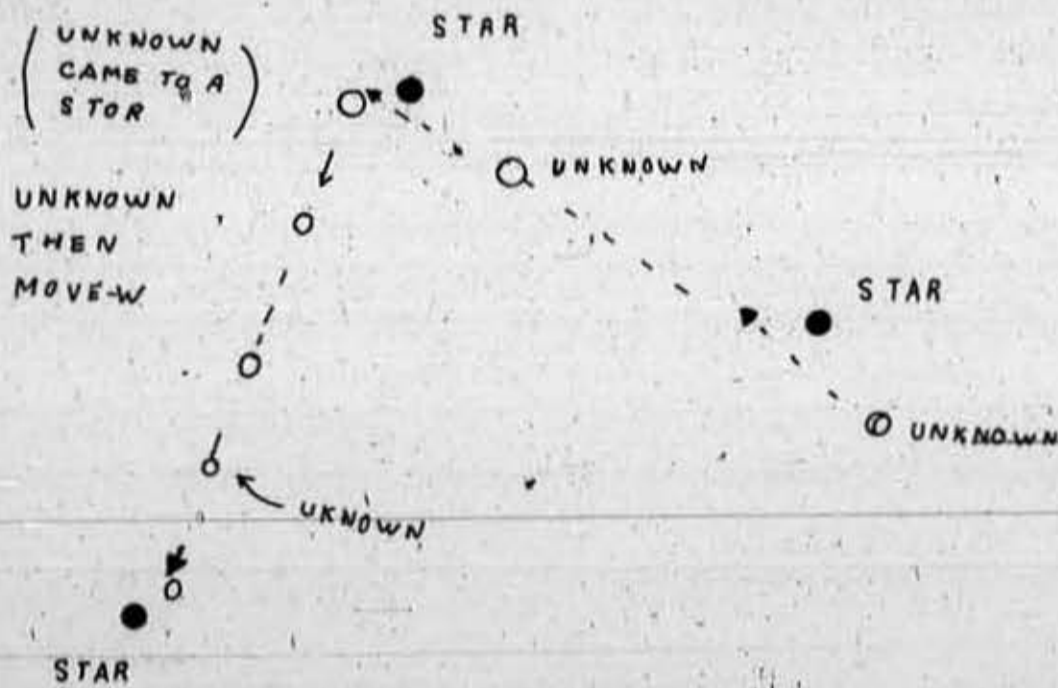

- On this date at approx. 2:30 PM a call was received from STECKI of Box 101 Lorette, Man. She stated that while driving down a municipal road one mile south of #1 highway and P.R. #206 on the 8 OCT 70 on her way home at about 11:15 PM she had spotted some strange lights in the sky which came down on her and then disappeared. She said that she thought that it might be a U.F.O.
- At approx. 3:00 PM a telex was sent out to N.C.S. Meteor Centre, info. CONFORCESHD.

14 OCT 70

- On this date Bernice STECKI was interviewed at her home. She stated that while driving east she saw three lights at about eye level. First she thought it was a car but then she noticed that it was too high in the sky for a car. The two outer lights were the brightest. She said they were coming at a angle toward the car and thought they would hit her. At this time she was just about stopped. She said it seemed to hang over her car and then suddenly took off with a lot of noise sounding similar to a airplane. After she went home she watched it for approx. one hour in a stationary position. It was one big object and it had a little red light at the back. A Mrs. SEMBRAT had also seen it.
- A patrol was made to Anne SEMBRAT's home at Box 11 RR #1 Dugald, Man. She stated that sometime around 11:00 PM she had gone outside for a few seconds and saw a light in the sky. It was a sort of a light yellow in color. She just took a look at it and never paid anymore attention to it except when she heard what had happened to Mrs. STECKI.
- Both STECKI and SEMBRAT are about 40 yrs. of age and seem to be mentally stable. Neither one of them are known as chronic complainers. Both are considered reliable persons.
- All persons who had spotted the lights have been interviewed.
- It is felt that the persons have seen a plane. Recently it was noticed that planes have been putting on their landing lights quite a distance from the airport and flying low. No further action taken.

Dear Mr. Semchison:

Thank you for your letter of 5 October with the enclosed sketches of the luminous phenomenon seen between 5 and 6 a.m. that morning. We have received a few other reports from the Ottawa area and also from the vicinity of Halifax.

There seems little doubt now that the cloud was produced by a release of barium in the upper atmosphere from a rocket launched at Wallops Island off the coast of Virginia. The upper atmosphere would be in sunlight some considerable time before sunrise on the ground and since barium is very easily excited to produce a glow when subjected to solar illumination it is used in experiments to study properties of the ionosphere. The long tail is caused by an interaction between electrical charges produced in the barium and the magnetic field of the earth.

Dear Dr. Halliday,

Your name was given to me by the secretary at the David Dunlap Observatory in Richmond Hill, to write to in regards to a possible Meteorite sighting.

This sighting took place at approximately 5:15 a.m. today and was sighted in an East, southeast direction from my home here in Pefferlaw. At the first sighting it appeared to be a large sphere of light with an extreme bright mass at it's base. It also had a very long tail of light that went up into the sky and seemed to disappear into the stars. The angle of the tail was approximately 85-87 degrees, to the horizon. Both the sphere and the tail were of a green color. At first look the sphere seemed to be a solid mass about twenty times the size of a full moon and hung suspended. However, upon closer observation the central part of it was diffused light. This sphere shape lasted for about 6 - 10 minutes and then changed into a shape somewhat like an arrowhead. The very extreme bright mass still at the lower extremity. The tail was still visible at this time and remained so for about twenty minutes and then dispersed. The arrowhead shape remained until sunrise and seemed to be lower in the sky. At all times the object was of this green color. The object was first seen by my business partner Mr. Geo. Conway and then reported to me whereupon I observed at the times given to you. Mr. Conway saw it approximately five minutes before he called myself. I called the operator (telephone) for our area and she had had no other reports of it. I also called CHUM news in Toronto and they had one other report of this object. The Dunlap Observatory had no reports.

I have enclosed three sketches of my observations with the times involved in the hopes that you might be able to enlighten me on this matter. I am very interested to find out if this object was sighted elsewhere and just what it might have been. I trust you may be able to help in this incident. I would appreciate and will be looking forward to hearing from you.



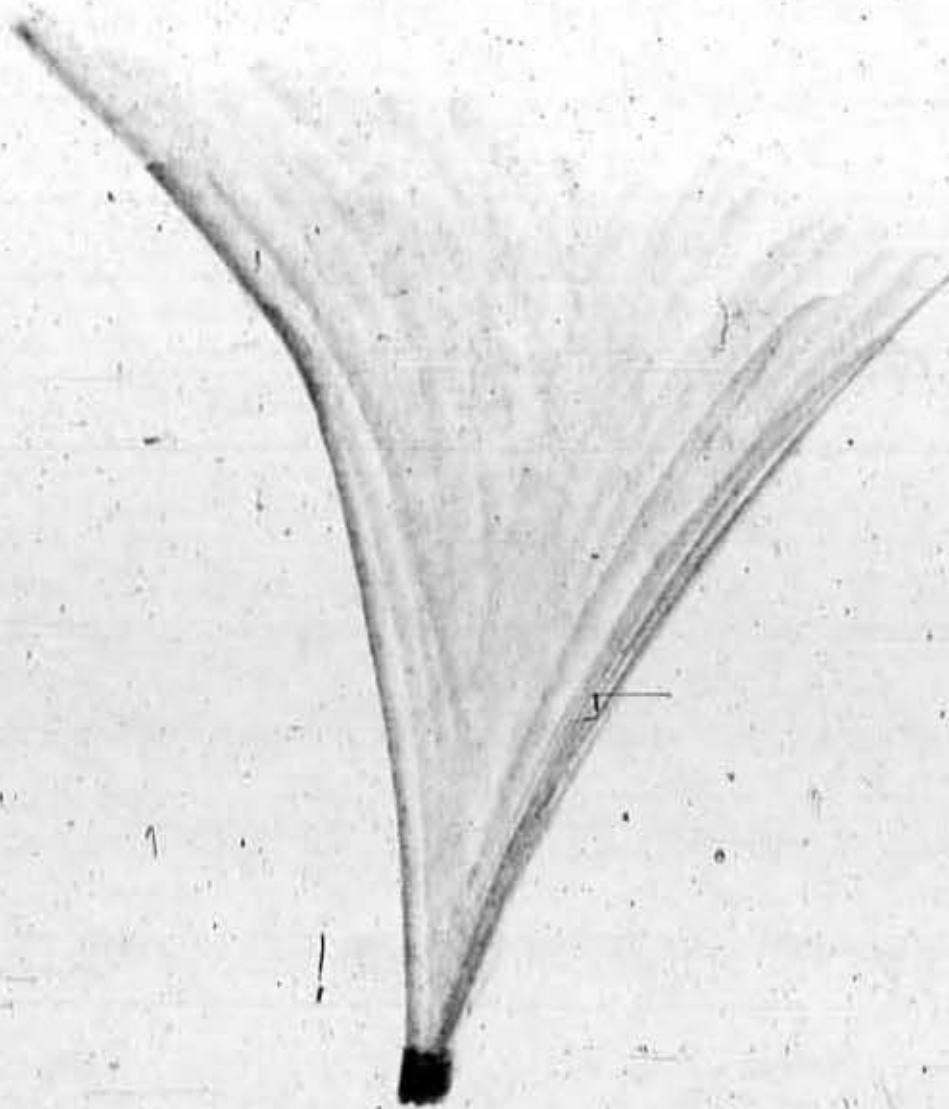

In regard to your letter on November 12, 1970 with file number M45-1-101, I will answer your questions to the best of my ability.

1. The event occurred at 1:00 A.M. Central Daylight Time.

2. My truck was parked facing north on a trail road about 3 or 4 miles north of MacGregor.



3. The object was situated north west of my truck.

My attention was first called to the object when we sat up because we noticed a bright light. We thought it was a car coming. I estimated that the object was approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ mile away from the parked truck. I estimated this distance because we were over half a mile away from the next cross road and the object seemed to be quite far away in the field.

5 There were 9 poles with red lights on top. There seemed to be a flange that stuck out about a foot and appeared to encircle the object.

I was able to make out the form of the object because the object gave off a light which seemed to light up the sky and also the moon was shining.

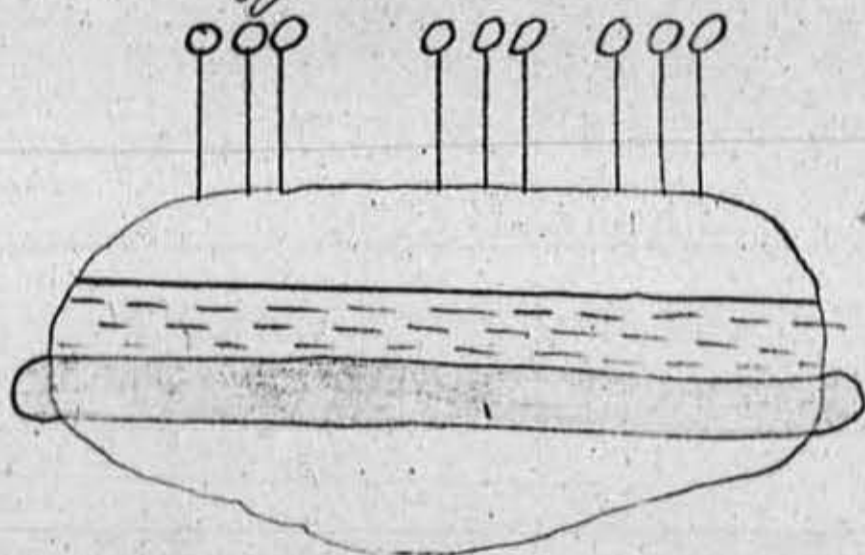
6 As my girlfriend and I sat in the truck watching the object we talked about what it could be. I told her it might be a U.F.O. This made her a little nervous. I told her I was going to walk over to the object. She then became scared as she didn't want to stay alone nor come with me.

After I took my girlfriend home I returned to find the U.F.O. had moved northwest of where it originally was. I estimated it to be a couple of miles away and it was hovering a little above the ground. This is why I could still see it. I knew it was the U.F.O. because it later took off and disappeared into the night.

8 It was a beautiful night about 32°^{of}. There were some light clouds but otherwise clear. The moon was shining and the stars were out, and the northern lights could be seen easily. There also could be seen quite a few falling stars as my girlfriend and I sat watching the U.F.O.

I will try to draw you a sketch of the object as I saw it that night. It was oval in shape and looked orange-yellow in color. There were 9 red lights on rods on top of the object arranged in clusters of three. There was a dark flange that appeared to go around the object and stuck out a distance of about a foot. Above this appeared a window about a foot high and a bright yellow light - 3 -

You mentioned that the moon was shining, and yet my calculations would indicate that according to your position the moon would not have risen on the night of October 23/24 until over one hour after the 1:00 a.m. you listed for your original sighting. I didn't question you specifically on the date, but it would appear that either your statement of the date, which was Friday, October 23/24, or your statement about the moon, must be in error. Which is the better assumption:- that you made the observation on an earlier date, or that your memory of the moon relates to a later period than 1:00 a.m., possibly to when you drove back after you had taken your friend home? I would very much appreciate your opinion on this point.

On looking for an explanation of what you observed there is one possibility that occurs to us, and while it may not be the correct solution of the problem, I will note it here. The direction you gave for the sighting of the object is almost exactly the direction of Neepawa. Neepawa has at least two high towers lit with red obstruction warning lights for aircraft, and there may be other high warning lights in the town. If on the night you were out there occurred a rather rare type of looming mirage, the town of Neepawa would appear quite similar to what you described as seen from your location. As the mirage condition disintegrated the appearance would correspond to what you described after you returned later, and eventually it would disappear.

Your comment of the frequency of meteors or shooting stars that night is interesting since this was close to the maximum of the Orionid meteor shower. Bright meteors from this shower would travel in general from a southeast to northwest direction, and it is possible that a very bright fireball produced the intense light which first called

your attention to the phenomenon, and you may have assumed that the mirage was the landed object. Again, I stress that this is not necessarily the correct explanation for what you saw.

I have no ready explanation for the small silver man, but I note that your observation of this phenomenon was in a direction nearly at right angles to that in which you saw the UFO. It is quite possible that what you saw as the little silver man was not associated in any way with the other phenomenon. Thank you again for your cooperation in reporting this to us. We have placed the record on file.



- At approx. 9:50 pm this date while on patrol at Barrington Passage, N.S. I was contacted by Lawrence Charles SMITH of Lower Shag Harbour, Shel. Co., N.S. SMITH was accompanied by his brother Manus Eugene SMITH of the same address and they stated that they had seen lights in the sky at Bear Point, Shel. Co., N.S.
- They stated that they had seen five or six lights in the sky approximately 30 to 50 feet in the air. These lights were described as being 20 inches in diameter and were reddish orange in color. These two witnesses stated that these lights disappeared without moving. The duration of the sighting as described by these witnesses was approx. 20 to 30 seconds. They stated that the tape player in the car had stopped and that the car had stopped on its own when it had been travelling approx. 45 M.P.H. They stated that the second light from the left had gone out and then lit up again at least once.
- An immediate patrol was made to the scene with the SMITH brothers. They explained the position of these lights and how they had been driving normally along the highway towards their homes when the sighting occurred. Nothing could be seen at the place of the sighting out of the ordinary; the area is thickly wooded. I was the scene for approx. 30 minutes and after a thorough search of the area I left.

26 NOV 70

- At approx. 9:15 am this date Col. RUSHTON, C.O. of C.F.S. BARRINGTON at Baccaro, Shel. Co., N.S., called and asked if our office had any reports of U.F.O. sightings the previous night. He was advised that there had been. During a short telephone conversation he revealed that one of his men had seen a U.F.O. the previous evening and from comparing notes it appeared that the sighting had been very similar to the sighting reported by the SMITH brothers. Col. RUSHTON stated that he wished to see me after I had conducted my investigation concerning the U.F.O.
- Lawrence Charles SMITH and Manus Eugene SMITH of Lower Shag Harbour, Shel. Co., N.S. interviewed separately concerning the sighting. They related to me how they had seen the lights as described in paragraph No. 2., statements attached. Diagram of Lawrence Charles SMITH'S version of the sighting attached.
- Patrol made to C.F.S. BARRINGTON and the sighting was discussed with Col. RUSHTON. He was supplied with the names of the witnesses already interviewed.

Col. RUSHTON stated that the sighting had been made by one of the men under his command, Cpl. Timothy NIELSON.

7. Cpl. Timothy Daniel NIELSON of Baccaro, Shel. Co., N.S. was interviewed concerning the sighting and he stated that he had sighted the lights at approx. 9:40 pm at Smithville, Shel. Co., N.S. NIELSON'S account of the sighting is very similar to that of the SMITH brothers. He stated that he saw four reddish orange lights stretched out in the sky in a perfect straight line. These lights were in a North West direction from him at the time of the sighting. He stated that the most Southerly light would have been in the altitude as the lights were at a 20° slant from the horizontal. He stated that the lights were about 18 inches in diameter and were perfectly round with no light reflecting off them. His girlfriend June SMITH and her mother were with him at the time. Statement of NIELSON attached hereto.

8. Cathelene Mary SMITH and Carole June SMITH were interviewed at their home at Smithville, Shel. Co., N.S. and they related how they had seen the lights in the sky. Their account of the sighting compared with that of NIELSON but they also stated that the lights were about 300 to 400 feet away and that one of the center lights went out and then came back on again. The height of the lights would have been just over the tree line. The duration of the sighting was approx. 30 seconds. Cathelene SMITH stated that the lights disappeared by gradually sinking below the trees, statements attached.

9. Message was forwarded to Halifax Sub/Division in accordance with instructions.

10. With regard to the reliability of the witnesses, I can say that I have known the SMITH brothers for approx. 5 months. Lawrence Charles SMITH is not superstitious and does not believe in common superstitions. I have known Lawrence SMITH as a personal friend inasmuch as we have gone on fishing and duck hunting trips together. Approx. 9:00 pm, 25 DEC 70 I met with the SMITH brothers at Barrington, N.S. They were looking for Manus SMITH'S daughter who had left home after school that day without saying where she was going. This would have been approx. 40 minutes prior to the sighting and both were perfectly normal and neither had been drinking. I feel that the SMITH brothers are reliable in this instance. As for Cpl. NIELSON, I can say that Col. RUSHTON felt that he had no reason to disbelieve him. I do not feel that Cathelene or June SMITH are persons to make up stories. It is just a coincidence that two of the witnesses in each sighting had the surname "SMITH". There is no blood relation.

11. These sightings were made at two points approx. 20 miles apart in a straight line. The sighting at Bear point, Shel. Co., N.S. would have been approx. 20° to the North from due West from the sighting at Smithville, Shel. Co., N.S.

The sky was clear in both of these sightings. As far as can be determined the sightings were at the same time, 9:40 pm, Atlantic Standard time. I am convinced that the witnesses in this case really saw what they described to me and that at this point there is no explanation for such an occurrence either natural or man made. About 9:30 PM to 9:40 PM I was driving home with my brother Gene SMITH. I was driving between 40 and 45 M.P.H. I got about half-way between the two Bear Point roads. Gene said up in back of the lilly pond there was a lot of deer sign. I came over that little rise coming west towards Shag Harbour.

I saw one small light about the size of a pop top. I was going to say what is that to Gene when the five lights lit up. I was within 200 feet of them when they came on. I said, "Gene, there it is". We didn't speak. Second light from the left was 4 or 5 feet over the left one, and between 10 and 15 feet apart. The next one No. 3. was down in line with the first one. The fourth one was on a 45° angle to the right vertically, 10 to 15 feet apart to the right. The next one to the right was up behind a tree 20 to 25 feet. For further information see diagram attached as described to me by Lawrence Charles SMITH.

The second light from the left went out and came back on again at least once. Then the next thing I remember about my car was that she was stopped when they went away. I don't remember if the motor stopped or not. I backed up to look up to see if the lights went over the trees or not. I drove home along the highway and I could not see anything when I came home or hear anything.

These lights were a bright fiery orange in color-with no light reflecting rays off them.

No's. 1, 2, 3, and 4, were perfectly round. They were about 16 inches in diameter. It didn't seem like they stayed longer than 20 to 30 seconds. There could have been a lapse of time or a blank in my memory and the lapse in time could not have been over 10 minutes. When my car stopped I had the feeling that my car was going and I wasn't going with it. Before I got that feeling I saw No. 2. go out and come on again. My tape player went off and when the lights went my player was still muffled.

Last night between 9:30 PM and 9:40 PM I was a passenger with my brother Lawrence SMITH. We were driving towards Shag Harbour from Barrington. As we approached a point about halfway between the two Bear Point roads we saw five or six lights between 30 and 50 feet in the air. There was one that was flashing on and off but it was not going completely out. The car stopped but the motor didn't stop. When the car stopped I could not feel any forward motion on my body. The tape player stopped and started up again after the lights left.

It felt like there was pressure inside the car as well. I'd say the lights stayed for half a minute and then they disappeared without moving. We searched the sky after we drove home but could hear or see nothing. We didn't get out of the car at the place. The lights were between red and orange in color. They were about 25 to 30 inches in diameter. These lights appeared perfectly round. They seemed to be about 150 feet from the car.

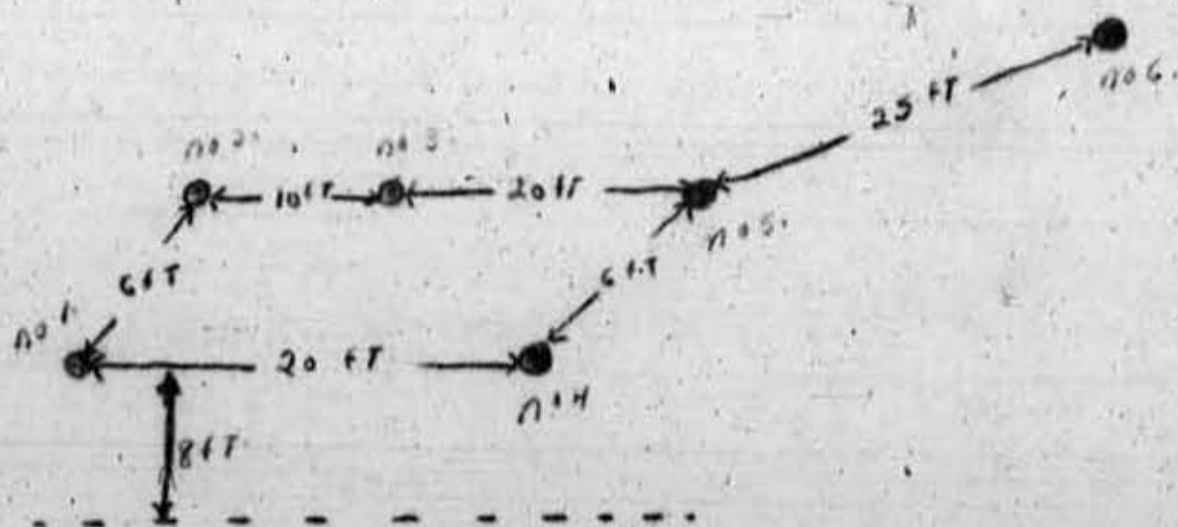

1. At 9:15pm this date Mr. Lance BALKY of Courtenay phoned the office and reported sighting a U.F.O. near 19th Street in Courtenay. A patrol was conducted to this area by Cst. ANDERSON and myself. When we were at this location a light orange object was sighted and observed travelling in an easterly direction approximately thirty seconds in all and then disappeared. Canadian Forces Base Comox Comox was notified of this sighting.

2. Courtenay's message number 370 was dispatched to N.R.C. Meteor Centre (Telex 013434), as per Operational Manual CO-Air.

2 DEC 70

3. On this date it was learned that a boy, named Ian POTTS of Courtenay was responsible for sending up the U.F.O. This was done by obtaining a plastic bag, which is used by Dry Cleaning businesses to wrap dry cleaned cloths. A hoop, made out of light guage wire, is attached to the open end of the bag. This hoop is then dissected with a piece of wire in such a way as to suspend a piece of cotton in the centre of the hoop. The bag is then filled with hot air by using a torch. The ball of cotton, which has been soaked in a solvent, is ignited and the bag begins to elevate. In view of the above no further investigations were conducted into this case.

1. Stanley WOOD, Havelock R.R. #2, Fork Stream Road, Canaan Forks, Queens County, NB reported to this office that for the past two weeks on clear nights he had been observing a strange phenomena in the sky. His observations are shown later. He advised that he could observe the object around 8:00P.M. and, on occasion, it was still visible when he retired after midnight. The object was still visible at approximately 6:00A.M. and clearer.

2. Although the area of the sighting is in our Chipman Detachment area, a patrol was in the Havelock area and Cst. G.R. BAMBURY patrolled to the area. He could observe the object, but not in the detail described by the observer in the early A.M. This could be attributed to its high altitude.

1. At approx. 8.30 PM, this Detachment received a call from Mrs. Mary Angeline GALLANT, St. Charles, P.E.I. of a UFO which had just landed in there yard. At this time Mrs. GALLANT wished a member to attend.

2. Cst. M.B. O'NEIL and myself made a patrol to the residence of GALLANT and the object was pointed out to us. This object landed approx. 50 yards from the residence of GALLANT in an open field. At the time this object landed the sky was clear, and GALLANT advised that it appeared to be like a star and that flashes of light were emitting from same. GALLANT further advised that this object was one of three which she observed from 6.30 PM this same date, the other two landed somewhere in a wooded area some distance from her house. Further information gained to the effect that this object came from the South and was under observation for 5 to 10 minutes and made a noise similiar to that of air escaping from a balloon. I might add that this object extinguished when it came in contact with the snow. The object was retrieved and brought back to this Detachment.

3. The physical appearance of this object is as follows, it has the appearance of a large plastic bag and measures approx. 4' in lenght and 2' in width. A rim on the mouth of this object is made from cardboard and attached to the rim is a piece of wire with a coil on the end with some type of cloth attached to the coil. This object appeared to be scorched and a certain amount of soot was inside this bag type object.

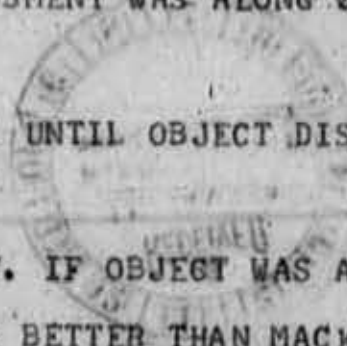

Swift Current, Sask.

On Saturday morning, 9 JAN 71, I left home at about twenty-five to eight and travelled to the Success Compressor Station - Saskatchewan Power. Just past Cantuar I observed an object ahead of me to the left. It was quite a ways ahead of me. It was five hundred to a thousand feet high. It was travelling towards the town of Success. It had white light, dull like you get through a light shade. It was long and narrow. My impression was that it was about eighteen inches wide and quite long. It appeared to be flat surfaced. It went all the way to Success in this form and I turned on the turn off to the Compressor Station. I could see the object go over Success and then it turned and headed towards Caswell's farm, about two miles down the road I was travelling on. It was now in a different form - it appeared to be a round disc laying horizontally with a second smaller disc under it. The discs were of a yellow light. This was easy to see, however, it was not a blinging light.

As I approached Caswell's farm, the object met me there. It changed to a deep wall of mixed colours, the shape was irregular, with the lights moving vertically, the sight similiar to that in northern lights. It was over Caswell's yard and faded out over the trees. When I got past Caswell's yard, I saw it again in the shape it came across the field from Success. It was about a quarter of a mile ahead of me on the right, about one hundred feet off the ground, or lower, and it illuminated the ground a bit. I went to the turn off and it veered to the right, going around the edge of the Compressor Station Sight. Near the north east corner of the Station Sight it changed to a red ball, similiar to a red sunset, with a line across the bottom. The colour appeared to move.

I drove into the yard. I shut the engine off and left the lights on. This red object stopped in front of the car between the tanks and trees. I went into the building and told Lawrence CURRIE who was working. Lawrence came out and looked at it. We called Bill BLYDO, the maintenance man, and I later told him to go to the window and look. To me the object appeared to stay between the tanks and trees. It stayed there about fifteen minutes. It disappeared into the distance - it just faded out. It seemed to retain the same ball shape and colour. The size was bigger than the sun.

When the object was ahead of me on # 32 highway I switched my lights off and on. The object here must have been travelling at one hundred miles per hour or more.

The sky was overcast with the air being clear and peaceful.

The object never left a trail behind. I did not hear any sounds as the compressor sight has an abundance of noise.

On Saturday afternoon I checked the areas by the tanks and found nothing out of the ordinary.

At about 8:10 A.M. on January 9th, 1971, Fergie SCHMIDT called on the intercom and told my husband to look out the living room window. My husband went and looked and went back to the phone. He looked again and it appeared as though the tanks were on fire. There was a red mass or ball hovering over the tanks. He was mumbling and I got up. When I looked I saw a red ball at about the horizon, to the north of our home. It just appeared to set - somewhat similiar to a sunset, however, there was no extra glow from it.

SCHMIDT came to the house, somewhat shook up, and he related that while he was coming to the station he observed this object from Cantuar proceeding a distance ahead of him and it continued towards Success, when he turned off the highway. The object appeared to go to Success, turn in an arc, and met him on the corner two miles west of the highway. It then went along to the side and ahead of him, turning right and then went to the north around the buildings and went south to the tanks.

The sky was cloudy and frosty, or haze.

The brightness appeared to be a dark red of comparable intensity as that of the setting sun. The colour was a dark red. It did not have any trail or outer glow. The form appeared larger than the moon.

At about 8:00 A.M. on Saturday, January 9th., 1971, Fergie SCHMIDT came to relieve me at the Success Compressor Station. He drove up to the door and rushed in and called me out and told me to hurry. I ran out in my shirt sleeves. He pointed to an object to the northwest of the yard. I seen a thing that appeared like a big full moon. He started to tell me about how it followed him and came around there. He was really excited and shaking. He kept saying, "What is it". He and I watched it for about five minutes before he ran in to call Bill BLYDO, the maintenance man. I watched it steadily. It was a dull red. It would change colour slightly to a yellowish. The sphere was constant. It was hazy and you couldn't get a distinct outside line on it. When he was calling Bill, I backed the car up and shone the lights towards it. Then Fergie came out. Him and I sat in and watched it. I viewed it for a good ten minutes and it stayed in this position. Then in three to five minutes it appeared to go away and fade out. As it was going straight away you could see movement of the sphere bobbing around a bit. Then we decided to move the car to see if we could attract it. As I drove the road was blocked so I had to back up. By then it had completely disappeared. I told Fergie I would go to Swift Current and see if it would be attracted to the vehicle. I watched all the way back in and I didn't see any signs of it.

1. Mr. John FRYBERGER of Wardlow, Alberta contacted this office to advise that he and his wife sighted what they thought to be an unidentified flying object. The sighting occurred at approx. 5:25 A.M. 17 FEB 71. Mrs. FRYBERGER was up feeding her daughter when the lights started to flicker off and on. She then looked out the window and saw the object. It is described as a large round object, dull orange in colour with a line around same approx. $\frac{1}{2}$ way down from the top. The object appeared to be approx. 400 feet from the ground. She got her husband out of bed and they both observed same for approx. 15 minutes and then went to bed. When they got up at approx. 6:30 A.M., the object was gone.

2. The sky was clear at the time and the sun was rising. They were looking east towards the sun and the object appeared to be to the right and above the sun. The sun had not appeared over the horizon. There was no movement to the object and it could be seen clearer with the naked eye than with a pair of binoculars. The location of the sighting would be approx. 6 miles south of Wardlow, Alta. along the Red Deer river.

3. Brooks Telex Number 34 was dispatched in this regard. This office has had dealings with FRYBERGER in the past and he is of reputable character. It might be noted that the lights at FRYBERGER's residence have been blinking off and on prior to and since this incident and same cannot be definitely related to the sighting. In the opinion of the writer and Sgt. PINNOCK who assisted in this investigation, it is felt that the U.F.O. was only a sun dog or something of similar nature. No one else could be located that saw the sighting.

1. At approximately 9:38 P.M., 23 FEB 71, Louis KOVACS (BD: 12 AUG 28) of 232 Deerwood Drive, Thompson, Manitoba, called this office advising that he had been watching this object in the sky since 8:30 P.M. KOVACS stated that he saw a plate shaped object about the size of a full moon. This object was flashing from red to green to yellow to blue. The altitude is unknown, but seemed to be moving in a small circle, in a northerly direction and away from the earth. Subject stated this object was getting smaller from the time he first sighted it. Also, a red flash from the north side of the object was sighted.

2. This object was first sighted by KOVAC's wife, Mrs. Gisella KOVACS, who then told her husband.

3. Patrol was made to 232 Deerwood Drive, and statements were obtained from both subjects. Mr. KOVACS then pointed the object out in the sky and stated that this is the object that they saw, and that now it was so far away that it looked like a star.

1. At approximately 11.00 A. M. Albert John CRIER, father of Milton CRIER, came to this office and advised that his two sons and a daughter had noticed an unusual object in the sky above their house around 10.00 P.M. 2 Mar 71. An immediate patrol was made by myself and Alice CRIER (16 yrs.), Herman CRIER (14 yrs.) as well as Milton CRIER were interviewed at length. Milton stated that at approximately 10.15 P.M. (MST) 2 Mar 71 he was playing outside when he heard a sound similar to the purr of a kitten, only louder. He stated he looked up at this time and saw a round object with three red and orange lights. This object was approximately 500 yards south of him and due to the brilliancy of the lights and the large size of the object, Milton ran into the house crying "U.F.O., U.F.O." Alice and Herman both ran out of the house and looked at the object verifying Milton's description as to it being saucer shaped, color unknown, approximately the size of two cars, flying approximately 5' to 10' above the treetops. It apparently remained stationary for approximately two minutes then left in a westerly direction at approximately 15 mph. All three subjects stated they knew and had seen a helicopter on previous occasions and maintained that this object was definitely a U.F.O. and not a helicopter. Parents of all three subjects were asleep at this time, however, Alice woke her mother up and Mrs. CRIER stated that she had seen some blue and orange lights reflecting within the bedroom but she did not hear any strange sound. Mrs. CRIER did not get up from her bed.

2. It might be noted that this area in question being approximately fifteen miles west and one mile north of St. Paul on the Saddle Lake Indian Reserve, is in a flight path of Canadian Forces Base, Cold Lake and a number of oil rigs surround the area. After lengthy questioning all three subjects remained sincere and it appeared that their sighting is not a figment of their imagination, although I am in doubt as to what they actually saw.

Meteorite May Really Have Been Flare

What was the red and orange ball that Aylmer residents saw shoot across the sky and fall to earth Thursday night?

The way it looks now we may never know.

Following reports from residents, Lucerne-Aylmer police took to their snowmobiles and combed Nesbitt's Field near the Lower Aylmer Road.

They found some tree trunks with the bark scraped off and an old, used hot water tank.

Friday, a National Research Council team scoured the area to investigate the possibility that the ball might have been a meteorite. Nothing was found.

However, after talking to residents they feel the light may have been the flare from a signal pistol.

But then again it may have been . . . something from outer space?

'Falling star' all shot down

The "meteorite" that plummeted into a Lucerne field at the height of Thursday's snowstorm was probably a flare, a scientist said Friday.

But so far no flare and no explanation of what it was doing there has turned up.

Ten to 15 persons witnessed the object, described as "a big red ball" or "an orange streak," fall into an open field south of the Glenwood Shopping Centre on Aylmer Road.

A check with Uplands control tower showed no aircraft was in the air at the time, thus scrubbing a rumor that the falling object was an airplane.

Snowmobile search

About 30 snowmobiles combed the field but only turned up a damaged tree.

"There was one tree with a lot of damaged bark," said Dr. Ian Halliday of the National Research Council, "but the owner of the land told us a bulldozer had been working in the area several months ago."

Along with Arthur Griffin, also of the Upper Atmosphere Research section, he spent four hours Friday afternoon talking to witnesses and searching the area.

"The damage wasn't done by a falling object.

"It seems it was a local thing, perhaps a flare fired

off and carried by the wind."

Eye-witnesses in a nearby house told Dr. Halliday the orange streak landed behind trees and gave off sparks for about 10 seconds.

Meteorites, however, stop burning about 10 miles up as the earth's atmosphere slows their descent.

Also, he said, there were no reports of witnesses hearing sonic booms which accompany the fall of a meteorite.

And finally, there have yet been no reports of persons in distant parts of the Ottawa region seeing the falling object.

"Fireball" Investigation - Aylmer-Lucerne, P.Q.

The Aylmer-Lucerne Police received reports of a bright fireball in the area during the early evening of Thursday, March 4, 1971. The impact area was given as Nesbitt's field, just north of the lower Aylmer Road and east of the town. Two constables plus some private citizens spent much of the night searching the area on snowmobile. On Friday morning we received a call from a reporter for the Ottawa Journal who had been out on the search during the night. He mentioned a damaged tree found by the police which he had also seen and had an unconfirmed report that the police had found a stone, variously reported as 3 and 1 feet in size.

Little information was available by telephone from the Aylmer-Lucerne police as the constables' reports were not immediately located. I. Halliday and A. A. Griffin picked up snowshoes and arrived in Lucerne by car about 12:30 p.m. During discussions at the police station one of the constables who had been on the search was reached by telephone and he came in to show us the site. Using a police snowmobile we went through about 200 yards of bush from the road where a large (dead) elm tree had much of the bark missing from its lower six feet on at least three sides of the tree. There was no hint of a fresh disturbance near the tree although heavy drifting snow from high winds had covered over the snowmobile tracks from the previous night in many places so a slight disturbance could have been concealed by the snow. There were abrasion marks on the tree on various sides making an impact from one direction appear out of the question.

On our way out of the field we stopped and found the owner, Mr. Nesbitt, who confirmed that a bulldozer had been working in that area not long before. The tree damage is readily explained by a bulldozer blade. Mr. Nesbitt indicated two neighbours south of him, across the train tracks, who had seen the fireball. We found one of these families at home and several members of the family had seen the light. It had moved slowly, at rather low elevation to be visible from within their living room, from west to east. They were quite definite that the object landed near the far (northern) edge of the woods or just beyond and that the light continued for at least 10 seconds after the object was on the snow. They thought it was a flare and a teen-age son had gone out looking for it at the time, without success. The direction of motion of the light was in the direction of the very strong wind at the time, also the apparent point of origin would be near the two school yards to the north-west of Mr. Nesbitt's home. The end-point was definitely beyond (east) the location of the damaged tree. Due to the heavy drifting the chance of locating a burned-out flare or similar object by Friday afternoon seemed remote from the accuracy of the known location.

We returned to the police station where we were given a copy of the police report (see file). A witness to the east of the impact area described the event in a manner consistent with a landing in Nesbitt's field, hence the local nature of the event seems established and no further search was made.

- At 9:00 PM this date COFFEY advised this office that he believed he just saw an aircraft explode in the air. COFFEY stated that he was watching a red and blue light in the sky and then suddenly an orange flame could be seen at the rear of the object and then a large burst of white sparks resembling an explosion. COFFEY saw the burst of white sparks at a point believed to be approx. 10 miles N.E. of Mazenod, Sask.
- Cst. D. Ryan and Cst. G. Madsen of Assiniboia, Sask. were on duty in the Congress Dist., Sask. at this time, and they proceeded to COFFEY'S residence for further details. Assiniboia members made further enquiries and searched the general area, which met with negative results. Douglas KNOX of Mazenod, Sask., owner of a light aircraft, was contacted and he agreed to fly over the area of the proposed incident. KNOX flew over the area north and east of Mazenod, which also met with negative results.
- The Canadian Forces Base in Moose Jaw, Sask. as well as the Swift Current, Sask. and Regina, Sask. airports were contacted, and it was learned that there were no planes reported missing and no known aircraft flying in this area. The Regina airport in turn contacted D.O.T. officials in Winnipeg, Man. and advised them of the foregoing. Dept. of Transport officials from Winnipeg in turn contacted Assiniboia Det. advising that at present there were no known missing or overdue aircraft.

- This A.M. COFFEY was re-interviewed and the following signed statement was obtained:

STATEMENT OF BRIAN JAMES COFFEY (B.16-Jan-53) OF MAZENOD, SASK.

BEGINS: On the 15-Mar-71 I was at home alone on my father's farm located 1½ miles east of Mazenod, Sask. I was watching T.V.

At approx. 8:45 P.M. I looked out our living room window, which faces east. I saw a flashing red light and a steady blue light in the sky. These lights appeared to be at an altitude of approx. ½ mile, and approx. 1½ miles east of our farm. I assumed these lights were on an aircraft as they were proceeding in a northerly direction at a reasonably fast rate of speed.

I hurried and got our binoculars and then went outside and stood on our back step. I looked at this object through the binoculars. The red and blue lights were the only things that were visible, and I was unable to make out the shape of the

SHAPE OF THE....object. The red light appeared to be on the rear of the object and the blue light on the front. Suddenly I saw an orange flame at the rear of this object which was similar to a rocket blast, and then I saw a large burst of white sparks. Then there was nothing. I thought the object exploded. Approx. 2 or 3 minutes elapsed from the time I first saw the lights until they disappeared. It appeared that the object was approx. 10 miles north and slightly east of our farm when it exploded.

I then contacted Danny KRAUSS, a friend of mine, and told him what I saw. Danny KRAUSS suggested that we advise the police, so we did. ENDS.

5. COFFEY appeared very definite on the facts, and there was nothing to suggest anything to the contrary. This incident was also discussed with COFFEY'S parents, and they are convinced their son saw the object in the air.

6. This same A.M. members of this Detachment and members of Gravelbourg Detachment canvassed the area north and east of Hazenod to ascertain if anyone else saw or heard the object. No further information came to light. Members strongly considered the possibility of a downed aircraft.

7. A Telex message MBI was dispatched to the NRC Meteor Centre, Att: Canforcehed. The Commissioner, "F" Div., and Swift Current Sub/Div. were also advised

8. To date no further information in this regard has come to light. It is believed very possible that this incident could be attributed to a U.S. aircraft or some other unreported flight. It appears very doubtful that an aircraft exploded in the air. Also there is nothing to suggest that this object falls in the category of something from outer space. The object does, however, remain to be unidentified. Should additional information come to light the appropriate action will be taken.

25 MAR 71

1. On this date at approximately 10:15PM this office received a call from Arnold DIXON of Rollo Bay. Mr. DIXON said that he had seen a red light in the sky and was not quite sure what it was and thought that he should report this to the police.

2. I went to DIXON's home in Rollo Bay where I learned that while on his way home that evening around 9:50PM he was travelling east on Highway #2 in the Fortune area when he saw a red light in the sky. He kept on driving and when he went into a dip in the road he lost the sight for a short time, however when he regained his previous elevation he once again saw the light. He parked on the road for awhile and watched the light. At that time it appeared to have landed on the ground and was not moving. He then called this Detachment and reported what he had seen. It should be noted that at the time of the sighting a snow storm was building strength. I went to the spot where DIXON had parked his car however, we could not see the object as visibility was poor. We then made a thorough search of the fields in which DIXON believed the object to have been however our search was negative. I then returned to the detachment where a radiogram in accordance with C.S.O.'s and Operational Manual, CO-air paragraph 6 and 7, was complied with and was sent to Canadian Forces Headquarters the Commissioner and the N.R.C. Meteor Centre.

26 MAR 71

3. On this date I returned to the area of the sighting at approximately 3:00PM however, could not locate the object described by DIXON. DIXON is an outstanding citizen of the community and does not drink. Persons in the area have a very high regard for him as he is a man of his word as they call him. I then again returned to the area at approximately 8:00PM where I could see the red light described to me by DIXON. At this time I was able to make a positive identification that the red light believed to be a U.F.O. by DIXON is the red light belonging to a new radio tower which has been installed at Bear River, P.E.I. This tower has only received electrical power on 25 MAR 71 and therefore this would be the first night that the red light was showing. In view of this information this file is being shown as hereunder.

Dear Mr. Ewen:

Thank you for submitting your photographic observation to us. Your identification of the stars and aircraft trails are correct. Concerning the bright streak you refer to as possibly a fireball I have the following comments. Since no one was watching the sky at the time one cannot be 100 per cent certain but I think there is a very small possibility that this photographic image was produced by a fireball. My reasons for this are as follows:

1. The luminosity is too regular and ends too suddenly. Out of thousands of meteor photographs examined I have never seen one that had these characteristics.
2. There is a very slight bend in the track which is unlike meteor photographs.
3. The track is split in two yet both parts retain roughly the same relative intensities and end at the same point. This is statistically almost impossible for a meteor trail.
4. A meteor bright enough to have made so prominent a track would very likely to have been noticed by others. We have no report of such a bright meteor on this date.

The small flaring which you identify as a possible burst just off the film is quite common, and results from the reflection of a bright image off the edge of the frame that holds the film in the camera.

Since no one was observing while your camera was exposed it is difficult to arrive at a definite conclusion concerning the source of this image. The best guess (and it is only a guess) that we can make here is that some plane turned on its landing lights while in the field of the camera. Thank you for calling this matter to our attention. We have put your observation on record in case additional information turns up in the future.

Dear Sirs -

This is a meteor report of a kind, except that I, nor anyone I know saw it, my camera did.

I recently loaded my camera with Ilford FP4 film at 125 ASA and set it in my backyard pointing in the general direction of Orion and Canis Major, and opened it at 9:35.

After that, I left to play with some friends up a street a few houses.

I returned about 15 minutes later, hoping star streaks would appear on the film.

I got the star streaks, but I luckily got an unexpected meteor streak of high brilliance.

I have an hypothesis of the "lifetime" of this meteor:

During its flight, it came into an explosion (slightly visible, I think, on the uppermost part of the photograph included) and split into two parts of possibly different colours, although the precise colour is unknown.

Also included is a sketch labelling the star streaks on the film and the unusual streaks also upon the film.

On the back of this sheet of paper is the technical data needed for a report.

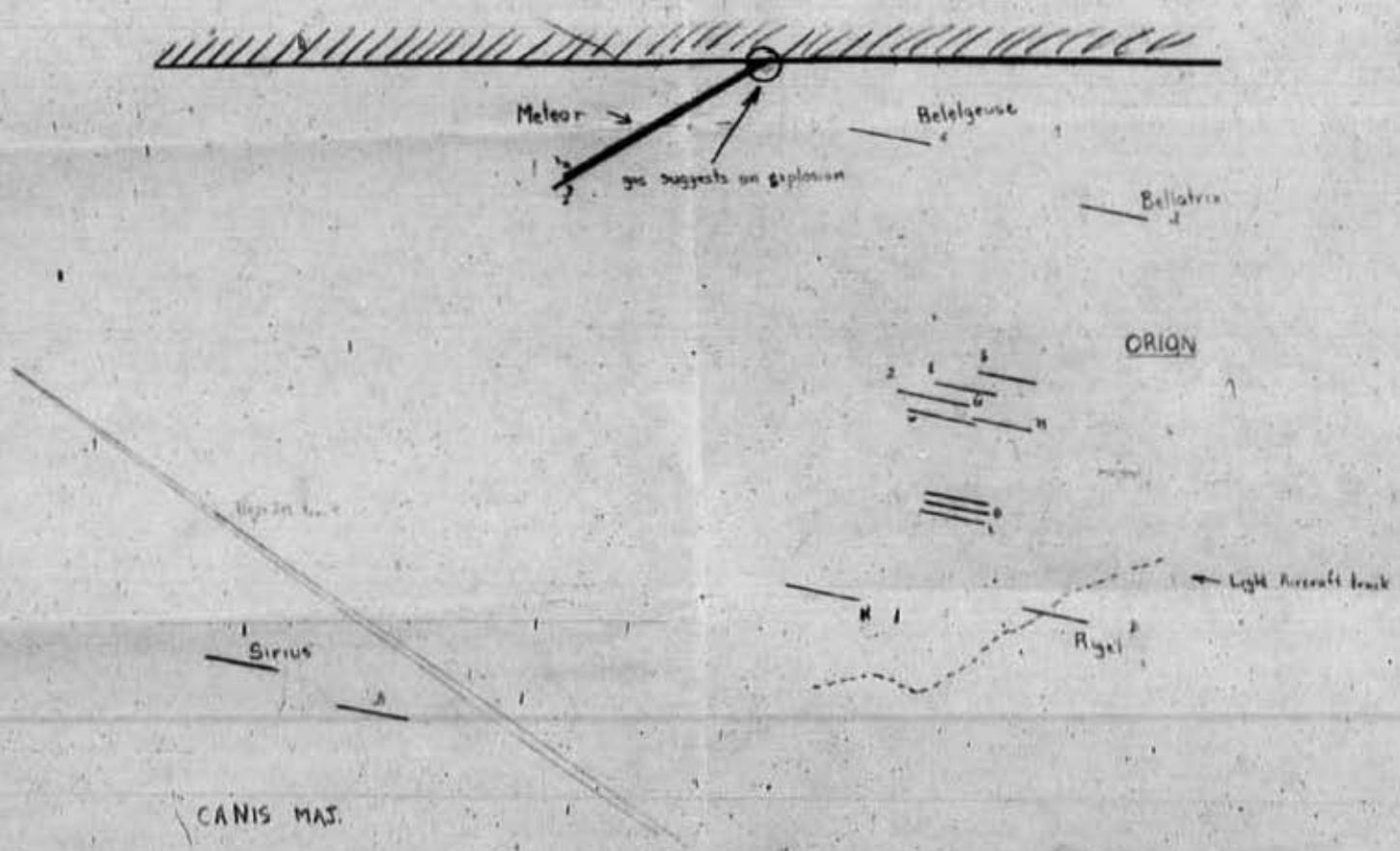

Approximately 3 miles East of Grand Falls Ron noticed something and brought my attention to it. I noticed a bright, orange coloured object, oval in shape off to my right. - Since that time and on other nights, there have been nather reported sightings. This matter is being terminated as indicated below.

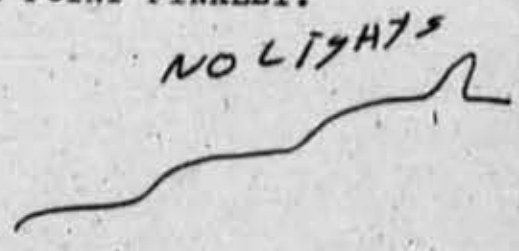
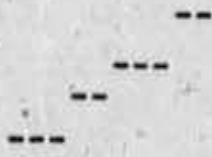

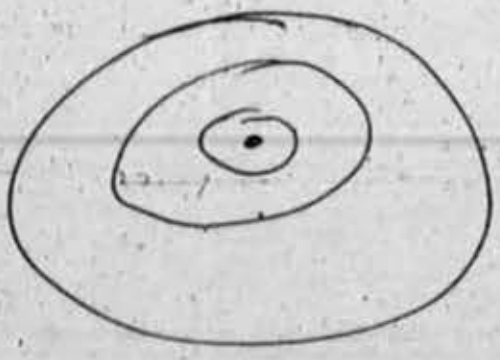

1. Inquiries at C.F.B. Penhold reveal that Alberta Hail Studies, during the past summer, employed some forty persons. Of these, approximately twenty are summer assistants and part time help. One Maryl SORTLAND (B.12 Jul 50) of 8507-95 Ave. Edmonton, and Garry HELANDER (B.26 Aug 50) Box 1544 Ponoka, Alberta, were involved. They, with several other part time assistants, dispatched the Unidentified Flying Objects as reported in this area on August 15th and 18th. Neither would give written statements, however volunteered that on the night of August 15th they released three pi-ball weather balloons tied together with a dangling yellow railway flare. This was sent up from a point approximately one mile east of #2 Highway on the Dalburne Road at 11.00 P.M. On the 18 Aug these persons released three Radio-Sonde weather balloons with red flares attached. These particular balloons are approximately 6" in diameter and were released, one from two miles west of Red Deer, one south of Red Deer and the other east of Red Deer, between the hours of 11.30 PM and 1.00 AM. Both SORTLAND and HELANDER were with INKSTER, and some six or seven other persons whom they would not name, at the time these balloons were released. It is believed that SORTLAND was the leader of the group.

Investigations to date revealed that a Mrs. Brenda INKSTER worked for the City Office, Red Deer, Alta. temporarily during the summer and upon discussing same with friends over coffee, related that they were just helium balloons with flares attached and that her husband often sent up same as a practical joke. Her husband, Robert INKSTER, was employed with the Hail Studies program at CFB Penhold for the summer and the impression was formed from the discussion that he and his local working cohorts may be responsible for the U.F.O.'s. Mr. and Mrs. INKSTER have both terminated their employment and are enroute to Montreal, Quebec to continue their studies of Meteorology at University that point, forwarding address unknown. It was also learned that Mr. INKSTER resorted to the same jokes last year while employed for the summer at Victoria, B.C.

6. In view of the foregoing, may investigations be conducted by our Red Deer S/D S.I.S. at CFB Penhold to determine the validity of the information at hand and any further investigative leads that may come to light.

1. With reference to the above may you please be advised that at 8:30 P.M. on Monday the 16 th day of August, 1971 a phone call was received at this Detachment from one Edward FLANAGAN of 144 Dover St., Campbellton, N.B. advising that during the early morning hours he had seen a mysterious object that he could not identify and he requested that we make an attempt to identify it for him.

2. Immediate investigation revealed that at approximately 4:30 A.M. of this date FLANAGAN had occasion to get out of bed and he noticed an amber light approximately 500 yards above Sugarloaf Mountain, which is in the City of Campbellton. Since this light did not resemble the stars FLANAGAN watched it for a few minutes. During this time the object moved in an easterly direction and in so doing came closer to FLANAGAN. At this time FLANAGAN got his wife out of bed and both of them observed the object as it appeared to hover near the same spot. During this time FLANAGAN counted five (5) amber lights that appeared to be pulsating. After a period of approximately 15 minutes the object started moving toward the South and as it neared the horizon it dissappeared as a streak of light, as FLANAGAN described it, "as fast as the eye could follow." FLANAGAN could not determine any shape to this object nor could he tell how far away it was.

3. On Thursday the 19 th day of August, 1971 at approximately 2:00 A.M. Cst. G. BARAGAR and Cst. D. MARTEL of this Detachment were on patrol in the area of Sugarloaf Mountain when they also noticed a mysterious light on the East side of the Mountain. A short time later the same light was observed on the West side of the Mountain and at this time these members drove as near to the Mountain as they could and in so doing noticed that this object was moving in the same direction as they were. In view of this they kept driving in the same direction for approximately 7 miles with the object following, or at least travelling in the same direction. At times this object was on the right hand side of the car and on other occasions it was on the left hand side. These members stopped on several occasions and when they did so the object stopped as well. On one occasion they stopped and turned all of the lights on the P.C. out. This object also stopped and it's lights became very dim. The flashing red dome light of the Police car was put on and at this time two objects that resembled rabbit ears (T.V. Antenna) appeared on each side of the object. These rabbit ears appeared to take on a dull red colour. At approximately 7 miles from the City the P.C. was turned and brought back the same highway it had left on. The object followed again stopping when they did until they reached the Sugarloaf Mountain again at which time it stopped. Shortly thereafter it dissappeared behind the Mountain and they were unable to see it again.

.....TO SEE IT AGAIN. At no time could they determine the shape of this object nor could they tell how far away it was. They could tell that at times it was much brighter than others and also at times it was much larger than others. They described it as being as large as a softball at times and other times it resembled the stars. The time of their observation was approximately 3 hours.

4. On each of the two occasions mentioned previously a check was made with the Charlo Airport and C.F.B. Chatham both were met with negative results. I might also point out that no sound was heard on either of these two occasions, from this object. On each of these two occasions Telex messages were forwarded to NRC Meteor Center with info to CANFORCED, Comm. Ottawa, "J" Division, and Moncton Sub/Division.

5. Since these two sightings several reports of sightings have been made from Matapedia, Rimouski, New Carlisle and New Richmond, P.Q.

6. On the 1st day of September, 1971 I had occasion to be speaking with one Omar BUJOLD, 146 Dover St., Campbellton, N.B. and at this time he mentioned to me that he had also seen this object, however, because of the fact that he had mentioned it to his wife and she laughed at him, he had not told anybody else about it. He described his sightings as being nearly every night for about three weeks. On the first occasion he saw it, the day Appollo 15 was launched, it was quite a distance from him and he assumed that this bright light was Appollo 15. He observed the object for approximately 10 minutes and it gave the appearance of being very bright and sparkling. On the next occasion that he recalls the object was much closer and at this time he could determine that this object was flat on the top and rounded on the bottom, he also advises that he was able to see lights from the interior of this object and that it was giving off a noise similar to that of a siren. He advises that he walked from his work to his home, a distance of approximately 1 mile and this object followed him. Again the object was near the Sugarloaf Mountain. Once he reached his home he went inside and never bothered to look out again. He has seen this object on several occasions since and the last being on the 30th of August, 1971. He finishes work at 12:00 MN each night from Monday through Friday and he has been advised to call the writer immediately should he see this object again.

7. In view of the above this file will remain open until such time as these mysterious objects are identified or further investigation appears fruitless. Two copies forwarded direct to H.Q. Ottawa.

- At 9:10 PM this date, Mr. Ed James LANGLANDS contacted this office advising that he presently has in view an unidentified object in the sky which seems to be moving. Myself and Cst. L. LANZA made a patrol to the residence which is located approximately two miles east and one mile north of city centre Creston, B.C. The object at this time was found to have moved from the original sighting in an upwards direction and was not quite as distinct. The object was located in the sky in a north north-east direction. In relation to the stars, it was found to be in almost a straight line across from the top stars of the "Big Dipper."
- The object was examined by myself through the detachment binoculars which are 7 x 50 power. At the time of the observation, the object appeared to be ovalar in shape and emitted three distinct lights in a flashing pattern. The most intense light was red which seemed to flash at different points on the object. The bottom portion of the object emitted a green flashing light while the top portion emitted a weaker amber flashing light. The object appeared to be moving in an easterly direction and upwards in relation to the stars. Eventually the object moved further away and became fixed in a position too far away to examine the object any further.
- A patrol was made back to the detachment where LANGLANDS contacted this office again advising that the object had moved closer and could be seen readily. A patrol was made to the residence by myself and the object viewed again. This time the object had moved westward and found to be much closer than the previous viewing. The object was once again viewed through the detachment binoculars and found to have the same shape as previously noted. At times, the flashing would be more vivid than other times. The time was approximately 10:00 PM. The object was viewed further by myself and LANGLANDS and at one point a bright white light emitted from the object southwards in a beam similar to the beam of light from car headlights. This beam of light eventually disappeared and couldn't be seen again. It also appeared that the object was revolving as a unit thus giving the flashing light effect. The sky on these sightings was found to be very clear and heavily clustered with stars. After approximately 20 minutes the object appeared to move upwards rapidly and eventually came to a fixed position where it couldn't be seen readily with binoculars.
- At approximately 11:00 PM, Mr. William IRVINE, Creston, B.C. was contacted and asked to view the object through his son's 60 power telescope. IRVINE called back after the object had moved away and advised that it had moved too far for the 60 power telescope to distinguish the features. The colours could be readily seen on the object. A patrol was made to IRVINE's residence by myself and the object viewed. At this time, the object was blurred due to the distance, however, the red, green and amber lights could be distinguished

4. IRVINE's son, William IRVINE Jr., was interviewed and he felt that this could possibly be a star, however, he couldn't explain the movement of the object which is incoherent with the movement of the stars.
5. Cranbrook Detachment was contacted and they in turn notified the Department of Transport who advised that no airplanes were reported in the sky at this time.
6. Kimberley Detachment advised this detachment that they could see the object, however, it was very faint and was never seen as clearly as at our point.
7. Upon interviewing LANGLANDS, he advised that he had seen this same object at approximately 10:00 PM; 24-8-71 and at this time it was the closest and clearest he has ever seen it.

26-8-71

8. The object was viewed until 2:30 AM this date, however, it never moved course again and remained fixed at the previously described distant location.
9. Creston telex # 322 was dispatched to NRC Meteor Centre in accordance with Operational Manual CO-Air, paragraph # 6.
10. At approximately 10:00 PM this date, LANGLANDS contacted this office again advising that the object could be seen again. A patrol was made and the object was closer, however, still too far away to make out features. IRVINE was contacted again and he brought his telescope to the area of the sighting with the same results obtained as previously noted. The object once again appeared to be fixed. William IRVINE Jr. advised me at this time that he had seen this object on past occasions and he strongly feels that it is a star and that the colour is caused by atmospheric conditions.
11. Statement was obtained from LANGLANDS and attached hereto.
12. No further action is being taken in this regard at this detachment. The suggestion of this object being a star is possible, however, the colours and movement of the object raises some doubt and this is the reason the report is being reported. This file will be re-opened if further pertinent information is received.

This is the statement of Ed James LANGLANDS (B: 15 DEC 37), Erickson, B.C. taken at his residence at 10:10 PM; 26-8-71.

On the 24th of August, 1971, I saw an object in the sky which I thought was an airplane as there were distinct green & red flashing lights. I got out of my car at my residence and shut off the engine. I couldn't hear an airplane and the object appeared to be fixed. This was at approximately 10:00 PM. I looked at it through my binoculars (8 x 40). The object was very close. It appeared to be oval shaped and revolving. The green seemed to be above the red. There also appeared to be an amber colour which would flash periodically. The red was the strongest colour and was also flashing. It was NNE at the time and moved slowly westward. The object also appeared to be revolving. It eventually stayed in a fixed spot. I quit looking about 11:00 PM.

On 25th August 1971, I spotted the object was much closer than the last time I saw it last night. The colours were the same in hue and brightness, however, the red flashing light seemed to flash at different spots on the object. I called the RCMP at this time and they attended. The object moved eastward, then down and up to the west. The RCMP left before it came to the west. When it appeared in the westward position it was clearer again and I called the RCMP. They arrived and viewed it with me again. Same observations were made at this time except a white beam of light like headlights was seen emitting from it southward. The object then rapidly moved away and stayed fixed in the sky. At 11:00 PM, I stopped viewing the object.

- Further to Telex number WD1146 dated 30 SEPT 71 sent to NRC METEOR CENTRE and CANFORCED, Info to COMMR Ottawa, as per CO-Air Para. 6, Operational Manual, this report is being sent to enlarge upon the details of the sighting and to advise as to what the statements of the person reporting and his friends are in this regard.
- Arthur HONKE called this office and advised that on the 19 SEPT 71 at approx. 3:30 - 4:00 A.M., he and his friends had seen a flying object unlike anything they had ever seen before. Apparently the object flew across the highway in front of their vehicle and then stayed stationary in the air just to the East of the highway (#6) and sat there and spun making a humming sound. It was also stated that they continued North on #6 highway and that the object seemed to be following them, and did so until they reached the town of St. Laurent, Manitoba, about another 30 miles up the highway.
- Arthur HONKE (BD: 11-6-50) and Alec HONKE (BD: 6-6-48), both of 283 Lulu Ave., Winnipeg, and their companion Gordon CAMPBELL (BD: 16-9-46) of 507 Boyd Ave., Winnipeg, all saw it and came into the office to give statements relating to the sighting of this object. Statements are attached hereto as Appendix "A", "B" and "C" respectively.
- Report of the sighting was sent to the local Police forces in the area where the object was said to pass through and there had been no confirmation of this report by them or made to them.
- Attached hereto as Appendix "A1", "B1" and "C1" are photostat copies of the diagrams drawn by each one of the observers, as they think the object looks.

STATEMENT OF Arthur HONKE (BD: 11 JUN 50) 283 Lulu Ave., Winnipeg, Manitoba. Phone: 786-1833 Unemployed at present. Taken: 4:10 P.M. 19 SEPT 71 Winnipeg Detachment office.

We were going North on #6 highway towards Ashern about 3:30 - 4:00 A.M. 19 SEPT 71 and my brother, Alec, said look. He said he saw a flash across the highway in front of the car. Alec was driving at the time. Then we looked up and saw this big spotlight, a big white light on the right side of the highway. At this time it was about a mile or a mile and a half in front of us. We were about 10 miles from the Perimeter. It was ahead of us and just off the highway and was moving real slow so we speeded up and got along beside it and we stopped the car and turned it off. We rolled down the windows to see if we could hear anything. At this time the object was just sitting still and was spinning. It was only about 50 - 75 yards away. There was sort of a humming noise, low pitched of medium volume. It was quiet enough that if you were inside a house that you wouldn't hear it. You'd have to be outside.

The object was shaped like two saucers, one on top of the other and there was a red light on the left side in the middle, and a green light right in the very centre of it and a white light to the right of it still in the middle. The lights appeared to be stationary and just blinked on and off while the rest of it was spinning. The red and green lights were both flashing together while the white one stayed on, I think. It spun there like that for about 30 seconds. Once it tilted, the back side of it (the other side from us) seemed to drop down and then it righted itself again.

Then it took off real slow, about 15 m.p.h. I guess, towards the South. It seemed to be following the highway. Gordon said let's turn around and follow it and see what it is. Alec and I didn't want to and we continued North to go into Woodlands to see if we could find an R.C.M.P. It was about three miles away, we couldn't see the shape any more but we could still see the lights flashing. We still kept on going North and then it seemed to catch up to us rather than going farther away. Then we told Alec that it was catching up and Alec turned to see it but I don't think he would because he was driving. It seemed to be catching up to us and it got about a mile away and then we couldn't see it anymore because we went past some trees. Then we hit Woodlands and we saw that it was just a store so there wouldn't be any R.C.M.P. there and we kept on driving. From that time we first saw it until we lost it behind the trees approx. 10 minutes had passed and all this time it was within eye sight.

After we took the turn in the highway we saw it again behind us and we saw it all the way up to St. Laurent. Then a gravel truck was coming up behind us and we lost sight of it. Gordon says he saw it cross the highway, but we never saw it after that. I guess about a half hour or 45 minutes had passed since we lost it behind the trees, down at Woodlands, for about 10 or 15 minutes.

Then we never saw it after that.

COLOUR - It must have been a dark colour because it was a clear night and we could see the stars and the Northern lights, because we couldn't see a colour, really, just the outline of it and the lights blinking on and off continually. I think the white light stayed on continually.

SHAPE - It was like two saucers being upside down on top of each other but more oval. The bottom half of it was deeper or thicker, than the top half. When we were up close to it, 50 - 75 yds., it seemed to be about a car length long and a car width deep.

ALTITUDE - When we saw it up close it was about 30 feet off the ground. It seemed about the same distance from the ground while it was moving both South and then again to the North. If it was much higher than that we wouldn't have lost it behind those trees. When we saw it the second time, after going around the bend, it was out over the fields, farther and seemed to be up higher.

MOVEMENTS - The object seemed to be following the highway. Every time the highway curved it would sort of curve too. It stayed on the right side of the highway and sort of ran parallel to it most of the time. It ran parallel to the ground when it moved and when it was motionless and just sat spinning. We only saw the one object.

DURATION - About 45 minutes I think, I don't know. I kept watching it. I didn't keep an eye on the time. There was that one time in there for about 10 minutes when we didn't see it.

SOUND - It was a constant humming noise. I don't think it varied. It didn't increase in volume or pitch when it started to move off.

Q. Had you had anything to drink prior to this?

A. No, it was at least 2 weeks ago that I last had anything alcoholic.

Q. You aren't on drugs or anything are you?

A. No - alcohol yes, but drugs no.

Q. When was the last time you had some sleep? How many hours previous and for how many hours did you sleep?

A. The last time I slept was about 13 hours previous. I had gotten about 11 hours of sleep.

We were going out chicken hunting and we just got about 10 miles out of the city and I spotted this big white light crossing the road ahead of us. I called Arthur and Gordon's attention to it and I thought that it was a plane or something. It was quite a ways off and the light was kind of bright, like a big spotlight. I went faster in the car to catch up to it to see what it was. We caught up to it and it was just floating there. It was just about a 100 yards or so away. Then we stopped the car and shut it off and rolled down the window to listen to it. It was making a humming sound. There didn't seem to be a variation in the pitch. It was loud enough that we could hear it.

There was three lights on it. A big bright white one, a red and a green (they were smaller than the white one). The white light seemed to have faded because it was not as bright as when it was farther away.

We were going North on #6 highway and it followed us for about 30 to 40 miles.

When it was just hovering there, it was about 20 feet off the ground. It stayed there for about a minute or so and then it started off towards the direction we had come from (South). It was travelling about 15 or 20 m.p.h. and we took off towards the North. There was a mile or more - quite a distance away and we could still see it, just the white light, it was blinding us so we couldn't see the others and then it came back towards us. It came in just a matter of seconds and then followed us, not too close but we could still see the white light. It followed us for about 30 or 40 miles about $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile off the highway into the fields.

We were going to report it to the R.C.M.P. but we didn't cause Gordon thought we'd be locked up or something.

It wasn't a plane or anything. It's like something I've never seen before. I've never seen anything like this before.

Whatever it was, it was about 30 - 35 feet long and about 15 - 20 feet in depth.

COLOUR - I'd say it was a light colour. A grey or something. It's hard to tell with that light on it. Actually it was more of an outline rather than seeing a colour.

SHAPE - It was sort of round. The bottom was like a saucer. It looked like the lights were on top. It was 20 - 35 feet long and about 15 feet high or so.

- ALTITUDE** - When we first saw it, it wasn't really high. You couldn't see anything but the white light. When you got closer you could see the other two lights. While it was hovering it was about 20 - 30 feet off the ground. It didn't hover too long. When it was following us it was quite a ways away, but I would guess that it was about 100 feet up.
- MOVEMENTS** - It stayed stationary but it was level. And it was spinning, the lights didn't seem to spin though. All the lights were on steady but the white light was on brighter and seemed to blind you until they were closer. It stayed perfectly level, both when hovering and when moving. It seemed to move smoothly. It always seemed to move in a straight line, that is it didn't zig-zag, but it seemed to follow the road, a little distance off into the field.
- DURATION** - We kept seeing it off and on for about 45 minutes or so. We travelled about 40 miles while all this was going on.
- SOUND** - It was a steady hum, no variation in pitch or volume either while it was hovering or when it started to move away.
- SKY CONDITIONS** - Cloudy to the West and to the East it was clear. Could see the stars and the Northern lights. The object was on the East side of the highway most of the time.
- Q. Had you had anything to drink prior to this?
A. No - the last time I had anything alcoholic was 4 or 5 days before.
- Q. You're not on drugs or anything are you?
A. No.
- Q. How many hours since the last time you slept and how many hours did you get?
A. I got 8 or 9 hours of sleep about 16 hours previous to this happening.

We were driving down #6 highway (North). We were around Grosse Isle and Alec sighted a bright light going across the highway and he mentioned it to us, and when I noticed it. It had one bright white light and flashing red and white light. It seemed like it was hovering over the field about 75 - 100 yards. We stopped the car and shut off the motor and we could hear a humming noise and it looked like it was rotating. It started to move East and we drove on. We watched it for about 3/4 of an hour 'til we got to St. Laurent and then it went out of sight..

COLOUR - I didn't see a colour. It was too dark. I just saw an outline of it.

SHAPE - Oval - it was just an outline. Red and green light flashed on and off, alternately, but the white light stayed on constantly and quite bright, like a spotlight. The ship was rotating or seemed to and the lights appeared to be stationary.

ALTITUDE - I couldn't say how high it was but it wasn't very high. When it was moving it seemed to go up on a slant.

MOVEMENTS - When it was hovering it stayed level and was rotating. When it took off it rose up at a slant but appeared to still maintain a level position.

DURATION - I saw it for about 3/4 of an hour.

SOUND - Constant humming. Didn't vary in pitch or volume.

Q. You hadn't been drinking?

A. No. It's been over a month since the last time I had a drink.

Q. You're not on drugs or anything?

A. No!

Q. When was the last time prior to this that you had slept and for how many hours?

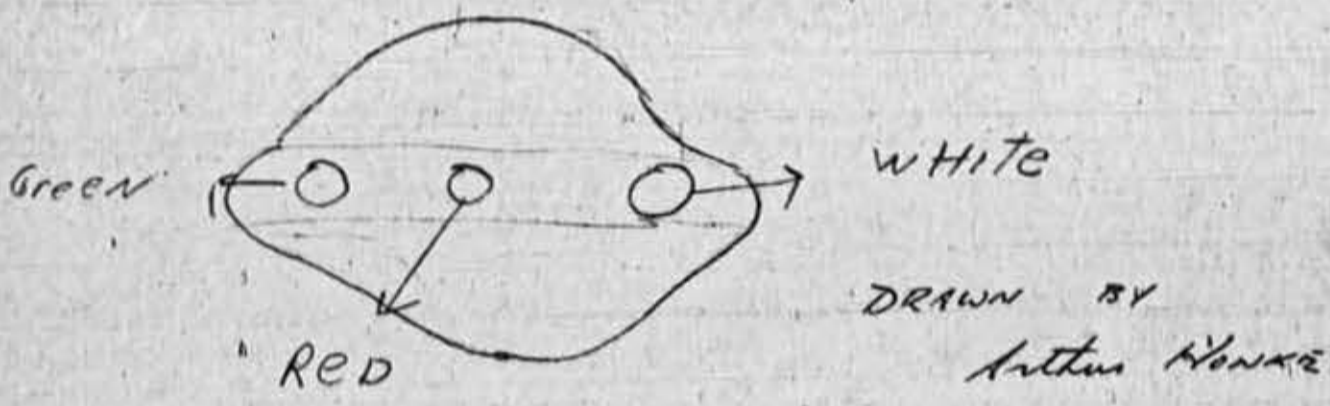
A. I got about 3 hours sleep about 4 hours before this happened. The night before that I got a full 8 hours.

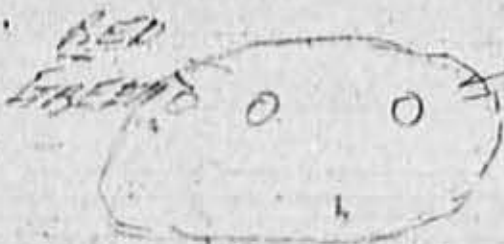

1. Reference to the above and our Telex #ASH/240 and Op. Man. CO-AIR para 6, Unidentified Flying Objects, I report the following.
2. At approximately 12:15 AM, 19 SEP 71, Mr. Mario LOSCERBO (B: 3 MAR 42), 6478 Victoria Drive, Vancouver 16, B.C., and Mr. John FUNK (B: 27 APR 31), 1402 East 27th, North Vancouver, B.C., came to our office and reported the sighting of some unidentified flying objects the evening before. They appeared to be sensible type persons and were quite sincere in the information that they gave. Information is as following and in compliance with Op. Man. CO-AIR, para 6:
 - (a) Date and time of sighting - 18 SEP 71 between the hours of 10:00 PM and 12MN Pacific Standard Time.
 - (b) Condition of sky - Clear.
 - (c) Identification of observer - As above noted.
 - (d) Location of observer at time of sighting - on top of a mountain north of Loon Lake, B.C., which is approximately 20 miles north of Cache Creek, B.C.
 - (e) Identification of other persons also observing the U.F.O. - Nil.
 - (f) Description of sighting - As follows:
There were three objects sighted. #1 was in a southerly direction approximately 25 degrees above the horizon at about two to ten miles away. The object appeared bright white in colour and was shaped like a peace symbol. It bobbed up and down for a while and then became stationary. #2 and #3 were in a westerly direction and about 2 degrees above the horizon. #2 was hexagon in shape and all red in colour. It held a stationary position most of the time. #3 had a white centre with a red ring around it. It bobbed up and down most of the time it was watched. A sketch of the above objects with explanation is attached.
 - (g) Duration of observation - Approximately two hours. Subjects observed U.F.O.'s through the scope on their rifles.
 - (h) Other relevant information - Subjects had only one hour sleep the night before, had not been drinking and were quite positive in what they saw. They stated that the reason they could not watch the objects any longer was due to them being over tired. In the morning when they awoke they looked in the direction in which they had observed the U.F.O.s and could see nothing. Where the #2 and #3 objects were seen together there was a high mountain with snow on it, they believe the objects they saw were just above this.



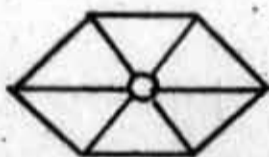

1. At approximately 2.50 P.M., Elizabeth (Mrs. John) SWAN, Clareville, Nfld., contacted this office and stated that last evening around 7.30 P.M. she was driving from Hodges Cove to Clareville when she and several other persons in the vehicle saw about 6-8 very bright white lights in the sky. She stated that they did not appear to be the lights of a low flying aircraft as they were all white and then appeared to be too low for stars. She further related that the lights were moving at a very fast rate of speed travelling from West to East.

13-24 OCT 71

2. As per O.M. CO-Air a message was forwarded in respect to the sighting. The complainant together with Stephen FOSTER age 9, Ian SWAN age 9, Fiona SWAN age 14 and Debra STANLEY age 14 were all independantly interviewed at length. They all stated that they saw the lights and that there were about 6-8 of them moving very fast from West to East in the sky, then disappearing into the clouds. The vehicle was travelling on Hodges Cove road which due to its terrian is encompassed with numerous hills and sharp curves to the left and right. The description of the lights varied from a number of light bulbs going on and off to, being similar to the lights on a runway at night landing in a aircraft. There was no definite indication of the altitude of the light as they all disagreed some stating lower than a low flying aircraft to being as high as stars are normally. All occupants stated that the lights were not flares such as a ship in distress or fireworks. The road on which they were travelling is adjacent to Trinity Bay. They all stated that there was no noise accompanying the lights.

3. Mrs. SWAN the operator of the vehicle did however, state that they did pass 5-6 vehicles coming in the opposite direction after seeing the lights. I patrolled to the approximate scene and while returning to Clareville noted lights in the sky which were made by oncoming traffic. At the time of the sighting it was raining heavily and a gale force wind was blowing. It is felt by this investigator that the lights seen were reflections of head lights of oncoming vehicles and due to the rain, wind etc made them more pronounced than normally. No other explanation could be undercovered to clarify the lights. Unless otherwise instructed this file will remain as hereunder shown.

Dear Sir:

Last night my family and I saw a U. F. O. (Also some of our neighbors.) I do not know if you are interested in these sightings or not, but to satisfy my own curiosity, I am writing you to enquire if the radar networks noticed this craft on their screens.

We first noticed this air (space?) craft at 10.00 P.M. Saturday, October 9, hovering motionless over the head of the Douglas channel, directly south of Kitimat. It hovered there for approximately 1/2 hour, (till about 10.30) during which time I observed it through my binoculars. It appeared to be about one mile high, circular in shape, and had two distinctly different light patterns which alternated in two varying time phases. Unfortunately I did not have the presence of mind at the time, to time these phases. The short phase which lasted perhaps 15 seconds, emitted green light from the top in the shape of a crown, brilliant white in a band around the center, and red light in a band around the bottom. These were flickering, or flashing, or shimmering. (Take your pick.) During the long phases which lasted perhaps a minute, the entire craft appeared in brilliant white which gradually

changed too yellow before the short phase started again. It started moving off and gaining altitude about 10.40 P.M. and was out of sight about 12.30 A.M. It moved off in a south westerly direction. Assuming true north as 0°, approximately 230°.

I don't know where the radar sites are located but perhaps one of them may have picked it up.

Incidentally in case you were wondering, we had not been drinking, and it was not an airplane, satellite, meteorite, weather balloon or marsh gas.

He was unable to determine how far away it was but stated that the object seemed to lift up on its North side, then levelled off, slowly faded and then suddenly disappeared. He stressed the point that what he saw was extremely bright white in colour, clearly visible and very large in size. GOLDSTONE claimed that he watched the object in his rear view and side view mirrors for approx. 2 minutes before it disappeared and stated that it was clearly visible and definitely not an airplane. When questioned as to traffic on the highway at that time, GOLDSTONE stated that there was a semi-trailer and other cars on the road but the drivers did not appear to notice the object he saw.
4. In view of the foregoing, telex message was forwarded from this point in compliance with Op. Manual CO-Air, Para. #6.

TRAFFIC AT THE time of the sighting, where it was learned that no light aircraft were flying that particular morning due to heavy winds. It was further learned that they have no knowledge of any aircraft which might have been in this area at the time, but that it was extremely unlikely that an aircraft would be that close to the airport without their knowledge. The weather at 8.30A.M., 27 OCT 71 was cloudy with 1200 foot ceiling and 15 miles visibility, wind was 290 at 17 MPH.

6. Enquiries were conducted in the general area of the sighting however nothing of value was learned with no more sightings being reported and nothing apparently amiss or unusual noted. Checks were also run on GOLDSTONE to determine his reliability and it was found that this subject is not known to the Brandon City Police [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] This subject was quite in earnest when interviewed and did not hesitate either in reporting this incident or in describing what he saw. However he claims that there was East bound traffic on the highway at the time of the sighting and indicates that it was a bright white colour clearly visible and large in size. This brings to mind the question as to why this object was not seen and reported by the people traveling East on the highway at the same time as he indicates it was so obvious as to be clearly visible through his rear and side view mirrors.

7. As no further sightings have been reported here to date and as nothing new has been uncovered in this regard, file being considered as shown hereunder. Extra copies of this report attached.

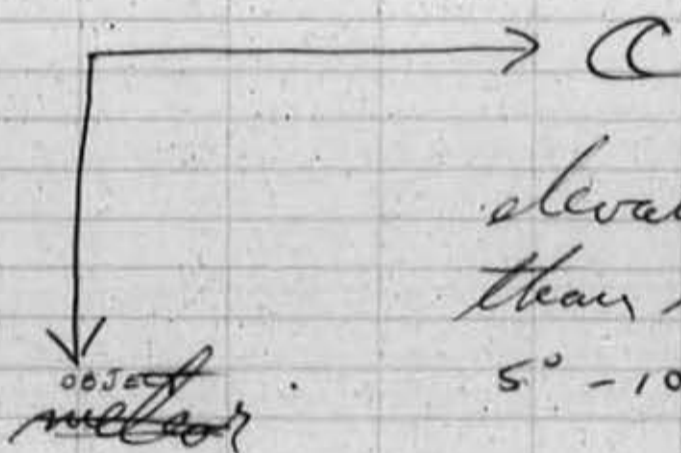

1. Wallace EVANS, Bear's Cove, Harbour Grace, Nfld. reported to this office that himself, Charles THOMAS, Carbonear, Nfld., and Harold BADCOCK, Shearstown, Nfld.; all employees with Gulf Oil Ltd., Harbour Grace, Nfld. sighted a U.F.O. at 4:00 PM this date. It was stated that Harold BADCOCK saw the U.F.O. first and he watched it for a while and then he told the other two fellows about it. The statements obtained from Harold BADCOCK and Charles THOMAS are attached.

2. I interviewed Samuel, Nicholas, and Thomas SHORT; Gerald CALLAHAN, and Joseph CUMBY; all of Harbour Grace, Nfld. and it was learned that these men were coming in from fishing around 4:00 PM, 6 NOV 71 and they were out in Conception Bay, Nfld. quite close to Harbour Grace Island. They stated that they saw a large flock of birds, probably ducks, flying in an up and down direction, but gradually moving South into Conception Bay, Nfld. They stated that they were close enough to be certain that what they saw was a flock of birds flying very close together. They described the way the birds were flying as the same way that BADCOCK, THOMAS, and EVANS described the way the U.F.O. was flying.

3. It appears definite that the U.F.O. in this case was actually a flock of birds, therefore, it is felt that no further action is necessary.

"Harold BADCOCK, Shearstown, Nfld. was standing near the door in the Gulf Branch Office at Harbour Grace, Nfld. around 4:00 PM, 6 NOV 71 looking East out over Harbour Grace Island. He brought it to my attention that he saw an object directly over Harbour Grace Island that looked odd to him. It didn't change shape or anything. He said that he had been watching it for about 10 minutes before he told me about it.

The first time I saw it, it was over the north end of Harbour Grace Island and in comparison it looked like it was the width of the island above the island. It looked like it was a round disc with a bubble in the middle of it on the top. The object appeared to go down behind the island and the second time I saw it, it appeared in the sky about over the center of Harbour Grace Island. It stayed in sight for about four or five seconds and then it went down straight behind the island again. It was kind of black or dark grey. It appeared to go down at a speed that looked like it was falling. The third time I saw it, it appeared over the South end of the island. It appeared to come up from behind and appeared to be a little higher in the sky than the two previous sightings.

Before I saw it again I was talking to Wallace EVANS, Harbour Grace, Nfld. on the two-way radio and asked him where he was and if he could see Harbour Grace Island from where he was located. He said that he couldn't and that he would come right up to the plant. When he arrived we saw the object about over the end of Feather Point, Harbour Grace South, Nfld. It appeared to be a bit higher in the sky again this time than before and I did not see it rise that time. It just seemed to appear in the sky. After that it just disappeared as it appeared that some clouds drifted over it. We watched it for about 15 minutes.

The object went back and forth several times, but it gradually moved towards the South end of the island and eventually disappeared off the end of Feather Point. It seemed to move in every direction at a quick rate of speed until it finally disappeared. It was getting dark and the object disappeared the last time it went down.

The weather on that day was slightly hazy out over the island. There were some light coloured clouds out over the island in the background and this is why the object showed up so plain."

1. This date we received a C-236 in the mail from Carlyle Detachment advising that on the 23 OCT 71, Norman FRITH of Wawota, Sask., stated that on the 8 OCT 71 he observed a U.F.O. FRITH stated that at about 7:00 P.M. on the 8 OCT 71, he was driving near his farm house, 1 mile West and 4 miles North of Wawota, Sask., on the S.W. 1/4 of Section 2, Township 12, Range 1, West of 2nd, when he saw a white light come from the North travelling in a South-East direction. FRITH advised that he would like one of our members to look into the matter.

8 NOV 71

2. After several attempts, I was able to contact Mr. FRITH this date and he advised that he saw a round object approximately 3 feet in diameter moving South-East, at the above location. He stated that this object was white and green and gave off a red trailing light. This object turned over once and appeared to be in the shape of a cone. FRITH stated that he was proceeding East along a municipal road in his vehicle when he first observed this object flying just over the tree tops. HE stated that it appeared this object went into the trees and bounced around in the trees and continued on over his vehicle. He stated that when it went over his vehicle, the vehicle stalled for a second and then started up again on its own. In all he observed this object for approximately 15 to 20 seconds. FRITH was alone at the time of the sighting. FRITH advised that Frank HOUSE of Wawota, Sask., also observed this object.

3. I interviewed HOUSE and he advised that he was hunting at a point approximately 5 1/2 miles North west of FRITH's, when he observed what appeared to be a bright light in the sky South East of his position. He advised that at the time he thought it was a meteorite of some sort and he did not pay any attention to it.

4. FRITH is not well known to myself or the other members of this detachment, however, after interviewing several of his neighbours and persons in the Wawota, area, it is felt that the reliability of his sighting is in question. FRITH is known to exaggerate on almost everything he sees or does. There is no doubt that FRITH saw something, however, after spending 2 weeks thinking about what he saw he decided to contact one of our members to report a U.F.O.

5. FRITH has gone to the trouble of going out to the field and searching the bush, where he thought this object bounced from tree to tree, however, he stated that he could not find any sign of burning or damaged trees. He advised that he searched the ground in the area for pieces of metal in case this object was damaged going through these trees, again with negative results.

- At 11:00 A.M. 29 NOV 71, Mrs. Betty COOPER, of Long Beach, B.C. called this office and reported that she and her husband, Harvey COOPER, saw a U.F.O. early morning of the same date.
- Patrol made to the COOPER residence which is situated approx. fourteen (14) miles North of Ucluelet, B.C., on Highway #4. The following story was related to the writer. At approx. 0500 P.S.T., 29 NOV 71, Mr. Harvey COOPER awoke and looked out the bedroom window, as he usually does to see what the weather is like. Mr. COOPER noticed a bright light in the West just above the treeline. The light appeared to be a star, but was much brighter and larger. Mr. COOPER jumped out of bed and this is when Mrs. COOPER awoke. She asked her husband what was wrong and he told her that he had just seen a U.F.O. Both of them then looked out the window and observed a large star which then turned into a round hazy ball of light, first greenish in color, then a reddish pink. A/N stated that this ball of light which was much larger than a full moon, appeared like a moon shining through a cloud. A/N stated there were no clouds in the sky. This hazy ball of light would disappear for a few minutes and then reappear as a large star. After about thirty (30) minutes they lost sight of this star behind the trees. After a few minutes it again reappeared, in the shape of a large ball. Mr. & Mrs. COOPER observed this object until approx. 0610, at which time they went back to bed. At 0630 Mrs. COOPER got up and looked for the object but could not see it.
- Inquiries in this area did not reveal any other persons who saw this object. We have had no other reports of this type at this office. Mr. & Mrs. COOPER are well known in this community and are regarded as rational people.
- On the 2 DEC 71, Ucluelet detachment message #153 was sent to NRC Meteor Centre, with info to Canforcehed, the Commissioner, and Victoria Sub/Division.
- The weather report for the above noted time and date was obtained from the Department of Transport, Tofino, B.C. and reads as follows. Darkness, partial cloud with some fog, visibility 5 miles, winds calm, 5/10 Alto-Cumulus. The position of this observation is approx. 49 degrees North, 125 degrees 40 minutes West. The D.O.T. had not released any weather balloons, and there were no known aircrafts in the area. Extra copies of report attached.

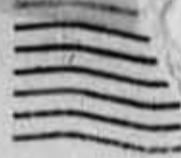

You have visited my school, Nabhuille Consolidated High School, when I was in grade 7 & 8. I am now in grade 10 and wish to get your opinion on some strange thing. On February 19, 1971, I was suddenly awakened by a loud noise. At first I thought it was the heating system in our house. It often makes some noises because one of the air in the pipes, but this was different. I then thought it was a car outside the house but the noise got louder and louder. I then thought of what my brother's girlfriend had said. She had seen one ^{thing} and explained the noise. The noise was the same as the noise she explained. It was loud and wrapped and cracked and sounded like a high-powered motor boat.

(The noise got into my room) I then looked out my window and saw a U.F.O. flying right over my house. Our neighbor has a large & intense light and the light from this reflected off of the saucer and outlined it in outline. It looked like one of those old space cones or rockets. The bottom was a light yellow and was divided off into sections - like the spokes and hub of a bicycle wheel, each one equal. The rest of it appeared to be a dark green. There was only one light and that was white and was on the bottom by the edge. (See sketch for location of light). The light shone steadily.

The U.F.O. seemed to wobble and flew in sort of a zigzag path. It flew across my neighbor's yard and stopped just down to them. The noise then changed to a hum and lasted for about ten minutes. It then went ~~down~~ ^{up} higher, and then low lower a couple of times, still humming. I then realized that I'd better get someone up to show them for a witness. I ran over to my father's bedroom and got him up to look at it, but it was gone.

A few weeks later my aunt came over to my house to tell me that she and her husband had heard a humming noise and when she looked out the window she saw a bright light above the woods. She may not be reliable because she didn't have her glasses at the time and her husband wouldn't let

The noise was heard until the last of ^{September} ~~November~~ and first of October. A few days later some were sitting on a bridge when they looked up and saw a bright light flashing irregularly above the clouds. It gave the effect of ~~some~~ ^{light} ~~lightening~~. The light got brighter and brighter and finally the image formed a ~~was~~ ^{was} a perfect triangle. ~~The following night I made it a point to follow it but it always kept ahead of them.~~ The following night I made it a point to get out and try to see it. I did. It flared as before and once there was two but then there was only one again. It got brighter but didn't form a triangle. All this happened around 9:00 - 9:30.

Two nights after that someone spotted a ~~big~~ ^{big} blinking red light followed by a white one in the sky. Its path crossed the Big Dipper and the time was about 9:30. It travelled fairly fast and kept going. The path it took was approx. ~~to the~~ ^{to the} following night one was seen also at about the same time and looked like the previous one.

Then two nights after that, ~~a~~ ^{during}, I happened to be out and I heard of these things & got interested. Then, at about 8:30 one was spotted ~~was~~ taking the same course as the one seen about two months later another was spotted, again taking the same course. Altogether ~~there~~ ^{there} was one more period for Lewis and Schaffner and we don't know how many were passing on that night. They were well coming and ~~it~~ ^{it} stopped June at 10:30.

These things made no noise and if you get in the right position you could see that the bottom was round. A few of these things stopped over by the horizon a minute and then went on. No one could see where they came from; they just seemed to be there.

That day when I went to school I told everyone to watch for these things and to tell me if they saw any. ~~That day a girl was found who had seen one Saturday night. She was talking on the telephone when she looked out and~~ saw one. She thought at first it was an airplane but then stopped. She paid no attention to it until she heard about the ones we saw. It was the same kind as we had seen.

That night 6 were seen, ~~appearing~~ taking the same pattern, coming in front of the 13.9 ships. Another light was seen. It was white and was going W → E, zigzagging as it went very fast. ~~Another night~~ The next night we saw only one. When I went to school the next day I found another girl had seen something around 9.30. She said it flew low and was orange. She described it as if it looked like a ball of fire. It was like it was whirling around very fast and shooting out things" that I thought might be rays of some sort.

~~The appearance~~

The description of these things was no like they were in a plane or jet but these things made no sounds, like the same path, same direction, didn't leave any vapor trail, and they stopped. They also appeared to be round in the bottom and if they were jets we would have seen them before. For that reason I believe that these were U.F.O.s, but I would like your opinion, opinion and I hope you are the one to write to. The people who saw these are very various, and I am, about it. The oldest one who saw it, was a grade 12 student who was a grade 11 senior student.

I have drawn some circles (I'm not exact, but I try) to try and describe these things more clearly.

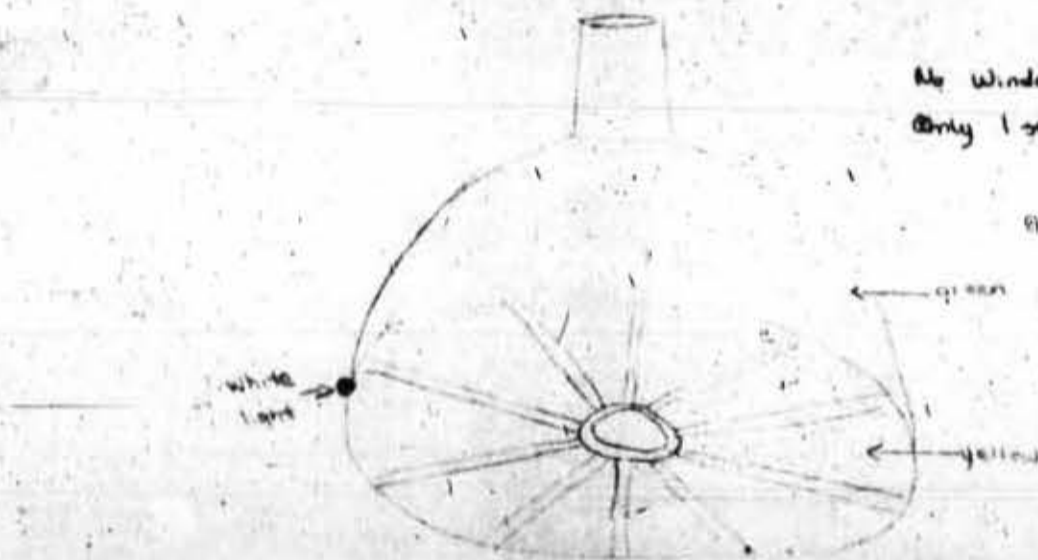

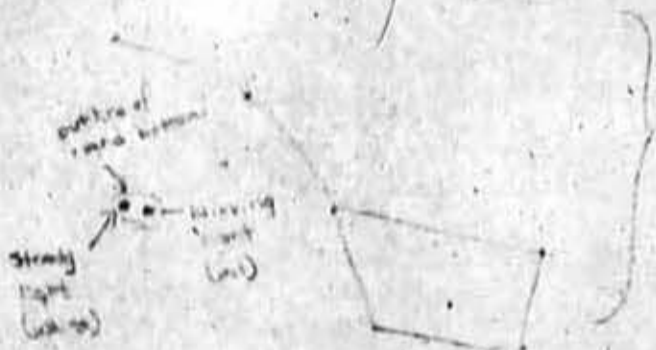

1. The above-noted person called this office at approximately 9:00AM on 6 Jan 72 and advised me that on 5 Jan 72 she was just shutting off the kitchen lights at approx. 11:00PM to go to bed and as she passed by the east kitchen window she noticed the following described object in an easterly direction approx. 1 mile from Treherne above ground level:

DESCRIPTION OF U.F.O.

Cone shaped object with bright orange-red pulsating lights at the base which appeared to revolve.

2. She stated that the object was above ground level but below cloud level as there was a dark cloud over the object. At this point I advised her that I would proceed to her house and she could give more detail than she had over the phone. As I entered her residence she appeared to be in a somewhat excited mood and began to repeat what had been said over the phone quite rapidly. She quietened down shortly and I obtained the following information from her. She stated that the object appeared to hover motionless except for the revolving of the lights, for approx. 2 minutes then it disappeared to the east quite rapidly in a period of about 10 seconds. She drew a diagram of what she thought the object looked like after it disappeared and the diagram when viewed by myself was as she explained, a cone-shaped object.

3. Mrs. DETIMMERMAN then phoned her father, Mr. John NATTRESS who lives 3 miles east of Treherne, Man. and advised him of what she had observed, with the purpose of having him look outside to try and sight the object. He phoned her back advising that he could see nothing. She stated to me that she should have known he wouldn't see it as it was out of sight and far away by then. No other persons in the DETIMMERMAN residence saw anything as they were sleeping at the time. The condition of the sky when the sighting of the object occurred was clear with cloud patches.

4. I contacted several people who live on the same street and district in Treherne, Man. in regards to sighting anything unusual at the aforesaid time and the results in this respect were all negative. I also contacted Mr. NATTRESS and he advised me that his daughter had phoned shortly after 11:00PM as she stated and requested him to look outside. He said that she seemed quite upset at the time she called but also spoke in a serious manner. Cst. L.P. BACON, Treherne Highway Patrol was working evenings that night and he stated he was around Holland, Man., 8 miles west of Treherne, Man. and he had not seen anything unusual in the sky. In view of the foregoing an Outgoing Message #72/1 was forwarded at 2:35PM, 6 Jan 72 for the attention of NRC METEOR CENTRE, as per Op. Manual CO-Air.

5. On the 7 Jan 72 a Mrs. Martin ROZDEBA, Traherne, Man. called this office stating that her neighbour Marjorie (Mrs. Jack) SMITH had advised her that she saw something unusual in the sky early in the morning and Mrs. ROZDEBA who knew of the sighting the day before felt Mrs. SMITH should be contacted. I interviewed Mrs. SMITH and ascertained from her that she had got out of bed at approx. 5:30AM, 7 Jan 72 to get a drink of water and when she looked out her east bedroom window she saw what she thought to be an unusual sunrise. She said it was an oval spot of sunrise surrounded by darkness. She never thought anything of it until speaking to Mrs. ROZDEBA who told her of the sighting by Mrs. DETIMMERMAN. As I spoke to her I felt that knowing of the first sighting had influenced Mrs. SMITH into thinking what she saw may have been a U.F.O. She still felt that what she had seen was an unusual sunrise therefore no further investigation was conducted into her observation of a U.F.O.

6. In regards to further reports of U.F.O. sighting these have been nil in this Detachment area. Mrs. DETIMMERMAN is a reliable person to the best of my knowledge as well as the other members at this point. We have never received any complaints from this person in the past regarding anything of this nature nor have any complaints been received about her. No further action will be taken at this point. I have taken up the studying of UFOs. I would like to know if you can send me some information on them. My teacher has told me that if I wrote to your airforce base I might be able to receive some information. I would also like to find out some information about a certain incident that happened ^{June} July 24, 1947. The incident was that a Capt. whose name was Thomas Mantell. He was chasing a U.F.O. that he was told to check out when he reported in to command base he said that the object was metallic and of tremendous size. The book is entitled "Intercept - But Don't Shoot" incase you were wondering where I found out about Capt. Mantell. I suppose that is all I can say about my case. I hope that you are able to send me some information, also I hope you might be able to tell me something about the object we saw scene, I guess I'd better tell when we saw this object. The first sighting was Nov. 18, 1971 approximately at 6:03 pm till approximately 6:20 pm. The second sighting was on Nov. 21, 1971 at approximately 8:01 till approximately 8:29. I and my family and neighbours agreed that it couldn't possibly be a type of aircraft because it was flying much to low and it was spinning rapidly with great speed with a red glow to it. I know that people write and call into you saying weird things that aren't true. But my story is very

true and I have witnesses to prove
it. I hope that you don't think I'm
a practical joker because I am really not.
Because I don't believe in saying things
that aren't true. I know you and your
men work very hard to keep our country
safe and I think you are doing a very
good job at. I hope you keep up the good
work. I also wait to be waiting to receive
a letter from you ~~something~~ telling me
something about this object we've seen
down here if you can.


Thank you very much for your informative letter regarding your sighting of a U.F.O. Unfortunately, we here at CFB Greenwood keep no records of UFO sightings.

Your letter of December 29, 1971 has been forwarded to us by the Canadian Forces Base, Greenwood.

As Captain Benoit stated in his letter to you dated January 5, 1972, the National Research Council maintains original reports, received by the Government, of various phenomena seen in the sky. We have no general summary of information on unidentified objects seen in the sky.

This file is located in the Radio and Electrical Engineering Building, Montreal Road Laboratories, National Research Council, Ottawa, and may be examined by those interested. An appointment can be made by writing to the Meteor Centre, Upper Atmosphere Research Section, National Research Council, Ottawa, Ontario, KLA OR8.

Prior to 1968, the Department of National Defence maintained the files, but these were turned over to us when the Government ^{delegated} the responsibility to the National Research Council. The files in our possession date back to 1965 only, as the Department of National Defence destroyed records older than three years.

Your sightings of November 18 and 21, 1971 have been placed in our files.

Useful information on the subject of unidentified flying objects seen in the sky can be found by referring to some of the many books that have been published. A selection of reference material has been listed on the attached sheet.
