At 11:25 p.m. Pacific Standard time above date, a call was received from CUNNINGHAM, who was at her home at 1103 Fir St., Porter Creek, a distance of approx. 5½ miles northwest of the detachment office in downtown Whitehorse. She stated that at approx. 10:50 p.m., she had spotted a bright object in the sky moving southward, east of the city. This object hesitated, moved north and then south again. It appeared to be moving quite slowly and at times hovered in one spot. It was last seen, at the time of her call, at what appeared to be a much higher altitude than when first sighted.

CUNNINGHAM reports that the object, when viewed through binoculars, appeared to be cigar shaped with a flame shooting out of one end.

No other sightings were reported, however CUNNINGHAM was in a stable frame of mind and thought to be reliable.

Inquiries were made with the Atmospheric Environment Service and the airport and no explanation could be provided from them.

Telex was dispatched to the National Research Council, Meteor Centre, Ottawa. No further information is available from this point.

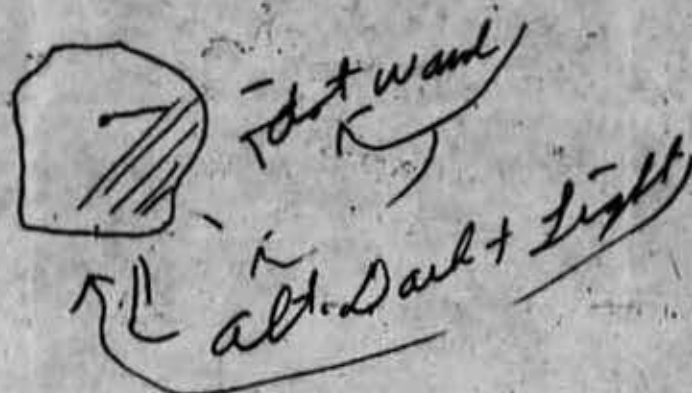

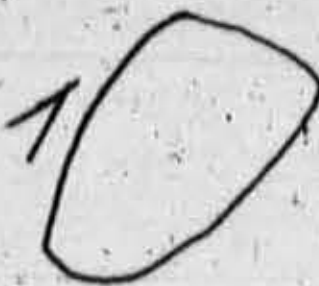

Inter-Galactic Trip to Earth Improbable—Who'd Want To?

There are more than a few problems in believing recent accounts that we are being visited by flying saucers from outer space.

For one thing it presumes there is life elsewhere smart enough to build spacecraft to get here, but dumb enough to think it's important to come.

REMEMBER YOUR eighth grade science teacher who told you that if the earth were a pea and the moon a grain of salt the sun would be a basketball down the block?

Well he was right. And what he didn't tell you was that the nearest star other than the sun would be represented by a fat lady in Alice Springs, Australia.

Beyond that it's unlikely the fat lady would have any planets in her orbit capable of supporting life. They would likely be too hot or too cold. Scientists do believe there are planets with intelligent life on them, but the nearest one is probably 100 to 1,500 light years away—meaning that if you went like lightning it would still take you hundreds of years to get there.

Put simply, the distances between the stars are so vast that one cannot get there from here—not now, and probably not ever.

BUT FROM watching TV and reading science fiction many people have come to believe that traveling to the stars is sort of like traveling to the moon. You simply pack a few oxygen tanks and peanut butter sandwiches and politely ask Mr. Spock to accelerate to "Warp 3."

It's not. The reason they used such a meaningless term as "warp" to describe speed on Star Trek was probably to save the show's science adviser from being carted off to the laughing academy.

Albert Einstein, a noted Swiss ex-patent office clerk and mathematician, became famous when he discovered the last word in speed limits. It's 660,000,000 miles an hour. Nothing except light goes that fast.

Einstein showed that as an object's speed increases so does its weight and so does the amount of energy required to make it go even faster.

Objects, be they rocket ships, speeding bullets or Democrats sprinting through Grosse Pointe, cannot reach a speed of 660,000,000 m.p.h. because it would take an infinite amount of energy to get them going that fast.

Even a 60-billion-volt atomic accelerator can only get a single electron up to about 99.9 percent the speed of light. And an electron is so light-weight that if the fat lady in Australia were a grain of salt her toenail clippings would weigh as much as thousands of electrons.

CONSEQUENTLY, getting even a peanut butter sandwich up to half the speed of light would require an unspeakable amount of energy. A whole spacecraft would take considerably more.

Our moon rockets only hit about 28,000 m.p.h. That is about zero zero zero four (.0004) percent the speed of light.

Even in the event that someone managed to stuff a star the size of our sun into an oversized seltzer bottle to get enough horsepower to hit half the speed of light, it would still take them between 200 and 2,000 years to get here.

If they really have arrived here this week they have been a long time coming. Imagine their disappointment. Generations of them—if they live a normal carbon-based organic life span as we do—have lived and died in space patiently passing on their culture and technology.

Perhaps the dead were recycled to fertilize the self-contained life support system if they haven't developed a relatively small life support system they probably had to bring almost the entire atmosphere and food supply of their planet with them.

BUT SUPPOSE again that they did it, that some psychopathic civilization managed to harness the energy of four or five stars and launched a colony the size of Keokuk, Iowa, which has spent 300 years consuming surrogate peanut butter intravenously, while whizzing through space at 12,000 times the speed of the Apollo command module.

Then they had to somehow slip this fetched-from-afar monstrosity into our solar sys-

tem when none of our radio telescopes were looking, and hide it behind the sun. Then some of the inmates of a small bottle craft down to earth there to interview two bewildered fishermen near Pascagoula, Mississippi.

Perhaps the spinal compression and motion sickness from all the acceleration and deceleration accounts for why they are described as short and green.

On the way back to the larger spacecraft the little green men passed briefly to terrorize the governor of Ohio terrorizing government officials may be a religious sacra-

ment in their culture, understand) and by now have settled into the 100-year-long joint home.

If the acceleration doesn't smash them flat and if their moored truck farm doesn't get corn blight or Dutch Elm disease, they will return to their planet after a 600-year absence and tell the home folk all about the planet-of-the-fish-eaters.

Police, Railmen See Flashing UFO

Two Detroit policemen and five central Michigan trainmen were on the job 50 miles apart when they looked up into the sky at 6:30 a.m. Sunday and said they saw huge spherical objects with flashing lights hovering above them.

Police officers Preston McBride and Charles Lain of the 12th Precinct were patrolling near Marygrove College, at Six Mile

and Wyoming when they said they saw a sphere-shaped UFO hovering over the schoolgrounds.

"There were two white flashing lights at first and then a third bright light came on followed by a flashing red light," they reported to their commanding officer.

They said the object hovered for about five minutes before speeding off towards the southwest.

The officers could not be reached Sunday for further comment.

A 12th Precinct spokesman described the two officers as "very reliable."

AT ABOUT THE same time as the Detroit sighting, the crew of an Apa Arbor Railroad freight train heading from Toledo to Owosso said they had the fright of their lives as they neared Dundee.

"All of a sudden there was this great big light in the sky," said a shaken brakeman, Thomas Manke, 20, of Owosso. "It was like a giant spotlight and hovered about 400 feet up just off to one side of the train."

Manke said they radioed the nearest train

tower operator about five miles away "and he looked out and saw it too."

Manke was quick to add: "This is no hoax. We'd take a lie detector test on this."

Manke said the UFO "was as big as a medium-sized house."

As the train moved closer to the hovering UFO Manke said the bright light went out "but there still was four red blinking lights, and then it took off in a northeasterly direction. I've never seen anything move so fast in my life."

It had hovered overhead for about seven minutes, he said.

At one point train conductor Dennis Mc-Kanich went out into the back platform of the stationary train to get a closer look.

"The lights were so bright he couldn't look at it," Manke related. "It scared the hell out of him. He ran back inside locked the door and grabbed a coal poker."

"I'm not saying this is a flying saucer, but it wasn't a helicopter or an airplane or a balloon or anything like that."

Part-Time Job Has New Status

NEW YORK — The part-time job: Once it was the stepchild of industry, the housewife's panacea for boredom, the breadwinner's source of supplemental income. Now, by virtue of a slow but steady revolution, the permanent (but less than 35-hour-a-week) position is beginning to achieve the status of career.

● For mothers, it offers the means of keeping a hand in the professional pie without

sacrificing the family.

● For recent college graduates, it is an escape hatch from the 9-to-5 trap.

● For corporations, which are under pressure to implement affirmative action programs, it provides a magnet for talented females.

● For some government officials, it is a potent weapon against discrimination in employment.

● For trend watchers, it signifies a change in society's values.

In 1962, 5.1 million Americans worked at year-round, less-than-35-hour-a-week jobs. In 1972, the latest year for which the Bureau of Labor Statistics has compiled data, those ranks had burgeoned to 6.5 million. "And women accounted for 80 percent of that increase," said Samuel Ehrenhalt, the Labor Department's deputy assistant regional director for labor statistics.

WHILE THE employment of part-time workers clearly is more than a noble experiment, it is still far from being an entrenched practice.

Large segments of industry, including the top five companies in the Fortune 500 list, adamantly resist bending their policies. Along with countless other business, they maintain that the need for continuity and the pressure of production deadlines mitigate against short shifts.

On the other hand, a growing number of companies are beginning to study claims by advocates of the part-time schedule that it offers savings in salaries and fringe benefits, fuller utilization of machinery and a larger pool of talent from which to draw. An added lure is the contention that the part-time worker provides greater productivity than his full-time counterpart.

Menzel was an adviser to the Air Force on Blue Book but unlike Hynek, whom he knows and respects, Menzel concurred in the decision to cancel the project.

"I have come to the conclusion that UFOs are nothing but natural phenomena, usually seen either under unusual conditions or seen by people who do not know how to recognize what they are seeing," he says.

Menzel has identified more than 100 natural phenomena which can produce the illusion of a flying object. They range from air inversions, in which cold air is trapped beneath layers of warmer air and distorts the images of heavenly bodies, to bad eyesight, which he believes is a factor in many UFO sightings.

"A few months ago, Venus, in the western sky, was very brilliant," Menzel says. "I was in Australia at the time, and it was widely reported as a UFO. Once it gets in the press, lots of people go out, and they all see it."

Ice crystals in the atmosphere can create what is called asundog effect. The ice crystals reflect false images of the sun or moon.

"This produces a peculiar, silvery object, with reddish tinge on the inside that makes it appear fire is shooting out," Menzel says. "Even the moon itself, especially when seen through some haze, has been reported as a UFO."

THEN THERE are the hoaxes, such as the report of a landing of a flying saucer in California's Death Valley in the late 1940s. Prospectors Buck Fitzgerald and Maze Garney said they chased two spacemen, neither more than two feet tall, but lost them in the dunes.

From Mexico, about the same time, came the report of a shepherd who had found six badly burned bodies, each about 2½ feet tall, in the wreckage of a silvery saucer in the Sierra Madre Mountains.

And Atlanta pranksters once shaved a monkey and cut off its tail, then claimed they ran over it with their truck before it could scamper aboard a departing saucer parked on the highway.

All were hoaxes. In the years of investigation by scientists and laymen alike, not one bolt or rivet from an extraterrestrial spacecraft has ever been found.

When the obviously shaken Hickson and Parker told their tale later that night.

Hickson and Parker were separated and questioned individually. The deputies could not shake their stories. Then the pair were placed in a cell together, while the deputies tape-recorded their conversation with a concealed microphone. Parker began praying.

"If they're lying," Ryder said later, "they oughta be in Hollywood."

Dr. James Harder of the University of California at Berkeley, who assisted Hynek in examining the two men, believes their story.

"There is a good deal of supportive evidence," he says.

There were three other UFO sightings in the Pascagoula area that same night, but more important, Harder says, was the reaction of the two men under hypnosis. Their terror could not have been feigned, he says.

"If they had hallucinated," he says "it would be most remarkable if they had the same hallucination."

HARDER IS not a scientist. He teaches hydraulic engineering. But he has been pursuing UFO investigations for about 10 years as consultant to the Aerial Phenomena Research Organization (APRO) of Tucson, Ariz., best known of the nation's private UFO groups.

Dr. Hynek was scientific consultant to the Air Force from 1947 to 1969 in its famous Project Blue Book investigation of UFOs.

After spending 22 years investigating 12,618 UFO sightings, the Air Force concluded there was no justification for further study and closed its files in 1969.

Hynek disagrees with that decision and regards the Air Force investigations as shallow.

Writing in the June issue of Science Digest, Hynek said that even the more bizarre reports, in which a figure is reported aboard or near the UFO, cannot be disregarded.

"They are too numerous," he wrote.

Hynek recommends establishing an institute, staffed by interested scientists, to study UFOs.

Currently there are only informal UFO organizations, such as the non-profit APRO, which has been chasing down UFO reports since 1952.

APRO has a small permanent staff, plus 489 volunteer investigators, such as professor Harder, who research the approximately 1,000 reports received each year at the Tucson headquarters.

Mrs. Coral Lorenzen, APRO secretary-treasurer and wife of the organization's founder, James Lorenzen, keeps a log of all UFO reports that appear valid.

THE CURRENT flap, as UFO buffs call a flurry of sightings, began Aug. 31, when UFOs were reported in four south Georgia towns — Waycross, Camilla, Albany and Leesburg—and in nearby Phenix City, Ala.

Between then and Oct. 5, APRO logged 56 reports of UFOs, all but a few of them in the South. Mrs. Lorenzen says that, if anything, the sightings have increased since Oct. 5 but that she and her staff simply have been too busy to log them.

The most celebrated has been the Pascagoula incident. But Louisiana sheriff's deputies have told of chasing flying objects with their squad cars. Indiana farmers have reported strange lights following them home, and the governor of Ohio, John Gilligan, said he saw a UFO on a visit to Michigan last week.

Gilligan's report was only one of numerous sightings in Michigan. The Detroit police

received 24 calls reporting UFOs last Sunday night alone.

Twelve-year-old Beth Tyson and her brother, Dean, 10, watched from their yard on the near east side as what looked to them like a meteor shower crossed overhead.

Then both noticed other lights in the sky behaving peculiarly. Beth saw what looked like an oversized star "move, then stop, then move again." A red light would dim, then "brighten up like a flash."

That same evening, around sunset, Alvin and Persis Hayden watched a copper-colored UFO all the way from Port Huron to Mt. Clemens as they drove along I-94. Mrs. Hayden described the object as wedge shaped, with one side slightly rounded. But she said it would phase out, then reappear as a dot of light, grow gradually to a sphere, then assume its original form again.

"It was so close," she said.

Saudi Arabia and Algeria Cut Off All Oil to U.S.

Saudi Arabia and Algeria on Saturday cut off all oil exported to the United States, according to an official broadcast from the Saudi capital and a government statement from Algiers.

The Arab sheikhdom of Bahrain threatened to close down a tiny U.S. Navy base on its territory in the Persian Gulf

as another protest against U.S. aid to Israel in the Middle East war.

Both Saudi Arabia and Algeria said the embargoes were imposed because of U.S. military aid to Israel. The United States, which imports about 175 million barrels of oil each month, normally gets \$149,000 million barrels a

month from Saudi Arabia and 5,626,000 barrels a month from Algeria.

Both, like most other Arab oil producing countries, previously had announced small cuts in the amount of total oil production.

The announcements brought to five the number of Arab countries shutting off all oil exports to the United States,

meaning more than 20 million barrels of oil are being kept from the United States each month.

The others were Libya and the sheikhdoms of Abu Dhabi and Bahrain.

Libya normally ships 4,125,000 barrels of oil each month to the United States, and the United Arab Emirates

exported 2,162,000 barrels each month.

The Algerian Industry Ministry said that shipments to the United States before Saturday already had been "substantially reduced" after "the Israeli aggression against the Arab nations."

In Washington, the Navy said the base in Bahrain is the home port for only one ship,

the tender LaSalle. The ship serves a tiny force of two destroyers that cruise the Red Sea and Persian gulf.

Saudi Arabia said Friday it was cutting oil production 10 percent, a move that could seriously affect Japan and Western Europe. Britain and Japan get an estimated 20 percent of their petroleum from the Mideast.

After Saturday's total cutoff to the United States, Western Europe and Japan apparently were still under only a 10 percent reduction in the flow of Saudi oil. But Arabs apparently feel the pinch of U.S. allies will lead them to exert their influence on the United States to reduce its support of the Israelis.

stories, differed with Asimov, saying: "I would hesitate to be dogmatic on the face of it, it seems very unlikely. But it's possible."

Anderson said scientists who think any alien ships would have been detected would be wrong because "radar is always registering blips called angels which they can't account for and even if such a ship were picked up, a radar technician might not have any idea what it was."

"He might just dismiss it as another false blip."

"I have not seen one," said Robert A. Heinlein, whose book "Stranger in a Strange Land" dealt with a human returned to earth after being raised by aliens on another planet.

"But the evidence, as far as I've heard it, leads me to think there is something (to it) that is not easily explainable by our science, our technology of this year," Heinlein said.

FRANK HERRBERT, whose book, "Dune," is the current science fiction rave on college campuses, said

he saw something unexplainable some years ago in a California valley.

"I saw a red cone which, from the surrounding trees, was probably 30 feet high and 15 feet at the base," he said. "It looked like an ice cream cone upside down on the sidewalk."

Herbert, who lives near Seattle, said the cone had a metallic appearance and was viewed from about two miles away through binoculars. He said he turned around for a moment and it was gone.

"We went over the next day and saw some tram-

pled grass but no burn spot," Herbert said. "To me it's simply an unexplained phenomenon."

Herbert said "I take a scientific approach to it. We don't have anything proved one way or the other — we don't have enough data."

Ypsilanti social-science fiction writer Lloyd Biggle said while "there is no known explanation for all this, we have to have an air of cautious and alert skepticism."

"It would be a mistake to dismiss everything as impossible," Biggle said.

UFO Plot Thickens: Photos Awaited, Gardener Missing

The world must wait for photographic verification of the UFO sighting Thursday night in western Michigan until Manistee County Sheriff's Deputy John Gielczyk gets his pictures back from the drugstore.

"That won't be for several days," said a spokesman for the sheriff's department Saturday.

GIELCZYK is one of four deputies who say they

watched for more than an hour Thursday night while a squadron of UFOs three times the size of jumbo jets sped around over the Manistee County Airport.

New sightings were reported early Saturday north of Manistee in Benzie County, but no member of the Benzie County Sheriff's Department was able to personally confirm the sightings.

One report involved a space ship that hovered over an automobile shortly after bar-closing time, according to a spokesman for the department.

Meanwhile, Mrs. Thomas K. Fisher of Detroit said Saturday that the strange disappearance two weeks ago of her gardener from a vacation property near Manistee could conceivably have involved extraterrestrial "foul play."

Reports from the Manistee County Sheriff's Department and the Manistee State Police post indicate that Mrs. Fisher's gardener, Frysk Skipski, 54, of Manistee, disappeared about two weeks ago. Police

sources declined to link the disappearance to UFOs, however.

Mrs. Fisher said she had decided that UFOs were not out of the picture after "putting two and two together."

In an apparently related development, the Free Press was unable to confirm reports Saturday that a man who lives in the woods near Manistee in a house full of computers had recorded actual conversations of UFO crews passing over his property.

UFOs: Hoax, Illusion—or Real Thing?

The writings of Livy describe what may have been sightings of unidentified flying objects by the Romans in 218 B.C., and some scientists believe that the prophet Ezekiel's vision of "wheels within wheels" was a UFO experience.

But the modern era of UFOs began with a businessman and pilot from Boise, Idaho, named Kenneth Arnold, who reported seeing

nine saucer-like objects flying in formation on the slopes of Mt. Rainier in Washington state on June 24, 1947.

SINCE THEN, there have been an estimated 50,000 to 100,000 reports of disks, globes and other wingless craft seen hovering, spinning, drifting and streaking at unheard-of speeds across the skies, usually silently, performing maneuvers that no known aircraft could manage and that no human pilot could survive.

Pilots have died chasing these phantoms, and a worldwide media audience has devoured fantastic reports which a 1967 Gallup poll showed an astounding 46 percent of Americans believed.

None of the stories has been more bizarre than the report from Pascagoula on the Mississippi Gulf coast that two shipyard workers were taken aboard a strange craft on Oct. 11 by what appeared to be robots.

"These men had a very real experience," says Dr. J. Allen Hynek, chairman of the department of astronomy at Northwestern University and one of the nation's leading authorities on UFOs. "There is absolutely no indication that they are perpetrating a hoax or that a hoax was perpetrated on them."

He urged that the two men, Charles Hickson, 43, and Calvin Parker Jr., 19, not be ridiculed. After examining them while they were under hypnosis, Hynek said their stories were real.

As for his own conclusion about what actually happened in Pascagoula, Hynek said: "I wouldn't even attempt an explanation at this time."

THIS IS THE men's own story, as related by them to a Pascagoula newsmen, Murphy Givens.

While fishing at night in the Pascagoula River, only a few blocks from the downtown business district, the two men heard what Hickson described as "a zipping sound."

Turning, they saw hovering just above the

ground a glowing, oval-shaped craft about 5 feet high and 8 to 10 feet wide.

Three forms came drifting out. They were about 5 feet high, greyish, wrinkled, with claw-like hands and what the two fishermen took to be a head with pointed ears and nose and an opening where a mouth would be. There were no eyes, as such, only small slits above the nose. One figure emitted a soft buzzing sound.

A feeling of weightlessness came over Hickson and Parker as soon as they were touched on the shoulders by the creatures, and they had the sensation of drifting upward toward an opening in the craft.

That is the last thing Parker recalls, but Hickson remained conscious. He was floated into a separate compartment from Parker, and lay suspended a foot or two above the floor. As a shipbuilder, Hickson was struck by the absence of seams, rivets or corners of any kind. There was no furniture, and no light fixtures, although the interior was brightly lit.

A free-floating ball, somewhat smaller than a basketball, moved about his body as if photographing him; then the hovering figures glided him out.

As soon as the two fishermen were on the ground, the craft was gone in an instant.

TWO DISBELIEVING sheriff's deputies, Glenn Ryder and Barney Mathis, laughed.

Science Fiction Writers Wary Of UFO Tales

You would think the writers who have done the most to make people believe in flying saucers and beings from other planets would be the first to accept the stories of the Mississippi men who claim to have been aboard an actual UFO.

But if you think that, you're wrong. Prominent science fiction writers, contacted by the Free Press last week, adopted it most in air of "cautious and alert skepticism."

ISAAC ASIMOV, probably the dean of science-fiction-turned science fiction writers, said: "Frankly, if someone came in and told me that story, I'd smell his breath first, get out of the room and call a policeman."

Asimov said "there's never anything but rashes of UFO sightings" because the first report "inspires" later sightings which "wouldn't have been sighted if that first hadn't happened."

Poul Anderson, well-known for his novels and short

Unidentified Flying Object Sighted
Falmouth, Hants Co., N.S. (6 NOV 73).

1. In compliance with our instructions re: CO-NRC, Paragraph 7, the following report is being submitted for the information of the Upper Atmosphere Research Section, National Research Council.

2. At 12:20 PM, November 7, 1973, this office was contacted by Barbara Alice (Mrs. Oris) REYNOLDS, Gabriel Road, R.R.#2, Falmouth, Hants Co., N.S., who stated that she had observed a U.F.O. at approximately 7:10 P.M., A.S.T., on November 6, 1973, supposedly flying above Falmouth district in Hants County. Mrs. REYNOLDS was interviewed and she stated the object was first sighted by her 12-year old son, at which time the object was stationary at an altitude of approximately 100 feet and one-quarter mile from their residence. The object was also witnessed by Mrs. REYNOLDS' other two children, ages 10 and 8 years, and also by Mr. and Mrs. Curtis SANFORD, Falmouth, N.S., who are Mrs. REYNOLDS' in-laws and who were contacted by Mrs. REYNOLDS after she had viewed the U.F.O. herself.

3. The sky was very clear at the time of the sighting and the U.F.O. has been described as being oval shaped, similar to a bathtub, with two reddish coloured lights shining downwards. These lights changed brightness in that as one light got dimmer, the other became brighter. The size of the object has been placed at approximately five feet in diameter, however this is without the aid of binoculars or telescope. Its height could not be approximated by the persons viewing same. The object remained stationary for approximately 20 minutes and then travelled in a northeasterly direction a distance of about three miles towards Avondale, Hants County, and then returned in a southwesterly direction back towards Windsor. It remained stationary for just a few minutes and then proceeded in a southwesterly direction and continued till they lost sight of it. There was no sound from the object, however as it moved it appeared to emit a light green glow. This is the first time any of the observers have sighted an object of this nature and all appear to be reliable witnesses

4. A check was made with various business firms in this area to see if a helicopter or light plane may have been in the area at the time. All proved negative. No further sightings of this nature have been reported to this office.

Point Beach Nuclear Plant Passes 5 Billion Kilowatt-hour Mark

THE first 497,000 kilowatt unit at Point Beach Nuclear Plant reached a total production of five billion kilowatt-hours at 3:34 p.m. on April 27. The mark was set well ahead of original expectations.

That amount of power would serve the needs of 500,000 average residential customers for a year and a half in the service area of Wisconsin Electric and Wisconsin Michigan. Unit 1 first began producing power in November 1970 and was placed in commercial operation on December 21, 1970.

President John G. Quale said the unit provided about one-fourth of total system generation during the 18-month period. He said the plant was still operating on its first loading of fuel. "Barring unforeseen problems, the unit will continue to produce power until refueling is required next October," Quale said the five billion mark was reached with "no measurable adverse environmental effects."

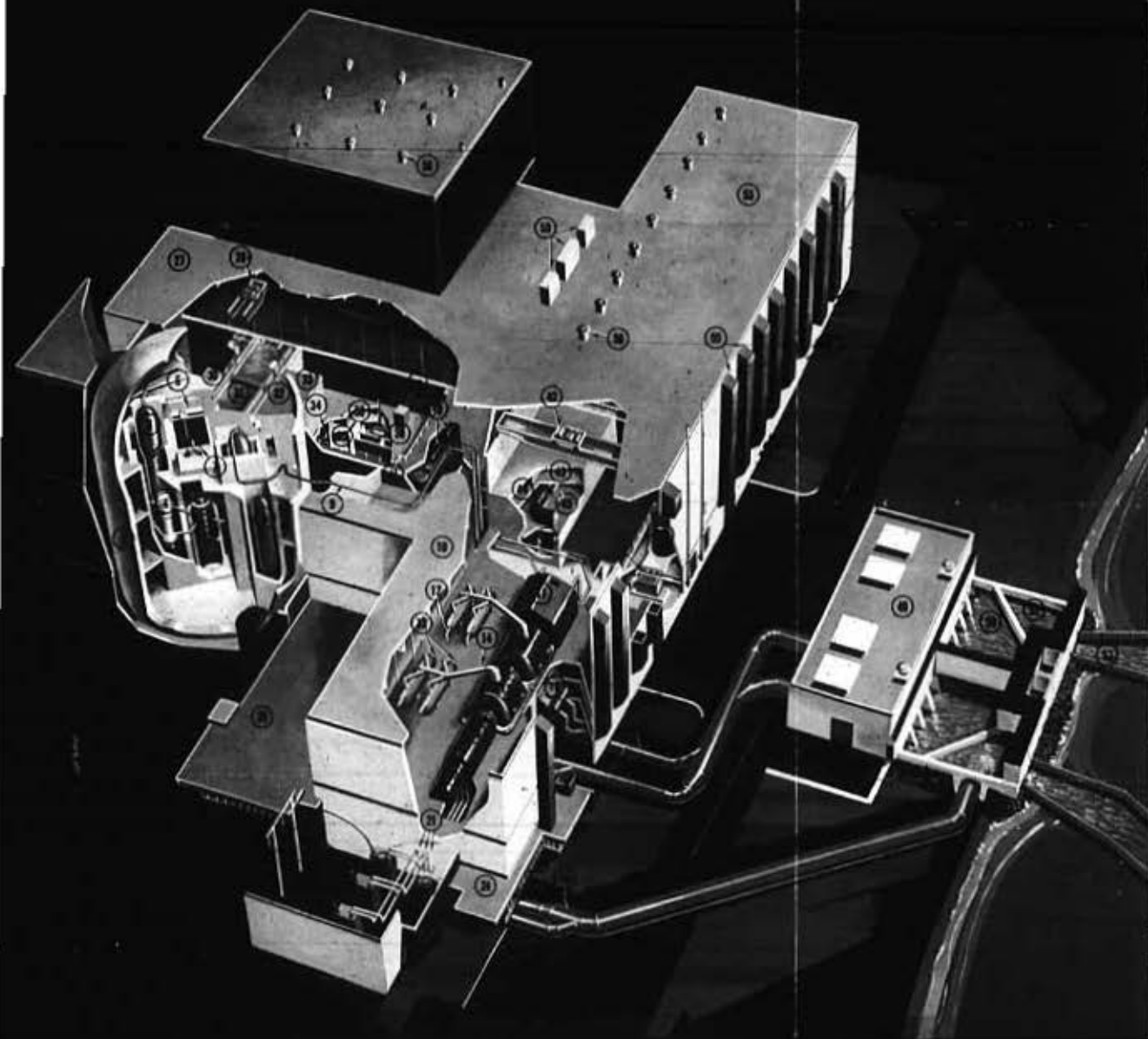
A second 497,000 kilowatt unit which was completed early last fall, and later loaded with fuel, still awaits an operating license from the Atomic Energy Commission. Licensing has been indefinitely delayed by intervention, prolonged hearings and several court decisions which affected licensing procedures.

Unit 1 set its first billion kilowatt-hour mark March 31, 1971, and passed the three billion total on October 26 of last year. Its availability for service has been nearly 88%.

Quale added that nuclear power conserves other fuel resources. To provide the equivalent amount of power at one of the largest units at Oak Creek power plant south of Milwaukee would have required the burning of four billion pounds of coal.

While the companies are contributing to research into even more promising methods of power generation such as breeder-reactors and fusion, Quale stressed that the present-day nuclear technology is a vast improvement over previous methods. "It is based on solid scientific and engineering development and enjoys an unsurpassed safety record," Quale said.

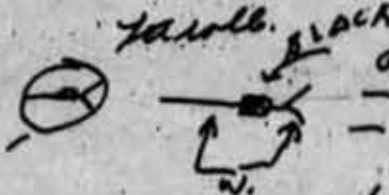

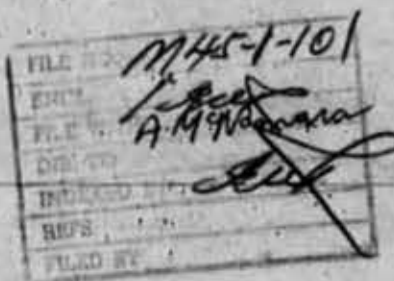

- At 9:10 P.M. this date Mrs. Jane (Allen Russell) WAMBOLT, Lot #5, Robbin Village Trailer Court, Lincoln, Sunbury Co., N.B., called the Fredericton Airport tower and advised she was seeing vapour trails and flashing white lights, possibly wing tip lights, but didn't know for sure. She further advised that the object which she believed to be a plane in distress was headed towards Moncton. The object disappeared within two to three minutes. Mrs. WAMBOLT was advised at that time that there was a DC-9 departing runway 15, but Mrs. WAMBOLT advised she heard the jet and felt it wasn't the same one in question.
- Cst. Fred SHAW, Airport Constable at the Fredericton Airport advised this office of the foregoing.
- I made an immediate patrol to Robbin Village with Cst. SHAW. Upon arriving at the residence of Allen Russell WAMBOLT I interviewed Mrs. Jane (Allen Russell) WAMBOLT, Allen Russell WAMBOLT, and Donald Jefferson HALL. I was advised that all three persons had viewed the spectacle from outside their residence. All three were unanimous on their description of the object.
- At 9:10 P.M. the 11 NOV 73, the sky was clear. The WAMBOLTS' and Mr. HALL were outside their trailer located at Robbin Village, Lincoln, Sunbury Co., N.B., when they noticed a white vapour trail (one) and heard no sound from an object very high in the sky. They could not make out a shape of the object. They saw the object for 3 to 5 minutes going from west to east at a fast rate of speed. There were two lights like neon lights, bright white on the object. The lights were flashing together maybe 4, 5, or 6 times, paused and then 4, 5, or 6 more flashes. During the pauses they saw a small red light like a cigarette lighter on what appeared to be the right hand side of the object.
- A check was made by Cst. SHAW at the Fredericton Airport for other transport passing at that time but none were reported. WAMBOLT is an E.L.M. Technician at C.F.B. Gagetown and felt to have a better than average knowledge of aeronautical transport. He is felt to be a very reliable witness to such an incident. It was his belief that an air transport vehicle was in distress, however, he could not identify such an aircraft with this sort of flashing pattern. All persons concerned are felt to have seen something unknown at this time.

Dear Sirs,

I would like to put a sighting of UFO on record which myself and my children saw at 6:15 pm Monday 15/10/1973.

A report of this was telephoned into Burlington Spectator Office late that evening.

This sighting was no more than $\frac{1}{4}$ mile from where we stood. It was dusk & the sky was cloudless.

Then (1) was how we first saw it (it looked silver in colour) & then a descent occurred until it became as in (2). There was no sound, but what looked like vapour formed a path behind the descent.

It hovered in stage (2) for about 4 minutes & the next we saw was as in (3). Distance travelled from (2) to (3) could not be seen. We saw the ascent starting & then next was the silver spot on horizon.

Dear Sir,

In one of this week's ^{Daily} issues of "The Ottawa Journal" an article was published with the heading "IF you SEE a "UFO", the NRC would like to know." (NOT meant for Poetry!)

I want to inform you of a curious entry I made in my "5-year Diary" a few weeks ago; at barely dawn, on Monday, October 15th 1973 when I rose early to get a drink of "still-lemon", (because my throat was parched on account of a faulty humidifier in our basement), I drew back my kitchen drapes after switching off the electric light, & in doing so looked involuntarily out of the window, & thought what a beautifully clear indigo sky there was, a star or two still visible in the fast approaching dawn. There wasn't a single puff of clouds in sight! Skies absolutely Clear!

Suddenly my eyes became riveted on what appeared to be a silver stick, about the size of a stick of ordinary school-board chalk, at an extremely high altitude, against the

clear indigo sky, it shone in bright contrast,
Yes it was moving, but at a snails pace!
There was no trace of vapour trail, & it
didn't appear to have any tail or wings
either, - moving extraordinarily slowly for
any 'plane! - it was in my sight for more
than ten minutes, - just a bright silvery
stick of chalk - very shiny, as silver!

It reminded me of World War I when
a Zeppelin was caught in searchlights
over Cuffley, Herts, England - [a great friend of
my youth had the good fortune to bring
it down in flames ^{Billy} Jeff-Robinson]. That looked
like a silver cigar, ~~tho'~~ much longer
length than the moving thing I watched
here in Ottawa skies on that October ^{15th} early
morning. [I left Canada for England in June 1915.
(then with my parents) returning in Aug 1917]

One feels ridiculous to tell
anybody about anything "queer", & I
hate to be laughed at, but this was so
very strange for a wingless, tail-less plane
& no vapour trail - & going at such a
crawl, towards the North West, following
the Ottawa River, (from which I only live
2 blocks or so;) ALSO SOUNDLESS!

I have only mentioned the incident
to my 43 year-old married son, during a
trip to Ingois the following Saturday, Oct 20th
to obtain our supply of apples for Halloween

"goblin" children! — This apple trip is a little annual treat for me from my son, as my family used to live by the St. Lawrence between Morrisburg & Iroquois until displaced by the Seaway, & we like to revisit old friends of the Macintosh apple orchards.

Returning to my flying object, I feel it must somehow have a rational explanation, but WHAT? Being only attired in a flimsy nightdress & feeling chilly, I gave up watching it altho still in sight, & seeming to have only moved about 100 yards in the 10 minutes I watched.

You may doubt my sight, since I am 73 years of age, but may I hear tell you that my sight has been extraordinarily good all my life, even to having won 38 prize ribbons (between Toronto C.N.E. and Ottawa's CENTRAL Canada Exhibitions since 1963 & up to August of 1973 inclusive) for my entries for very fine-thread & patterned Crotchetwork! Tablecloths, bedspreads, centre-pieces, lace drapes & "what-have-you!" and I am still going strong for 1974 entries!!! I also do a lot of music composition for organ, & Chorus ^(published) anthems! So my eyesight you will agree cannot be challenged?

Before closing I would like to add that at the temperature noted down on that day in my diary was 61° ~~high~~ later in the day & that there was a "cold wind" - cold too, earlier, & we had snow flurries next day.

Thanking you for your attention & trusting that the journal were right in telling its readers to contact you if seeing anything "odd" in the Skies!

I might add, that in addition to no visible means of propulsion, this object made NO SOUND on its slowly moving trip, it was completely Silent.

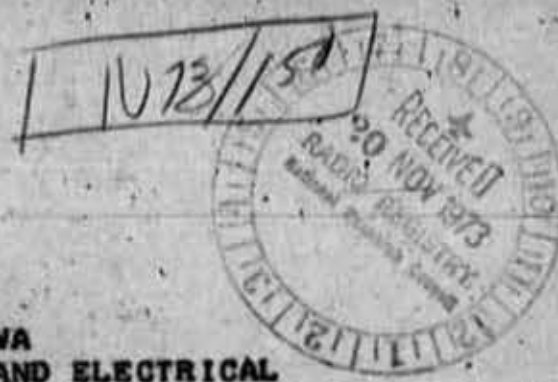


Dear Sirs:

On the morning of 25 NOV 73, at approximately 5:00 am- Noel KAKFWI (BD. 21 DEC 16) of Fort Good Hope, happened to be looking in a westerly direction from his residence when he saw an object discribed as follows. About one mile away and at 1000 foot altitude, he saw what appeared to be fifteen or sixteen red balloons tied in line one behind the other, not bright just illuminated and about fifteen feet in diameter. There was no sound of any type at anytime. They appeared to be moving away from him at a slow rate loosing altitude as they progressed. KAKFWI watched the UFO's for several minutes and then called Gorgina KAKFWI (wife) and Tommy KAKFWI (son), both were interviewed and advised that they saw a red circle in the west but due to the temperature did not observe the UFO for any length of time.

KAKFWI then called on some neighbours and they too observed the red object. The neighbours were interviewed and advised that they saw a red object in the westerly skys but that by this time it looked similar to a star. KAKFWI then moved to a different location on the river bank about two hundred yards away and advised that when he reached this point the objects had disappeared from sight, it had been observed for about 20-25 minutes.

Noel KAKFWI had been sleeping and woke to have something to eat when he happened to go out side, he was not intoxicated and there is no reason not to believe the sighting. Gorgina and Tommy KAKFWI had both been sleeping and were awakened to go out in the cold. The neighbours had been partying and their observations would be limited.

There has been no previous sightings of this type in the area. M.O.T. advised that there was no aircraft or weather balloons in the area at this time. If further information is required please contact this detachment.

The following is in reference to our Radiogram No. 73/247 dated 23 NOV 73.

2. On 22 NOV 73, Cpl. KEEN of the Canadian Forces Base, Chatham, N.B. called and stated that he had received a phone call from an Ex-Serviceman who told him that his son had seen an U.F.O. near their residence at the captionally noted location. KEEN stated that the caller did not wish to have his name divulged, however, gave his phone number as [REDACTED]. I asked the caller if there had been any aircraft in the air prior to his call and KEEN stated that there had been a helicopter, however, it had landed sometime before receiving the phone call. Checks were made with the Moncton Airport and their radar failed to detect any aircraft in the scope of their radar at the time of the presumed sighting which was approximately 7:15 - 7:20 P.M.

3. I called telephone number [REDACTED] and explained to the gentleman that we would need some information for record purposes. He stated his name was [REDACTED] and that we could visit his residence and interview his son, [REDACTED] who had seen the U.F.O. At 9:30 P.M. I met with [REDACTED], 13 years of age, and he stated that he had seen the object from his back yard. [REDACTED] stated that he had seen a set of lights, two red and two green and one white light which was revolving and looked like a search light. [REDACTED] stated that he had observed this object for approximately two minutes after which time it went out of sight in the vicinity of the abandoned Glenwood School. Further to this, he stated there was no noise being emitted from the object and that it was flying at an altitude of approximately twice the height of trees. [REDACTED] was unable to give any information pertaining to this object's shape and colour. Atmospheric condition in the vicinity of the sighting was misty with a light mist falling.

4. [REDACTED] stated that the route which the U.F.O. seemed to be taking was that of a North-easterly course going from behind his residence on the west side of highway 11 diagonally across to behind the Glenwood School.

5. On 23 NOV 73, I visited the area behind the Glenwood School. Mr. Merton DICKSON, owner of the School and who resides in a mobile trailer behind the School, stated that he had heard two extremely loud thumps sometime between

..... SOMETIME BETWEEN 7:00 P.M. - 7:30 P.M. 22 NOV 75. DICKSON paid no particular attention to these thumps as he thought they were caused by a truck going over a bump on highway 11 a few feet from his home. After telling DICKSON my reason for being at his residence and describing to him the supposed course of the U.F.O., he seemed to be more sure that the sound had come from the North side of his trailer which he felt was unusual as two bumps in the road were directly in front of his residence and not North of his residence on highway 11. DICKSON and I searched the area where the U.F.O. seemed to disappear from [REDACTED]'s view without finding any trace of any foreign object or aircraft having crashed or landed. This area behind the residence is wooded with evergreen trees which seem to be approximately 30 - 40 feet in height and behind these trees is a large open swampy area.

6. [REDACTED] at the time of his interview was very excited and scared of the consequences of seeing this object, however, I am confident that he did see an object of unknown origin or possibly a helicopter from C.F.B. Chatham, N.B. doing radar approaches and possibly counter blade rotations.

7. I contacted Cpl. KEEN and we both feel that what the observer saw was, indeed, a helicopter approaching the Base, however, this cannot be conclusive as the records at C.F.B. Chatham, N.B. show that the helicopters landed prior to the sighting.

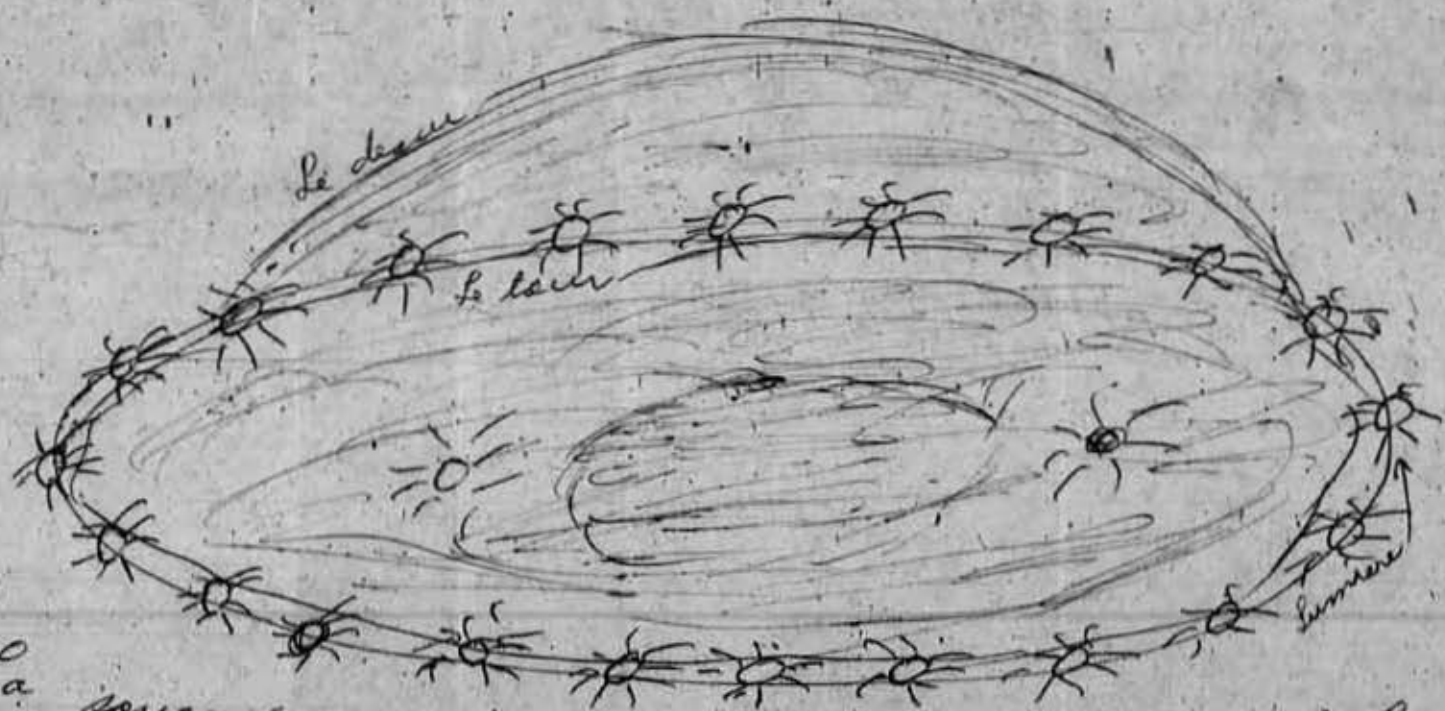

1. At 8:30 P.M. the above date Noel STAR, Chief of the Starblanket Indian Reserve, reported that at 7:40 P.M. he saw what he believed to be a U.F.O. in the area of Fred STAR's residence on the Peepeekisis Indian Reserve. He advised that the object he saw was large estimated to be 150 feet in diameter and flying very fast. STAR added that it appeared to be red and orange in colour. STAR further stated that he saw this object in an open field behind STAR's house and he knows for a fact there are no buildings in that area.

2. Cst. BRISCOE and Cst. HOEL to scene and I was also advised. Noted members drove to this area and met Fred STAR who advised that he personally didn't see anything but Jimmy and Dorothy STAR had seen something and were north on the grid trying to locate it. Cst. BRISCOE and Cst. HOEL drove along the grid and came upon Jim and Dorothy STAR who advised that they had also seen a strange object minutes before their arrival. They claimed the object was moving very fast and they said it was red and orange in colour. It was apparently west of the grid at this time. Cst. HOEL and Cst. BRISCOE then drove north on the grid, then west on the 10 mile road however failed to see anything which resembled this object. An odd set of lights west of #310 Hwy., attracted their attention and patrol was made to the grid west of the highway. They drove approx. 4 miles down this grid when they saw the lights to the south west and they appeared as described above. To affect a closer look they drove to the Lipton Grid another 4 miles south and then another four miles west on this grid. At this location they could see the object again and it appeared to be no more than a mile away to the south west. They observed this object for approx. 1 hour when it lifted to an estimated altitude of 100 feet and moved towards them. At this time they could see a clear out line of the object that being a mushroom shape with red and orange coloured lights encasing it completely. The object then stopped and seemed to back track to where they first observed it. Cst. HICKMAN and the E.M.O. team attended the scene with approx. 15 snow machines and they attempted to get close to the object for observation. As the machines approached the object it moved further away to the south west. For approx. two hours members noted on page one and various civilians present from the E.M.O. team observed the object and its actions. I was also present with a high power scope and numerous individuals had a good look at the object. The object was moving further away as time passed so Cst. HOEL and Cst. BRISCOE drove to #10 Hwy., where they again saw the object however it was moving very fast to the south east and shortly disappeared from sight.



3. Telex Bal 31 dispatched and National Research Council advised. Dept. of Transport also made aware of the situation at the outset since it was thought the possibility of a small aircraft having trouble existed. There were no small aircraft or foreign objects reported on radar.

4. 28 NOV 73: This date Luetenant NEWELL of the CFB Yorkton Radar site telephoned and requested particulars of the incident.

5. On the 28th NOV 73 Cst. HICKMAN and myself searched the area in the Starblanket and Okanese Indian Reserves where the object had been first reported however nothing was found. All the witnesses in this particular case are considered reliable persons. As a matter of interest the Band Administrator Fred STAR advised that on the night on the 29th of November 1973 this same object was back in the Reserve area and was also observed by Jimmy STAR and other persons on the reserve.

STATEMENT OF CST. J.W. BRISCOE - BALCARRES DETACHMENT
28 NOV 73: 1:00 AM.

At approximately 8:30 P.M., 27 NOV 73, Noel STAR, Chief of the Starblanket Reserve reported to Cst. HOEL and the writer that at 7:40 P.M. this same date he saw what he described as a U.F.O. in the area of the Peepeekisis Indian Reserve. STAR stated he saw a large object with red and orange lights approx. 100 feet from the ground in the area of Fred STAR's residence on the Peepeekisis. From there STAR felt the object went north towards the Okenese I.R. in the area of Dorothy STARS. STAR then stated he thought the object moved south back toward Fred STAR's residence. Cst. HOEL and myself immediately drove to the Peepeekisis I.R. where we spoke to Fred STAR who indicated that Jimmy STAR and Dorothy STAR had gone to look for the object apparently seeing it earlier. Cst. HOEL and myself drove north on the grid where Jimmy STAR and a carload of kids and Dorothy STAR were stopped. STAR stated they had seen the object again a few minutes before our arrival and at this time it was west of the grid in an open field. They could not give any distance but claimed it moved very fast and was red and orange in colour. The noted members then proceeded through farm yards and along the 10 mile road failing to see any sign of this object. From here we drove across #310 Hwy. in the direction of some odd lights west of #310 Hwy. , on the grid. Approx. 4 miles down the grid we observed an object in the southwest displaying red and orange lights. To affect a better look, we drove to the Lipton grid another 4 miles south on #310 Hwy. In approx. the same position we saw this object which appeared to be approx. 1 mile away. The lights were distinct and very bright at this time. We stood on the road with the lights of the PC out and watched the object move up and down. The lights went from bright to dim nearly fading completely. Suddenly the object appeared to be moving in our direction and lifting from the ground. I would estimate it to be approx. 1/2 mile away and approx. 100 feet off the ground. At this time I saw a clear outline of the shape of the object that being mushroom shaped and lights covered it from one side to the other. I would also estimate the size to be approx. 150 feet in diameter and I could not hear any sound from this object. Cst. HICKMAN and the EMO team attended and searched the area with skidoos. Cpl ARMSTRONG advised and attended. As the object appeared to be moving away from the skidoos Cst. HOEL and myself drove to #10 Hwy. and followed the object visually southeast until it disappeared from sight.

STATEMENT OF CST. A.B. HOEL - Fort Qu'Appelle Detachment
28 NOV 73 1:00 A.M.

At approximately 8:30 P.M., 27 NOV 73, along patrol with Cst. BRISCOE, Balcarres Detachment we received a complaint from one Noel STAR who advised that he had sighted a U.F.O. down near Fred STAR's place. Cst. BRISCOE and myself patrolled to the area and after checking the area out we sighted an orange coloured light in the sky some distance away from us. It appeared to be about 100 feet off the ground and was a bright orange at this time and as we watched it, it appeared to fade and disappear altogether. The next time we noticed it, the bright orange light was on the ground and as we watched it changed from orange to a red. We proceeded to try and get closer to the object and we drove down on a back road and lost sight of it. The next time we saw it, it was red coloured and it appeared to be bobbing up and down like a yo-yo. Prior to this Cpl. ARMSTRONG and Cst. HICKMAN advised of the sighting and Cst. HICKMAN proceeded to round up the E.M.O. group and made arrangements to have them brought out to the area with their skidoos. Cst. BRISCOE and myself drove down the road to where the object had appeared and as we approached with our head lights on the object disappeared. Next time we saw the object was on the Lipton grid. This time we watched it for approximately half an hour as the object appeared to be playing tag in the farmers field would raise off the ground approximately 100 feet and race back and forth through the air all the time the bright lights becoming brighter and dimmer. The lights this time appeared to be bright red and also an orange. It started to move sideways and suddenly turned and came straight towards where we were standing. The objects at its closest time to us appeared to be approximately 1/2 mile from us. It looked to be in the neighbourhood of 100 feet in diameter and with the appearance of an upside down saucer. The lights burning across the top and a light at each corner. The lights on the side appeared red. No noise of any kind came from the object. Suddenly it stopped approaching us and it went back in the direction that it came from. It went back to the area that it had been in previously approximately a mile from us and played around in the fields some more. At this time I proceeded to walk down the road trying to get closer to where it was. I sighted the object as I walked down into the valley. After I had gone down into the valley Cst. HICKMAN and his E.M.O. team arrived at the scene and the lights from the cars appeared to drive the object further back into the field. Cst. HICKMAN and the E.M.O. people headed out on skidoos to where the object was stationed in the field. They had a good look at the object through the scope on Cpl. ARMSTRONG'S rifle. It appeared to have port holes. Cst. HICKMAN and his voluntaries approached the object but it appeared to take off away from them and the further they went the further the object went. Seeming to stay just ahead to them. Cst. BRISCOE and myself went back to #310 hwy. and back around it to try and intercept it.

We lost sight of the object and the next time we saw it was on the south rise and it appeared to be moving up and down just above the horizon and in a latitudinal direction. The object would climb and then drop appearing as if it was hedge chopping. Cst. BRISCOE and myself headed back to #10 hwy to try and get around the object. We lost sight of it and the next time we saw it was in the Abernethy district. As there are no roads into this area we could not get any closer to it. The last we saw of the object it was heading towards the Manitoba border at the high rate of speed. I might also add that Cpl. ARMSTRONG and Cst. HICKMAN as well as the E.M.O. workers also witnessed the object that was at the scene at the Lipton grid.

On above date, C/N called this office stating that on the A.M. of 7 Dec 73 at approximately 2.30A.M. she had seen what she described as a U.F.O. The sighting was made from her residence. The object in question was described as being cigar shaped with two light coloured spots on the front. Mrs. ROUX stated that the object became lighter as she looked at it, and described it as being larger than the moon. Altitude appeared to be approximately 1500 ft. and object appeared to be moving very slow. The sky was clear and visibility good at the time of the sighting. Sighting was for approximately 10 mins. and object disappeared travelling from east to west.

2. No other reported sightings were made to this office and a check with the Bathurst C.P. also proved negative. C.F.B. Chatham has been contacted and advised that no aircraft were in this area on the day and time in question. Our telex 349 was dispatched.

As we drove west on the Queensway towards Ottawa we were able to observe continuously the aircraft's progress. It quickly passed into a region above the shadow line and the contrail looked like a brilliant orange fan or comet in the sky. I remarked then to the other passengers in the car that this aircraft contrail would probably generate a number of comet or UFO reports. After about 10 minutes, the contrail was low in the west, and resembled a nearly stationary, orange, oval due to the perspective. Some 15 minutes after first sighting the aircraft at Bldg. M-50, we turned off Alta Vista Drive and it was hidden from view. At this time the jet's contrail was probably 100 - 150 miles away and still clearly visible as a bright orange blob against the sunset sky.

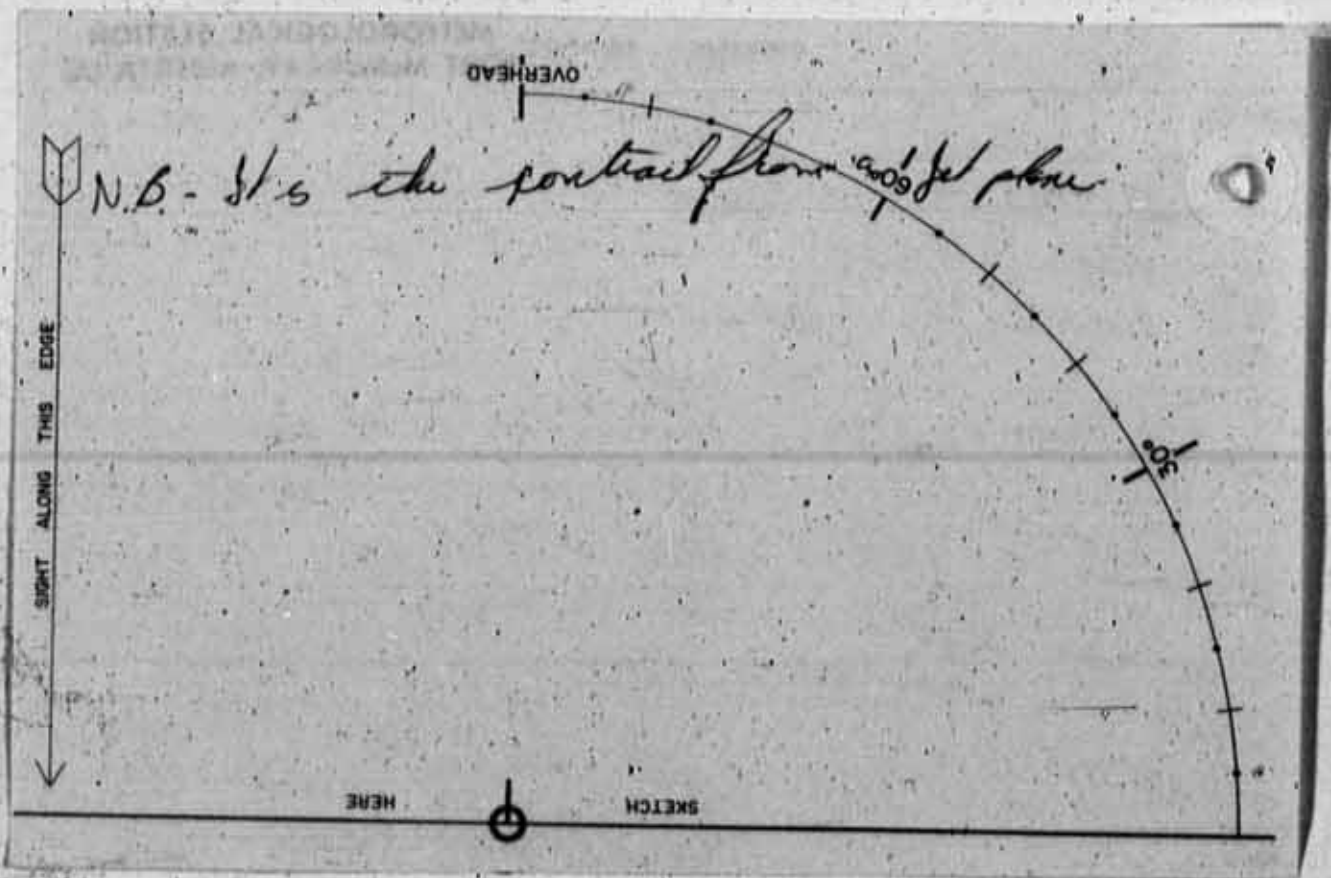

At approximately 5:45 AM on the 6th of January 74, I walked to the living room and as I passed the picture window I noticed a strange light about 30 feet above the ground coming toward the house from the west. It was coming straight east. It was dark and the sky was clear at the time. The object was a very bright light at first. As it came closer I began to see the form of an object. It seemed that I spotted the object at approximately one half a mile away and within 15 to 20 seconds it was approximately 150 feet from the house. The object was above some willow trees approximately 20 to 30 feet off the ground. The ground and the trees were illuminated just like in daylight. The object was oval in shape like a squash ball. The object was approximately 30 to 40 feet in diameter and about 15 to 20 feet in height. There was a dome on top from 4 feet to 6 feet in diameter and 2 high. It seemed like the dome was transparent. The body of the object was shiny bright silver. I seen four exhaust at the center of the object from 4 inches to 6 inches each in diameter in a single row approximately 1 foot apart. I can't tell on which side the exhaust pipes were as I couldn't say if the machine spun on its axel. I don't know if the machine stopped above the willows but all of a sudden it changed direction and travelled from going east to south west. As it was pulling away it was losing its altitude. When it went away there was flames coming out from the exhaust. The flames were all colours, yellow-orange with some blue. The flames were shooting 10 to 12 feet behind. I last noticed the object as it went down under the tree line. I figured it was landing. I partially dressed up and went for the car. I drove out of the yard and up the road. When I passed the tree line I could see it standing still on 244 highway. I can't say if it was right on the highway or a few feet above it. I travelled up to the municipal road to Provincial Road #244 which is approximately 1,000 feet from my yard. I turned toward the object which was sitting approximately 1/2 mile south on PR244. There wasn't any flames coming out of the exhaust just a very bright white light coming from the dome on top. It wasn't like a search light, just a bright light illuminating the surrounding up to 50 feet around the ship. I travelled approximately 200 feet south at approximately 20 MPH and then I noticed flames all around and the ship lifted right up for approximately 60 feet and then took off south west. In approximately 12 to 15 seconds it was the size of a bright star. A few seconds later it disappeared. I went back 3 1/2 hours later at daylight to the spot where the object had landed but there wasn't any tracks on the highway. The temperature at the time was very cold, approximately -30°F.

Dear Sir:

On Jan. 2/74, at about 3:45 P.M. I saw a UFO. I was about to go outside and so I first looked out the window to the west, just to see what the weather was like. At about a 35° angle to the ground, going east, I saw what looked like a meteor. As I continued to watch it, it went higher in the sky and darkened in colour. I ran to the house to get my camera and took one picture when it still looked like a shining mass and one more about a minute later, when it darkened in colour.

It was flying east and seemed to be going higher in the sky. When it got to be about a 90° angle with the earth it was no longer visible. While the object was visible our dog, which never goes in the house, went in and refused to go back out. I can't say why he did this unless the sound of the object was hurting his ears even if we couldn't hear it.

The total time the object was visible was about 4 minutes at the longest.

I am inclosing the negatives of both pictures (no. 12 and 11) on condition that I have them returned. I also would like to know what the object is, no matter what the object turns out to be. You can reach me at 306 342 4546 Glaslyn, Sask. during the hours of 4:00 P.M. till about 12:00.

Please excuse the delay in replying to your questions about the photographic film which you sent to us. We had to send it out to have enlargements made for preliminary examination, and then look at the original film under a microscope.


Your description of the object in your letter of 28 January, 1974 fits exactly that of a vapour trail from a high-flying jet aircraft flying from west-to-east. At great altitude, only the vapour trail will be visible, illuminated by the sun. (It is quite possible that a dog could hear the aircraft since a dog has much greater hearing sensitivity at the high end of the spectrum.) I am enclosing a copy of a report which I put on record myself in December 1973. This was an aircraft contrail which I saw, and which I was certain would lead to many erroneous reports of a UFO or of comet Kohoutek. Exactly as anticipated, we had several reports come in the next day reporting it as a UFO and comet.

Examination of your film under a microscope shows nothing unusual. Frame No. 11 has a gouge or film defect near the top-centre which makes an odd looking spot on a print made from it. Frame No. 12 has a very faint, diffuse, greenish spot near the centre of the picture, above the roof of the central shed. In a color print, this would show up as a faint reddish or orange spot on the print, and it is probably the contrail which I think you observed.

At 8:20 AM CST on Friday 8 FEB 74 a report was made to this office by Mr. Donald DAVIDSON of McCord Dst., Sask. that he was presently watching an object in the South Eastern sky that he did not feel was a star. This object had been in the East on first sighting and had now moved to the South East.

2. A patrol was made to the DAVIDSON residence which is located 12 Miles South West of McCord. DAVIDSON advised that he became aware of this object when his neighbor Hugh BRAWLEY had phoned him and told him of its presence. The object had gone behind the clouds upon my arrival at the sighting location. DAVIDSON advised that he had observed this object through field glasses and it had appeared oblong with a cone shaped object descending from the bottom. However his wife who had also observed the object through field glasses stated that she felt that it was more circular. They both agreed that the object had been a luminous white colour. DAVIDSON had been advised of the object at 7:45 AM and had made his last sighting at 9:00 AM.

3. BRAWLEY was also interviewed and stated that he had seen the object first at 7:00 AM. BRAWLEY lives 1½ Miles North of DAVIDSON. BRAWLEY advised that the object was directly East of his residence and appeared to be sitting on the horizon. The object had risen in four stages and remained still for approx. 20 minutes before ascending to the South East. BRAWLEY did not observe the object through field glasses but stated that it was small and a white luminous colour.

4. Richard COUTURE, Ferland was contacted as he drives the school bus in this area at this time of morning. COUTURE stated that he had seen the object at 7:20 AM when he was ½ Mile East of McCord. The object to him appeared to be a bright light in the South East.

5. All three persons mentioned above are known to this member and are of a reliable nature.



I cannot believe that I am the only person to have seen Kohoutek the night of Jan 4 as it whipped round the sun but after reading all the available reports I have still to read one that matches mine.

From the vantage of my rooftop, after 5 pm, Jan 4, I saw a red flare in the sky. A few minutes earlier, a jet and its red-orange contrail had appeared in the same spot and for a minute I thought it was Kohoutek. The second flare, however, had an object within its orange-red corona which I could see with the eye. Inspection with binoculars revealed the details which I specify in my drawing.

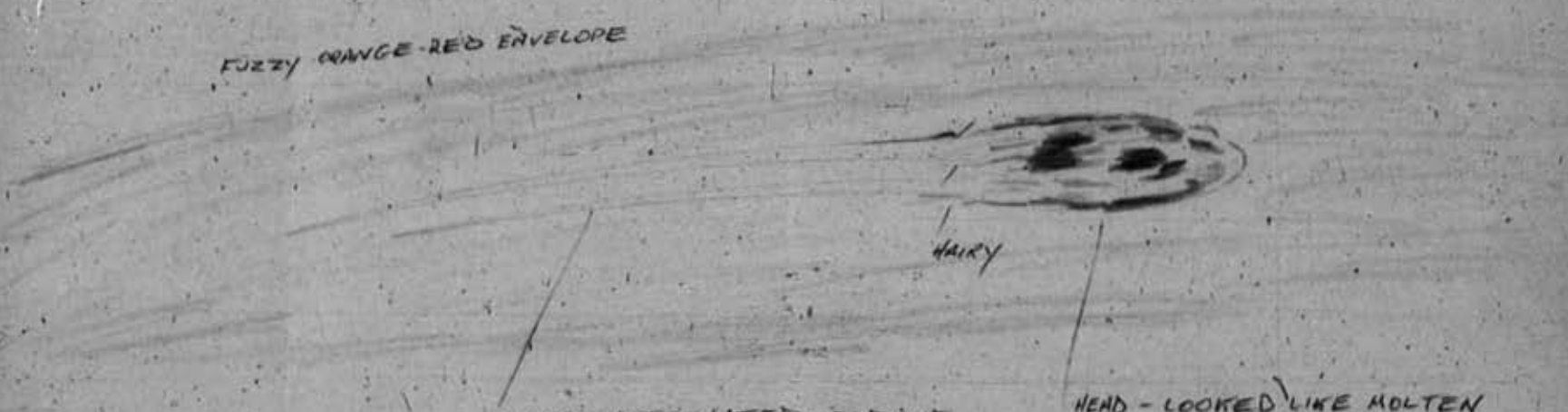



Thank you for your observation of a peculiar object on January 4, 1974. I cannot be sure of what this was but I suspect it was some variation of a contrail from an aircraft; there were many visible that night in the early evening and the colours you describe fit very well with this description. I don't believe this object could have been Comet Kohoutek. I observed the comet on 6 nights out of 10 during that period and never felt sure I had seen it with the naked eye as it was extremely faint. The only colours seen in the comet were the blue-white tones and these are confirmed by colour photographs which I secured. We have placed your observation on file so that it can be compared with others. The position you plotted for the comet is a long way from where it actually was. On the night you made the observation, the comet was much closer to Venus and Jupiter.

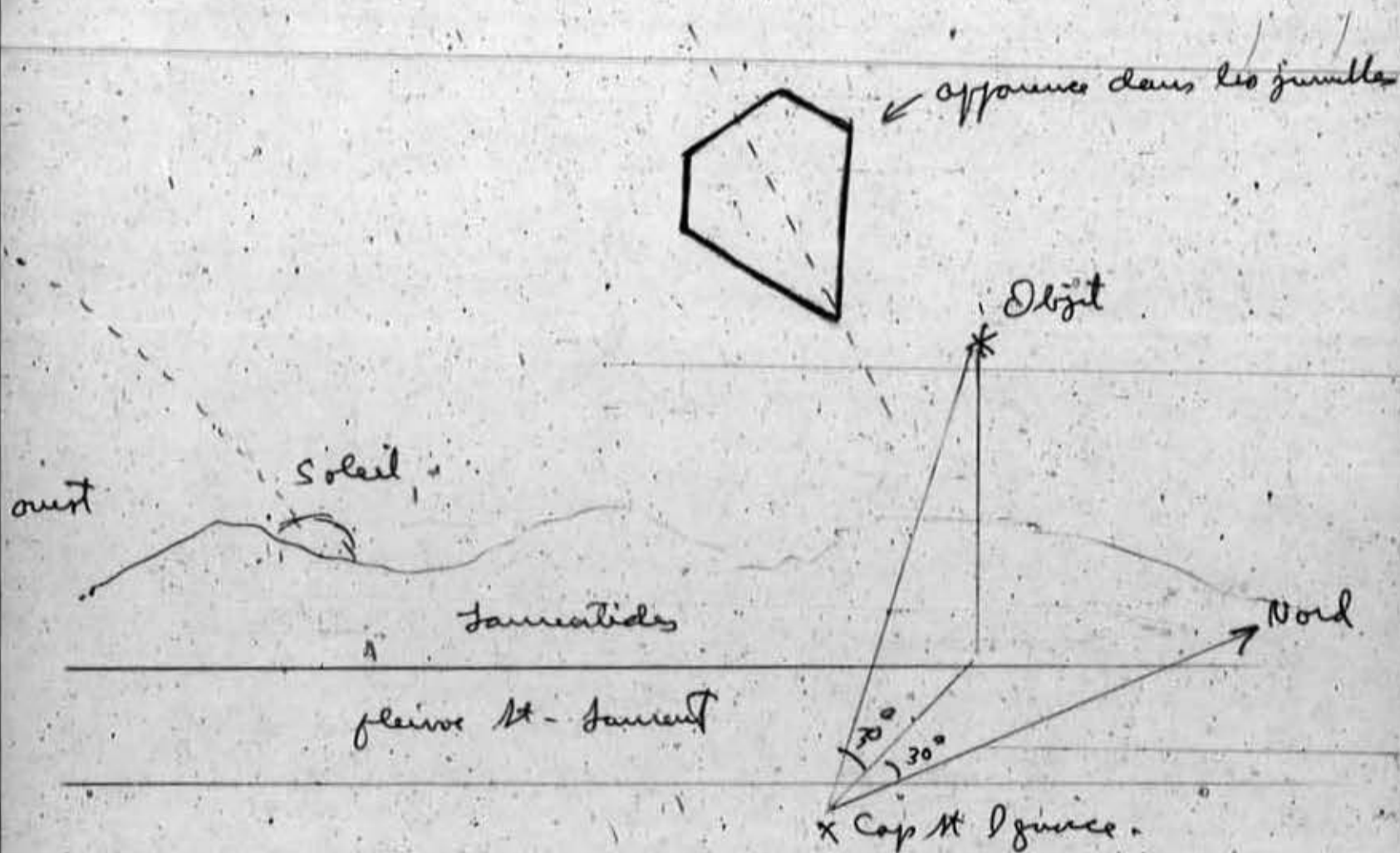

J'ai hésité longtemps avant de vous transmettre l'observation qui suit. En tant que professeur de physique et astronome je suis sensible au ridicule qui entoure souvent l'observation de tels phénomènes. Je pense cependant qu'il est de mon devoir d'ajouter cette pièce à un dossier controversé.

Le 20 juin 1973 je me trouvais à Cap St-Ignace, cote Montmagny, sur le terrain de M. Henri Bernier, dans le 3^{ème} rang du nord-est. A 20h.15 heure locale j'ai aperçu un objet dans le ciel plus brillant que Vénus et plus gros à l'oeil nu. Cet objet se trouvait à 30° environ à l'ouest du nord et à 30° au-dessus de l'horizontale. Il ne pouvait s'agir de Vénus car cet objet était complètement en dehors de l'écliptique. Avec des jumelles 10 x 50 on pouvait voir très nettement la forme de cet objet. L'objet avait une forme en delta avec des contours très nets. L'éclat était métallique. J'ai pu observer cet objet durant deux heures. Durant tout ce temps il est demeuré exactement au même endroit et dans la même position inclinée par rapport à l'horizontale. Cette position expliquait sa brillance car il se trouvait à réfléchir les rayons du soleil dans ma direction. Le soleil s'est couché très rouge mais l'objet a conservé le même éclat jusqu'à 22h.15. A ce moment il a commencé à rougir, devenant de plus en plus sombre, puis il a disparu sans changer de place. Ce changement de couleur était manifestement dû au fait que le soleil s'est couché à 10h.15 à l'endroit où il se trouvait l'objet. Un calcul sommaire permet de situer cet objet dans la région de Chibougeau et à une altitude de l'ordre de 100 milles. Le diamètre apparent de cet objet à une telle distance exige des dimensions de plusieurs centaines de pieds. Plusieurs personnes dont les noms suivent ont pu observer ce phénomène et leur témoignage pourra corroborer le mien. Ce sont: M. Henri Bernier M. I report I wrote to Dr. Peter Millman to
report a sighting to him. He wrote
back and referred me to you to
give full details of my sighting,
so you may put them in your file.
The sighting occurred on Tuesday
July 2 between 10:30-11:00 at night.
It could not have been a plane or
helicopter because it did not look like
either one. It also made no sound
such as a plane makes when
passing by. It could not have been
a signal light, like those seen
flashing on tall buildings to warn
planes at night, simply because we
have no tall buildings with signal
lights for miles around us. With
word about the Russian space stations
being launched I assumed that's
what it was. But I quickly
dismissed that idea when I
heard that the space stations
were launched 3 or 4 days after
I reported my sighting. So what
else is left to assume? That's
how I think I sighted a U.F.O.
I will now give you the full details
of this occurrence and include a
picture of what I saw in the
sky that night. When I looked out
of my bedroom window that night
I saw a shiny metallic object
moving in a slow, semi-circle
across the sky in a north-easterly

direction. I leaned out farther and looked closely. Then, the object took a diamond shape. It looked like those "flying saucers" you see on TV and in the comics. I could also see on the front of the saucer an oval hatch-like opening. As it moved across the sky, I became aware of a very small, bright light in the back of the vehicle. It looked like some sort of "tail-light". When it came about centre in that area of the sky, it stopped. After a few seconds, there was a gigantic flash that blinded me. There was no sound during or after the flash, and the object resumed its flight and disappeared over the roof and out of my sight. I had nothing together with the experience until the disappearance of the saucer took about five minutes. I hope you can use this information for your files and I was glad to be of help to your research.

- At approximately 10:30 p.m., this date a telephone call was received from Mr. Lucien HOTTE of 72 Brodeur Street, Hull, P.Q. reporting the sighting of an U.F.O.
- Witnesses to this sighting were his wife and daughter who saw same in the vicinity of Rockcliffe Park. Mr. HOTTE referred to the U.F.O. as being very bright, round in shape and changing place slowly in a gradual speed. The duration of observation was at least fifteen minutes, under clear sky conditions.
- Upon receipt of the above information, a telex message has since been forwarded to the National Research, Meteor Centre, Ottawa under number 11 routine, 29 July 1974.
- Enquiries conducted on Mr. Lucien HOTTE revealed that he is an independant realator working out of the Hull, P.Q. area. He could add nothing further in regards to the above and simply reported the incident as being an unknown experience to him. His wife confirmed the sighting and it is felt that subject is a reliable witness.
- A check with the Stol Aircraft Tower, located in the area of the sighting, put forth the explanation that the sighting could have possibly been wing lights from a small plane. The control tower also stated that there was a new bright star in the South, so bright that they thought it was an aircraft at first.

31 July 1974

- A check was made this date through Mrs. C. CHENIER of the National Research Council Meteor Section, Ottawa, Ontario. She confirmed the fact at this time that there had been a bright star in the south around the time of the sighting. One further possibility put forth was that the object could have been a weather testing device. Also it has been proven in the past that the wing lights mentioned above often resemble an unknown object. This is due to the fact that the planes path often shows the lights clearly as long as the plane stays on the same flight path as the viewers eyes. However, when the planes path changes the light automatically disappears.

"I went out about 9 a.m.," reported Edwin Fuhr of Langenburg, Saskatchewan, Canada. "It was very cold and I had on my coveralls with the hood of my parka over my head. Ice crystals were falling, and it was raining at the time.

"I was going very slowly when I noticed the object in front of me. At first I thought it was a goose blind for hunters.

"I jumped out of the swather (combine) and I walked up to within 15 feet of it. I noticed the object was rotating, spinning (clockwise) and the grass around it was moving.

"I stopped right there and viewed it for maybe two minutes. I don't know exactly how long I was standing there and instinct told me not to go any closer so I backed out all the way back to the swather, walked around it and got in on the left-hand side.

"As I sat down in the seat, four more appeared on the opposite side of me and I immediately froze. I couldn't move at all and they sat there about 15 minutes, rotating, all five of them."

Fuhr added, "Then they went straight up, all even, in a step formation. They were up about 200 feet when a dark gray vapor appeared from the bottom two exhaust ports and lasted

a few seconds. Then they were gone."

Fuhr returned to his farmhouse, about 140 yards away. Realizing something was wrong, his wife asked him why he was upset. Fuhr related the frightening experience. Later in the afternoon, his brother and sister-in-law came over and the incident was again brought up.

When his brother returned to town, he called the Royal Canadian Mounted Police and asked if they had received any reports of anything unusual.

At first, Constable Ron Morier said he was skeptical of the incident but agreed to investigate the following morning.

However, after arriving at the site, Morier stated, "Once I saw the rings, and how genuinely scared Mr. Fuhr was, it was most definite something had landed. Nothing could have been brought into that area. There were no tracks. It came out of the sky and went back to the sky.

"Mr. Fuhr is very sincere and a responsible member of the community that members of the force have known for the past four years."

A complete report of the incident was forwarded to the National Security Council in Ottawa. Fuhr further described the details of his sighting to officials.

"It was about 5-feet high and 11-feet in diameter. It was stainless steel, saucer-shaped, domed, dark on the bottom like it had been hot, very hot. There were no markings on the craft."

After the five objects disappeared Mr. Fuhr said he "got off the swather to see if the spots were warm or hot. They were cool, all five of them. I do not know if they were sitting there all night or not."

While no occupants were observed, Fuhr added, "It looked like something got out, as the grass was trampled down near one of the rings."

Investigation of the rings by Constable Morier resulted in the following preliminary findings:

Five rings were arranged in a horseshoe design, with three of the rings only about 5 feet apart. Two additional rings on each side were further back.

The grass was approximately 18 inches high, with the strange trampling down appearing to come from one of the rings in the center cluster.

While investigating, Morier smelled the grass in the rings and noticed no odor of any kind.

Another ring was found in the area the following Tuesday morning and many residents reported strange lights in the sky.

UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS

1. Mr. ZORN telephoned this Office wondering whether or not our Office had received any calls reporting sightings of unidentified flying objects. I advised Mr. ZORN that no such reports had been received. Mr. ZORN then reported that he had just spoken to his brother-in-law Edwin FUHR (B: 28 APR 38) on the telephone and he related to him how at around 10:30 A.M. today he came upon five (5) 'saucer shaped' objects while swathing rape at the above location. He apparently froze with fear and watched the 'Saucers' for approx. 15 min. as they hovered about a foot off the ground. Finally he got off the Tractor and walked towards the 'Saucers' coming to within 20 ft. of them before they propelled straight up disappearing into the clouds. Mr. ZORN of course was skeptical as was I of the above story, however he advised that his brother-in-law is a responsible person and not prone to making up stories. Mr. ZORN also spoke to his father-in-law who returned to the scene of the sightings, and he confirmed that there were five definite circular patterns left in the swamp grass.

2. As it was dark at this time there was no point in patrolling to the scene. Arrangements were made to accompany Mr. ZORN to the scene first thing tomorrow morning.

3. 2 SEP, I went to the scene with Mr. ZORN where we spoke with Edwin FUHR and examined the circular patterns left by the 'Saucers'. There were five different distinct circles, caused by something exerting what had to be heavy air or exhaust pressure over the highgrass. The grass was flattened in a clockwise circle with the flattened portion being approx. 18 in. The total diameter of two of the circles was 12 ft., with the other three being approx 10 1/2 ft. in diameter. The grass in the centre portion of the ring was standing, and appeared untouched. Photographs were taken of 4 rings. FUHR stated that he was so involved with swathing in the rape, which was a good 3 1/2 ft. tall, that he didn't notice one of the 'Saucers' located in the sunken dried slough in the field until he was about 50 ft. away from them. He described the 'Saucers' as being about 4 or 5 ft. in height. The body was a highly polished

HIGHLY POLISHED...steel, with the bottom lip being a duller steel shade. He didn't notice any windows on the 'Saucers' because they were revolving at two great a speed. He didn't hear any noise coming from the machines over the noise of his tractor. FUHR stated that as the 'Saucers' gained altitude he noticed exhaust come from underneath them. Other than the five rings, there was no other physical evidence in the area.

4. The witness FUHR has been known by a member of this Detachment for a period of four yrs., and during this time he has not been known to materialise any such stories. He is a responsible person, and his information is considered reliable.



1. On the above date, at approximately 10:45 p.m. (Atlantic Time) a report, of a possible sighting of an Unidentified Flying Object (U.F.O.) in the Central Newfoundland area, was made to the Gander Airport Detail office.
2. The sighting in question, was made at approximately 10:10 p.m., (Atlantic Time) by one John BREHN, 74 Edinburgh Ave., Gander, Nfld. BREHN, a three year veteran as an Air Traffic Controller now employed at the Gander Air Traffic Control Center, was at the time of the sighting flying a Cessna Aircraft, Canadian Registration C-GLCF. BREHN was flying at an altitude of approximately 5,000 feet and experiencing clear skies with occasional cloudy periods and was returning to Gander, Nfld., from Deer Lake, Nfld. When approximately 40 miles north-west of Gander, Nfld., BREHN, along with his only passenger sighted the possible U.F.O. Janice GOULD, 19 Balbo St., Gander, Nfld., BREHN's passenger and girl friend, first sighted the Object just as they had passed over the town of Grand Falls, Nfld., a small town situated approximately 60 miles west of Gander, Nfld.
3. The Object was described by BREHN as being a solitary greenish, aluminous light. When first noticed by BREHN, the light was directly below BREHN's aircraft at an altitude of approximately 5,000 feet. BREHN's first interpretation of this greenish light was that his starboard aviation light may have been reflecting on something below. He then turned off all of his aviation lights for a moment; nevertheless, the greenish light continued directly below the aircraft. BREHN, at this time, along with GOULD, attempted to determine whether or not the greenish light was part of a bigger unlighted mass; however, this met with negative results as nothing but the greenish light could be noted.
4. BREHN further stated, that at this time, the Cessna was travelling at a speed of approximately 134 M.P.H., and that the greenish light could, and did at times speed up and remain some distance ahead of the aircraft, still at approximately 3,000 feet. This greenish light would then slow down and allow BREHN to once again get directly above it. The light would then continue to slow down more, and as a result lag some distance behind and then go back to it's original position below BREHN's aircraft. BREHN's observation period of this greenish light lasted approximately 25 minutes.
5. When approximately 5 to 6 miles north-west of Gander, Nfld., BREHN contacted the Air Traffic Control Center and advised them of what was taking place. Controllers, at the Air Traffic Control Center, then attempted to pick up this object on their radar screen. One Robert LAWRENCE, the supervising controller on duty at the time, advised that a target was picked up by their 6 mile radar; however, the object remained on the screen for only two sweeps of the radar needle. The target did not show up on the screen as an aircraft. The target did, however, indicate while on the screen that its course had now changed from a north-west course to a westerly course and that the reason it could no longer be picked up on radar was that it was now believed to be flying at tree top level. Continued attempts to regain contact with the target on radar met with negative results. BREHN, upon arriving over the Gander area, circled his aircraft in an attempt to further identify the object; however, upon circling, all traces of the

greenish light were gone.

6. Continual attempts to further identify the greenish light in question by both the Air Traffic Controllers and BREEN met with negative results. LAWRENCE, upon losing all contact with the target on radar, contacted the authorities connected with the Early Warning defensive system at Goose Bay, Nfld., and notified them of the incident.

7. Upon the landing of BREEN's aircraft at Gander International Airport, both BREEN and GOULD were immediately contacted. It was noted at this time, that neither BREEN nor GOULD appeared to be under any sort of influence, from either alcohol or a drug. Their accounts of the incident are neither exaggerated nor are they dramatized and both BREEN and GOULD appear to be of a mature and responsible nature.

11 OCT 74

8. On this date, at approximately 4:45 a.m. (Atlantic Time) another report, of a possible sighting of an Unidentified Flying Object in the Central Newfoundland area, was once again made at the Gander Airport Detail office.

9. This apparent sighting, was made at approximately 4:15 a.m. (Atlantic Time) by the Captain as well as by the Co-Pilot of a DC-8 jet liner. The aircraft in question, was "Capital Airlines" jet, bearing American Registration N-490C, and at the time of the sighting the aircraft was descending in order to land at Gander International Airport for a technical stopover. The weather at this time, was once again clear with occasional cloudy periods. The DC-8 was flying at an altitude of approximately 7,500 feet and cruising at a speed of 290 miles per hour, proceeding in a westerly direction.

10. The object, in this case, was described by the Captain as well as by the Co-Pilot as being an object, of undistinguishable shape or size, flashing red and white lights. The object apparently pulled alongside the DC-8 jet liner and continued on a parallel course with the aircraft. This sighting lasted for approximately 5 to 7 minutes. When the aircraft was approximately 5 miles west of Gander, Nfld., the object in question, still travelling alongside the DC-8, entered a somewhat small cloud formation, and disappeared. The object in question, was further described as being able to keep up to DC-8, and at times would speed up slightly, just ahead of the DC-8, and then would return back alongside the aircraft.

11. Both the Captain and the Co-Pilot stated, that in their opinion, the object was not an aircraft. Edward DUHANY, the supervising controller on duty at the time, advised that no other aircraft were reported to be in the area at the time of the incident. DUHANY, further stated, that their radar monitors, at the Gander Air Traffic Control Center, did not pick up any other targets except the descending DC-8. DUHANY, once again contacted the Early Warning defensive system at Goose Bay, Nfld., and notified the authorities at that point of the above.

12. In compliance with existing instructions, a copy of this report has been forwarded direct to the Upper Atmosphere Research Section, Astrophysics Branch, NRC, Ottawa.
