On the night of the 4/5 AUG 75, six persons sighted and observed a U.F.O. from 11:00 PM to 4:00 AM. Their names are as follows:

- (1) Joe & Daniela FORST - 2128 - 18 Street S.W.
Calgary, Alta. (phone - 244-9231)
- (2) Joe & Anita KORNITZER - 4828 Worchester Drive
Calgary, Alta. (phone - 246-8529)
- (3) George & Olga OPOCENSKY - 730 Hunterston Road
N.W. Calgary, Alta. (phone - 274-2094)

All six persons were camping in the Red Deer River valley west of Big Valley at a campsite known as the McKenzie Crossing. They had been watching the northern lights in the North East sky when they saw an object rise above the valley rim to the east of the campsite.

This object was first sighted at 11:00 PM the 4 AUG 75. It rose slowly in the sky and gradually worked its way across the sky to the south where it was last sighted at 4 PM the 5 AUG 75.



They kept this object under observation with binoculars. It was described to me as being oval in shape with a dark centre, white flashing lights on the perimeter of the oval, a halo of light surrounding the oval with shafts of light going from the oval to the halo. There were also shafts of lights, shaped like corkscrews going out from the oval towards the halo. (Diagram attached)

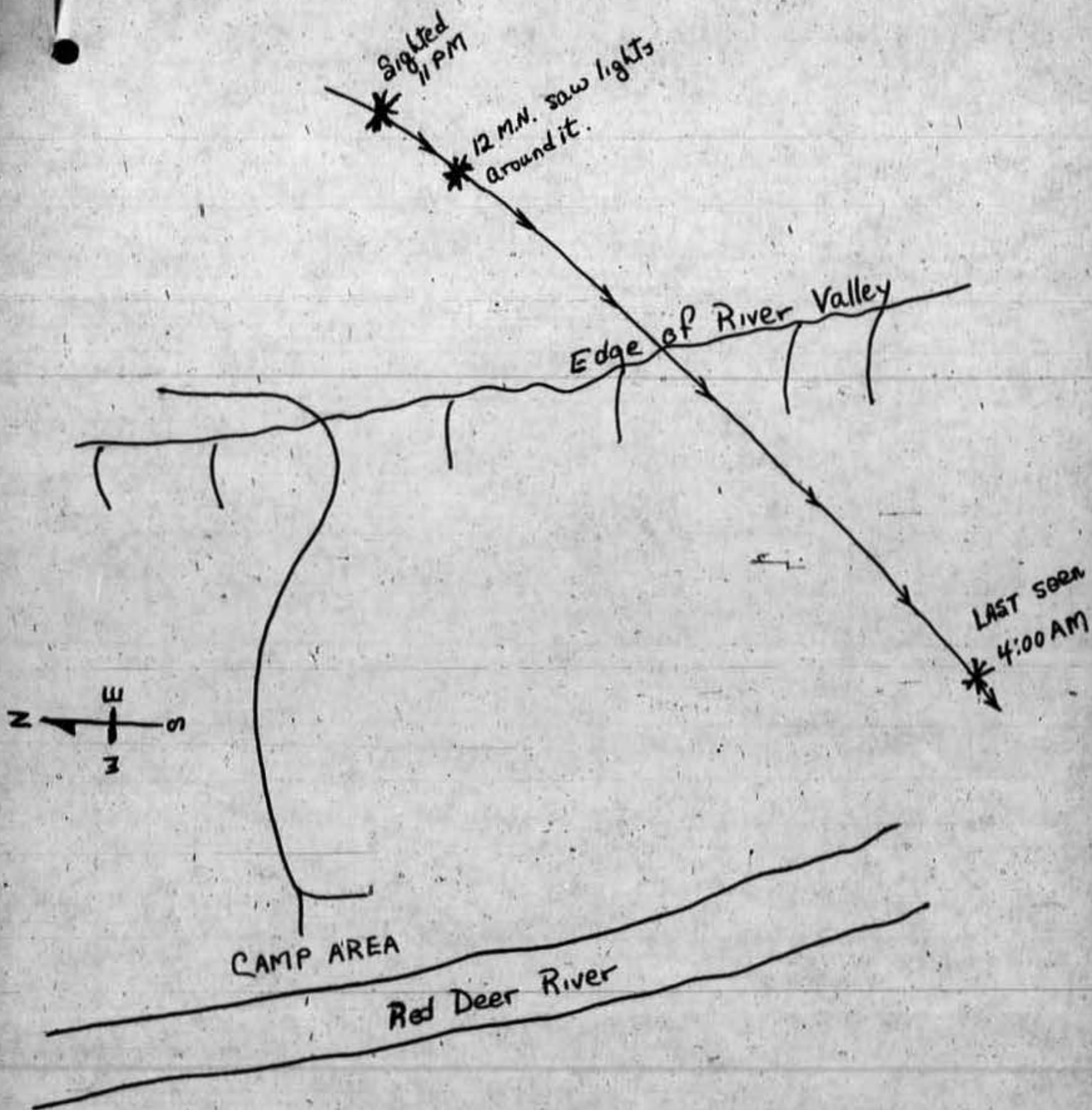
The sky was clear with no clouds. Penhold A.F. base advised they had no radar sightings in that area of sky during the hours mentioned.

All six persons have a limited command of the english language. They all appeared sincere when I talked to them.

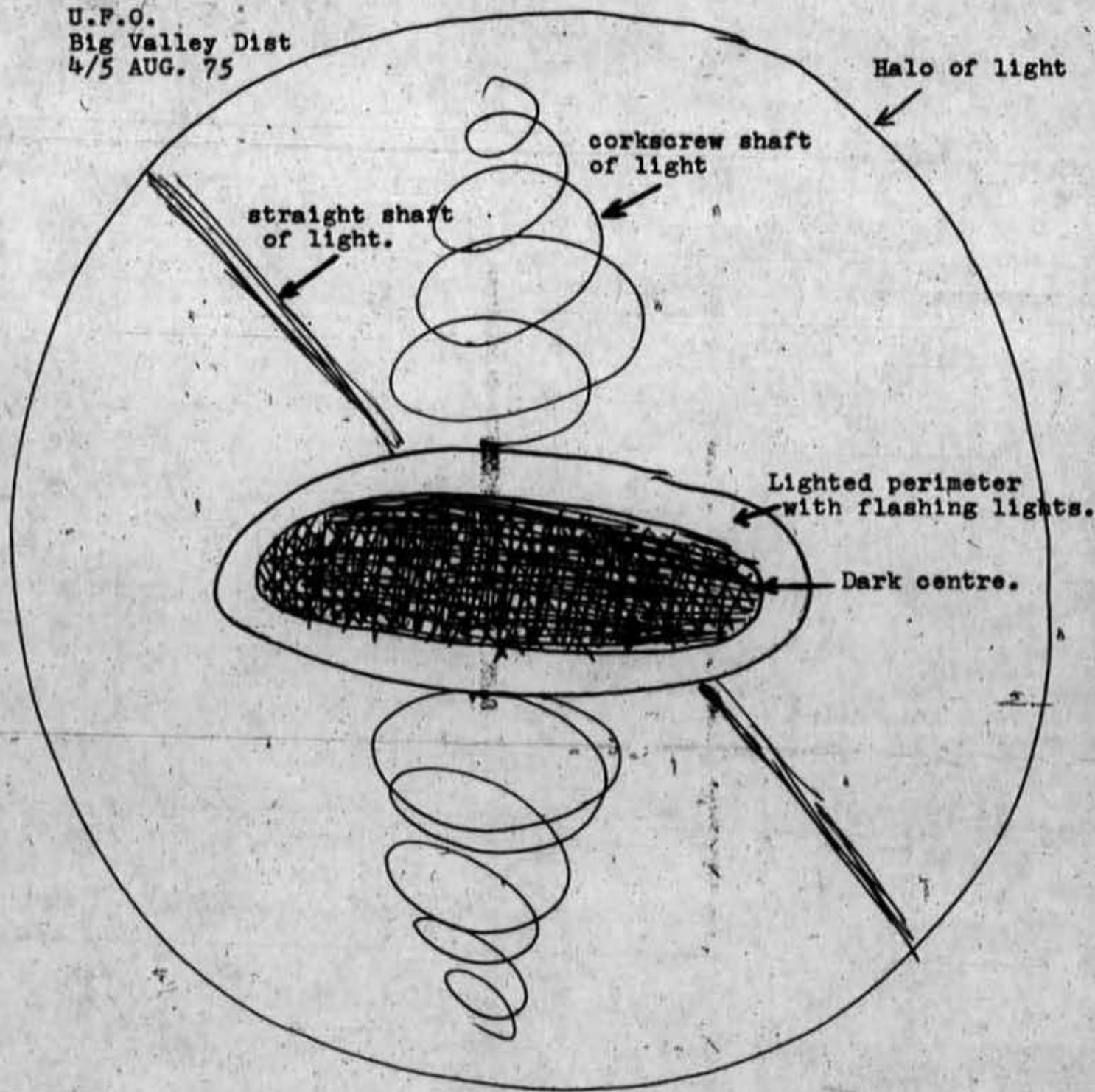

- At 2:30 P.M. this date, captionally noted contacted this office via phone to advise that at approximately 3:45 A.M. Central Time, this date he and four other members of his family witnessed what was described as an Unidentified Flying Object (UFO), a short distance to the east of their home which is located 9 miles north of the junction of PTH # 212 and 508 on 508, 2 miles east and 1000 feet south (land location 2E-15-5 north-east quarter).
- At 5:00 P.M. this date, I attended at the residence of Herman JANECKO and interviewed same, along with Lillian JANECKO (BD: 8 SEP 31), Carol Anne JANECKO (BD: 2 DEC 59) and Josephine Ivey JANECKO (BD: 27 AUG 61). All of the aforementioned were persons who observed the UFO. Herman JANECKO advised me that his older daughter, Alexandria Dianne Helen JANECKO (BD: 17 JUL 58) observed the UFO for the longest period of time and it was she who first sighted the object. Herman JANECKO advised me that Alexandria JANECKO would not be available for interview until 6 AUG 75.
- Carol and Josephine JANECKO were interviewed and they advised that the UFO was first sighted by Alexandria JANECKO from a bedroom window, in the bedroom where all three girls sleep, and that they saw the object moments after Alexandria. Carol and Josephine advised that Alexandria went to bed at approximately 3:30 A.M. (Central Time), and they had gone to bed a short time prior. At approximately 3:45 A.M. (Central Time) Alexandria complained to Carol and Josephine that she was experiencing a sense of dizziness and that the house appeared to be spinning. Carol and Josephine went to give Alexandria assistance and at that time, Alexandria noted the object through the bedroom window and immediately alerted Carol and Josephine of same.

4. Alexandria, Carol and Josephine observed the object from the bedroom window for a short period of time and the commotion caused by the three awoke Herman and Lillian JANECKO who were sleeping in an adjacent bedroom. Carol and Josephine advised that moments prior to seeing the object themselves, they heard a loud roar and then looked out the window to see the object move across the sky in a north-east direction. The object was observed by Carol and Josephine at a distance of approximately 150/200 yards east of the house and was observed moving north-east and then east.

5. Carol and Josephine first described the object they saw as being a bell-shaped object (round top and flat bottom) with orange and red spinning lights. The yellow lights appeared to be the centre of the whole object and the red lights were on the bottom portion of same. No real estimate of altitude could be determined, but it is indicated that it was approximately 50 feet in the air. There was only one such object sighted, and same did not appear to touch down at any time during the 8/10 minute observation period.

6. Herman and Lillian JANECKO advised that when they first observed the object, it was some distance east of the house and motionless and resembled a star. Herman and Lillian thought same to be a star until same continued to move in an easterly direction and then disappeared. Herman JANECKO advised that the object moved at an apparent rapid rate of speed.

7. A general opinion of the weather conditions of the time of sighting are that the sky was clear with a thin layer of cloud and what appeared to be a red-coloured haze on the eastern horizon from a partial sunrise.

8. Further conversation with Carol and Josephine JANECKO revealed that they had witnessed a similar occurrence on two previous occasions. The first occasion was on the 26 JUL 75 at approximately 3:35 A.M. (Central Time) at which time the object was noted east of the JANECKO residence at some distance moving in a northerly direction. The second occasion was at approximately 3:30 A.M. (Central Time) on 27 JUL 75 and at this time, the object was sighted east of the JANECKO residence at a closer distance than the 26 JUL 75 sighting. At this time, the object was noted moving in a southerly direction and in an up and down pattern. The sightings of 26, 27 JUL 75 were reported to Herman JANECKO, but he doubted the validity of the sighting and never reported same. Carol and Josephine advised that the objects they observed on 26 and 27 JUL 75 were quite similar to the object they observed on 5 AUG 75. In all observations, there was only the one object observed.

9. During the interviewing of Herman, Lillian, Carol, and Josephine JANECKO, it was my opinion that all subjects were of sound mind and character. However, I did observe that they were all highly excitable and had conversed over the sightings to a great extent. The immediate reaction they had to the object they saw, was that it was a UFO and this was due to the 26 and 27 JUL 75 sightings of Carol and Josephine and the group conversations they had on the subject after. It almost appeared as if they had a one-track mind on the subject.

6 AUG 75

10. This date, I interviewed Alexandria JANECKO and a statement was obtained from same. Alexandria advised that shortly after going to bed at approximately 3:45 A.M. (Central Time) on 5 AUG 75, she started to get dizzy. She called to her two sisters for assistance and then heard a loud roar outside. At this time, she looked out the bedroom window and noticed the object previously-mentioned. It appeared to her to be approximately 75 yards in a south-east direction from the house and approximately 50 feet in the air. She could only distinguish the revolving red and orange lights of the object and was unable to give it any shape. Through further conversation, Alexandria advised that the weather conditions at the time of the sighting were that it was a cool night, was partially cloudy, but a few stars could be seen. There was a partial sunrise and it was slightly misty. The clouds appeared to be misty also.

11. During the interview of Alexandria JANECKO, I found her to be a very excitable person, and so much so that I instructed her to write down her own statement. Alexandria had never made such a sighting herself before, but was well aware of the two previous sightings of 26 and 27 JUL 75 that Carol and Josephine had made. Alexandria further advised that she had never experienced dizziness in the past and could only give the UFO as the cause of her dizziness on the 5 AUG 75.

12 AUG 75

12. On this date, I made a patrol to the general area of the UFO observation. There are very few people who live in the area and none who had observed any of the noted sightings.

13 AUG 75

13. This date, I made a further patrol to the sighting area and interviewed the closest neighbours of the JANECKO'S. Mr. Walter JONASSON who lives .8 miles north of the JANECKO residence was interviewed and he advised that he was at home sleeping on the times of the three noted sightings, but heard and saw nothing. JONASSON did advise however, that approximately 3 years ago he witnessed a red glow near his residence, but attributed the sighting to the burning of methane gas from a nearby marsh. JONASSON has made no sightings since that time, but indicated that the mist from the nearby marsh reflects lights in the area making them appear closer than they really are.

14. I also had occasion to interview Mr. Tony JANECKO, brother of Herman JANECKO, who lives .2 miles south of the Herman JANECKO residence. Tony JANECKO was at home during the times of the reported sightings, but heard and saw nothing. Tony JANECKO owns the property over which the 5 AUG 75 observation was made and from all indications, the 5 AUG-75 UFO would have been almost directly over his house when the loud roaring sound was heard. Tony JANECKO lives alone in his house and heard and saw nothing. I checked his property in the immediate area of the sighting, but was unable to locate any evidence that anything had been there.

15. I made a check of the area for physical characteristics and came up with the following:

(a) The whole area is surrounded by water, except to the south. The Red River is 2 miles to the west and the Devil's Creek Marsh is .2 miles west of the Herman JANECKO residence.

(b) The nearest residences to the JANECKO residence are .8 miles to the north, .2 miles to the south, 2 miles to the west and approximately 2 1/2 miles to the north-east.

(c) Provincial Highway #59 runs in a north east to south west direction approximately 2 miles east of the JANECKO residence and Canadian Pacific Railway tracks run parallel to and a few yards from the west side of the highway. There are several gravel roads leading from highway #59 in an easterly direction and appear to be in the immediate path of that taken by the UFO.

(d) A gravel road leading from the JANECKO residence extends approximately 6 miles to the south east before it intersects with highway #59. A short distance further south high tension Manitoba Hydro wires cross highway #59 in an east west direction.

(e) I have heard windshield glass breaking from impact at a distance of approximately 4 miles during the early quiet hours of the morning and investigated to confirm the noise heard. This sound carry is due to general flatness of the terrain in the area. The Town of Libau, Manitoba is approximately 2½ miles to the north east of the JANEKZKO residence and a summer resort area is approximately 2½ miles to the west. No sightings or noises have been reported from either of these areas.

(f) The following airports are situated within a 15 mile radius of the JANEKZKO residence and operate on a fixed to a non-fixed time basis:

(1) Netley Airport which is north west of the JANEKZKO residence and is only used in emergency cases as it is not maintained.

(2) Cambrian Airways which is south west of the JANEKZKO residence.

(3) St. Andrews Float Base which is south of the JANEKZKO residence.

(4) St. Andrews Airport which is south, south west of the JANEKZKO residence.

It might be noted that on several occasions, I have observed the search light at St. Andrews Airport reflect through mist and cause the light beam to reflect upwards and for a greater distance than under normal conditions.

(g) Winnipeg International Airport is approximately 30 miles south west of the JANEKZKO residence and it has been noted on several occasions that aircraft fly over the Selkirk, Manitoba area going to and coming from that airport.

16 AUG 75

16. To this date, no further witnesses have been found regarding this matter and no further sightings have been reported.

I arrived home from work at approximately 2:25 A.M. on the 5th of August 1975. My boyfriend, Paul LONG was with me. We were all in the house. My two sisters and my boyfriend and I had coffee downstairs. My two sisters went to bed and I stayed up for a short time longer. I went to bed at approximately 3:45 A.M. I just lay down and I started to get dizzy. My eyes began to revolve the room, when upon closing my eyes, my body seem to revolve around and around. I seemed afraid, so I woke my sister Josephine up. I began asking to hold my head, when this noise came about. It came about quiet, then roared up to a sound like a four barrelled engine of a car, then the noise suddenly disappeared. The time length of this noise was about a couple seconds. I sat up and looked out the window and noticed a blinking light, not bothering to notice whether it was a star, me and my sister, Josephine ran towards the livingroom window yelling there was a UFO. The shape of the object was invisible at the time. By sight, we that's me and my sister, noticed huge yellow lights revolving around in a circular motion. There also seemed to be a red light within the circle of yellow lights. It first appeared as I saw it over my uncle's bush, almost across from our livingroom window. It didn't appear to be at a great height. It advanced in a north easterly direction increased with height as it moved. It appeared, to be travelling very fast. It covered a great distance in a matter of about 2 minutes. Then the object disappeared, we watched it till it went out of sight. It was no plane, jet, but maybe a UFO.

Q. Were you able to determine any shape of the object during your observations?

A. The only thing I could really make out were the lights.

Q. Why did you immediately identify the object you saw as a UFO?

A. My two sisters had told me before that they had seen a UFO and I guess I just assumed it was a UFO.

Q. Had you taken anything in the way of alcohol or a drug prior to going to bed? Or at any time during the evening?

A. No, I don't drink for one thing.

Q. Have you ever experienced dizzy spells before?

A. Never, that was the first time.

Q. How long had you worked that day and what type of work do you do?

A. I work as a waitress at Howard's Lunch Bar in Selkirk and I had worked from 5:00 P.M. to 1:00 A.M. before going home.

Q. Did you go anywhere after work?

A. No, my boyfriend picked me up and we went to my home.

Q. Have you yourself ever seen the object before?

A. No, I haven't. I've just heard about it from my sisters.

Q. What was the total length of time that you observed the object?

A. It was for approximately 8 to 10 minutes. It's kind of hard to say because I was really scared.

Q. Were you able to determine the size of the object?

A. To me it appeared to be big, but I was unable to determine any shape. The lights were quite large and moved in a circle.

Q. Were the objects movements abrupt?

A. The movements were smooth. It moved north east and then east without stopping. I didn't see it stop at all.

Q. What were the weather conditions outside at the time you saw the object?

A. It was cool that night. It was partially cloudy, but you could see a few stars. There was a partial sunrise and it was slightly misty. The clouds appeared to be misty also.

Re: Bright Light in Sky

On the 6th day of August 1975 at 2:00 AM our Detachment received a call from a Mr. Gary SHILLIDAY of the Lethbridge District. He stated that he is presently observing a bright light in the sky which is much brighter than other stars in the same location.

A patrol was made to the SHILLIDAY farm and the object was observed. It was approximately located in the 10:00 o'clock position in an East South Easterly direction. It was not moving in relation to the other stars around it and did appear to be much brighter than the other stars.

On the evening of the 6th day of August and early morning of the 7th day of August, the same light was observed in the same location and in the same relation to the other stars.

It is felt that the object observed is only a bright star and no further investigation will be continued. There have been no other reports on this sighting received at this office.

Between 12:15 & 12:45 in the vicinity of Oxford - Bishops Mills - my wife & I observed some form of UFO.

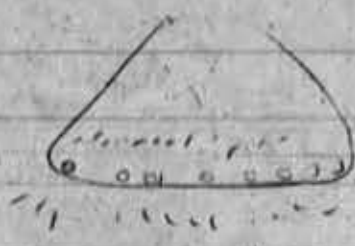
It appeared to be conical shaped & Bright Orange in colour - the orange colour of Amber turning lights.

The object was between $\frac{1}{2}$ & $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile away from where we watched it.

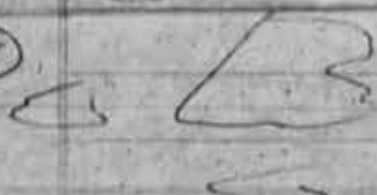

What I first observed was cloud-like (long thin clouds) with light shining through. The light did not follow a straight pattern to the ground (like moonlight would) but seemed to reflect in different directions. Small lights flashed throughout the form. This form started to change shape and gradually faded out. A small bright orange dot appeared and then increased in size to the shape above (dome-like). This form stayed for a minute or two and then faded out to a bright orange blur.

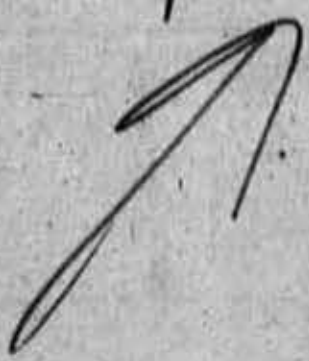



Hynek and The U.F.O. Controversy (A Commentary)

Dr. G. L. Verschurr, Director of the Fiske Planetarium at the University of Colorado in Boulder, attended the meeting of the International Society of Planetarium Educators held in Atlanta in 1974. Dr. J. Allen Hynek, author of *THE U.F.O. EXPERIENCE*, was the invited speaker at the I.S.P.E. banquet. Dr. Verschurr reports to readers of the *GRIFFITH OBSERVER* his skeptical impressions of Hynek's talk. Dr. Verschurr recently won second prize in the *GRIFFITH OBSERVER* 1974 Hughes Essay Contest.

The overall impression I was left with after listening to Hynek's talk was the feeling that the scientific side of his study was being swamped by biases and value judgements which make it hard to swallow the veracity of the present work of the Center of UFO studies. It is not enough to read in the headlines of the newspapers that a former sceptic (Hynek) now is no longer a doubter. So Hynek now believes that there are UFO's. Speaking personally, and lest the readers of this report suspect otherwise, I too believe that there are UFO's, even as defined by Hynek. That is to say, it is eminently clear that there are phenomena, which, even after careful investigation, remain un-explained, and the flying variety of those are called Un-identified Flying Objects. It seems that the point Hynek makes about there not being unidentified swimming objects (although I would like to know what fish under the sea think of humans) or pink elephants floating all over the place is hardly a point in favor of examining only UFOs. After all, people see ghosts or experience other psychic phenomena which are not understood, and we don't make a big deal of examining all those cases. There is little

serious effort being put into finding a scientific explanation for such events. So why all the hulabaloo about UFO's? Probably because there is the underlying belief (or fear) that these things are from outer space. That places UFO's apart from other unidentified phenomena.

Even though Hynek comes across as having a scientifically open mind, his talk was riddled with (perhaps unconscious) statements about





the alien nature of these UFO's. For example "They must have some knowledge of aerodynamics that we don't." Who is they? Or "they do not seem to obey Newton's laws of motion." Again the concept of "they" rather than "it." A subtle point, you might argue, but one that is important, since the problem is not solved, and the use of such words implies a solution.

Hynek states quite correctly that there may be theories for UFOs that are not even formulated yet, but nevertheless, the rest of his talk ignores this very important point. Since we do not know what the phenomenon is we must be especially careful, in a scientific inquiry, to avoid unconscious bias. Indeed, there may be many solutions. Perhaps the daylight "disks" are one class of phenomenon, and the close encounters of the second kind are quite another phenomenon. In his book *The UFO Experience* Dr. Hynek lists the many different classes of sightings, but still they are listed together as being part of the same UFO-experience. I know of at least one astronomical problem that was finally solved only when it was realized that there were three distinctly separate phenomena being observed. They had previously been erroneously lumped together as one problem, and that had made it impossible to come to grips with it. Can this be happening with UFOs?

But to get to the thrust of the talk given by Hynek: we were told early on in the piece how bad, how biased, and how useless the Condon report was. We were told how the summary of that report was "the villain of the piece." We were not told that you have no hope of getting a copy of that report, unless

your local library has one, since it is now out of print. If that report was so useless, why doesn't Dr. Hynek let sleeping dogs lie and forget about it? After all, the majority of any of his audiences anywhere will never have seen it. Of course the report is there, like the sword of Damocles. I have started to read it and as far as I am concerned it appears as an extremely careful piece of scientific investigation. Indeed the report states that after their investigation they found no information in the UFO phenomenon which added to scientific knowledge at that time. They do not say that UFOs don't exist. Clearly they do "exist." There are events or experiences which, even after careful investigation, are still unexplained. People do experience UFOs. I use the word "experience" deliberately, because we are dealing with reports made by people who are convinced they experienced something. Often it is a visual experience. It seems to me that perhaps we have a selection effect here, in that any other experience which could not be explained but which came through another one of the senses would not be reported in the way that a "seen" UFO is.

The Condon report also states that if someone has any idea about how to tackle this UFO problem in the future, an idea that would hopefully lead to a scientific explanation of the phenomenon, then such person should apply to the usual funding agencies for support and such support should be given. Personally I have no idea how I would set about seeking a solution to the UFO problem, being as complex at it is. The question I ask is why Dr. Hynek did not approach the usual funding agencies for support of his Center for UFO Studies. Should his plans for explaining UFOs be found to bear great promise, then any reasonably open-minded referee of a proposal to a funding agency would have to pass it. So why are none of the usual funding agencies supporting Hynek's Center for UFO Studies?

The impression left with me, after this talk was that there was no very clearly worked out plan of investigation being followed at all. We heard some stories about visiting the scenes of some recent sightings, of hypnosis of some witnesses, and even about getting one witness drunk. But too often I heard Dr. Hynek state that after his interviews these people were judged by him to be reasonable witnesses and

sometimes he stated that the witnesses were well respected members of the community. In one case he stated that the witnesses of the UFO incident would have been credible witnesses in a court of law. None of these criteria seem in the slightest bit relevant as a scientific criterion for defining the credibility of humans. For example, we have just been through a period of political chaos in this country which revealed that some of the potentially most credible witnesses or even respected citizens have been anything but reliable.

This does not mean that the witnesses of UFO incidents are all liars. It does mean that one does not judge the reliability of witnesses on a personal impression. It is not sufficient for us to hear about Hynek's visit to Father Gill and be told that Father Gill is a very methodical Anglican priest and Hynek has no good reason to call him a liar. It does not add to the story of the Gill incident to learn that Hynek found Father Gill to be a good gentleman and a scholar. The UFO phenomenon needs to be studied scientifically, and personal judgments of witnesses does not add to the scientific content of the event described. We are too often deceived by appearance. To me the UFO phenomena are beset with appearances which deceive.

I believe that the very fact that UFOs are regarded as being primarily in the realm of experience of an astronomer is fallacious. Why an astronomer? Yes, an astronomer can help in explaining where the stars and planets are during a sighting. As a result many strange experiences become explained phenomena, but what of the remaining sightings? Why is the center for UFO studies run by an astronomer? Why didn't the psychologists, who are used to dealing with people and the things people experience, start serious study of these phenomena? Is it possible that they know something astronomers don't? Is it possible that they have a better awareness of the enormity of the problem considering our pathetic knowledge about what humans are really like, of how humans perceive things and all the complexity that entails? I question whether it is astronomers that should be dabbling in this study. The bias toward astronomy does not only presuppose that the answer lies in astronomy, but implies that astronomers may be

supremely capable of tackling any mystery that befalls the human race!

Dr. Hynek reported that the Gallup poll had showed that 15 million Americans had seen UFOs. Of course, these UFOs would be by the Condon definition (an observation that was puzzling to the observer) rather than by the Hynek definition of a UFO (which is a sighting that remains a puzzle after careful investigation). It is a pity that after Dr. Hynek spends so much time bad-mouthing the Condon report as well as its definition of a UFO, that he should then quite blithely quote this Gallup poll result in the way he does. Those were 15 million Americans who saw a Condon type UFO, which is not the same as a Hynek UFO!

The study of UFOs is a fascinating example of the way bad science is sometimes practiced. It is also a good example of how some scientists have done their very best to come to terms with the problem from the point of view of their science. Hynek claims that "the UFO reports do not fit into the established scientific picture." Nor did quasars or pulsars or anomalous OH emission when they were first discovered. But scientists approached those problems in the "established" ways. They proposed experiments, formulated new theories and tested them. This doesn't seem to work too well for UFOs. Why not? Are the UFOs not really in the realm of science? Are the wrong scientists asking the wrong questions? Is our science too young to deal with the phenomena? Why do highly trained scientists, respected by their peers, not report UFOs in a regular way? After all, in a sample of 15 million there should be hundreds of astronomers, leave alone other trained observers of natural phenomena, who must have seen UFOs. Why is it always some fisherman (or men) or some other poor hapless citizens out minding their own business who have the good fortune (or misfortune) of seeing these events? Why doesn't a good UFO sighting happen over a meeting of the American Astronomical Society or over Mt. Palomar?

A group of us in Atlanta saw a UFO for a while, over the outdoor sky program on Stone Mountain. Most realized that it was a distant plane so it wasn't a UFO for very long, by anyone's definition. But none of us knew what sort of plane it was, so to that extent it was still an unidentified plane. If we wanted to

investigate that incident further, in order to identify the plane, one of two outcomes was possible. Either we succeed in identifying what type of plane it was, or we do not. Can anything be added to the body of scientific knowledge in either case? No! In the latter case clearly not. In the former case we might learn that it was a Cessna, but that is a datum which does not help us understand Cessnas or planes. We would have to see a Cessna in the daylight and take it to pieces and understand how it works and only then would we have added to our pool of knowledge about planes.

The same is true of UFOs. Even if twenty people all see the same UFO (and if we can assume the usual bias that the UFO is a solid flying machine) then we would need to catch one and analyse it before we could claim that we have added to the general fund of knowledge that is called science. It is not enough for us to be convinced that twenty people saw a UFO. So what if they did? There is little we can do about it isn't there? We can say, "Fine, you guys all saw a UFO. Lucky you." But so what? And it is this quite frustrating aspect of UFO-ology that keeps most scientists back in their labs studying the psychology of rats or in their observatories photographing the stars. It is because no one has much idea what to do with a UFO until it is in the lab or at the other end of a telescope, or until it is humming over some city for weeks on end, like they do in science fiction stories, that so little can be learnt from past UFO experiences. Only when a UFO is available for close study will the majority of scientists lose any sleep over the problem. In the meantime Dr. Hynek is performing a laudable task in keeping the pot percolating. If Dr. Hynek is lucky, he might see and photograph and tape record one himself one day, and then he will be in business.

In fact, the ideal way to study the phenomenon, considering the known properties of the UFOs, is for there to be trained scientists at the scene of the experience with only seconds delay, but that is hardly practical.

In conclusion I want to stress that I have no doubt that people experience UFOs. Dr. Hynek's stories are true stories. But what have the people experienced? How useful are the descriptions that are made? What can we learn from them except that they saw something that cannot be explained at this time? Where do we go from here? I don't have the answer. Perhaps Hynek's Center for UFO studies is the answer, but if it is, I don't know what questions it will answer. Maybe we will not have an answer to the UFO problems for years, which should keep the pulp magazines happy. Too many scientific studies which prove that UFOs are not necessarily alien spaceships are not good for popular sales. The Condon report is out of print because no one wanted to buy it, let alone read it. Why not? Well, it is hardly dramatic news to learn that scientists do not understand what UFOs are and at the same time not going to make a wild guess as to what the phenomenon (or phenomena) might be. The Condon committee studied many possible hypotheses in as scientific a way as possible and found none of them to be tenable. The theory that UFOs are alien spaceships can only be tested when one finally lands and then allows daily tours by interested scientists. In the meantime try to imagine what sort of highly advanced civilization it is that is flying between the stars and then occasionally lands and makes fools of themselves by revealing themselves to some non-comprehending humans. But there I go again. I am assuming that there might be truth to the rumors, while believing deep down that the answer lies in the studies of human beings, not in space.

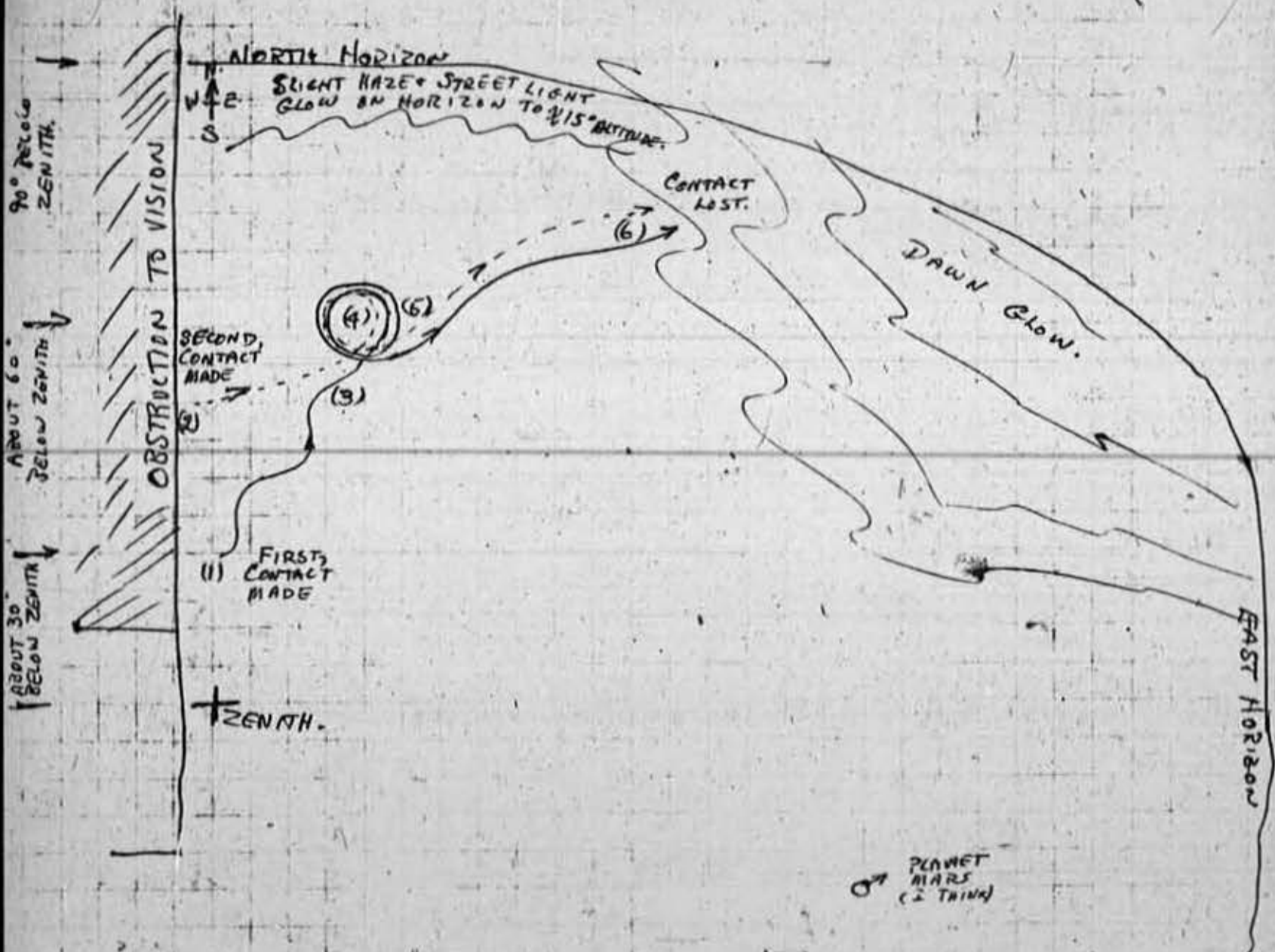



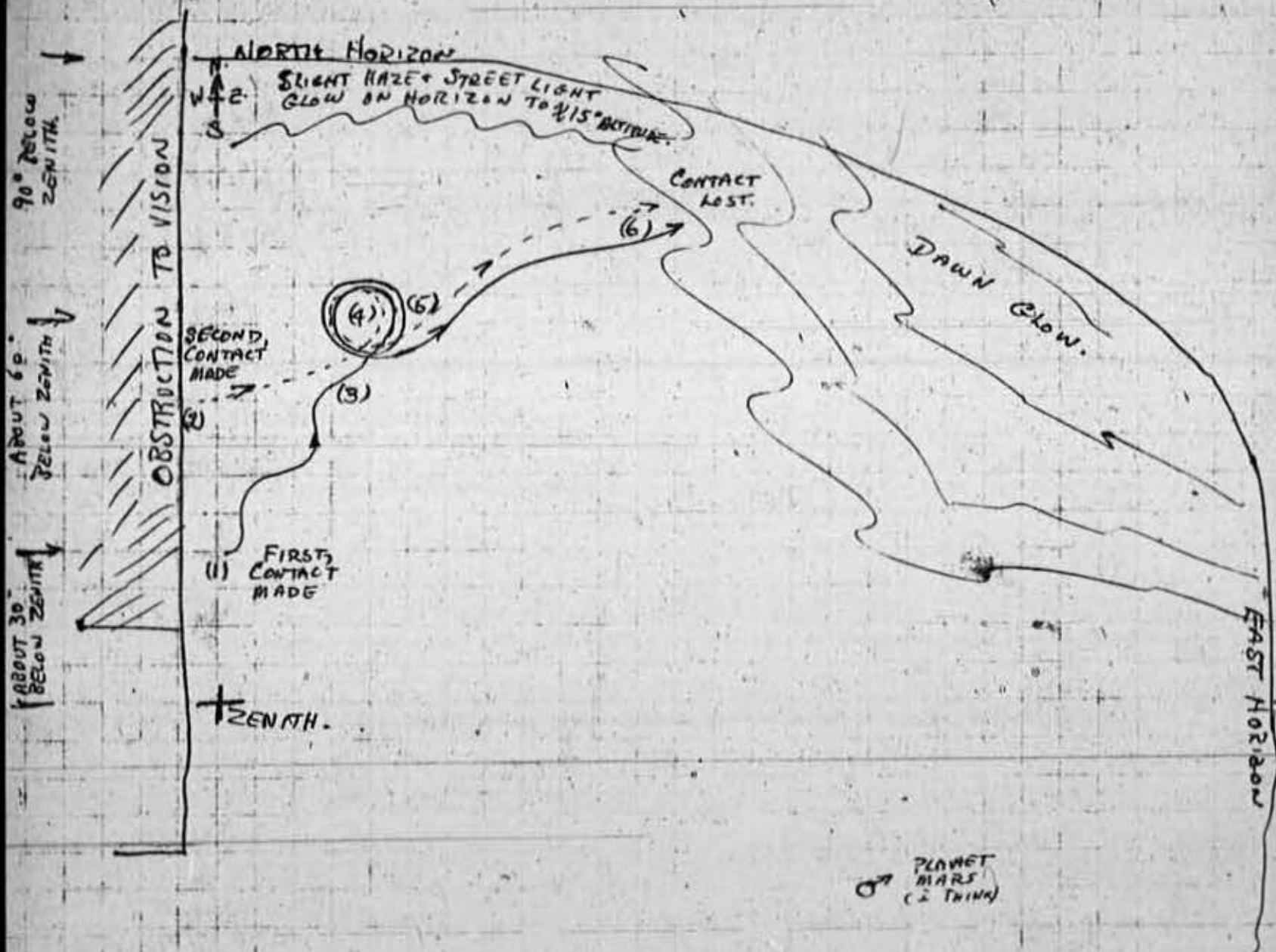

1. Mr. GOGAL reported to this office that he has seen lights in the sky which he said are U.F.O's. At approx. 6:25 A.M., 26 SEP 75, he saw two bright lights moving south, and one in between them moving north. These were very high, and moved very fast. When he saw them, they were south-west of Woodridge, Man. Mr. GOGAL is employed by the C.N.R. in Woodridge, and was standing on the C.N.R. station platform when he saw the lights.

2. Sprague telex #11 has been forwarded to the National Research Council, Meteor Centre, Ottawa.

5 OCT 75

3. Further attempts have been made to locate Mr. GOGAL, and question him further regarding the above, however each time, he had not been available. Will continue to look for him.

10 OCT 75

4. Contacted Mr. GOGAL this date. He repeated the same story about the sighting mentioned above. He stated that the objects were a bright clear light. He stated that the two lights moving south disappeared after a couple of seconds, and the one going north travelled for quite some distance, and he watched it for 5 to 10 seconds. He advised that the sky was very clear at the time that he saw them. He did not hear any noise whatsoever. Mr. GOGAL went on to advise that the next night, 27 SEP 75, at approx. 6:05 A.M., he saw another light similar to the ones mentioned. This light was travelling from south to north, and was west of Woodridge. He watched this light for 5 or 10 seconds. None of the lights he has seen has had a tail behind it. Since the 27 SEP 75, he has not seen anything further.

5. In speaking with Mr. GOGAL, it seemed that he was quite sensible and reliable. He is a married man, 27 years of age. He resides in Suite #2, 268 Hanover St., Steinbach, Man. Telephone #326-9635. Mr. GOGAL is employed as an operator for the C.N.R., and his wife is a registered nurse at the Bethesda Hospital in Steinbach. He advised that he was leaving on holidays on 11 OCT 75, and will be gone for three weeks. Should you wish any further information from him, he will be more than willing to answer any questions he can.



John Musgrave's Date with a UFO

The Canada Council is putting up \$6,000 to see that he keeps it

It all began, I suppose, with the stuffed animals. Johnny Musgrave was an army brat, born in Minneapolis in 1941. When the youngster was in Grade 3 his father received a transfer to California. When they left they took everything, including Johnny's stuffed animals, but for some reason the animals didn't stop moving once the rest of the family had settled in San Diego.

Not that it's unusual for a child to believe his playthings are real, but it is curious that one could actually convince his mother that the animals didn't seem to need any help to get around. Johnny and his mother even did tests: arranging the animals according to a specific floor plan; closing the bedroom door, waiting, and then checking to see who had gone where. Johnny's mother was convinced.

It wasn't until 1955, though, that he had his most remarkable encounter with strange forces. He was 14, camping near El Cajon, Calif., when he met a retired doctor who told him that he and some 10 others had been observing flying saucers for the past few days, always shortly after sunset. The doctor invited young Musgrave to join his group that evening. They waited a short while until the bright light the doctor had described showed up, moving slowly across the western sky, then breaking into two lights, one moving north, the other south. Next night the strange lights and Musgrave returned, and although he was the only non-adult among the witnesses to the event, it was that evening that he received the distinct impression the entire show was being staged for his sole personal benefit.

Next night he had a dream. It was not his first unusual dream: he'd dreamt once the house was going to catch fire, only to wake up next morning to find the kitchen ablaze. But this dream was not the same, not so easily passed off as mere coincidence. This time he felt he was being drawn up into the object he had observed the previous night, and while inside he spoke with some of its occupants — people-like, not monsters — and he believed it to be a conversation among equals. Musgrave was frank with them, telling them he just couldn't cope with the dreams and strange events that had been occurring. He told them it was too soon, that he wasn't yet ready. But, he added, he would be ready in his 32nd year.

When John Musgrave was 30 he went to Edmonton to accept a job as a computer analyst at the University of Alberta (there was no draft evasion involved — a football injury had left him ineligible for duty in Vietnam). When he was 32, he took the step the dream had predicted: he wrote a long, detailed letter to Dr. Jacques Vallee, the noted UFO examiner at the Institute for the Future in California, detailing the El Cajon

sightings and his peculiar dream. A year later he applied for a Canada Council grant to study the UFO phenomenon in Canada, and last April he was given \$6,000. He felt he was simply answering a call.

When Paul-Émile Leblanc, head of the Council's explorations program, announced the grant he was quick to add, "It's not a put-on. It's a serious study." The very nature of the UFO grant was

enough in itself to give them worry — better, in some minds, that they use taxpayers' money to find out just what it is angels are up to when they gather on pinheads. But if the Council felt it had to defend the grant in some way, it's just as well they didn't also take on the task of defending Musgrave: certain things about him were probably better left untold. Bad enough that he was American, not one of our own rifling Ottawa's

pockets, but he was also a former 4-H Club member whose sympathies now lie with the Marxist-Leninist line of communism; he wears only denim and eats health foods; he keeps his hair, which runs halfway down his back, in a ponytail; and he considers the gossipy American tabloid newspaper, the *National Enquirer*, good source material.

Admittedly, it all sounds absurd, but it is also unfair. John Musgrave is as well qualified for the task as anyone else in this country. He has been taking specially assigned college courses since he was 13, entering the University of Chicago on a full scholarship when he was only 16, and he has done graduate work at the University of California at Berkeley, as well as a return stint back at Chicago. Although he has received enough credits to make his education roughly equivalent to a PhD, he never graduated as such, for the courses he took never lay in traditional directions; rather, they seemed mostly to be of value to someone engaged in the study of space and UFOs. "It was, I admit, in the back of my mind all along," he says.

During the decade he spent absorbing university courses in physics, psychology, computer analysis and history, he also kept up ties with the various UFO societies throughout the United States, so that when he applied for the Canada Council grant he had not only his formidable education, but he also had impeccable references that included, among others, Dr. J. Allen Hynek, the highly respected Illinois scientist who is generally considered the expert on UFO phenomena.

Even so, the Canada Council must have been somewhat nervous about the grant, since Musgrave received barely half the amount he had initially requested. ("In essence, they gave me my expenses, but not my salary.") For a while he tried to hold down his job as course designer at Alberta's new Athabasca University and research UFOs as well, but he resigned in August to work full-time on the UFO research, figuring he could live off his savings until December or so. It was the only way he could arrange the time needed to travel. Since leaving his post at Athabasca, he's spent three weeks researching in California, and another week at Dr. Hynek's Centre for UFO Studies at Evanston, Illinois, where he uncovered nearly 1,000 pages of American-compiled data on Canadian UFO sightings.

And that is but one hint of the magnitude of the phenomenon in this country. So far he's filled a filing cabinet with stories of UFO sightings that took place in Canada, and is about to begin his second cabinet. The information comes from old newspapers, diaries, word-of-mouth, interviews, and from letters

(written to him at 10510 86th Ave., Edmonton, Alta., T63 2M6). There are literally thousands of such letters, coming from people like Howard Nelson, who waited 63 years to find someone who would listen to his story about the "elongated object that appeared twice as long and high as a modern Boeing 747 jet," which he saw on a June morning in 1912, when just a 5-year-old boy on a Saskatchewan farm.

Musgrave has also uncovered what may be the earliest sighting of an unidentified flying object over North America. An 18th-century diary belonging to one Simeon Perkins contains an entry dated October 12, 1796, which tells of a strange story from the Bay of Fundy that "ships have been seen in the air." Two men and a girl observed "15 ships and a man forward with his hand stretched out." He's discovered that Canada was subject to the same waves of sightings that have made certain years stand out as times of peak UFO activity in the rest of the world (1896 being a particularly big year for us, as well as 1947 and 1952). He has come across stories such as the tale of the tugboat *Gulf Master*, a fairly new ship in apparent good condition, which vanished without a trace with five crewmen aboard on January 11, 1967, near a place (Parksville, B.C.) where loggers had

repeatedly seen UFO activity. No explanation for the disappearance has ever been offered.

There are also stories from farmers who have found circular depressions in their fields after sighting what they believed were flying saucers, from puzzled old people who have always wondered what it was they saw 40, 50 or even 60 years ago, even from police officers who have seen strange events on late-night patrols. There is no one type that reports to him, no typical UFO observer that Musgrave has found. All they have in common is their seriousness and their desire to know what it was they saw.

"I'm convinced it's the first time in the world a grant has been given to an individual to do such a study," Musgrave says. "I'm not researching to prove the phenomenon exists. I'm investigating to find out what they are. And I'm also doing a service: people now have someone they can tell their stories to."

It's unlikely Musgrave will ever get all the stories. A Gallup poll, taken in August of 1974, estimated that one in every 10 Canadian adults actually claims to have seen a UFO; that means there are probably 1 million Canadian adult witnesses around at any given time. The poll further estimated that 53 per cent of

all adults believe UFOs are real. It has been estimated by the experts — even, surprisingly, by those employed by the U.S. government to "explain away" the phenomenon — that approximately one of every five sightings *cannot* be explained easily by swamp gas, weather balloons, the planet Venus, shooting stars, satellites or even hoaxes. And as these are the ones Musgrave most wants to uncover, that still leaves roughly 200,000 adult Canadians out there who have seen something totally inexplicable, and whose main hope to understanding is what people like John Musgrave may some day find out.

"Even if the phenomena were nothing but hallucinations," he says, "they are still hallucinations that are scaring a lot of people, making them lose sleep, get ulcers, live in total fear. Just having someone who will listen

seriously is good from a mental health aspect — just that should make my whole grant worthwhile. That's one thing that keeps me going. Just talking and helping people who say they've been badly scared."

Such a man is Ed Rutledge of Grande Prairie, Alta., who saw the story about Musgrave's grant in the local paper and immediately mailed a tape recording to the researcher. "I went to John with my story because I figured he might be my only hope," says Rutledge. "I couldn't get a real honest-to-God answer any place else and I wanted someone who could just explain, basically, what in the hell I saw. And after talking with him I'm satisfied that I did see something, a UFO if you like, but what they are I still can't say."

Rutledge had only one witness — his son Scott, 17 — to the sighting he had September 14, 1974. They'd gone out bear hunting about 100 miles south of their home, taking several hours to cover the rough bush roads. Getting to their camp site late in the evening, they bedded down sometime around 9:30. Sometime after 10 o'clock an incredibly white, bright sphere descended and hovered over the nearby lake, veering up toward their lone campsite as they watched. When the sphere came closer they both panicked and look

off in their car — with the UFO following. As Rutledge drove in terror, Scott kept watch out the rear window. They made it back over 100 miles of bush road in just 1½ hours, and it was only when they arrived at Grovedale, near Grande Prairie, that the sphere finally left them, soaring straight up and covering what seemed like several miles in an instant.

Three days later, still badly shaken, Rutledge reported the incident to the nearby Beaverlodge air base. "The base captain did say they'd picked it up on their radar at 10:25," Rutledge says, "and they traced it right from the point I had told them to Grovedale. It went off the screen at about 11:50 p.m., and he said they didn't know why it had taken so long to come that distance. I told them maybe it was slow for them, but I was going to beat the devil. I never had anything scare me like that before. I didn't sleep good for possibly two weeks. It shook me right to the roots."

Rutledge, an avid outdoorsman, later resigned from two executive positions he held with fish and game organizations in Alberta, and has since refused to go back to the area where he first sighted the UFO. When he learned that John Musgrave might in some way help him to understand, Rutledge didn't hesitate to contact him.

Musgrave, however, was only able to

help Rutledge see that he was not alone in having a UFO experience. A letter sent by Musgrave to the Beaverlodge base in Trumpeter, Alta. only proved frustrating. While Rutledge claimed that a captain had spoken at length with him about the base's tracking of the UFO, Musgrave's inquiry was answered only by the base commanding officer, Major G.V. Clements. The answer was short and blunt: "Our log does not show any unusual sightings for the date in question."

It gives some idea of just what Musgrave is up against when it comes to dealing with official bodies. Ever since the publication in 1969 of the Condon report, a multi-year study financed by the U.S. government, there has been no governmental support for such investigations short of the meagre grant the Canada Council offered. The Condon report concluded "... nothing has come from the study of UFOs in the last 20 years that has added to scientific knowledge... Further extensive study of UFOs probably cannot be justified in the expectation that science will be advanced thereby." Experts were later able to point out that 23 per cent of the cases described in the Condon research could not be explained, but the publicity surrounding the report's conclusions had a long-lasting dampening effect.

Musgrave has only historical access to

the best-known Canadian story of the government refusing to cooperate. That is the case of Stephen Michalak, who in 1967 encountered an unusual UFO at Falcon Lake, Man. and apparently suffered burns from it. His case was examined carefully by the federal government, the National Research Council, the Condon investigators and the Canadian Armed Forces, but when then-MP Ed Schreyer asked the government whether or not the results of the very formal investigation would be made public, the then-defence minister, Leo Cadieux, answered no, they would not.

Still, there are an ever-growing number of Canadians convinced that the UFO phenomenon is genuine. It is not just George Chuvalo's claim that he saw one from his lawn the night after his loss to Muhammad Ali; there are also those like Dr. Frank Maine, the only scientist in the Canadian House of Commons, who firmly believe in the possibility that there is other life in the universe. The Liberal MP for Wellington South (in the Hamilton area) actually came out in support of photographs taken early this year by an Ontario high school student, Pat McCarthy, whose pictures of a sombrero-shaped object have since been called by the American UFO expert Dr. Hynek, "among the best ever taken."

Once Musgrave has taken his research as far as he can, he hopes to publish his findings in a book. He's well aware that there are some 200,000 or more Canadians out there who haven't the foggiest about what they once saw, but would be willing gladly to listen to any suggestions Musgrave might have. And since it's unlikely he'll ever actually *prove* we've had extraterrestrial visitors, his suggestions are basically what the grant is financing.

"When you think about what they could be, the possibilities are vast," he says. "It could be that they are taking vacations. It could also be that they are graduate students, or maybe they're just making pit stops for groceries and power, or they might be from some other dimension that spatially shares where we are and we accidentally see them from time to time. One of the most fascinating theories is that they are time trippers, maybe earthlings from thousands of years from today who have discovered the secret of time machines, come back, and are sworn by some code not to disturb us, hence the lack of contact between UFOs and man. Whatever they are, I hope to find out."

"You know, I sometimes think it's like looking through a slit in the fence at a ball game. I can't see the whole game — but I know one is going on." ☐

At approximately 3:10 a.m., 2 NOV 75, [redacted] and [redacted] were travelling south-bound on PTH#59 between the junctions of PR's 311 and 305. It was observed by these members that there was a strange light in the sky east of PTH#59. This light appeared to be close, perhaps over Mitchell, Manitoba or an area south of New Bothwell, Manitoba. The light was too close and too low to be a star or perhaps another planet. It was also too high to be a tower light for height warning. The police car was stopped and members observed this light for about 10-15 minutes. The light is described as very bright with a yellowish or faded colour. It appeared to have a red light to the bottom or right side of it also. At first members thought it might have been an aircraft, however, this thought was soon dispelled as, while observed for that 10-15 minutes, it was observed that the object moved very little. Sometimes it would appear the object would start to drop, then it would stop right away. Sometimes it would appear to move left or right, but for a very small motion and return to its original point. Sometimes it would appear to rise, however, this also took the same reaction. It would stop again almost right away and then return to its original point. Members thought it may have been a helicopter, however, for that hour, and that area this seemed rather strange. The members then commenced to drive eastbound towards this object to perhaps get closer or at a better angle to perhaps identify what it was, and what it was doing. As they drove towards it, it seemed the object was moving eastward rather fast. However, it maintained the same altitude, it seemed. The light was still bright but became a little dimmer as it moved off. It was the brightest light in the sky this night. The sky was clear of any clouds and well lit with stars, etc. It was a little cool. As members drove, it seemed the light had now settled somewhere over Steinbach, Manitoba. It was now 3:20 a.m. Members decided to call Steinbach Town Detachment via radio to see if they could observe this object and perhaps make out what it was. The members from Steinbach reported that they estimated the object then to be somewhere over Richer, Manitoba. They agreed it was strange, and nothing they had ever seen before. They stated that they had looked at the object through binoculars. The St. Pierre members decided that they would join the members in Steinbach to view this object through their binoculars also. As they drove towards Steinbach, the object, several times, seemed to go off far to the east, and then return rather close again. The green and red lights seemed to disappear frequently. The strange thing was the object seemed to remain at a fixed altitude or axis as it moved.

When St. Pierre members arrived at Steinbach Town Detachment, they were met by [REDACTED]. These members were all briefed about the object as were the St. Pierre members. [REDACTED] observed the object for about 15 to 20 minutes through the binoculars. As I did, the object seemed to change shapes and colours quite frequently. As it came closer it became much clearer and likewise less clear as it went farther away. I have never seen anything like it or its actions before, and neither had any of the six other members. The closer I could guess as to what it appeared to be like was the planet Saturn, however, it seemed too low for that. It seemed to be either, a) an object with a ring around it, or b) an object with fire or flame coming from the rear of it. It was noted as the object went away in the distance the red portion (looking like a flame or fire) glowed larger and brighter. As it came closer and became clearer, the green portion (looking like the edge of a ring - as the ring on the planet Saturn), became more expressed. It is hard to explain. See Appendix "A" of report for diagram of the object as viewed through binoculars by [REDACTED].

As per Op. Man. CO-NRC, Paragraph 6, priority, telex sent on the 2 NOV 75 via IJE563 to the National Research Council Meteor Centre, Ottawa, Ontario, with respect to the sightings. Statements requested from all Steinbach members for the purpose of this master report being compiled by this detachment.

Beausejour tracking station, Beausejour, Manitoba, was contacted by [REDACTED] and informed of the sighting and asked if they had any unidentified object on their radar section in that particular area described. They stated that they had no such spot on their section.

While en route back to St. Pierre, west-bound P.T.H. #52 from Steinbach another light was observed directly over #52 and seemed rather close. This light, however, seemed not so bright as the other. It was presently 4:30 a.m. The other object was now much higher in the sky over us and to the east of us. It was brighter and seemed to have lost all its red and green colours. It was now the same colour as the stars, which is a clear, brilliant white. This new second sighting also appeared to travel west-bound as we did. When we reached St. Pierre, it seemed to be over Carey, Manitoba. This object also appeared to maintain the same altitude or axis, however, continued to come close and drive off again. By the time we had gotten to our homes and off duty at 5:00 a.m., this second object was very very far off in the west. The first object was much higher again in the sky and still very very bright. 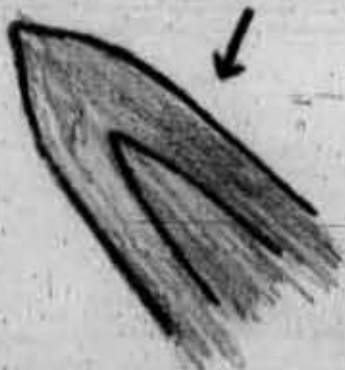

THE FIRST U.F.O. AS SEEN THROUGH A PAIR OF BINOCULARS. BASICALLY COMPRISED OF TWO SEPARATE PARTS, HOWEVER SOMETIMES SEEMED TO JOIN TOGETHER.

WHEN SEEN WITH THE HUMAN EYE ALONE THE OBJECT WAS A SINGULAR, VERY BRIGHT LIGHT, BASICALLY WHITE IN COLOUR, WITH FLASHES OF RED AND GREEN COLOURS.

This area here was green in colour. It appeared and disappeared. It grew large and then small again. It sometimes had a sharp point, and sometimes had a blunt point to it. The shaded area of it was like green streaks.



This area here was dark, as though shadowed.



This area here was like a porcupine shape. The interior shaded area was bright red in colour. This part also grew large and small. As it came closer the red was much brighter.

APPENDIX "C"

At approximately 3:10 a.m. 2 NOV 75, [redacted] and myself were patrolling south on PTH #59, somewhere between PTH #311 and PTH #305. [redacted] spotted a bright object in the north-east sky. He brought my attention to the object and we both were quite amazed at its brilliance. The object seemed very close and perhaps even over New Bothwell or in that area. The object also seemed very low to the ground but not as low to positively identify it. [redacted] and myself discussed what this object might be. We hashed out what it could possibly be, a planet or even a comet; but the movements of the object seemed strange to be a planet or comet. The movement of the object was not regular; it was noted to move to the left and right but seemingly to stay at about the same altitude. [redacted] and myself observed the object from this position for approximately 10 minutes.

At 3:20 a.m., same date, [redacted] decided we should contact Steinbach Town Det. and get their opinions on the object. Steinbach Town were notified and the members mentioned in [redacted] report took note of the object and observed it through field glasses. They too thought the object had peculiar things about it.

[redacted] and myself after notifying Steinbach, decided to patrol east and perhaps have a look at this object through the field glasses. As we patrolled, it seemed the object also moved. This time movement seemed quite different than the motion before. The object moved in a definite direction and seemed to go higher in the sky.

Upon reaching Steinbach, myself and [redacted] both observed the object through the field glasses. It seemed to me to have the shape of a parachute with the round part of the chute being the part that was always in forward motion. Also two other colors which were observed on the object besides the white basic color were red and green colors and could only be noted a few times and seemed to be on the tip of the object. I observed the object for only a short time at this point.

While on patrol back to St. Pierre via PTH #52, another object was sighted in the westerly sky. The object was not quite as bright as the first object but seemed to have the same characteristics as the first, in shape and color.

After arriving in St. Pierre at approximately 5:00 a.m. both objects were noted to be in totally different positions and seemed quite far off. The first object was now south-east and very high in the sky. The second was north-west and very low in the sky.

It is to be noted also that all during the night, the sky was clear and temperatures were cool.

This concludes my statement.

APPENDIX "D"

I am Reg. [REDACTED], currently stationed at Steinbach, Manitoba on Highway Patrol duties. I was on duty during the early morning hours of 2 NOV 75 and this is my statement with regard to events which occurred during that time.

At approximately 3:15 AM, 2-NOV 75, I had occasion to be in the office of Steinbach Municipal Detachment. Also present were [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] At this time, a radio call was received from [REDACTED] of St. Pierre Detachment. He stated that he had observed an unusual light in the sky north-east of Steinbach. He was currently east-bound on P.T.H. #52 and was unable to tell how far away it was or exactly what it was. He asked that we look and either confirm or deny his sighting.

All members present then went outside to look in the sky north-east of Steinbach. We all observed a light or what appeared to be an object with lights attached to it hovering in the sky. The precise location or elevation could not be determined. The light was many times brighter than any star.

With the use of binoculars, we were able to see the shape of the object somewhat more clearly. To me, the object appeared to consist of two groups of lights, one smaller than the other. The area between the lights was black, but it appeared as though the lights were on either end of a transparent cylindrical object, since they seemed to rotate and move simultaneously. The light given off was basically white, but there were flashes of colour as the light changed intensity slightly.

I contacted the Canadian Forces Base at Beausejour, Manitoba. I spoke with a member who was working the night shift. I advised him of our sighting and asked if they had observed the same thing either visually or on radar. The member I spoke with, who was not identified, stated that he had seen nothing but that he would check. He did not sound very convinced and did not call back with any report.

During the time that I watched the object, it moved south until it was due east of Steinbach. It maintained its form and did not fly about or disappear. The only movement was a slow one when it changed position and the only other change was when it rotated and emitted flashes of light.

At approx. 4:00 AM, [REDACTED] dispatched a Telex to Winnipeg. I then returned to my residence as there was no further action to be taken. I last observed the object at approx. 4:15 AM, 2 NOV 75.

At 3:00 A.M., the 2 NOV 75, myself, [REDACTED] returned to Steinbach Mun. Det. after investigating a B.E. & T. At 3:15 AM a radio call was received from [REDACTED] of St. Pierre Detachment. [REDACTED] asked if we had noticed anything peculiar in the sky; after quickly asking other members in the office, I told [REDACTED] we had not. He then stated he was presently watching a light or object in the sky to the North-East of Steinbach. At this point, all members of this Detachment went outside and looked in that direction. All members who were present noticed the object without having to be told where to look by other members. I went back into the office and contacted [REDACTED] on the radio and confirmed that we did see the object they were speaking about. [REDACTED] related that they were just outside of Steinbach and would be at our office in a few minutes.

I went back outside and looked at the object through the Detachment binoculars. To me, the object seemed hazy at first with a dark area in the middle. While looking through the binoculars, the object seemed to change into a Wedge shape and what appeared to be 4 or 5 streams of light, could be seen coming from the indented portion of the object. The object would then become hazy again and go into a circular shape. I noticed red and green colors mostly around the top portion of this object.

I continued watching the object from Steinbach Mun. Det. off and on until approx. 4:35AM. During this time I contacted R.C.M.S. Airport Det. and requested they contact Air Control and ascertain if they had noticed anything or received any report. Airport Det. reported that nothing had been seen, however, a slow moving airplane went through the area at approx. 2:50 AM. [REDACTED] contacted the Canadian Forces Base at Beausejour, Manitoba. The above was related to them and they stated they did not have any sightings either visually or on radar, however, would make further checks and contact this Det. Canadian Forces did not contact this Detachment.

I went to my residence at [REDACTED], Steinbach, at approx. 4:40 AM. and began watching the object at 4:50 AM. At this time, I noticed the object had moved towards the East rather than the North-East as previously stated. I watched the object until 5:30AM. I was not using binoculars, however, I saw definite lightning-like actions coming from the bottom and left side of the object. These actions did not appear and disappeared like lightning but rather extended from the object to a certain length and then withdrew. These projectiles were red and green in color. This action stopped at approx. 5:20 AM. and at this time the object had moved further to the South, exact distance I could not determine. At 5:30 AM I lost sight of the object and have not seen it or anything resembling it since. In my opinion, the object was about 5 times the size of a star.

On the 2 NOV 75, at approx. 3:00 A.M., I was on duty and in the office with [REDACTED] after investigating a B. E. and Theft in Town. At that time, we received a call from [REDACTED] from St-Pierre Det. and he mentioned that he was observing a bright object, unusual in the sky, north-east of Steinbach and he wanted to know if we could see it.

Members of the office all went out right away to look at the sky, and myself I saw a bright object North-East, and it was sort of low in the sky. I then had a look at the thing with the binoculars, and I could see a sort of round thing, bright colored and that it would change forms and some blue and red color would come up around the object.

As I was on duty until 6:00 A.M., I still kept an eye on the thing, and it would move very slow, and by the time I went home at 6:00 A.M., the object was completely East of Steinbach.

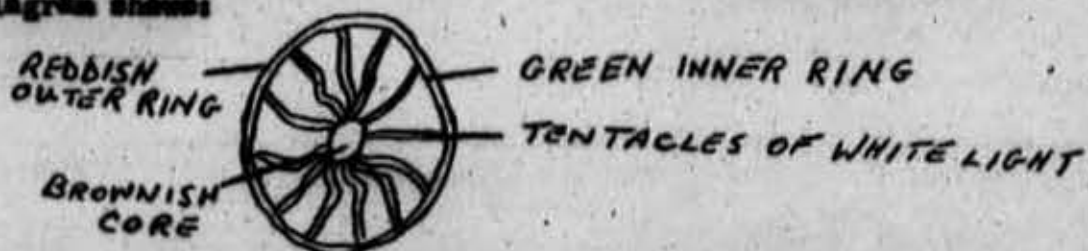

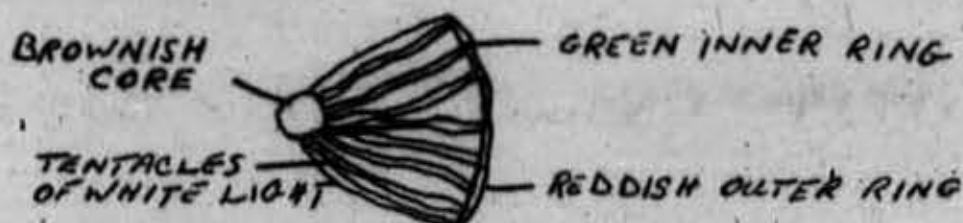

At approx. 3:15 A.M., 2 NOV 75, a radio call was received from members of the St. Pierre Detachment pertaining to a mysterious light in the sky. [REDACTED] asked us, [REDACTED] and myself, if we had noticed an unusual light, to which we replied no. We then went outside to have a look. The object was easily found as it was a very bright light situated in the North-East sky. A pair of binoculars were brought out and each member had his turn studying the object. To me it first appeared as the following diagram shows:



It appeared to move and change its appearance slowly. By 3:45 A.M. it had moved more Easterly and changed to a shell shape, but still with the same colours. Shaped as below;



I should point out prior to concluding this statement that I have never seen anything quite like this object, however, I have never studied the universe in any great detail.

At approx. 3:00 A.M. on the 02 NOV 75, [REDACTED] St. Pierre Detachment stated that while they were on patrol in the car, they noticed a very bright object in the North East sky just over Steinbach. We replied that we had not seen this object as yet but we would definitely get out of the office to have a look. This object was then sighted by [REDACTED] and myself. It seemed much to huge and bright to be a star. When we looked at this object through the binoculars, it seemed to twist and turn a bit in the sky and it accepted the colors of orange and blue with the orange colors being substituted some times by red. The object took on many shapes and sizes, one of which was disc shaped and the other a wedge shaped. Earlier in the morning at approx. 5:00 A.M., the object moved to the east with it's altitude increasing greatly. I was able to observe this same object while on patrol until around 6:00 A.M. when clouds presented interference.

4. Further enquiries in the area indicate that nobody else had seen this object. A telex was forwarded to the National Research Council Meteor Centre, Ottawa, information "K" Division.

5. The credibility of the observer is unknown, although he seemed quite sincere.

6. Copy of report being forwarded direct to Upper Atmosphere Research Section, Astrophysics Branch, National Research Council, Ottawa. No further action being taken.

"Around 6:40 P.M. tonight (13 NOV 75) as I was locking up the hanger to go to supper, we noticed a bright red object travelling from North-West to the South-East. It was a bright red object and it continued South-East until it was about straight West of us. When it got to this point, it stopped and went directly North to the Boyne River and then East towards Carman. The closest it would have been about $1\frac{1}{2}$ - 2 miles. The visibility was excellent and the distance between the two red lights on the craft would be about 75 feet.

A second craft appeared, about a half a mile behind, and made an arc from the North to the South. At one point, the red lights on it went out for about ten seconds, and it shone a white light only. The red lights came on again, very bright, and I looked over my shoulder as I was running down the road to the house to get my binoculars, and the lights were pulsating. It would have been around $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from us and it looped North. I would estimate their speed at about 60 knots and not any higher than 1000 feet, probably about 500 feet, depending on the distance from us. This one went off in an E.N.E. direction and then a third one appeared.

The third one came from almost directly West of us and then angled off towards Winnipeg. The closest it came to us would be about one mile or so. The size would be similar to that of a DC 8 or perhaps smaller. The shape appeared to be a circular, spherical thing.

"At approx. 6:35 P.M. this date I received a phone call from Mrs. Elaine DIEMERT. She advised that they had just seen an Unidentified Flying Object. They requested that I attend.

An immediate patrol was made to the scene, Friendship Field, $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south and $\frac{1}{2}$ mile west of Carman, Manitoba.

When I arrived, Bob DIEMERT, Elaine DIEMERT, and James BLACKWELL, were standing in the roadway gazing at an object which was flying north-west of our location. The object appeared to be red in colour, when just observed with the naked eye.

I was handed a pair of binoculars and observed the object travel from west to east in a straight line for approx. five minutes.

The object had a red light on the bottom of the front end and a white light at the rear. It appeared to be shaped in a cylindrical manner, similar to an airplane fuselage.

Its altitude could not be determined as its distance was unknown and could not be estimated.

I would estimate its ground speed at approx. 100-120 M.P.H.

I then patrolled to the east of Carman without regaining sight of the object.

It is my belief that the U.F.O. was some sort of airplane, whether private, commercial, or military.





When I came by the West end of Londonderry, I observed an object, a pink object in an Easterly Direction. As I proceeded home, the further I came the brighter it got. At Mile 16(5) I lost sight of this object. When I got around to straight track again I could still see the image of this pink thing in the sky with a bright light in it. It was a light about as bright as one on one of the small planes Debert field.

As I came down to mile 15 this light came down toward the earth in a slanting direction, I would say at that time it was about 20 feet above the tops of the trees in the distance. I decided to stop to see if there was any noise coming from the thing, now I turned the motor car off so there would be no noise from it and the only thing I could hear was a truck going over by Folly Lake.

Well I just decided to keep coming home and when I was coming across the overhead bridge I thought I would put the lights out on the motor car to see what would happen. I travelled approx: $\frac{1}{4}$ mile with my lights out.

The object was just down on the tree tops then, so when I put the motor car lights back on, and when I did, this light, still glowing, went in a southerly direction and stayed at the same altitude.

I sped the motor car up to see if I could see what speed it was travelling and this is the only time I seen the light dim as this object sped away so much faster than I was going. The light never went out, I kept my eye on it right to Debert.

When I was to Debert I would say the light was South of Belmont somewhere.

1. Captionally noted subject reported that at approximately 0530 hours this date, she sighted what in her opinion was a 'U.F.O.' At the above noted time YEATRAU stated that she noted an intensely bright light being directed at her residence. This light remained, shining intermittently for approximately one full hour. The location of the above noted residence is three miles East of the Junction of P.R. #216 and P.R. #303, on Provincial Road 303.
2. Subject states that she at risen at approx. 0530 hrs. in order to tend to an infant child. While so occupied she noted a bright 'flash,' at first presuming that it was due to lightening she looked from the window, and it was at this point that she realized that the light was not due to lightening but rather the result of some other activity. In the pre-dawn darkness the light was sufficiently bright to illuminate the interior of the dwelling house.
3. Rather than being continuous the light flashed on and off for the full hour, and while there was apparently no definable pattern it was noted by the subject that after several flashes there was a downward movement of sparks that seemed to descend from the light source to the ground. This was not a 'shower' of sparks but rather like a condensed single ball-like grouping. The altitude of the light source seemed to be approximately forty feet, and at all times was directed from the south therefore shining north onto the south side of the residence. No estimate of the range of the source from the house was given, the colour of the light was at all times white, with just the one light observed. There was never any sort of noise such as that resulting from an aircraft engine of any type. At no time did the complainant or her husband venture from the house to investigate the situation. It should be noted that at one point the light was 'shut off' while a passing vehicle was in the immediate area, once this vehicle had gone the flashing activity began again.
4. Due to the extreme intensity of the light any attempt to discern the nature of the source was impossible, further no air turbulence or flying snow was noted at any time. Attitudes of the complainant and her husband were cooperative, both were afraid of being labelled as 'attention getters,' or 'cranks.'
5. Neighbours residing directly across the road from the complainant were advised by telephone. Mr. and Mrs. W. DYCK on being so advised went from their home to the road in order to get a better look at the light source. Both DYCK and his wife stated that the light came from the

6. (Cont) south being directed on the south wall of the YEATRAU house. DYCK states that the altitude of the source was approximately forty feet from the ground, and that there was absolutely no noise. DYCK'S field of view would therefore be from the side of the source/target, and from this angle DYCK states that the edges of the light seemed to have a 'bluish' tinge. Not a bluish-white coloured light, but just the edges of the beam having what appeared to be a 'bluish tinge.' DYCK'S account had no inconsistencies with that given by YEATRAU, other than while YEATRAU initially assumed the flashes to be due to lightning, DYCK took it to be due to the activities of 'night-hunters.'

6. The YEATRAU home is located on the north side of P.R. 303, approximately 1,000 metres from that provincial road on a municipal road. To the east of the dwelling is a pasture like field, and then approximately one kilometer from the house is a stand of bush. To the south of the house is a field, again empty, then P.R. 7903, then more bush. To the west is the DYCK residence. According to all reports the light source was south of the YEATRAU home, yet not so far away as the above mentioned bush on the south side of P.R. 303. It should perhaps be noted that when I attended the scene at approximately two o'clock p.m. 03 DEC 75, I walked over the general area over which the light source was said to have been located. The land is flat, and was at that time snow covered with slight drifting. There was nothing out of the ordinary either on the snow or with the occasionally protruding shrubbery.

7. The light source was not seen to move at any time either in a vertical or horizontal direction. Rather it remained perfectly stationary, it was noted to leave but was simply there one minute and gone the next.

8. C.F.B. Western Air-Ops, and the M.O.T. Section reveal negative radar sightings this date reference complaint.

- Q. What can you tell me of the U.F.O. which you and your husband saw this morning?
- A. I got up first because the baby was crying, I just got up and I seen the flash, I thought it was lightning at first. Then I ran back and woke my husband up, and he looked and said "that's no lightning", it flashed then stopped and started flashing. It seemed as if it was watching this house. Like a bright spotlight. A car went by on the road and the U.F.O. went dark and didn't flash again until the car went by. I phoned the neighbours at about 5:45 a.m., him and his wife went outside and they said they saw it too.
- Q. At what time did you first see it?
- A. A little before a quarter to six or 5:30 a.m.
- Q. This light you referred to, did it shine in your house windows, and how intense was it?
- A. I never seen anything so bright, it really lit up the house, it blinded me. It would flash on and off and the third time a big spark came from it.
- Q. Describe the shape of the light.
- A. It seemed it was round, and had a beam like a search light.
- Q. Why don't think it was an aircraft of normal design?
- A. Because there was no noise, and airplanes have wing lights.
- Q. How far off the ground was it?
- A. A little higher than the house. I'm not so sure. It wasn't too far away.
- Q. How long did it stay?
- A. It seemed like a long time, roughly an hour, I didn't even see it go.
- Q. Did you experience any electrical or mechanical abnormalities with household appliances?
- A. No.
- Q. Did you hear about the U.F.O. in Carmen area in the fall?

- A. I haven't got no idea. The light was too bright.

Il a ensuite contacté le détachement local de la Gendarmerie royale qui l'a interviewé hier matin. Un officier lui aurait dit que certaines personnes auraient observé depuis quelque temps de tels phénomènes dans la région.

Un homme de la région de Sorel qui s'intéresse vivement aux OVNI aurait été le témoin d'un fait semblable, tout dernièrement.

1. At 10.00 a.m. Phylis REMPLE reported the sighting of a U.F.O. to this office. REMPLE advised that she had noticed this at 5.00 a.m. to 5.45 a.m. on 5 Dec 75. She stated that the object was white in colour and oblong in shape. This object had a glow around it about the size of the moon. It did not appear to move, nor was any noise heard. The glow would change colours from reds, blues and yellows.
2. During this time period the temperature was approximately minus 40 degrees Celsius, with a light haze overcast.
3. REMPLE at the time was in her cabin located on the west side of Lake Labarge. She noticed the object across the lake to the east and just above the mountains.
4. REMPLE appears to be a reliable person. There were no other reported sightings of this object.
5. The Whitehorse MOT weather office was contacted and they advised that there may have been northern lights in the area at that time. This accompanied by a new moon may in fact account for this sighting, although REMPLE did not feel that in fact it was the moon. This appears to be an isolated sighting.

1. At approx. 3:30 P.M. this date Mrs. STUBER reported that between 7:45 and 7:55 A.M. she had noted an object moving through the sky north of her home. The object was travelling west to east, moving rapidly, and she was unable to identify it. Hanna Telex message #75/81 forwarded as per OPS Mem. Co-N.C.R., Para. 2. Information as required by Para. 3 of that Instruction follows:

- A. 7:45 - 7:55 A.M., 16 December 1975
- B. Sky was clear
- C. Mrs. STUBER was seated at her dining room table and noted the object through the window. Her home is situated 8 miles east and 3 miles south of Hanna, Alberta.
- D. No bursts noted
- E. Very bright
- F. Silvery blue and no tail noted
- G. Described as 2/3 the size of a full moon
- H. In view for approx. 30 seconds
- I. No sound noted
- J. Low in the northern sky - (Mrs. STUBER was seated approx. 4 feet from the window, the bottom of the window being at her eye level. Object noted approx. 12" up from the bottom of the window when it passed.) Object disappeared into eastern horizon.
- K. Mrs. STUBER feels her radio ceased playing at the same time the object passed. It was on Calgary Station CFAC at the time.

2. A patrol was made to the STUBER farm on the 17 12 75, at which time Mrs. STUBER repeated the information obtained over the phone and was consistent with the information supplied. There are no trees or buildings around the farm site to obstruct the view and it appears to be a successful farming operation. Mrs. STUBER is approx. 30 years of age and appears to be in full control of all mental faculties. There were no other sightings reported directly to this office, however enquiries revealed that a Garry Richard BUCHWITZ, 10 yrs, had sighted something on the morning of the 16 Dec. 75.

3. On 22 12 75 Garry BUCHWITZ was interviewed in the presence of his father Daniel Arnold BUCHWITZ. They reside on a farm 12 miles north and 2 miles east of Hanna, Alberta. At approx. 7:45 A.M. on the 16 12 75, Garry was seated in the kitchen looking out the north window when he noted an object in the sky. He described the object as follows: It appeared to be slightly larger than a basket ball, rough edges, short tail, glowing red and orange. The tail was mostly white, but had several other colors. It was moving quickly and disappeared into the eastern horizon. He estimates watching it for approx. 5 minutes. The

BUCHWITZ have a barn 26 feet high situated 100 feet north of the house. The object was visible over the roof of the barn. BUCHWITZ appeared to be sincere in relating what he had seen.

4. From the time, location, and direction it would appear that both BUCHWITZ and STUBER viewed the same object, with BUCHWITZ being much closer to it than STUBER. The object described would appear to be consistent with a fireball and investigation in this area has failed to locate any other persons who will admit to seeing it.

1. At 5:35 AM this date [REDACTED] telephoned this office and advised that he and his partner [REDACTED] had just returned to Whitehorse in their tractor trailer outfit and that they had sighted what they felt was a UFO at about 4:20AM while driving south along the edge of Fox Lake on the Mayo Road. Both subjects are employees of WHITEPASS HIGHWAY DIVISION and were hauling a load of ore to the railhead in Whitehorse. [REDACTED] also advised that two other [REDACTED] drivers, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], who, were driving another ore truck about 5 miles ahead of them had also seen something.

2. At 3:40 AM this same date this office was also contacted by one [REDACTED] also of Whitehorse, who felt that he had just seen a UFO over the City. [REDACTED] described his sighting as follows: "Was like an explosion big ball of light, white and blue, for a few seconds then faded to a tail of lighter colours, white, blue and pinkish. This lasted for a total of about 5 seconds at a height of anywhere from 1,000 to 2,000 feet and was east of the city."

3. As [REDACTED] sighting took place while members of the Force were out on patrol they were contacted about same. These members, Csts E. BASERABA and R. FRANCE, advised that they had seen a bright object in the sky at about this time but both were emphatic that the object was none other than a flare. Both of these subjects advised that they felt this object had originated in the vicinity of the Whitehorse Recreation Center near the airport where a dance or party was just breaking up. Checks made there and with the M.O.T. at the airport failed to provide any further information on this object.

18 DEC 75

4. During the interval since the above noted sightings numerous attempts have been made to contact and obtain statements from the four truckers. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] are unable to give any definite description of any object but could only say that the area in which they were driving seemed to get much lighter for about a half of a minute. They did not see the source of the light.

5. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] gave the following statements of their sighting:
Statement of [REDACTED] (B:25-2-50) of [REDACTED] Whitehorse, Yukon Territory. "I and my partner [REDACTED] were driving south on the Mayo Road in a Whitepass Company Kenworth truck. I was not driving at the time. At a point near Fox Lake there was instant light over the whole area including the whole valley which lite up everything like daylight only there was a bluish tinge to everything. The inside of the truck remained dark. The light appeared to come from behind us. The whole incident lasted for about 30 seconds. The only time that I could actually

I COULD ACTUALLY see the source of the light was when it verred to the left (east) and was some distance from us. I saw it for only a second or two as it slipped down behind some hills to the east and it appeared to be travelling at a very high rate of speed. At this time the object was about the size of a full moon and was very bright, white light not yellowish or orange like the moon. At this time it didn't hurt my eyes to look at it. This all occurred around 4:20 AM on 16 Nov 75. I wasn't able to hear anything over the sound of the truck which felt like the brakes may be dragging but this cleared up before we saw the object. The above is true to the best of my memory."

Statement of [REDACTED] (B:25-10-47) of [REDACTED], Whitehorse, Yukon Territory: " I was driving a Whitepass Company, Kenworth tractor trailer outfit south on the Mayo Road. At about 4:20 AM of 16 Nov 75 and at a point along Fox Lake I noticed a small glow in the left rear view mirror and this was quite a long way above and to the rear. I can not give any idea as to it's exact distance from the truck. This object descended to about tree height, about 200 feet above the truck, at a fantastic speed and then seemed to stop at the 200 foot level and proceed in the same direction as I was travelling and at about the same speed as the truck. I was able to make out a shape of an aircraft without wings that could possibly look like a large cigar. At this time the light got extremely bright and hurt my eyes just like looking directly at the sun. The light at it's source was white but in the distance where the whole valley and lake was lite up had a bluish tinge. The area was lighted to the point where I was able to distinctly see the far shoreline and trees of the area across Fox Lake which would be at least 3/4 of a mile away. During this time the interior of the truck cab was still dark and no light came in. The few seconds that I saw the cigar shaped object I would think that it would be at least 200' long and about 150' around in circumference. I wasn't able to see any windows or anything else of this sort. About 10 to 15 seconds later the light rose vertically at fantastic speed again to where I had originally seen it and then went directly north without gaining any more altitude that I could see until it was out of sight from a hill rising above us to the north.

At a point about 2 1/2 miles prior to seeing the light in the distance in my mirror, I had noticed a pulling sensation in the truck which felt to me like the brakes were partially on or the wheels were not wanting to turn properly. I originally checked this with a back up light from the tractor and could see the wheels turning. As this kept up I eventually stopped and had my partner [REDACTED] get out and watch all wheels while I moved slowly down the road to see that they were all turning. This effect continued and was checked two more times by [REDACTED]. Shortly after this I saw the light in the mirror. This pulling or dragging effect ceased suddenly after the object started to rise vertically.

6. The reliability of these subjects is unknown but they appear to be genuine in their stories and I have no reason to doubt that they didn't see what they claim. Both now say they wish that they had kept the situation to themselves as they have taken a lot of ridicule from fellow employees.



- At approx. 9:55 AM, Mr. Robert BARRADELL, Airport Manager contacted members at the airport, and advised that between approx. 9:10 AM and 9:40 AM, Finton FARRELLY, Telecom Station Manager, Fritz FIECHTINGER, D.P.W. Employee, and himself had seen an unidentified object in the sky, to the south of the airport. It had remained in a stationary position during the sighting, then faded directly away. The colour had been changing from red to green at the beginning, then changed to a steady white. Mr. BARRADELL had checked with the D.E.W. Line site at Tuktoyaktuk, and they had no air traffic on radar.
- Telex TUK69 submitted at this time to the National Research Council Meteor Center.

31 DEC 75

- At approx. 9:10 AM, Finton FARRELLY contacted this office again and advised that the object was back and in the same position. It could be seen clearly from the window of the Detachment office.
- Mr. Dave FREEMAN of Tuktoyaktuk was contacted and his 800 X telescope was used to locate the object. It was realized at this time that the object was either a star or a planet. Mr. FREEMAN advised that he had observed this planet for the past few nights in various places in the sky.
- In view of the above, no further action taken.

[REDACTED] We have received your report of a UFO sighting by [REDACTED] and his family on January 5, 1976 (your reference YRD 76-8).

The report can be identified with the setting moon which is well-known to create various illusions when seen near the horizon. On the night in question the moon was a thin crescent very much as in Mr. [REDACTED]'s sketch with the right-hand cusp slightly higher in the sky than the left cusp. Because the earth's atmosphere absorbs blue light much more than yellow or red, the color of the moon becomes orange or red when it is seen very low in the sky. Seen through binoculars the jagged edge of the moon, due to craters, can be seen as in the sketch. Because of the slight tilt of the crescent, the right corner would not slightly later than the left corner, as observed. The time of moonset near Yorkton on January 5 was very near 10 p.m., C.S.T. and the direction of the shed as seen from the house must be slightly south of west (5° to 10°) if the sketch is accurate.

It is common for the human eye-brain mechanism to detect motion when staring at a light source, even if the source is not moving. In the case of the setting moon it would be moving slowly to the right, as observed, and could appear unsteady because of the earth's atmospheric effects on the light. The vertical black line must be some foreground obstruction, possibly in the window or else a pole or tree in the line of sight.

I hope this information is of help to Mr. [REDACTED] and I would stress that it is not unusual for the rising or setting moon to give rise to such reports.

It swayed slowly ~~back and forth~~ side to side
in a north-south movement. It only
moved a short distance side to side. Its
movements would be only about one half
of its own width from side to side. I figured
it would be about 10 miles away, maybe 9.
I would guess its altitude to be much higher
than an elevator. It would be 500 or 600 ft
high for sure. I suppose it could be 2000 ft
high if it was far enough away.

It was a brightly coloured object, orange-

red in colour and very pretty. There was no flame
in it and nothing which appeared to be white.
It glowed and shone in the sky. It had ~~two~~
one black strip down the center of it.

It emitted no sound that I could hear.
I was in the house and the furnace was
blowing. I shut the light off and followed
for my wife and kids to come and look.
At first I shouted for the camera. They
couldn't find it but they brought the
binoculars. My wife, [redacted], 36 yrs,
my daughter, Shelly, aged 7 yrs and my son
Curly, aged 4 yrs, all watched.

We watched for about 45 minutes. There
was a good minute where it seemed to be
sitting still. Then it seemed to move west.
It faded and faded until the right hand
tip of it was glowing.

When I looked it through the binoculars
it looked as I have described it to you.
I couldn't see rays coming down from this.
I couldn't see a hood on it. My binoculars
are pretty powerful. It didn't move rapidly
at any time and glowed continuously until
it faded away.

It was a clear, cold night. No
clouds at all. It was dark out and
there was no full moon. I could see the
stars but I didn't see the moon. There was
no wind.

I have never seen anything like this before
nothing even closely resembling it. I have

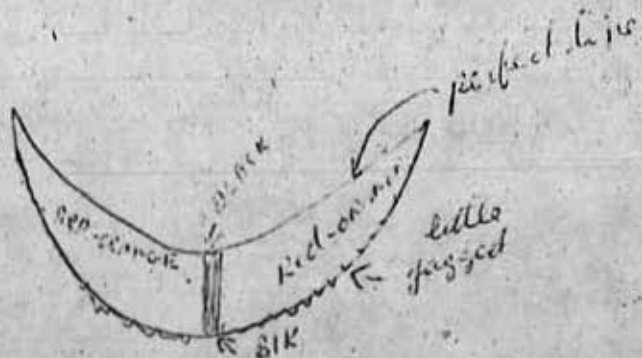
never taken any interest in unidentified
flying objects before this. You'd have to see it
to believe it.
When I saw it, it scared the hell out of
me.

I farm at that location and have been
for seven years now. I was a transport driver
before that. I am also a full time
employee at the post office. I have a Grade
XII education.

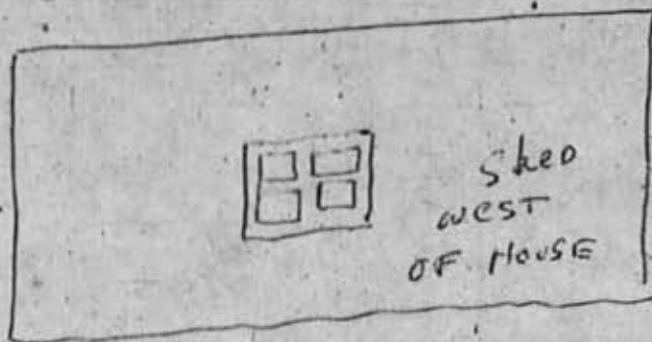
I would estimate the object to be about
300 yds to 1/2 mile long. It would be about
50 feet thick. The top line of this was very
distinct. The bottom edge was lightly jagged.

1. On the 5th of January, 1976 at 6:00 P.M., Mr. Mel HEINS of Box 23, Harrogate, B.C. phoned the Detachment to report an Unidentified Flying Object. The complainant claimed that he was driving his vehicle south on Highway #95 two to two and one half miles south of Parson, B.C. at approximately 22:15 Mountain Standard Time on the 4th of January, 1976 when he observed several vehicles stopped along the road and people watching something. The complainant stopped his vehicle and got out. He saw a large triangular object in the sky. At the time, it was snowing heavily, overcast and dark. The object had a leading red flashing light. Each of the trailing ends of the triangle had a flashing blue light or a flashing green light. The object made no noise as it travelled northbound. The object was approximated at travelling the same speed as a helicopter. The U.F.O. was thought to be flying about 100 feet above tree level and following the hydro lines. The witness described the craft as looking like it had a row of windows spaced far apart with lights inside. The object was observed for a short time until it was lost from sight in the snow storm.

2. Mr. HEINS was the second person to report the incident. A Mr. James HUNT had reported the same occurrence earlier in the afternoon on the 5th of January, 1976. Mr. HUNT phoned from Revelstoke, B.C. as he was on his way to his home in KAMLOOPS, B.C.

3. A check of the helicopter companies in the Golden area showed that there were no helicopters flying on the night in question. The Ministry of Transport advised that there were no reported fixed wing aircraft in the area.

4. The complainants are unknown to the investigators and it is impossible to make a conclusion.

5. Parson is located 26 miles South of Golden, B.C. in the Columbia River Valley.

REPORT OF U.F.O. SIGHTING

KENNEDY came into this office stating that a U.F.O. had followed him on Highway 1A out of Brandon, Manitoba. The U.F.O. was originally spotted on 26th St. in Brandon and he followed it out to 1A where in turn the U.F.O. supposedly cast a light onto his car. He then stated that it was a disc about 30 feet in diameter and that it had hovered over K-Mart Shopping plaza in Brandon for an unknown period of time.

A patrol was made by Csts. JOYCE & HOWE on 1A highway but nothing was observed out of the ordinary. A patrol was also made north of Brandon on #10 highway by Csts. JOYCE, HOWE & LAFRENIERE but once again nothing out of the ordinary could be seen in the sky.

Brandon Airport was contacted and they stated that there were no flight plans for this area on this date and stated that they would try the different frequencies on the radio to establish if it could possibly be a plane. Negative results were obtained along this line of the investigation.

Winnipeg Airport was contacted for possible U.F.O.'s on their RADAR SYSTEM but once again were met with negative results.

In view of the above, no further investigation was done on this complaint. Reliability of witness is unknown.

Brandon Telex # 76/1 was sent to the National Research Council Meteor Centre, Ottawa, Ontario for their information.

1. HESKETH advised at around 9:33PM last night he observed an UFO. He was walking home from the store and as he was going by the ball park in Timberlea, Halifax County, Nova Scotia; he noted the UFO moving in a southerly direction. HESKETH was alone at the time and described the UFO as follows:

bright white in color, high in the sky,
shaped like a space capsule, noiseless,

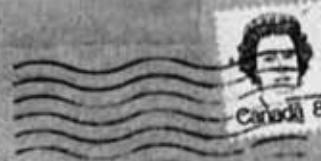

At 1:05 AM, 6 APR 76, the following two persons came into this Police Office and reported they had seen a UFO: Collette PION (DOB 30 SEP 61) of 821 Lucas Road, Richmond, B.C., and Valerie Marie DOYLE (DOB 17 APR 60) of 737 No. 2 Road, Richmond, B.C.

These persons were separately interviewed and both stated that they were at the Skyline Hotel, No. 3 Road and Sea Island Way, Richmond, B.C., sitting in a car in the parking lot. The girls were waiting for Valerie's mother to get off work. At 12:10 AM, approximately, Valerie DOYLE left the vehicle to steal some flowers from the curb beside the Skystage Theatre Restaurant, which is across the parking lot from the Skyline Hotel. A few seconds later Valerie came back to the car and was visibly scared. She pointed to the area at the top of the Skystage, PION looked out of the window and both girls saw a large craft hovering above the Theatre-Restaurant. The craft began to move slowly, approximately 20-30 feet above the roof of the restaurant. It went down, behind the restaurant, which is a rather large building, and disappeared. The girls then saw a large flash of white light.

Following is a description of the craft they saw:

Approximately 30-40 feet in diameter. Shape of two frisbees placed together, then compressed into an oval shape, instead of round. There was a rectangular addition in the back of the craft, resembling a tail. There were many small windows at the front and on the sides which appeared orange in color. Four large orange lights were on front of the UFO and one larger white light on the top. There was no noise at all being emitted from the UFO.

Cst. R.P. SCHNEIDER, along with the witnesses and a few other R.C.M.P. members attended to the scene of the reported sighting and searched the area.

Nothing of any value was found, except for the flowers which Valerie had dropped on the pavement when she spotted the UFO. Several other persons, who are employed in the area, were interviewed, but no other witnesses were found.

This area is approximately two miles from Vancouver International Airport and approximately one mile south of the flight path. The girls are positive it was not an aircraft approaching the runway. It was thought the flash of light the girls saw could have been the strobe lights at the end of the runway. These lights were turned on and checked, however, this is not what the girls saw either. At this time, the girls were in separate Police cars and both said the light was right behind the Skystage and brighter.


At the time of the reported sighting, the cloud ceiling was 4,300 feet and visibility was ten miles in a light drizzle.

The Airport Tower advise they saw nothing unusual or on the radar screen, as previously mentioned, the girls were interviewed separately and the conversations were taped. Transcripts of the tapes are attached on following pages.
