1. On the 10 APR 78, Mrs. BURNS contacted our office and advised that her horses had been struck by a beam of light from a U.F.O. and they were now receiving medical treatment from Dr. MCKEE. The U.F.O. had been sighted on the 6 APR 78, but Mrs. BURNS did not contact our office until the 10 APR 78.

2. A patrol was conducted to the BURNS farm, which is located approx. 10 miles west of Prince George. Mrs. BURNS was interviewed and her horses examined. She advised that at approx. 7:30 p.m. on the 6 APR 78, she had bedded down her horses and was returning to the house when a beam of light flashed by her and into the barn. She heard the horses scream and went directly back to them. The animals were very agitated and had to be calmed down. Mrs. BURNS then called some people to come and assist her with the horses. The following people came to the BURNS residence and assisted her. Ray and Alice MILLER, Otway Rd., 563-9626; Wayne and Lenore LOFTUS, Bergman Road, 562-3923; Jean ANDERSON, Bergman Road, 563-8717. They later viewed an object in the sky with BURNS.

3. On the evening of the sighting, Mrs. BURNS contacted the Radio Station and advised them of the sighting and the beam of light which had struck her horses. The Radio Station put a broadcast over the air and it was heard by Ken STEPHENS. STEPHENS apparently saw an object in the sky along with the following people. George SEVIGNY, Gus STRIEFEL, Cindy STEPHEN, Karen SEVIGNY.

4. On the 12 APR 78, I contacted Dr. MCKEE and questioned him regarding the horses. He stated that the horses were completely exhausted as the result of shock. The shock has affected their body functions. He could not explain what had caused their condition. Two spots on the neck of one of the horses was examined and he stated that it appeared to be ringworm. Dr. MCKEE has prescribed medication for the horses and they appear to be recovering. Two horses are being treated.

5. As the result of Mrs. BURNS concern that there may be radiation present in the barn, I attended with Chief TRASK from C.F.B. Baldy Hughes, and he tested the barn. No radiation was detected.

6. On the 13 APR 78, C.F.B. Baldy Hughes was contacted and it was discovered that Ken STEPHENS had contacted the Base on the 6 APR 78 at 8:05 p.m. Cpl. DOIRON and Cpl. PERRIN were working at the time. They advised that nothing was detected on radar and they checked the sky and observed an object which appeared to be a star.

7. On the 14 APR 78, I contacted Dr. McNAMARA of the National Research Council and advised him of the circumstances. He was provided with the names of the people involved.

8. Statements have been obtained from all persons involved in the sighting and are attached. They are self-explanatory and elaborate in detail.

Statement of Vicki BURNS (BD: 31 JUL 51), Bergman Road,
taken by Cst. J.N. HOLYK on the 13 APR 78.

"At approx. 7:30 - 7:45 p.m. on the 6 APR 78, I was leaving the barn located on my property, Bergman Rd., 10 miles west of Prince George. I had finished bedding down the animals for the night and was about to go back to the house. It was dark outside but there is a yard light located near our trailer. The sky was clear. I had just left the barn and was standing outside when I saw a beam of light which extended from a group of trees to the barn. It was approx. 2" in diameter. I saw the beam, heard the horses scream, so I immediately returned to the barn. I don't recall if the beam was still there. I attended to the horses.

The horse nearest the window in the barn in which the beam seemed to have gone through was down with front feet through a plywood wall. It was conscious and struggling to get out. He got up on his own power. When I had left the barn both horses had been standing. The horse in the next stall was laying on its side, and was motionless. While I stood there, the horse got up and it appeared frightened. After getting to its feet he immediately darted forwards into the screen surrounding the stall.

I checked the third stall and checked the mare, and attended to her.

I returned to the house and phoned Mrs. ANDERSON, my mother. She came to my house immediately and we looked up into the sky and saw a light which appeared to be round and misty. It was at plane level and appeared to have no set flight pattern and would dart from one spot to another. There were no bursts. It was white in color, no sounds, was travelling from North to South and was approx. $\frac{1}{2}$ the size of the moon, when it was closest to the ground and then smaller

It appeared to be at jet plane level at its lowest level and then higher. We phoned Mrs. Lenore LOFTUS, who owns one of the horses, to come over. She arrived with her husband and Mr. and Mrs. MILLER. Everyone, except Lenore, viewed the object at this time. It appeared to be farther away at this time and appeared to be a darting light. We watched the light for approx. one hour and went back into the barn. We were back and forth into the barn during this period of time. When I went into the house the light was still present I never checked to see if the light was still in the sky after I had gone into the house. I had viewed the light for approx. 3 hours in total.

The following day, I checked the horses and found that they appeared dopy, uncoordinated and out of character. Upon checking the filly, I noted a circle on either side of its neck, which weren't present the previous day. I photographed the horse. The horses were put outside and in the afternoon, I noticed the filly fall down. I called the Vet. and Dr. McKEE came and checked the horses.

He told me that they seemed to be suffering from severe fright which caused a number of unrelated symptoms. He said that the circles were a form of ringworm. He left to consult with Dr. BIXBY. Dr. McKEE kept in touch and the horses didn't improve. On Monday the 10 APR 78, I called the Vet. again, and Dr. BIXBY prescribed some medicine. I then called the police and advised the occurrence. I didn't call them the night of the occurrence. I had called Baldy Hughes. My mother called the Radio Station.

The horses to date seem to be improving."

Statement of Ken STEPHENS (BD: 12 FEB 47) taken by Cst. J.N. HOLYK on the 15 APR 78.

"On the 6 APR 78 at approx. 8:00 p.m., I arrived at 4278 Hart Hwy., Prince George, B.C. from the hospital. As I was parking the Van, I noticed an object move across the sky from the East to the Southwest. The object stopped and appeared to descend. It appeared bluish white in color. After descending, the object's light went out for approx. 15 seconds and then flashing colored light appeared. The lights flashing were red on the ends of the object and orange on the bottom. I was viewing the object with my naked eye. It appeared to be approx. twice as high as a small aircraft flies. The sky was clear. There were no bursts and when first sighted the light was bright but then seemed to dim. After moving across the sky, it appeared to stay fairly stationary. The object appeared alot bigger than a star probably because of its elevation. No sound or fireballs were emitted.

I went into the house and told some people what I had seen. I then returned outside and set up a 7 X 50 power telescope. I viewed the object with the telescope. I saw a disc shaped object. It was orange on the bottom with flashing red lights on the side. It was fairly stationary. I viewed it for approx. 1 hour. While I was viewing the object, I phoned Baldy Hughes Radar Base and advised them of what I was observing. I called twice, the second time they stated they could see the object. The object then moved farther west until it disappeared behind the hill.

As the result of a Radio Broadcast, I drove to the Miworth area. The broadcast had stated that some people living in Miworth area had some horses struck with

a beam from a U.F.O. I drove to a residence and inquired.
It was the Ray MILLER residence. They apparently knew the
people that the horses belonged to. I told them what I had
seen so they took me over to the people's residence.

I spoke to the people there and looked at the horses and
left.

Approx. three days later, I attended at the
residence at Miworth with a geiger counter. I had been
given a brief lesson on its operation by Dr. FALKNER.
I checked the barn where the horses were located and got
what I thought was a small reading. I then returned to
Prince George."

Statement of Ray MILLER(BD: 9 MAY 35) taken by Cst. J.N. HOLYK on the 16 APR 78.

"On the 6 APR 78, I was visiting at Wayne and Lenore's residence. At approx. 8:00 p.m., Mrs. BURNS phoned and talked to Lenore. Lenore told us that Vicki BURNS had told her not to say anything about what had happened over there because we would think she was nuts. She did want some help with the horses. Lenore told us a little so we left and went to the BURNS residence.

When I got there, Vicki BURNS, Jean ANDERSON were there.

Vicki told us about a beam of light and this thing that was flying around up there. I went into the barn and found the horses in a highly agitated state.

The young gelding had been moved to a corner stall and was trying to climb over a 6' door. The mare was sweating, pounding around, she wouldn't settle down at all. We took those two horses out of the stalls and walked then around outside.

I went outside the barn and Mrs. ANDERSON said, "Look, there it is."

I looked up and saw, straight up above me and saw what appeared to be a satellite moving at a high rate of speed in a southern direction. It disappeared in about 5-6 seconds. The horses were put back in.

The satellite I saw was the same as a star, just a white light. It was about the same size as the stars in the area. It appeared that it may have been slightly lower but it was hard to tell. No sound was heard. It appeared to rise in elevation until I couldn't see it any more. Sky was clear. It appeared as bright as a star. No fireballs



THE OBSERVER OF THE UFOS IS WALTER BRENT MURRAY BD 09 JAN 60, SE 13-6-17, NINETTE, MAN. MURRAY STATES THAT HE FIRST OBSERVED THE OBJECTS WHILE TRAVELLING NORTH ON PTH 18 APPROX 1 MILE WEST AND 2 MILES SOUTH OF NINETTE, MAN. THE OBJECTS WERE STATIONARY IN THE SKY, DIRECTLY NORTH OF MURRAY'S POSITION AT THIS TIME. MURRAY AGAIN OBSERVED THE SAME OBJECTS AS HE TRAVELLED NORTH FROM NINETTE ON PTH 18 A FEW MINUTES LATER. THE OBJECTS WERE TRAVELLING EAST AT THIS TIME AND MURRAY ESTIMATED THAT THEY CROSSED OVER PTH 18 APPROX 2 MILES NORTH OF NINETTE. MURRAY DESCRIBED THE OBJECTS AS BEING AN EXTREMELY BRIGHT, GLOWING ORANGE AND CIRCULAR OR EGG-SHAPED. THERE WERE NO PROTUBERANCES OR DIFFERENT COLOURS THAT MURRAY COULD DESCRIBE. DURATION OF OBSERVATION IS ESTIMATED AT FROM 3 - 10 MINUTES. MURRAY STATED THAT HE INITIALLY OBSERVED ONE OF THE OBJECTS AS HE WAS TRAVELLING TOWARD NINETTE AND HE OBSERVED 5 MORE SIMILAR SUDDENLY APPEAR AND ALIGN EASTWARD FROM THE FIRST. THE OBJECTS REMAINED STATIONARY IN THIS FORMATION UNTIL HE LOST SIGHT OF THEM WHEN HE DROVE DOWN INTO A VALLEY AND INTO NINETTE. WHILE TRAVELLING NORTH FROM NINETTE, A FEW MINUTES LATER, HE OBSERVED THE 6 OBJECTS TRAVEL QUITE SLOWLY EASTWARD OVER THE RIM OF THE VALLEY AND THEN DESCENT VERTICALLY UNTIL HE LOST SIGHT OF THEM BEHIND TREES AND BUSH. SECONDS LATER THE OBJECTS ASCENDED VERTICALLY AND SUDDENLY VANISHED. MURRAY ESTIMATED THE HEIGHT OF THE OBJECTS ON INITIAL OBSERVATION AS 1 MILE HOWEVER COULDN'T ESTIMATE THE SIZE OF EACH. Dear Mr. Taylor:

Your letter describing a sighting made by one of your Grade 8 pupils has been forwarded to me from the Canadian Forces Base Trenton.

It is difficult to guess the cause of this phenomenon without more accurate knowledge of the time and directions involved. If you have been studying the sky this spring you will be aware that there have been four bright planets visible, with Venus much the brightest. The time mentioned in your letter is after Venus has set but if the observation was really made roughly an hour earlier, then the description fits reasonably well the sort of image distortion which can occur when a bright object is seen very close to the horizon (especially when the observer was on a hilltop). The effects of refraction and atmospheric unsteadiness can do dramatic things to the image of a bright object such as Venus. It is very normal for bright objects seen after dark to appear much closer to the eye (or really the eye-brain combination) than they are, since there is no means of evaluating the size-distance relationship for an unknown object.

I am enclosing a reprint of an article which I hope may be of interest to you and your students.

I am an Intermediate Science teacher at the above-mentioned school. I have been doing a unit on astronomy with the Grade 8's. One of my best students (keen and reliable) reported the following incident to me yesterday.

On Saturday, April 22, 1978 at approximately 2200 hours, she was attempting to locate certain constellations we had studied in class from a hilltop on her family farm located approximately 9 km northeast of Marmora. It was a bright, clear, still night and the moon was full. Her attention was drawn from the east to the north when the horse herd began milling up. It was then that she noticed this object, just a little west of the horses, as described in the attached sketch. The object was noiseless and motionless, hovering quite low to the ground approximately 100 m from her. The lights were green and blue and not flashing. She observed it for a few seconds, glanced back to the horse herd, then back again to the spot the object had been. However, it had disappeared.

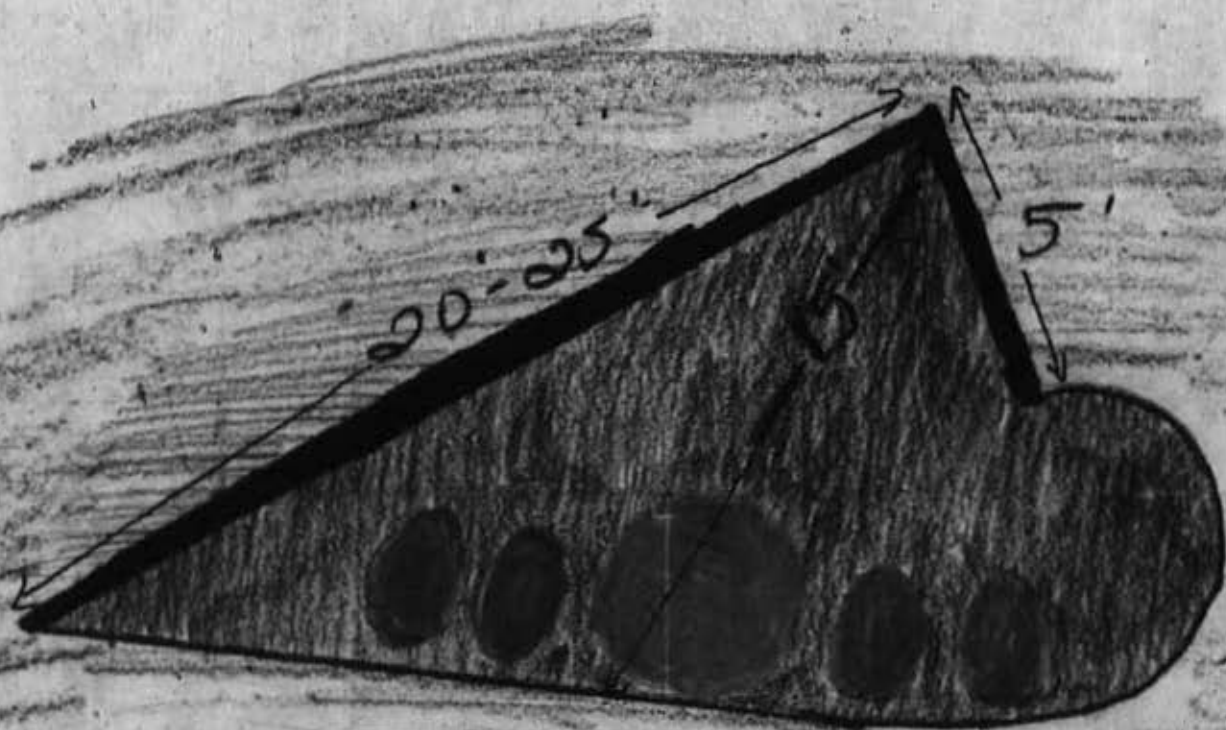
I am writing this letter in the hopes that you can be of assistance to us in identifying this object, either personally or by directing me to a person or agency that could.



Near Town of Souris,
Souris, Manitoba - 12 APR 78.

At 8:40 P.M. Central Standard Time, 12 APR 78, Andrew William WATAMANUK (BD: 13 AUG 40), Farmer, residing three miles west, attended at the R.C.M. POLICE detachment in Souris to report what he thought was a "U.F.O." hovering in the sky west of his farm and south of P.T. Hwy. #2. WATAMANUK stated he sighted a similar object about the same time on Sunday, 9 APR 78. He described the object as being approximately 3,000 ft. off the ground, three dimensional spherical centre coloured bright yellow, changing to bright red in the sphere's extremities. Two "wing-like" extensions opposite each other on the sphere (horizontally) cast a pulsating bright bluish green light with a periodic red flash. He stated the movement of this object was vertical, directly over a neighbour's (Keith Orville KONTZIE, born 11 MAR 50) farm. The object then moved horizontally west, approximately one mile and hovered over the farm of Paul David ADDISON, born 7 FEB 43, where it's vertical movement continued. The object then made a quick circular movement over the ADDISON farm and disappeared, re-appearing approximately five minutes later over the KONTZIE farm. WATAMANUK stated the object then moved very slowly westward without a sound, finally disappearing. He stated the sky was clear at the time and he kept this object in sight for approximately two and one-half hours.

At 9:10 P.M., 12 APR 78, two members attended with WATAMANUK at his farm, later joined by the N.C.O. In Charge. WATAMANUK pointed out the object and with the naked eye we could see a pulsating bright light constantly changing colours from white to green, green to blue with periodic red flashes. The night was cool (below zero degrees celcius, slightly) with a south-west wind causing

WIND CAUSING the eyes to tear. The object was clearly seen through field glasses where the pulsating bright light and constant colour changes were made more vivid. WATAMANUK was extremely excited while gazing at this object, repeatedly saying things like, "look at the wings on that thing", "look at it move, look at it move". The members failed to see what WATAMANUK was describing other than the bright pulsating light and colour changes. The members did observe the object moving very slowly westward across the sky, toward the moon. It appeared to be miles from earth, but much closer than the stars. At 9:50 P.M. the object was lost from sight. At 10:00 P.M. it re-appeared south-west of the moon at an approximate 45 degree angle. At 10:05 P.M. the object moved slowly away from the moon at the same angle. At 10:15 P.M. the members left the scene as the sky became overcast obscuring further sightings. At 10:25 P.M. WATAMANUK called police to advise the object changed its position to the south-east side of the moon.

At 10:30 P.M. the Brandon office of the Ministry of Transport were asked if any accountable aircraft were flying this area. M.O.T. advised that none had reported in. None of our neighbouring detachments had reports of possible sightings.

At 11:10 P.M. police contacted Dr. J.R. RICE, in charge of the Brandon University telescope. He suggested that Jupiter would be the largest natural light in close proximity and above the moon. Dr. RICE advised that due to the hour and the fact that the moon would set shortly, use of the University telescope would not be possible. Attempts were made to contact the Winnipeg Planetarium and University of Manitoba Planetarium, without success.

At 5:30 P.M., 13 APR 78, police spoke with Keith Orville KONTZIE, born 11 MAR 50, closest neighbour to WATAMANUK. He was away on 12 APR 78 returning home in the early hours of 13 APR 78 and of no assistance in this regard.

At 5:40 P.M., KONTZIE's neighbour to the west, Gail Marie (Mrs. Paul) ADDISON, born 20 APR 47, was spoken with. She received a phone call from WATAMANUK the P.M. 12 APR 78. She was asked by WATAMANUK to look at a strange phenomenon in the sky over KONTZIE's. On her way to the door WATAMANUK called again stating the object was over his farm. She stepped outside but failed to see what he was talking about.

At 7:05 P.M., Robert Wilfred HICKS, born 12 FEB 35, neighbour directly east of WATAMANUK was spoken with. He too received a call from WATAMANUK P.M. 12 APR 78. HICKS took his field glasses and on his way out another call for him prevented his seeing the object.

SEEING THE OBJECT.

At 9:20 PM, WATAMANUK reported two similar objects presently in the sky, one being in the same area of the moon as previously described and one north-east of Souris in the Brandon/Shilo area. Police attended and saw these objects, both being similar to the one previously witnesses. WATAMANUK stated that prior to our arrival a red/white "ball of fire" travelled north-west over his farm at great speed disappearing on the horizon. This was not witnessed by police.


At 9:35 PM., 18 APR 78 police were called to the ADDISON farm by hired hand Charles Thomas CHAMBERS, born 2 MAR 43, regarding a possible U.F.O. sighting. Police attended and saw an object as previously described, which travelled west across the sky at accelerated speeds, disappearing from sight.

WATAMANUK, although excitable, is a fairly responsible person and was not trying to lead us astray. Had we not witnessed these phenomenon with him his reports may have been questionable. The above is submitted for your information. No further action is being taken by this office.

A luminous, top-shaped UFO responded almost playfully to the lights and sirens of patrol cars in a small California town — as police officers and townspeople watched in awe, unable to believe their eyes.

Although police took photographs of the incredible object, those pictures were later mysteriously "misaid" — and one officer involved in the case suggests the sighting has been officially covered up.

"It was like nothing I had ever seen before," marveled Detective Mel Stewart, 35, of the Simi Valley Police Dept., who first spotted the UFO at 10:41 p.m. the night of Saturday, Aug. 13, 1977.

"I saw what appeared to be an aircraft in distress. It was emitting orange flames and there appeared to be blobs of metal coming out of it."

The object disappeared over rooftops in the direction of the local airport, about 40 miles from Los Angeles. Stewart put out a broadcast that an aircraft was possibly in trouble.

It was not until 11:22 p.m. that police headquarters received the first frightened phone call describing a UFO.

The call came from Rene Helton, who had noticed something very strange in the sky outside her house while walking her boyfriend to his car.

"It was shaped like a child's top hanging in the air," she recalled. "We watched it for a while, as it just hovered there, two blocks away."

Thunderstruck, she phoned the police. Patrolman John Kennedy responded.

"Answering the call, I noted a lighted object coming in my direction at a high rate of speed," Kennedy told the ENQUIRER.

"I pulled off the road. It

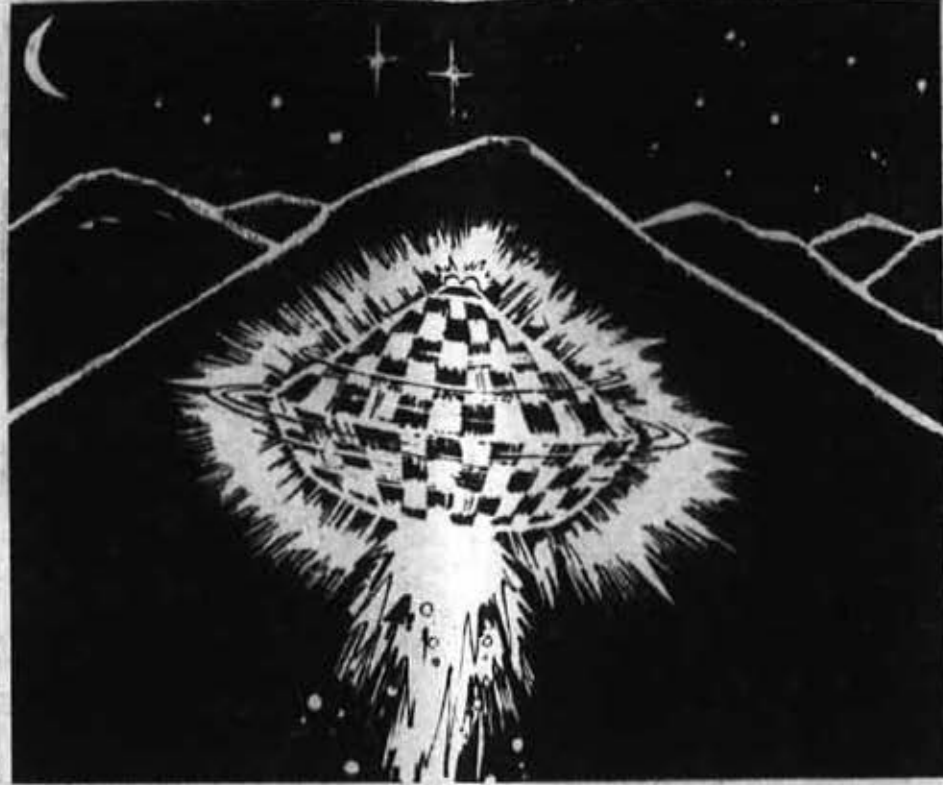

was a saucer, but with a top on it and all lighted up on the inside. It had like a pattern of steel frames with illuminated glass in between. The bottom was a pure white sea of lights."

Kennedy made a U-turn and pursued the UFO at high speed. At the same time, another officer was chasing the object in the same direction on a parallel highway.

"I activated my siren, and that's when the fun started," Kennedy said. "I relayed over the radio, 'It's reacting to my lights and siren.'"

"When I activated the siren it would come toward me, and when I would turn it off it would back away."

And when the other officer turned on his siren, the UFO moved in that direction.

Said Kennedy: "It was almost as if it was playing with us. And the more I played with it, the closer it got and

the thought went through my mind, 'If that thing lands, what in hell am I going to do? I would probably have left the area.'"

Kennedy was impressed by the size of the UFO. "It was larger than any American aircraft I have ever seen and even larger than a blimp," he said.

"At one point I even stopped a car and ordered a couple out and told them to look up and tell me what they saw. They said, 'What is it?' And I told them I didn't know."

"You can call it what you like — flying saucer or UFO. But it had speed, maneuverability, and it reacted. When I was chasing it, it pulled away from me as if I were standing still."

Stewart, also responding to Rene's call, witnessed a sight he will never forget.

"I looked at it through binoculars and it appeared to

first saw it, it was a white light. Then it began pulsating and then I saw red and green lights. The colored lights would come on when it was reacting to our sirens or the red and blue lights on our vehicles.

"I watched it for 30 minutes and there were numerous citizens who stopped and became aware of it. This caused some excitement."

Added Kennedy: "The last I saw of the UFO, it was heading west toward the ocean."

Police aide Mike Robinson stationed himself about 2 to 3 miles from the object and began taking photographs.

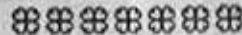
But these pictures later mysteriously disappeared, and a junior officer now suggests that his superiors have turned investigation of the incident, which was recorded in the department's official log, over to Washington.

"I think there was a cover-up," declared Kennedy, who has since joined the Culver City (Calif.) Police Department. "Obviously, if they found something on the film, they are not going to let it out. Uncle Sam has got a hold of it. Suppose they did develop something — you'd panic the American people."

Dorsey Cullen, a Simi Valley Police Department spokesman, told the ENQUIRER: "The film was forwarded to the Ventura Sheriff's Crime Lab for processing. The film has been misaid. There may have been a clerical error. There is no investigation."

A Pentagon spokesman said the federal government was not involved in the case.

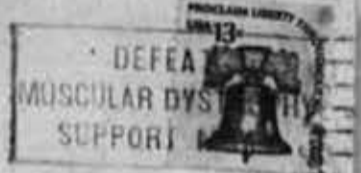

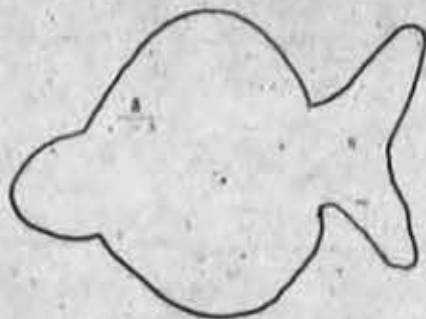

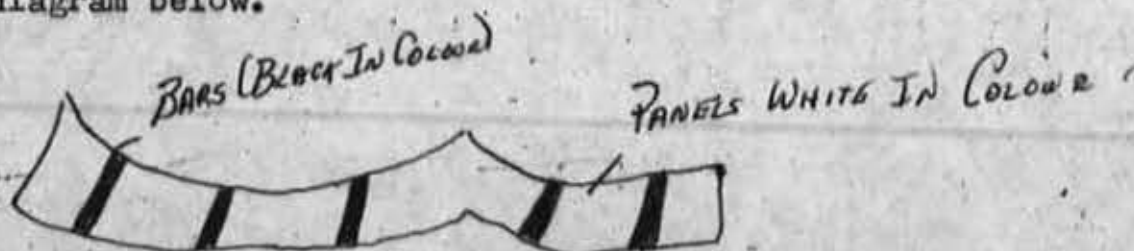
On Monday, 78 May 15, @ approximately 0310 hours, I woke up and decided to go downstairs for a glass of milk.

I was standing in the kitchen and was going to pour myself a glass of milk when I heard a very loud high pitched sound. It was similar in sound to a noise consistent to that of a jet aircraft.

The sky at this time was clear. I then walked over to the living room window to take a look outside to determine where the noise was coming from. I noticed an object in the sky towards the West. It was approximately 100 feet in the air. The object was flat and shaped somewhat like a fish, and was approximately 150' long. The object rotated onto its side and stayed there for a period of time. When the object became stationary the high pitched sound ceased. I held observation on it for approximately 1½ to 2 minutes. The object then departed at a high rate of speed and quickly disappeared. The underneath portion of the object looked similar to this diagram and was black in colour.



When the object rotated onto its side it took the shape similar to the diagram below.



When the object left the area, it did not make any noise.

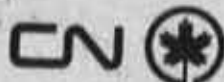


Dear Dr. Halliday:

Thank you for your letter of 26 May concerning the sighting over Toronto. I have discussed the report with Miss A. Claude who spoke with you on the telephone.


It is impossible to be specific on the identification without such more detailed data on the observations. A fragmenting meteor or re-entering satellite is one possibility and in the case of the meteor the apparent motion can be slowed any amount by the geometrical projection effects which may be involved. It would be more usual for the fragments to follow each other in essentially one path than to be spread out transverse to the direction of flight.

Reports of this nature have sometimes been traced to migrating birds illuminated from below by city lights. This may not fit very well for the velocity unless they were unusually low, but it is the season when birds are a real possibility.

We can probably expect increased confusion from man-made toys launched for this purpose. They are currently available in at least one catalogue whose distribution is in the Toronto area.

There are undoubtedly many other possibilities but these are some that have given use to similar reports in the past.



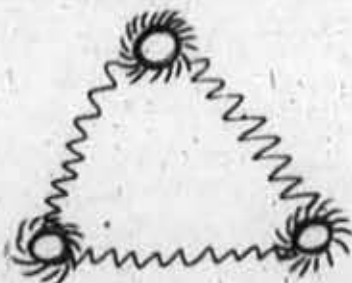

I told my wife what was taking place and she looked briefly at the bright light without the aid of binoculars. She was also surprised at such a bright light in the sky. I then went next door to the John and Olga Cearnnes Res., 75 Brompton Road, and told them of the object. My objective at this point was to discover if Mrs. Cearnnes, the high school Librarian, had any knowledge of any man-made space phenomena that was taking place on that date. Both Mr. and Mrs. Cearnnes came into the yard and watched the bright light for about 20 minutes, expressing some surprise. While watching this light I could not make out any shape that would indicate some type of vehicle. Most of the time, I could only make out an extremely bright light in the sky which was travelling almost directly away from me in a North-Westerly direction. At one point I went into my house to phone Chief O'Connor of the Red Rock Police Department. I remained inside for a few minutes and at 11:20 P.M. I went outside and could see red and green flashing lights in the same area as I had earlier seen the bright white light, which was now gone. Once again I was unable to make out any object shape-I was able to see that the red and green lights were alternate over a fairly large - elongated space. There were three green and three red lights which appeared to be blinking. Mrs. Cearnnes advised me that she had seen three white lights coming across the sky travelling toward the area where we had seen the bright light. I was inside at the time she had made this observation, however. It was becoming difficult to see the lights from the area of my residence due to trees interfering with my line of sight. I walked to a clearer area where I could once again see only a bright white light which appeared much more distant.

It was becoming difficult to keep the light in constant view due to the cloud cover. The light finally disappeared from my sight at 11:35 P.M. At this point the light had been obliterated by cloud cover as it appeared to near the horizon. If we were to assume that the surface of the earth was flat, running from 0 degrees to 180 degrees, the bright light was observed by me at approximately the 60 degree point and disappeared at approximately the 20 degree point. Bear in mind that the light was travelling almost directly away from me in a straight line which may have veered slightly to the North. I can give no estimation of distance or size of any lights, having nothing to relate to in the sky. It was only at my first observation that I noted a triangular positioning of the bright lights-after that I could only see a bright white light. The following is a diagram of the two different light systems I observed:

On Sunday June 11, 1978, at 11:05 P.M. Ken Richardson, (next door neighbour) asked me to go out to look at a bright object in the sky he had previously noticed. The sky at this time was completely overcast, with wisps of dark clouds streaking it. This made us realize that what we were seeing, could not have been a star.

The object was north-west, about a quarter circle above the horizon.

I looked at it through my binoculars (7X35). At first it was shaped as a crescent, with an extremely radiant ray coming out of the inner circle to the left. The ray was so bright, one wondered if it could only be a reflection.

It seemed to stay more or less in the same spot for at least 10 minutes, but the shape kept changing from crescent to diamond. When it was diamond shaped, the rays were flashing from each point, and when it was a half circle (standing on end) the rays were from the top, bottom and centre of the cut-off circle to the left.

After about ten minutes, it slowly started to move further down the horizon, as well as further away. In fifteen more minutes it had



gone behind a tree in our yard. I went upstairs to view it, and it was now quickly moving down and away. I then saw three very small dim lights well above the object, but coming towards it, but they soon disappeared.



On a mid-November morning in 1970, my wife and I, DROVE to Pembroke. The sky was overcast and although there was no snow, it rained most of the forenoon. At 11.45 we started for home, and on reaching the top of the hill where John Lackie formerly lived, we noticed a light at the entrance to the East Range Road. Along this road were a number of Maple trees with dead and froz leaves still attached thereto, and these leaves glistened in the unusual light.

As we watched the light became intense and spread over Arnold Gribbon's LARGE field, as well as his house and metal roofed barn. No object was visible. Just an unexplainable brilliance coming from an overcast sky. I spoke to a number of people, but found no one else who saw it. That night Gillies Waltham Mill burned.

1. The following information was obtained from Mr. and Mrs. Steve RUDY of the Codette District, Saskatchewan.

NEW INFORMATION:

- (1) DATE AND TIME OF SIGHTING; 78 AUG 02 at 2:15 AM
- (2) CONDITION OF SKY; Cloudy
- (3) LOCATION OF OBSERVER; First sighting from master bedroom (Mrs. RUDY). Second sighting from diningroom (Mr. & Mrs. RUDY).
- (4) OCCURRENCE OBSERVED; Mrs. RUDY described it as something moving in the Easterly to Westerly direction within a distance of approximately three feet, moving up and down slightly (10 inches). During the second observation from the diningroom, subject described the object as moving South in an up and down movement. She compared it to something having trouble staying in one spot. Mrs. RUDY's first sighting was from the bedroom when she observed this object for approximately ten to fifteen seconds. Mr. RUDY was awoken by his wife and they both went to the diningroom where they saw this object going Southbound to the horizon.
- (5) LUMINOSITY; Described as much brighter than a planet. It was like a set of good car lights only yellowish. Subject also compared it to the color of a bulb inside a flashlight turned on, only much brighter.

- (6) COLOUR; Fireball, subject stated that nothing was visible as a trail of any kind.
- (7) SIZE IN RELATION TO MOON AND SHAPE; Size, four to five feet in diameter. Shape, round like an orange.
- (8) DURATION; First sighting by Mrs. RUDY from the master bedroom was for ten to fifteen seconds. Second sighting, both Mr. & Mrs. RUDY observed the object from the dining-room travelling South for Thirty to forty-five seconds until it disappeared in the distance.
- (9) SOUND; No sound whatsoever was heard, nor was anything such as an appliance or otherwise turned on inside the house.
POSITION IN THE SKY; Described as horizontal to the ground and close, approximately one foot off the crop.
- (10) OTHER; There is no physical evidence in the crop or in the immediate area that any object had touched the ground. Mr. and Mrs. RUDY are mature and respected citizens of the area. Mr. RUDY is the Vice-Principal of the Carrot River School. Inquiries in the area failed to reveal any other sightings.

2. Cst. MEYER then questioned the above four (4) subjects and obtained written statements from each one. Diagrams of what each person saw were drawn on the rear of each statement. The girls were divided up into separate rooms as they could not then influence each other in the giving of their statements.
3. In checking over each statement once completed, they were found to be somewhat similiar. The A/N subjects saw what appeared to be an oval shaped object with rows of pulsating white lights. The object was considered to be approx. 30' in diameter and hovering $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile up in the sky in a stationary position.
4. The U.F.O. made no noise throughout the entire sighting. The object then proceeded in a southerly direction and then vanished. Refer to the attached statements for further details.
5. Cst. MEYER attended at the Vancouver International Airport Tower and spoke to the shift supervisor, Moriss BRAGER, regarding the above incident. BRAGER, in checking the flight log book, stated that they had not seen any UFO's on radar nor did they receive any phone calls re the above.

BRAGER also stated that several planes landed and lifted off between 2230 Hrs., and 2300 Hrs., on 78 AUG 03, and he feels that they perhaps either saw that or a Sky-Add plane flying by. The location of the observers at the time of sighting was on Westminister Hwy near Gibbons Rd., Richmond, B.C. The Vancouver International Airport is located approx. two (2) miles north of where the sighting was made.

- 6. In conversation with the A/N subjects it was obvious that they were telling the truth as they were very concerned and serious about what had happened. Due to their ages the possibility of human error cannot be overlooked.
- 7. In Cst. MEYER'S opinion it is believed that the four (4) girls in question actually saw something, but what they saw remains to be identified.

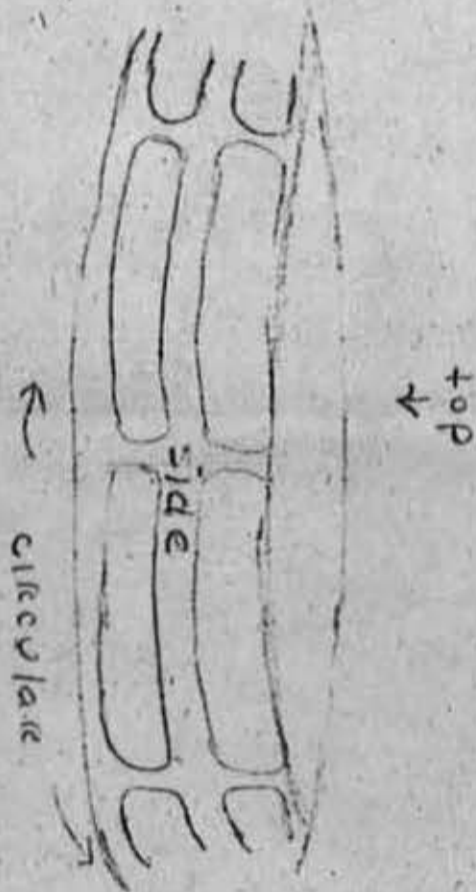



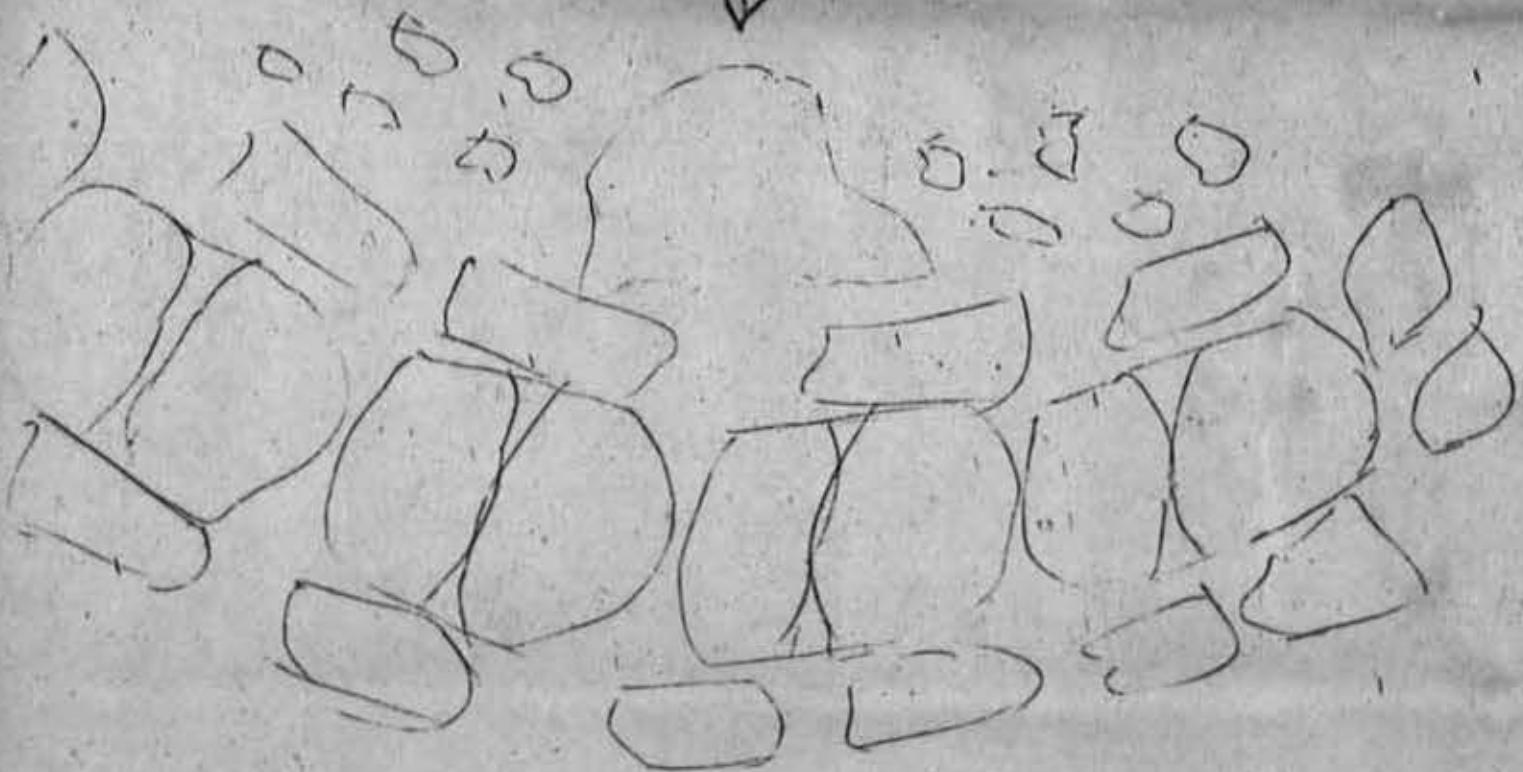

This member talked to Mr. Brian Murray and his family- Elaine Murray-wife-age 29 yrs., Michelle Murray-daughter-age 9 yrs., Daryl Murray-son-7 yrs. at their residence (152 Muir Cres. N.W. Medicine Hat, Alberta) and the following was related to myself:

On the night of the 27th of August 1978 at 9:45 P.M. apprx. 36 km. west of Bassano, Alberta, while travelling in a eastly direction on the Trans Canada Hwy. Mr. Murray observed a dark solid object, which appeared to be long and flat in shape, through the front windshield of his van. He mentioned the object to his wife and children and all four of them watched the object for approx ½ an hour. The object seemed to pace the vehicle and did not vary in size. Approx. 10 minutes after first sighting the object, the daughter of Mr. Murray, spotted a second object a little further behind the first object and it seemed to be farther away than the first object. Both objects were to the north of the van and both could be seen quite clearly because of the display of Northern lights that were in effect that night. Shortly after sighting the second object, the first object moved closer and in front of the van. The object started to move from one side of the hwy. to the other side of the hwy.. At the time the object started to move from side to side it was observed through the open windows (side) of the van by both Mr. Murray and Mrs. Murray. Also at this time the vehicular traffic was moderate in both lanes of the hwy.. The first object started

to move closer to the van and both Mr. and Mrs. Murray noticed that the hwy. traffic had dwindled to nothing. As the object moved closer to the van Mrs. Murray received a better view of the object and described it as follows: It looked like a long round disk and the edges were curved upwards and went into a small rounded hump that was in the middle on the top side of the object.

Mr. Murray had slowed to approx. 15-20 M.P.H. and observed a vehicle approaching from the rear of the van and about this time the object rose slowly into the air and moved in close to the second object and then both objects moved off to the south. Mr. Murray stopped the van and got out looking for the objects but both had disappeared.

The conditions that night were as follows: There was no moon and the sky was clear except for a few high hazy clouds. The only other sky condition was the display of Northern Lights.

It is the opinion of this member that the Murray family did see something that night and while they were relaying the incident to myself the family did not exaggerate or fantasize but presented a clear and concise account of what happened that night.

This is further to telex message forwarded on 78 AUG 31.

1. On 78 AUG 31, Woodrow ELLSWORTH (B: 52 FEB 04) of 1 Stanley Place, Stephenville, Nfld., came to the R.C.M. Police Detachment at Stephenville, Nfld. and reported that at 2145 hrs on the above date, he was travelling east on Highway 463 in Piccadilly, Nfld. when he and a passenger in his car noticed a large bright object in the sky moving from west to east. ELLSWORTH was a taxi driver for a local taxi company in Stephenville, Nfld. and was in the Piccadilly area when he picked up Clancy WHITE hitch hiking on the road.
2. ELLSWORTH reports that at the time of the sighting the sky was clear and star lit, with the northern lights slightly visible.
3. When the object was sighted, ELLSWORTH was approximately one mile east of Piccadilly Beach.
4. There were no reported bursts of speed. The object moved slowly and steadily.
5. The object glowed brightly. It appeared dull as compared to the moon and the brightness of the object hurt the eyes when ELLSWORTH looked directly at it. He compared the brightness of the object to the brightness of an arc welding flash.
6. The object did not look like a shooting star. One witness reported the object as very bright red on the inside and bright blue on the outside, with no tail at the rear.
7. The object was described as somewhat tubular in shape and streamlined like a commercial aircraft.
8. The object was observed for approximately five to six minutes.
9. Both witnesses report no sound coming from the object.
10. ELLSWORTH reports the object as being approximately 100 ft. above the ground, while WHITE states the object was very distant in the sky, so far away in fact that he could not comment on its size.
11. ELLSWORTH states that two or three red lights were flashing on the inside of the object and that the object had windows similar to that found in commercial aircraft.

REMARKS:

The sighting of this object was related to the writer by Woodrow ELLSWORTH in the first instance, with WHITE being unconcerned whether or not the matter was reported. Since the time of the sighting, efforts were made to locate WHITE, however, during the summer he had no fixed address and at the time ELLSWORTH did not know the name of the person he had picked up.

WHITE's account of what happened is very different from that of ELLSWORTH. WHITE claims he recalls the incident vividly and that he could not give an adequate description of the object.

1. On 78 Sept 11 at approximately 12:00 midnight, Mr. Fred WESOLOWSKI, his mother Tina WESOLOWSKI and sister Laverna WESOLOWSKI were proceeding south-east on highway #41 near Aberdeen, Sask. WESOLOWSKI reports that he observed the following:

Four pulsating silver/blue lights in a vertical column at approximately 1 mile distance. The lights then seperated and formed various patterns at times and at other times were at random. Lights continued to pulsate rapidly and change color from silver/blue to yellow to pink several times in no sequence. Lights travelled very fast horizontally. WESOLOWSKI feels there was a solid object at the source of each light but could not make out any discernable shape.

2. WESOLOWSKI watched the lights for approximately 1 minute. It is not known in what direction or manner the lights left. WESOLOWSKI was visibly shaken by the sighting but in my opinion, as well as two other members of this Detachment; he is a reliable witness and is mentally competent.

3. Saskatoon Airport control reports no unusual sightings or trackings during time in question.



1. In reference to our Telex #OLD 100, forwarded to your point on 78 OCT 15. The following is a complete report of the sighting.

- Date and time of the sighting was 78 OCT 14 at 1855 hours.
- Condition of the sky was clear.
- Location of the observer was on the west side of Highway #2 (in park lane) at the junction with Highway #27, near Olds, Alberta
- There were no occurrences of bursts.
- The brightness could be compared to that of a shining star at night. If there were any shadows cast, it could not be seen.
- The colour of the object was that of a white light. No trail could be seen either in front or behind the object.
- Size of the object was similar to a large plane. Shape of the object was thin, almost pancake shape.
- Duration of the sighting, from the time of the actual complaint, lasted for approximately five (5) minutes. Again, there was no persistent trail in the sky.
- No sounds could be heard at all.
- Position of the object in the sky, from where sighting occurred, was to the south-west of the Town of Olds, Alberta, and around 30,000 - 35,000 feet in the sky, well above the Rocky Mountain range, with the object being parallel to the ground.
- No other unusual observations occurred.

RCMP spots UFO

CLARENVILLE, Nfld. (CP) — An officer assigned to the RCMP detachment here sat and watched an unidentified flying object for more than an hour earlier this week, an RCMP officer here confirmed Friday.

The sighting came after an officer answered a call at 1:45 a.m. Oct. 26. The officer then observed an oval shaped object hovering at about 1,000 metres for more than an hour above Random Island, east of here, the police spokesman said.

The name of the officer who saw the object has not been released.

However, RCMP here do say that the officer watched the object through a telescope and provided a detailed description of it.

It had a pyramid-shaped fin on the top of an oval shaped white body and it flashed red, blue, and white lights for more than an hour before "it went straight up and disappeared."

A report on the incident has been filed with the National Research Council in Ottawa.

RCMP officers here have refused to provide the names of those who saw the object and reported it.

Meanwhile, a spokesman at the Air Traffic Control centre at the Gander International Airport said nothing had been logged to indicate that a UFO had been in the area.

SKIES CLEAR PATCHES OF FOG MOON

+8 Oct 29 - 03:10

L'HEUREUX DRIVING A VEHICLE WAS NORTH BOUND ON MAIN ACCESS
ROAD INTO GOUSSARD WHEN SHE SAW A CURVED LIKE WISP OF LIGHTED
FOG WHICH BEGAN MOVING FWD AT QUITE A SPEED. ASSUMING THAT
STRAIGHT UP IS 90DEG ANGLE THIS OBJECT WAS ABOUT 20 DEG OFF
THE HORIZON. THE WISP OF LIGHT FOG APPEARED TO HAVE BROKEN AWAY
FROM THE LIGHT WHICH WAS STILL FOR TIME BEING REVEALING A
QUARTER MOON-SHAPED OBJECT. THE OBJ GREW INT FULL MOON SHAPE
THEN MOVING OUT FM BEHIND IT CAME RED GLOWING DISC WITH BLUE
GLOWING CENTER. WE NOW HAVE A WISP OF FOG SHAPED LIKE A WEDGE
A-MOON-LIKE DISC, DULL YELLOWISH IN COLOUR AND A RED, BLUE-
CENTRED DISC. THEN THE WHOLE ISSUE MOVED FWD VERY RAPIDLY IN A
WESTERLY DIRECTION THEN STOPPED. THEN THE RED DISC SHIFTED FWD
IN A SLOW MOTION TYPE OF WAY BACK INTO THE MOON DISC. THE DISC
HAD CAUGHT UP TO THE DEFINITE SHAPED FOG WISP. THERE ALSO
APPEARED AT THIS TIME TO BE AN EXHAUST TRAIL BEHIND IT. THE
ENTIRE PROCESS WAS PERFORMED OVER AGAIN TWO TIMES. THE DISC
THEN DISAPPEARED LEAVING BEHIND THE WEDGE-LIKE WISP AND
AN EXHAUST TRAILM DURATION OF OBSERVATION 3-5 MINS.
L'HEUREUX DIS NOT REPORT THIS INCIDENT UNTIL SHE HAD SECOND
SIGHTING ALONG WITH HUSBAND.

SKIES CLR. OBJECT ALSO SIGHTED BY GUY ARTHUR L'HEUREUX
BORN 03FEB47 RELATION-HUSBAND. OBJECT SIGHTED FROM HOUSE
OWNED BY L'HEUREUX IN GOUSSARD ALTA. OBJECT APPEARED OVER
LESSER SLAVE LAKE. OBJECT A LARGE WHITE LIGHT SHINING LIKE A
STAR BUT BIGGER. TRIANGULAR IN SHAPE AND SEEMED TO PULSATE.
THERE WERE RED LIKE SPARKS OR BEAMS EMITTING FROM TOP POINT.
THE TRIANGLE WOULD FLARE UP THEN GO ROUNDISH. APPEARED TO BE
SETTLING DOWN IN A SWINGING TYPE MOTION. L'HEUREUX LOST SIGHT
OF OBJ WHEN SHE WENT TO GET HUSBAND. ON THEIR RETURN OBJ
HAD RISEN AND CHANGED LOCATION APPROX 45 DEGS. RISING IN SKY
GETTING SMALLER FOG OR HAZE AROUND IT. LOOKED THRU BINOCULARS
AT OBJ - IT WAS A DEFINITE OBJECT. OBJECT GLARING LIKE
MOLTEN STEEL OBSERVED BY L'HEUREUX TIL 0845 AND NO LONGER
SEEN AT 0900.

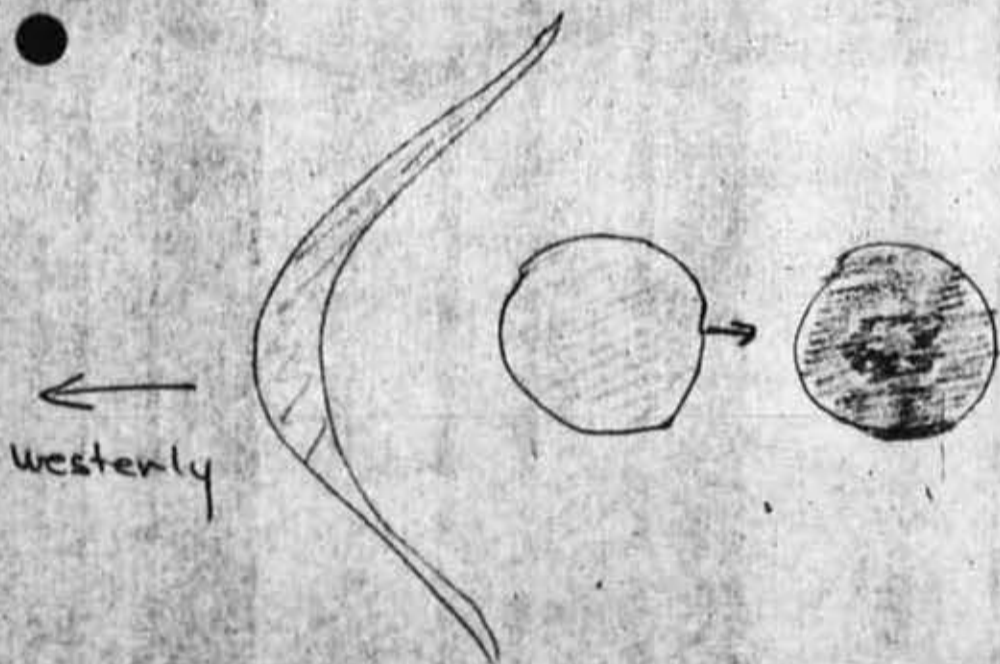
Oct 29, 1978.

Seen between approximately

5.10 - 5.20 am.

Oct 28. Went to Halloween Dance in High Prairie with husband. Had 2 beer. Went to party afterward & slept until husband & other couple, Doris & Marcel Duchesneau, were ready to come home around 4:30 am. I was driving. It had snowed several inches then cleared, except for occasional foggy patches, and frozen. Roads were treacherous. Driving slowly, -arrived at Jassard main turnoff, turned down the road - facing lake. Sighted what appeared to be a small waning moon surrounded by fog - shining - like headlights shining on fog. ⁽¹⁾ Seemed too low to be a moon - there a curved-like wisp of lighted fog (on whatever) started moving forward at quite a speed - Faster than what an aircraft would at that distance. I assumed that it was situated over the lake about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile out. when you don't know what size something is, its hard to tell how far away it is. Assuming that straight up is a 90° angle this object was at about a 20° angle above the horizon. The wisp of lighted fog had appeared to have broken away from the light, which was still, for the time being.

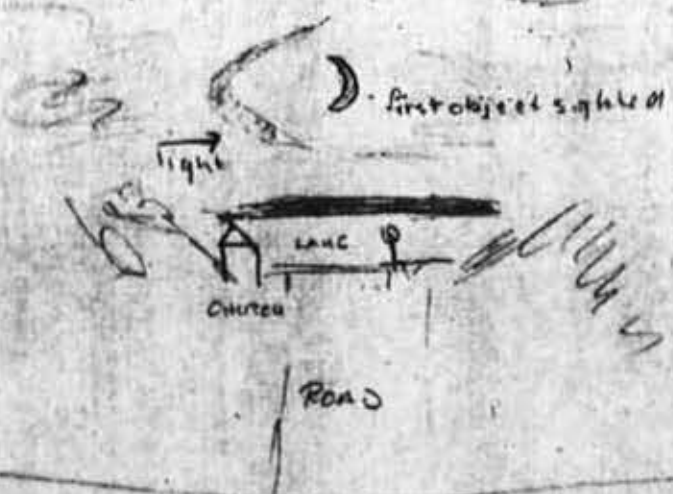

fog and an exhaust trail. She saw the fog
and said it did look rather strange but must
be caused by the northern lights. I didn't point
out the exhaust trail. I felt rather stupid about
the entire matter, as I had no witnesses and
would convince no-one but myself. The sighting
is still very clear to me and entertains my thoughts
very often. I'm still trying to figure out what it
could be. Anyways, I dropped the Duchesneau's
at their house and arrived home at 5:20 a.m.
There was a moon that night, also, on the other
side of the sky.
