You will find herewith a drawing illustrating what I saw one night during the second week of January 1972 (probably the 11th).

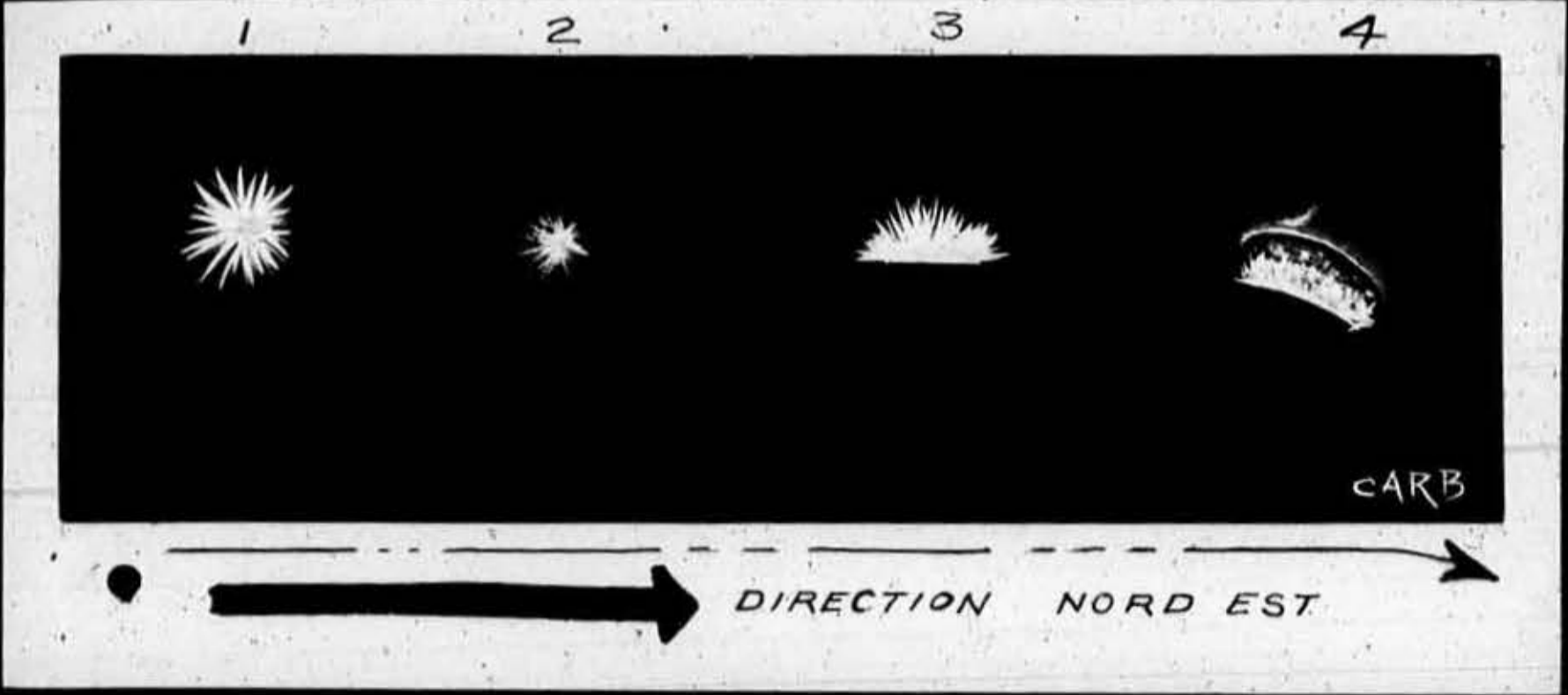
Following the numerical order, this light changed its form while moving at the speed of an airplane, without any noise, under a very dark sky.

1. At approximately 10:50 PM, Earl Charles GRAHAM of 11111 Braxton Road S.W., Calgary, Alberta - Phone: 252-6154, contacted this office by telephone and advised that he and several other persons had observed what appeared to be a flying object in the sky to the west of his residence. The object was sighted at approximately 10:10 PM and disappeared at approximately 10:45 PM. GRAHAM advised he then contacted the McCall Field Control Tower who in turn advised nothing was evident on their radar for a distance of 30 miles. The following embodied Telex was forwarded immediately to NRC Meteor Centre, Canforched, Commissioner R.C.M.P. Ottawa and to Prof. R.E. FOLINSBEE - University of Alberta, Edmonton:

2. All persons mentioned in the Telex were interviewed and their statements are attached hereto. It is felt that all persons are extremely reliable.

3. Further investigations were conducted at the various residences of the noted persons at which time, it was learned the object had appeared in the western sky and slightly to the north. As will be noted in the statements, the description of altitude varies, however, all persons were consistent in stating that the object fell from sight. Taking the accumulated information John FINDLAY, Asst. Chief Technician of the Calgary Planetarium was contacted. He studied the available information and came to the solid conclusion that the object was in fact the star VENUS. He advised that this star would appear in the exact location and has many times been mistaken for a U.F.O. The star has a magnitude of minus 3.8 and moves at a speed of approximately 15 degrees per hour, setting four hours after sunset. Sunset on the 11 MAR 72 was 6:36 PM; thus, the object would disappear at approximately between 10:35 and 10:45 PM. Mr. FINDLAY stated that due to the atmospheric conditions the star would appear to change colour and also to vary slightly in its movements. FINDLAY demonstrated to me the exact position of the star VENUS on the 11 MAR 72 at 10:30 PM utilizing the Planetarium Observatory. From what I learned at the various residences in regard to the sightings, I felt that the object was in fact in identical proximity to the area indicated by the witnesses.

4. Further contact has been made with all witnesses who in turn advise that they have since observed the same object in the same position and feel that it is in fact the star VENUS and not a U.F.O.

5. In view of the foregoing information, it is felt that there is little doubt that the object is in fact the star VENUS.

"At approximately 10:00 PM on the 11 MARCH 72 I was at my home in Calgary. I came from my front room into the bathroom and upon entering the bathroom, I looked out of the window which falls west. I noticed a bright light that I at first thought was an aircraft with its landing lights on. I looked again when I went to the kitchen and noticed that it was still there. My father-in-law, N.R. KEMPTHORNE of 4907 Kerrydale Road S.W. Calgary and I watched the light for some time. It did not appear to be moving when we were watching it from the kitchen but when I went back into the bathroom, I could not see it from the same spot.

I telephoned Fred BRASNETT of 11127 Braxton Road S.W. to tell him of the light. He looked at the light with his field glasses and told me that it appeared to be a multi-coloured thing and when it moved it moved fast. While Mr. BRASNETT was watching the object I went outside and took two photographs using MANKYA SEKOR 35MM with telescopic lens.

Following this, I contacted the Calgary Airport Control Tower. They advised that there were no objects on the radar scope for a 30 mile radius. After this I called my neighbour, Larry THIELEN, who came over. We talked about it and watched it for approximately 15 minutes. I then contacted the R.C.M.P.

"At approximately 10:00 PM 11 MAR 72, I was playing bridge at our home. I was with Mr. & Mrs. R.H. ATKINS, and my wife. I received a phone call from my neighbour, Chuck GRAHAM. He asked me to look out my window and have a look at a funny looking "Sputnik" out to the west. My house faces west. I looked out my front window and saw an extremely bright object travelling from the south to the north. Its position was approximately west-north-west from the front window. The object was a bright whitish yellow. It was radiant much similar to a star. While I watched it, the object appeared stationary. I then went over to GRAHAM'S residence. We talked about it for awhile and lined it up using the kitchen window which also faces west. I used the center of the window to determine lateral flight and the curtain rod to determine vertical movement. While I watched, it appeared to move approximately one inch. I was unable to detect any vertical movement. I didn't notice any change in intensity or color. I observed the object for approximately ten minutes.

From my front window it is possible to see two distant lights. The object was approximately centered on these and slightly above.

It was approximately 10:15 PM when it was first sighted and was gone at approximately 1:15 PM.

I am employed by Shell Oil Canada Ltd. as a senior Technologist in field facilities for 18 years. I have also been employed as a surveyor by the Dominion Government for five years."

"On the 11 MAR 72 I was visiting my son-in-law Chuck GRAHAM at 11111 Braxton Rd. S.W. I was not sure of the time. We saw an extremely bright light out the kitchen window which faces the west. The light appeared to be coming in from the west at a low altitude, approximately 500' - 1000' feet. It appeared to be a bright blotch of light, green, red and blue in color. The intensity of the light varied, however, was always bright. The object appeared like a star but the colors were different. I watched it for approximately 15 - 20 minutes. During this time, the course of the object moved both to the left and right much similar to weaving. It appeared to be hovering without much forward speed. The altitude was being estimated by using the horizon. The object came in fast and then hovered.

My son-in-law called the Calgary Airport Tower to find out what it was. They advised they had no sightings but were sending out an aircraft.

We saw the aircraft come from the south. As it approached, the object started to lose altitude and then dropped out of sight of the horizon.

I am employed by C.M.P. as a salesman and have been employed here for 23 years."

"On the 11 MAR 72 I received a phone call from Chuck GRAHAM at approximately 9:25 PM regarding a very brilliant object in the skies directly west of my residence. My family and myself proceeded to watch the object, both visually and with 8x50 binoculars. The object appeared to be a brilliant, yellow and circular with a black define porifery. An aurora of light blue surrounded it. There was interjecting overlay of crimson. The object appeared to move in an upward angular projection to left and right from the horizon. I assumed it was an aircraft on approach with its landing lights on. Having lived in the area, I am aware of the approach of aircraft at approximately 5 - 6 thousand feet. The object, taking a line sight from my house, appeared in the position.

After observing the object sitting in a reasonably static fashion, I called the McCall Field Control Tower to see if they had a radar track or aircraft in the area, but was informed negatively.

Approximately 10 - 12 minutes after my call a light aircraft passed over and the object disappeared from sight.

I have subsequently checked with the Planetarium and was informed that the object was the star VENUS.

I have since observed the same object and have found it to be the same in appearance and location, only it was not as bright."

1. Information was received at this office to the effect that Arthur and Virginia LESTER sighted a U.F.O. in the Caddy Lake, Manitoba area on the night of the 15 Apr 72.

17 Apr 72

2. This date, I contacted Arthur & Virginia LESTER at West Hawk Lake, Man. The LESTER'S revealed the following events to me. At approx 9.30 PM (CST) Arthur LESTER was driving his car south on PTH #44 towards West Hawk Lake. His wife, Virginia, was a passenger in the front seat. At a point 10-15 miles north of West Hawk Lake the LESTER'S observed an oval shaped grayish-white light approx two feet in diameter. This object travelled in front of LESTER'S car at tree top height in a spinning motion weaving continuously from left to right. The LESTER'S claimed this object was visible for about ten minutes, and then disappeared. A few minutes later Mrs. LESTER glanced out the rear window and observed the same grayish-white object following the car at the same height and in a similar manner as before. Arthur LESTER stopped his car and both occupants got out and watched the object for a few minutes. It then disappeared. The LESTER'S informed me that the sky was clear at the time. The LESTER'S then proceeded directly to the home of Mr. & Mrs. William BLACKWELL at West Hawk Lake.

3. Mr. & Mrs. William BLACKWELL, a retired couple residing at West Hawk Lake, were also interviewed. These subjects stated that the LESTER'S arrived at their house between 10.30 - 11.00 PM of the 17th Apr. and related the events as described in para #2 to the BLACKWELL'S. The BLACKWELL'S stated that Mrs. LESTER seemed very upset but her husband appeared quite normal. The BLACKWELL'S advised that the LESTER'S were both sober and had not been drinking any alcoholic beverages.

4. Falcon Beach message #72/4 was forwarded direct to NRC METEOR CENTRE, info CANFORCED and Commissioner.

5. Mr. & Mrs. LESTER are sources of unknown reliability as they do not reside in this area but are from Beausejour, Man. Arthur LESTER (BD: 11 Nov 24) is employed as a Weigh Scale Inspector with the Man. Motor Transport Board and only works at West Hawk Lake periodically.

It was brought to the attention of this Detachment via a local daily newspaper, The Daily Gleaner, Fredericton, New Brunswick, that Mrs. Nelma GRAHAM had reported observing an Unidentified Flying Object near her home at Maple Ridge, Carleton County, New Brunswick. Mrs. GRAHAM was contacted by the writer and interviewed at length. She advised that the object was observed by herself and her husband at approximately 12:15 A.M., 1 MAY 72, in the northwest sky. The object appeared to be blinking a distinctive red color and was observed for approximately twenty minutes, the object then disappearing over the horizon. The object was described as being quite large and when first observed, it appeared to have the shape of a cross moving vertically continuously. The altitude of the object could not be determined by Mrs. GRAHAM but she felt that it was flying very high. There was no apparent sound coming from this object.

2. The night in question was clear with the moon shining in the eastern sky. The area in which this object was observed is an open area with no obstructions so a very clear view of the object was had by Mrs. GRAHAM and her husband.

3. Another sighting was made by the same two persons the following night, (2-MAY-72) with the same conditions prevailing, with the exception that the sighting began at 12:40 A.M. and ended at approximately 1:00 A.M.

4. Radio-gram number 170 was forwarded from this point to NRC Meteor Centre on 4 MAY 72 as per R.C.M.P. Operational Manual - CO-Air 1195, paragraph number 6. There is no reason to believe that this sighting was not exactly as described by Mr. & Mrs. GRAHAM. Both subjects appear to be very upstanding citizens in their community and sources of good reliability. No further action being taken in this regard unless otherwise instructed.

"It levelled off abruptly, with almost a 90 degree turn.

"I don't think there's a plane anywhere that can manoeuvre like that."

Only one of the seven pictures taken by the man was printable, Upper Islander photographer Bob Howse said Tuesday.

"The rest were under-exposed, taken when there wasn't enough light for his camera," Howse said.

The one print that could be made is itself blurry.

Because of the poor quality, it is doubtful it will be identifiable.

"I would rather doubt we could identify it if the picture quality is poor," CFB Comox information officer Capt. Tony Brett said Tuesday morning.

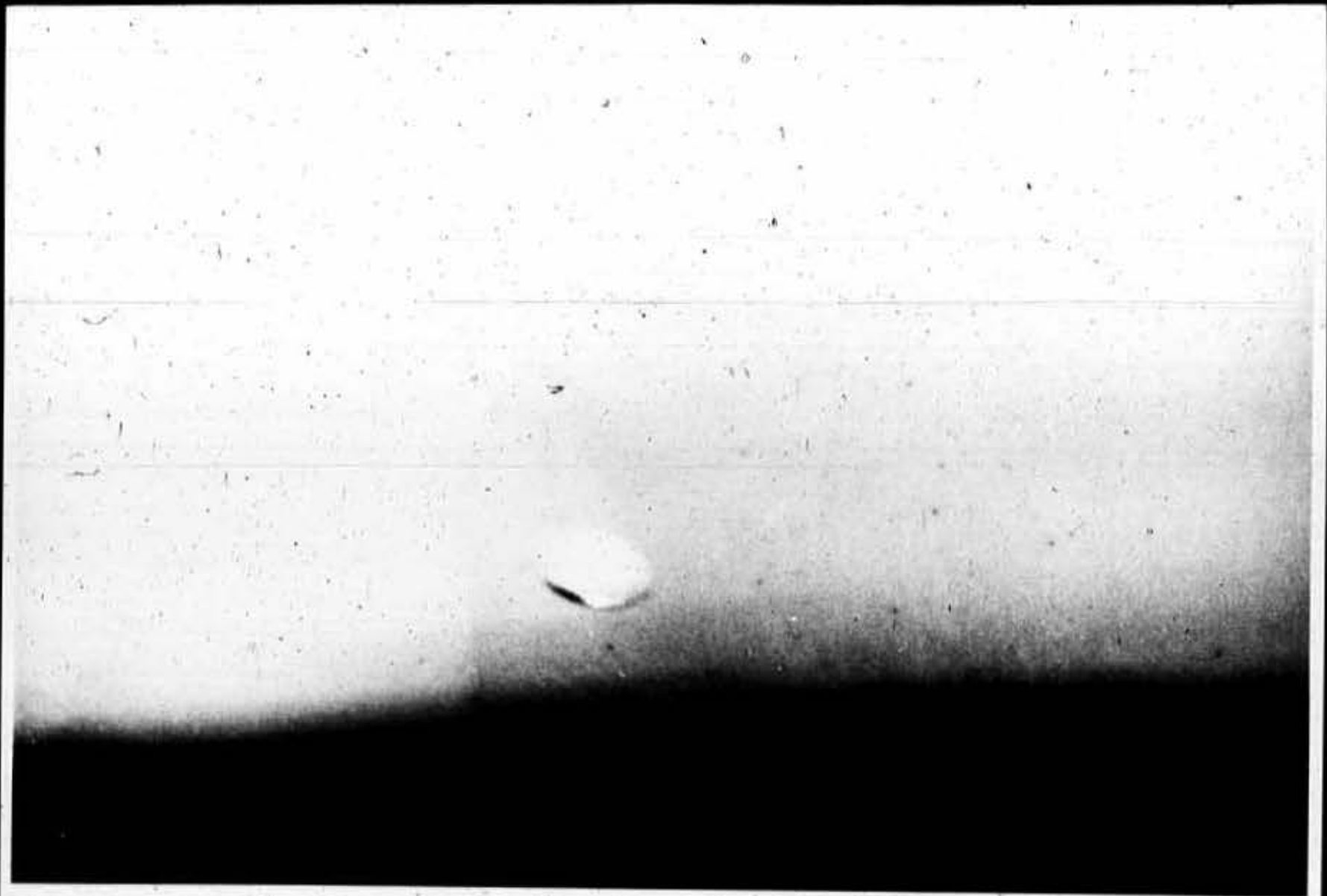
He said there would be no way of knowing if the object had appeared on the base's radar screens, since the base monitors for air traffic control only.

- (F) UFO travelling approx. 500 ft. from ground, speed varied according to speed of DUPRENSE vehicle. Main UFO appeared to split into groups of 3 and 6 at random. Main UFO appeared Black with no lights and made no noise. UFO accelerated away from DUPRENSE vehicle travelling 85 m.p.h.
- (G) Sighting lasted approx. 1 hour. UFO last seen heading North West toward Footner Lake Airport, 7 miles North of High Level, Alberta.
- (H) Check with D.O.T. at Footner Lake Airport. No Incoming traffic. One light aircraft left airport 5:30 a.m. 26 MAY 72. Afore mentioned people sighting UFO local residents add reliable. Reports to follow.

APPENDIX 1

STATEMENT OF: Earl R. ANDERSON
5:00 P.M. 26 MAY 72
High Level, Alberta

"On 26 MAY 72 Robert ASHMEAD, Andrew DUFRENSE and myself were proceeding North on Highway 35 toward High Level from Paddle Prairie. At approx. 2:00 a.m. and 5 miles north of Paddle Prairie, Andrew DUFRENSE observed on the right of the Highway, approx. 500 yds. away and approx. 500 ft. high, a black object, round in shape, travelling at approx. 60 m.p.h. which was the same speed as our vehicle was travelling.

After DUFRENSE first observed the object, both ASHMEAD and myself also observed the object. We increased our speed to approx. 85 m.p.h. and the object would move away from us until we ran out of power and then it would seem to come back towards us but never getting behind us. The object seemed to be moving from one side of the road to the other at random.

Approx. 15 miles south of High Level, we used the truck radio to contact Mr. Lee MURPHY, our boss, to come out and see the object. MURPHY lives approx. one block from the High Level Skating Rink towards the North. The object continued to lead us into High Level and then we proceeded to the MURPHY residence where both Mr. and Mrs. MURPHY had observed the object.

We had the object in sight all the way to the MURPHY'S residence. We all observed the object at the MURPHY residence and then it left quickly heading North West in the direction of Footner Lake Airport.

When I arrived home, I went and got my Binoculars and by the time I got out again, it was gone."

STATEMENT OF: Robert ASHMEAD of High Level, Alberta
Taken: 9:50 P.M. 28 MAY 72 at High Level, Alberta

" We first observed one UFO at about 2:00 a.m. 26 MAY 72. It was approx. 200 to 500 yds. away to the right and about 500 to 1000 feet off of the ground. It would move away from us, but it would keep at approx. the same height all of the time. The object stayed at approx. the same speed as the vehicle that we were in, but the object would always be ahead of us. It disappeared ahead of us a few times but it always seemed to wait on us.

When we hit the pavement 10 miles south of High Level, we increased the speed of our vehicle to 85 m.p.h. and the object accelerated away from us. It continued to move at different speeds, approx. the same speed as our vehicle all the time.

It began to divide into pieces of 2, 3, 4, or 5 as we approached town. We then proceeded to Mr. Lee MURPHY'S residence. We had already waken the MURPHYS via the portable radio in the truck. At the MURPHY residence, all 5 of us observed the objects, which at this time were 4 or 5 in number.

At the time of the sighting, the sky was fairly clear and it was just getting daylight. At times the objects appeared to resemble clouds.

The objects appeared to be oblong in shape. They moved quickly and had no lights and as far as we could determine, had no noise. At times the object appeared to have a tail first on the right and then on the left.

I had consumed approx. 1 dozen beer from noon 25 MAY 72 until the sighting at 2:00 a.m. 26 MAY 72.

"On 26 MAY 72 at approx. 2:15 a.m., Robert ASHMEAD contacted us on the portable radio in the truck that ASHMEAD, ANDERSON, and DUPRENSE were riding in.

ASHMEAD had exclaimed to Lee MURPHY, "Now I believe in UFOS." He then went on to explain to MURPHY about their sighting the objects. ASHMEAD and the other two occupants of the truck arrived at the MURPHY residence at approx. 2:30 a.m.

When the incident occurred, it was almost dawn and fairly clear out.

We were waiting in the front area of our house when we observed the objects. We saw the objects first in the West. There appeared to be three objects when we first saw them. 2 of them appeared to be close together and one was by itself. They were approx. 500 to 1000 ft. from the ground.

All three of the objects appeared to be oblong in shape. They made a grayish-black outline against the sky. They made no noise and had no lights.

The objects seemed to appear and disappear and move around alot.

We had been in bed for about three hours and had not been drinking on that evening.

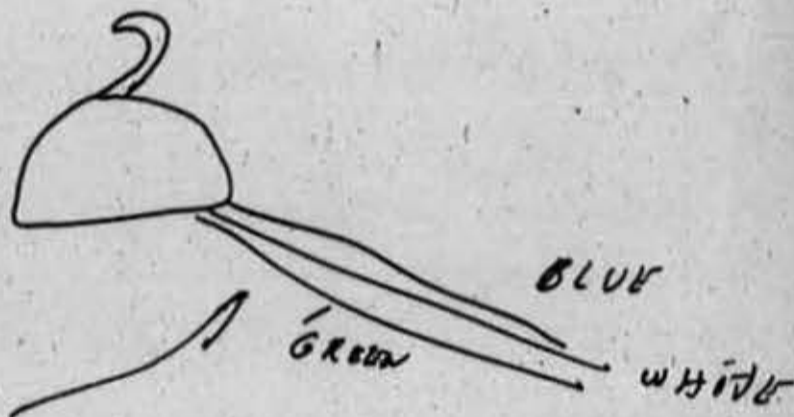

More sightings of UFOs reported

Residents of the Glen Cairn-Kanata area reported seeing strange objects in the sky early today, less than a week after similar sightings at Campbells Bay.

A Glen Cairn housewife reported she saw an arrow-shaped object — red and green in color — in the sky early this morning. She said she watched it for about half an hour before it disappeared.

GPP at Bells Corners said that between 1 and 2.30 a.m. they received six calls from people who reported the object.

Police said some may have been crank calls but most

seemed legitimate. A spokesman at the weather office said the sightings may have been the "northern lights" or "balls of lightning."

Last week's lights in the sky above Campbells Bay, described by residents as unidentified fly-

ing objects, remain unexplained today.

The "bright orange light" was observed on four consecutive occasions about an hour after midnight.

A theory that the sightings were reflections from a welder's machine at the Pontiac Transit Mix gravel pit was denied by owner Lawson Smith.

"The light from the welder could resemble the one these people described but last week we were welding only on Wednesday night," said Mr. Smith. "We never weld after midnight."

The welding equipment is

used to "build up" worn steel rollers on a rock crusher.

"It makes a bright, yellow light," said Mr. Smith.

Two residents who saw the strange light described it as orange.

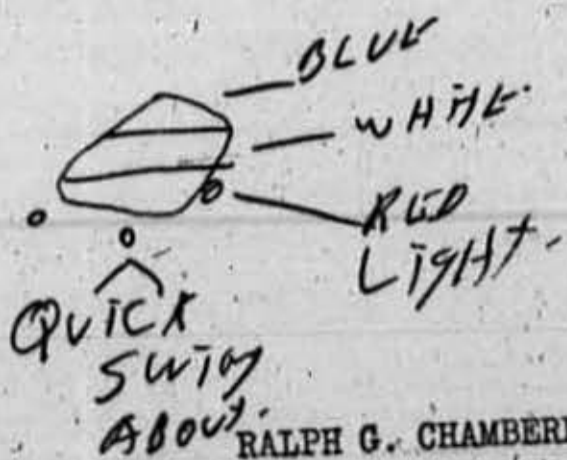
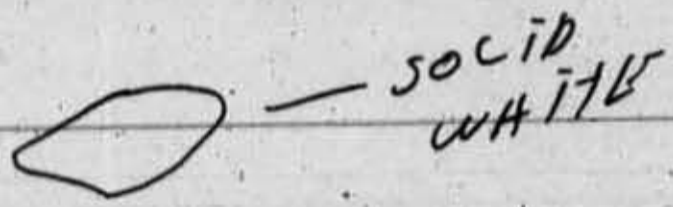

1. At approx. 10:30 P.M. this date Mr. Robert H. ROSS 4905 Hampton Ave., Montreal, P.Q. and Miss Christine HAYWARD, 128 Queens Road, Sackville, N.B. came to this office and report sighting an object which was displaying a very bright white light with a smaller red light directly behind it travelling in a north easterly direction over Sackville.

2. The object appeared to be travelling at an altitude of between 800 and 1000 feet and at a speed of approx. 80 M.P.H. Subjects watched object for approx. 2 or 3 minutes until it slowly descended from sight on the north side of Sackville. They stated they heard no noise from the object.

3. The Moncton Airport was contacted and they advised that there was no air traffic in the area at that altitude during the time of the sighting.

4. Both subjects appeared to be reliable an investigation failed to show that their report was a hoax. No other persons in the Sackville area reported sighting the object.

5. Sackville Detachment Message No. 126 was sent to N.R.C. Meteor Centre info Canforcehed and the Commissioner, Ottawa.

1. On the above date at approx. 12:15 A.M. a call was received from a subject who identified himself as Orville STEFANSON who resides at Lot 49 Parish of St. Clements, R.M. of St. Andrews, Man. STEFANSON advised the member taking the call that they had sighted an unidentified flying object and wished members to attend at his farm. An immediate patrol was made to the STEFANSON residence.
2. Upon arriving at the STEFANSON residence the members were greeted by the two c/n subjects. The extent of their story is as follows: At approx. 12:10 A.M. the lads who were sleeping in a bunk house near the main farm building heard a low toned and throbbing noise. The subjects walked from the bunk house towards the house and were looking up in the sky at that point which was quite clear. It was then that they noticed a bright object, that of a star, multi-coloured, crossing the sky in a southerly direction. The object was taking a sharp zig-zagged pattern, very distinct, and then stopped, 4-5 seconds, then took a distinct 90° course proceeding west and out of sight. When asked as to altitude, the boys could not state definitely other than object was like a bright star, multi-coloured, and had no idea how high it was. The subjects were questioned for a lengthy period of time and during this time, it was suggested that it could have been an aircraft, helicopter or a jet aircraft. Both subjects state definitely that it was not either as they have both seen helicopters and jet aircraft within the Selkirk area. Both subjects were quite visibly shaken and at this time there was some doubt in the writer's opinion, as to their reliability. In all, their assessment of the situation appeared rather vague.



3. Numerous enquiries have been made within the district of any other persons sighting a U.F.O. but all met negative results. It might be noted at this time, the STEFANSON residence is approx. 1½ miles west of the Town of Selkirk in a farming area. Also on the night in question there were some thunder-clouds to the south of Selkirk, estimated distance of 15 miles. The sky above the STEFANSON residence and surrounding area was considered quite clear.

4.  It is also known in this area that it is a flight lane of commercial aircraft and in view of this it is believed what they reported as a U.F.O. was in fact a low flying aircraft. Some doubt is cast upon this report as no other individuals had reported a sighting of this nature, as approx. 20,000 people reside within Selkirk and district, therefore the report will be shown as noted hereunder. Extra copies of this report being attached for Headquarters Ottawa.

After Car's Systems Shorted, He 'Saw' UFO

WAUKESHA (AP) — An 18-year-old Sussex youth reported sighting an unidentified flying object after the electrical system in his car shorted early Monday and the Waukesha County Sheriff's Department wasn't discounting the report.

"He seemed real sincere, he was really shaken," Sgt. Herman Sprung said. "We sent officers to check his car and its condition was as he reported it."

Greg Faltersack told officers he was driving home from visiting his girlfriend about 2:30 a.m. on county roads in the northeastern part of Waukesha County when his lights went dead. He said there was a complete electrical failure and as he applied his brakes, he skidded 23 feet.

He told officers when he got out of the car he looked up and saw a large, orange object, about 20 feet in diameter, hovering about 40 feet above him at tree-top level.

The object went, "Beep, beep" then disappeared from

sight, Faltersack said.

He said the water in his car had boiled over and the fuse box had been blown out. He managed to drive home where he called officers.

"Everything he described was there — the skid marks, the blown fuse box," Sprung said. "Faltersack hadn't been drinking and we're not discounting this as a hoax."

At approximately 9:30 pm of the above date, the captioned individual telephoned this detachment to report that a shortwhile ago she and her 18 year old daughter Mary saw what they thought to be a U.F.O. in the sky. She further advised, it appeared to be a very bright whitish star with pulsating white light with bright red flashing light on top at times. She stated it left in the general direction of Port Elgin, N.B.
2. I left detachment in police transport and upon reaching the intersection of the Moore Road and Highway 16 on the outskirts of the village I could see the object as described by Mrs. DEAN. It was stationary in the sky and stayed so for approximately one hour. I first saw it at 10:10 pm AST. It seemed to be at a high altitude in a somewhat cloudy sky. Cst. Terry STILWELL of the Port Elgin Village Police happened along as I was viewing the object and saw same. It appeared to depart in a westerly direction.

19 SEP 72

3. At approximately 1:15 am of the above date, while on patrol to Cape Tormentine, N.B. I again saw the object, which departed in a north easternly direction towards Prince Edward Island. There would be a distance of approximately 12 miles between the 2 sightings.
4. Radiogram No. 74 was forwarded in this connection.
5. Persons viewing this object are all considered reliable at this point.

6. At approximately 9:45 pm of the above date Mrs. DEAN telephoned this detachment to report that she had just seen the object again and it had departed in the direction of Port Elgin, N.B. She said it appeared to be quite high in the sky and the weather was somewhat cloudy.

8. On the first sighting I caused checks to be made at Summerside C.F.B. and Chatham C.F.B. These were met with negative results.

On the 27 SEP 72, information was received at "A" Division Desk from Cst. Ralph THORHAUGE, member of our Force that his wife had sighted a U.F.O. in the western area of Ottawa.

2. I interviewed Mrs. THORHAUGE on 28 SEP 72 and the following details were obtained. She was in her residence, 25 Saginaw Crescent, Ottawa and happened to look through the study room window facing the western direction. She sighted a very bright light in an oval shape in the sky. She observed this object for five minutes and then called her neighbour, Mrs. Leigh ANDERSON. Mrs. ANDERSON was accompanied by her husband who also is a member of the Force; both ANDERSONS looked through their residence window and spotted this U.F.O. The same description of the U.F.O. was obtained from the ANDERSONS. The observers were not able to determine an approximate altitude of the U.F.O. but at the time the sky was clear and the approximate time of sighting was between 6:45 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. on 27 SEP 72, Eastern Daylight Time.

3. The U.F.O. was sighted in the western direction and from the observers' point of view, the U.F.O. slightly was descending toward the southerly direction. The U.F.O. disappeared from the sight of the observers at approximately 7:00 p.m.

4. All observers who reported sighting this U.F.O. are believed to be reliable sources.

STATEMENT OF Marion GOFORTH (B. 11 MAR 34)

"On the 22 SEP 72 at approx. 10:45 PM I was with my husband Jimmy. We were driving south on a road from Junior TUCKANO's place. I saw what appeared to be a helicopter coming from the east at a high rate of speed. It came closer to us and then dropped down. We got out of the car close to our place but we could not hear anything. It was shaped like an egg. It looked like it had two red lights on it one on each side. It was glowing like a star. I figure we watched it for about 15 minutes. It then turned south and we didn't think anymore about it. I did not see it again."

- At approximately 5 A.M. 29 OCT 72, one Nelson CRAIGIE (BD: 8-5-40) of 236 8th Street, New Westminster, B.C. reported the movement of a U.F.O. CRAIGIE, a taxi driver, informed that he and his wife had driven up from New Westminster, B.C. that evening and at approximately 4:00 A.M. this date had been proceeding east on the Horse Lake Road, 7 miles from 100 Mile House, when he sighted an object in the sky.
- The object was observed for approximately one hour and during this time it was hovering, swaying, and occasionally ascending. CRAIGIE described the object as oval shaped, approximately 20' in length, 5' in depth, very bright with the occasional colour of red and green showing. No sound was heard. At one time the object was approximately 1000 feet from the ground.
- After sometime CRAIGIE reported this matter at this office and pointed out the object to the guard, Otto AUGUSTINE of 100 Mile House, B.C. When questioned AUGUSTINE confirmed that he had seen the same object as CRAIGIE.
- AUGUSTINE called the writer and also pointed same out to me however, by the time it only appeared to be a star of more brilliance than the others. This was sighted between the moon and the large dipper approx. 8:00 o'clock position from the moon. This member did not notice any movement or any colour change. And when it was observed through a telescope it was round in shape. This object was still in sight when the remainder of the other stars had disappeared and it appeared to be a considerable distance away.
- Both CRAIGIE and AUGUSTINE were in a normal state of mind and it is this writer's opinion that they definitely saw some kind of object at a much lower altitude.
- Due to the foregoing, no further action is being taken at this time. Message was dispatched in accordance with existing instructions. Copy of this report direct to Upper Atmosphere Research Section Astrophysics Branch, National Research Council, Ottawa, Ontario.



1. On this date, Mr. Zolton PATAKFALVY contacted this office to advise that approximately 7:43 PM, he had observed an illuminated canister-type object with a vapour or smoke tail which was also illuminated. The object fell to the ground at approximately a 35 to 40 degrees angle. This object was seen for a time lapse of 2½ to 3 seconds. Mr. PATAKFALVY, at the time of the sighting, was walking his dog approximately four miles northwest of the Calgary International Airport.

2. Mr. Dave CARTHEW was contacted at the Calgary International Airport Tower; he advised that they did not have any unusual occurrences during the evening. The weather station, which is located at the Calgary Airport, did not release any weather balloons during the time of the sighting. Calgary Detachment telex message CDET 22 was dispatched to the National Research Council Meteor Centre, Ottawa, Ontario.

10 JAN 73

3. It was learned that Jet Air, Calgary, Alberta were flying four prop planes at low altitude within the area of the sighting. Jet Air pilot, Captain Glen LONG, was contacted and he stated the crew and himself did not witness any unusual sightings. Captain LONG did, however, give a logical explanation as to how a possible sighting as described by PATAKFALVY could have occurred. At the time of the sighting, Captain LONG and crew were practising firing and flying with one and two engines. He stated that an exercise of this nature carried out during the right atmospheric conditions could produce a vapour or illuminated smoke tail as witnessed by Mr. PATAKFALVY.

4. The following statement was obtained from Mr. PATAKFALVY:

STATEMENT OF: Zolton PATAKFALVY (B: 14 SEP 35). Taken at
Calgary, Alta. 12 JAN 73 at 1:45 PM

"While walking my dog on January 9th, 1973 at 7:43 PM, I saw an object in the sky. The location in sky would be, as my judgement, about 5 to 10 miles north of the city limit in conjunction with Travois Place N.W., where I was standing at the moment of this sighting. The object was seen by me for about 2 or 2½ second duration and it was traversing the sky in about 35 to 40 degrees angle from east to west. It appeared to me as cylindrical...

...CYLINDRICAL or canister type and was very brightly and definitely illuminated with a vapour or smoke tail closely attached and also illuminated by the object itself. The travelling height of object appeared to be twice the approaching height of an incoming plane. I have seen meteorites before but have not seen such an intensively illuminated as sharply outlined object in the sky which I could not clearly identify".

5. Lieutenant GUSCOTT of the Canadian Forces Base, Calgary, Alberta was contacted to establish whether or not any exercises were being carried out during the evening of the sighting; his reply was negative. During my conversation with PATAKFALVY, he stated that the sighted object appeared to be twice as high as any plane flying within the area of the sighting. There is a possibility that if there were exercises during the evening in question, the sighting could be a B-52 bomber flying at blackout conditions.

6. Mr. PATAKFALVY appeared to be a very responsible person and to be well-read. PATAKFALVY stated that he does not read books or writings on unidentified flying objects. As Mr. PATAKFALVY thought this occurrence to be rather odd, he felt it advisable to contact this office in order that we might try to ascertain the reason for the sighting, and its origin.

1. At 12:30 AM, Mrs. PHILLIPS contacted this office via telephone to report the sighting of an unidentified flying object between 10:40 PM and 10:50 PM MST, 10 FEB 73, over the Lake Bonavista Park area in southwest Calgary. She and her husband, Allan Vern PHILLIPS (B:28 JUL 36), including their son Grant PHILLIPS (12 years), were travelling in their vehicle at a slow rate of speed on Lake Bonavista Road when they observed two large lights, one being white and the other red in colour, low in the southern sky. Their view was momentarily obstructed by houses but the object again came into view when they approached Lake Bonavista. The object was observed to be hovering approximately one hundred feet above ground level. The lights were noted as being unusually large, possibly twelve inches in diameter and to emit a constant and brilliant beam. They were estimated to be spaced approximately twelve to fifteen feet apart and between was observed a long silver grey bar or strip. The outer hull of the object could not be distinguished because of the intensity or brightness from the lights, also the atmosphere was illuminated to a certain degree by neighbouring residences but not enough to affect good vision. A rear window was lowered in the vehicle for a little better vision and at this time, it was noted that no noise could be heard coming from the object. In fact, at no time was there any noise heard. After viewing the object for a few minutes, it switched on two more powerful white lights which were placed above and below the first white light. The object they noticed moved slowly in an easterly direction, turned and with a great burst of speed, headed in a northwesterly direction towards the centre of Calgary, staying at the same altitude until it disappeared. The PHILLIPS family remained in their vehicle during the whole sequence which was estimated to be between eight to ten minutes. They did not see anyone else who observed the object.

2. Calgary Detachment Telex Message CDET 143 was dispatched as per Operational Instruction CO-NRC to the National Research Council Meteor Centre, Ottawa.

3. An enquiry was conducted with the Calgary City Police and they reported that no complaints were received during the evening 10 FEB 73. Checks were made with all the small airline and helicopter companies with negative results. Most companies had no flights in the air during the time in question. All commercial helicopter aircraft are not allowed to fly at night...

...NIGHT in this area except for the Military. Major Myron JOHNSTON, Commanding Officer, #1 Tactical Control Air Control Unit, Canadian Forces Base, Currie Barracks, Calgary, Alberta stated that he had no military aircraft in the area or in fact flying. A check with the major airline companies revealed that two Canadian Pacific Airline Boeing 727 jets and one Pacific Western Airline Boeing 727 jet flew low over the Lake Bonavista area during the times in question. The planes were using runway #34 south approach at McCall Field, Calgary International Airport and therefore, they had to use this area for the approach. Pacific Western Airlines stated that their plane had to come in slow because of heavy air traffic using the runway, as a result slowing down below normal procedures. A Boeing 727 jet has three white landing lights and one red which is on top. This type of plane also has strob lights, red and green, on the wing tips and one small white light of navigation type on the back. There is the possibility these lights were not turned on or were at an angle where they could not be seen. There was an ice crystal condition in the atmosphere and the brightness of the landing lights may have caused a reflection of the light on the ice particles causing a projection, thus giving the stationary or hovering effect. Only when the plane got close would movement be noticed.

4. Several checks were made with Air Traffic Control Tower, Calgary International Airport, but they had no knowledge of any unidentified flying objects. They confirmed several major airline flights coming in around 10:40 PM, 10 FEB 73 and over the Lake Bonavista area.

5. At 10:00 AM, 10 FEB 73, the Climatologist report for the Calgary International Airport was middle cloud, partially obscured surface with light snow, visibility three or four miles, wind north at 14 m.p.h., temperature eight degrees above zero, 800 feet scattered and 7,000 feet broken.

6. Statements were obtained from Delores PHILLIPS (Appendix "A") and Allan Vern PHILLIPS (Appendix "B") which are attached hereto, original copies held on file. A statement was not obtained from Grant PHILLIPS because of his age and lack of maturity. Also attached is a rough copy of a drawing depicting the general area of occurrence and the U.F.O.

7. The PHILLIPS family appeared sincere in the sighting, being awed by the strangeness of the encounter. They appear to be an average family of low income but fairly close-knit. Both parents gave their version of the sighting in almost identical stories. The fact that several commercial jets flew over the area was mentioned but they both declined to...

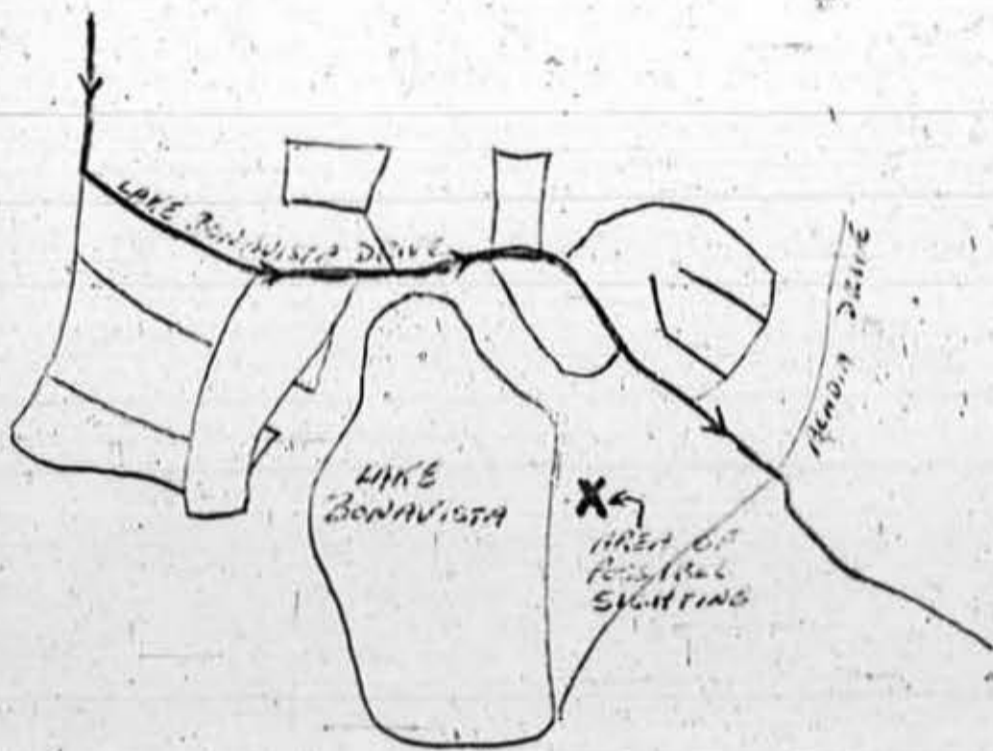

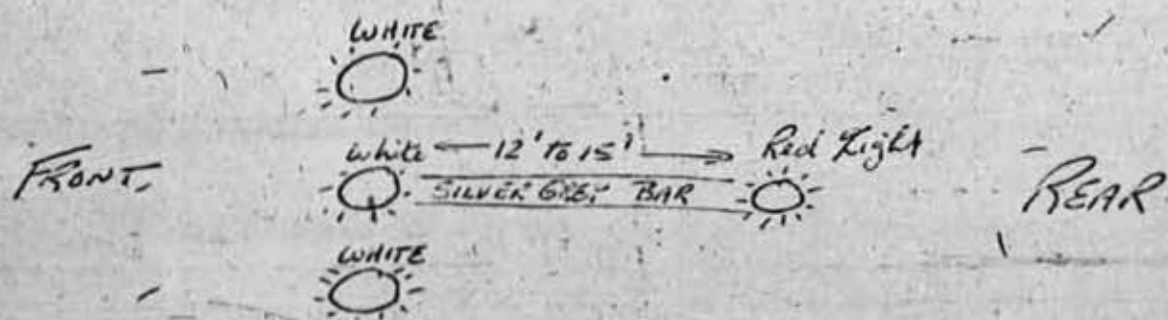

1. This date at 6:30 PM, NST, I was driving from my home in Carbonear and had just started to proceed along the new highway towards Harbour Grace. As I travelled up the road I noticed to my left in the sky an object, white in colour, travelling in a north-westerly direction. As this did not appear to me to be an airplane or the like, I pulled my car in to the side of the road and stopped.

2. Upon turning off my motor and rolling down my window, I had an excellent view of this object. The condition of the sky was very clear. As mentioned previously, this object appeared white in colour, like the white of a star, to the naked eye. This object appeared two or three times larger than a star and there were no other colours visible. This object was moving in a straight line staying relatively parallel to the earth. The sighting lasted approximately one minute. The object either got out of sight or just disappeared as it could be seen one second and then vanished the next. There was no sound to be heard coming from this object and there was no trail or other material moving behind or around it. The light coming from this object appeared to pulsate erratically and at no time did it go out completely.

3. I immediately checked the airport at St. John's and it was learned from that point that there should not have been any other object in the vicinity of Carbonear at the pertinent time of 6:30 PM. The R.C.M.P. helicopter MPZ was landing at the airport in St. John's at approximately this time, however, their direction of travel was directly opposite to the object which was sighted.

4. I was the only known witness to this sighting and at the time I called via our radio system to Cst. G. WEST to have him look in the direction of Carbonear to see if he could sight the object, however, by the time he got outside, the object was apparently gone.

5. I have been with the R.C.M.P. for thirteen years of which most of my police time was consumed on criminal investigations and one and a half years as court prosecutor.

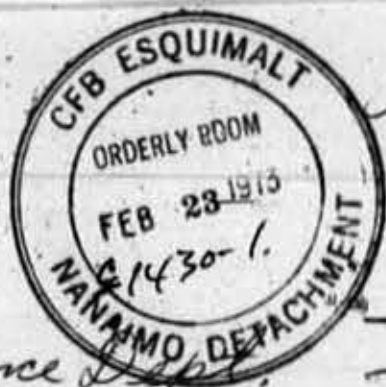

To whom it may concern

On Wednesday afternoon the 21st I telephoned your military camp to report a series of U.F.O. sightings which took place last September, October, November and the last sighting on December 2. I have yet heard no reply to my phone call on the 21st. I assure you I have all my faculties and I'm not trying to perpetrate a hoax. What I saw was definitely not an aircraft of any description. The objects were not reflections, astronomical or meteorological phenomenon of any kind. I wouldn't mistaken them for stars or planets for I'm an amateur astronomer and I would readily recognize them as such. These objects not only flew through the air with tremendous speed at times but also submerged below the surface of the water giving it an eerie glow.

I would like to report an unidentified object which appeared in the lower sickle of Leo on the night of April 28, 1973.

I have speculated that this object was receding from the Earth, because as it proceeded in a southerly direction, it slowed down in apparent motion and dimmed in apparent brightness.

Here are some of the statistics I have drawn from this phenomenon:

Observed with the unaided eye, apparent diameter determined from short look through binoculars.

1. No sound accompanied trail.
2. Color: blue/white.
3. Apparent diameter: 5 seconds of arc, same as nearby Regulus, in Leo.
4. Beginning of trail: April 28th, 8:58 EST; April 29th, 1:58 UT
5. End of trail: April 28th, 9:06:40 EST; April 29th, 2:06:40 UT
6. Duration of trail: 8 minutes, 40 seconds.
7. Rate, average: approx. 1° per minute.
8. Beginning of trail observed immediately after cloud break, may have begun before mentioned time and place.
9. Brightest magnitude: + 1.7.
10. Observed beginning of trail: Dec. 15° North, RA 9h 45 min..

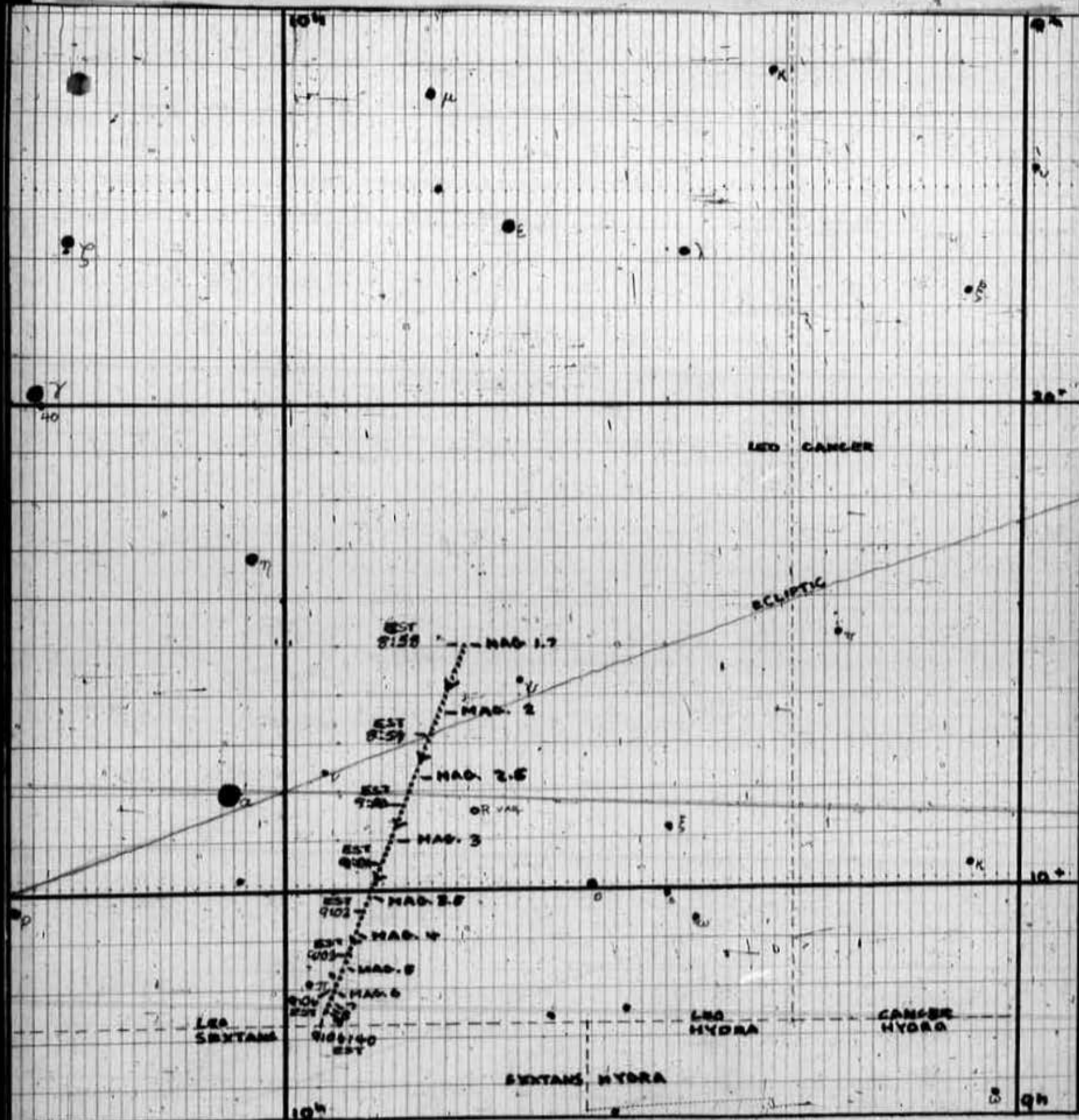



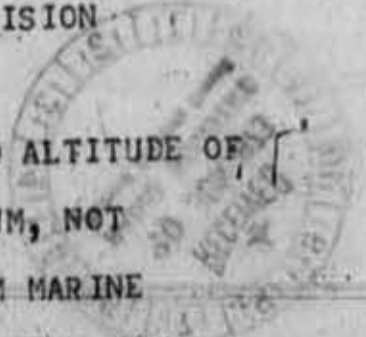

The following is the substance of a report dated 15 June 73 submitted by Cst. M.D. LEAMAN of our Fort Frances Detachment, Ontario.

"At approximately 3:30 P.M., 13 June 73, S. BURGHARDT of the Ministry of Natural Resources, Fort Frances, Ontario called this office to report that a resident of Fort Frances, Mrs. Helen CORAN, had heard what she thought was a meteorite. The location given by BURGHARDT was east of Lloyd's Tug Service, 315 Armit Ave., Fort Frances, Ontario. The suspected landing site was on the bank of the Rainy River in approximately 2' of water.

... attended the scene and found two holes, the smaller of the two being approximately 50' east of Lloyd's Tug Service and the larger approximately 25' further east.

The larger hole was approximately 6' wide and 8' long running lengthwise from east to west, the east end being shallower than the west. The ground on the west lip of the hole was pushed up to form a ridge approximately 8" high and 6" through, indicating possible entry from east to west. The smaller hole was approximately 5' in diameter and more uniform in shape and both holes were approximately 2½' deep.



The following morning her son discovered the above mentioned holes, which are approximately 200' from the CORAN residence. Mrs. CORAN also advised that her son indicated to her that the holes had not been there the previous day.

On the 15 June 73, with the use of skin diving equipment both holes, as well as surrounding area were searched by myself. The search proved negative although the possibility exists that the object is embedded in the river bottom. Further investigation proved negative."

Dear Mrs. Jonas:

In reply to your letter regarding an unusual sighting on the evening of July 29, I believe I can answer your questions.

A group of scientific and technical staff from NRC, including myself were driving south on highway 31 at the time you mention. This group has been observing and photographing the night sky for many years and we are used to evaluating lights in the night sky. People in two different cars reported seeing a bright light such as you describe and when we reached the Observatory the comment was made that others would surely report seeing this unusual light.

It was observed by at least one person to be a DC 9 aircraft, circling while waiting to land at Ottawa and with all its landing lights turned on. It is not normal for an aircraft to fly so low and with landing lights on so that is why we suggest that it was circling while waiting to land. We all agree that your description of an extremely bright light with rays shining out in one direction, sometimes appearing to be still and sometimes moving low over the trees, describes very well what we saw too. The human eye often interprets unusual things in terms of more familiar objects and the three bright windows could

have been the three landing lights appearing separately as the aircraft turned towards you.

I hope you find this to be a reasonable explanation.
