1. Information relative to inidentified Flying Object has been obtained from A/2C Robert J VEACH, AF 12322180, A/3C James CHRISTODOLAN, AF 15471733 and James C. RAY, AF 13403680, A/1C Jessee J. JOHNSON, AF 13345627, A/3C Norman D ELLISTON, AF 16373249, A/3C John P RCBSINS, S/Sgt John J HALD, A/3C Gene P LANDIS, AF 13374521 and 1st LT. ANTHONY C KELLEY AO 759021 and is forwarded herewith.

2. The following information was revealed:


- a. Airmen VEACH, CHRISTODOL N and RAY, assigned to 1946th AACS Squadron, Tempelhof Air base were collectively interviewed on 12 August 1952 and stated substentially as follows: - At 2300 hours, 11 August 1952, they were on duty at the Control Tower, Tempelhof Air Base, when they received a call from the Fire Department, Tempelhof Air Base requesting them to look in the sky south of the field, Tempelhof Air Base. In the sky directly south of the field Tempelhof Air Base were observed three (3) objects which could not be identified as any presently known Aircraft or Missile type. Description given by the three airmen was essentially that objects were cloud like in texture, elvotical in shape, and emmitted a light which made them stand out on an otherwise dark sky. These objects appeared to hover at some distance away (unable to state distance) from the south end of Tempelhof Air Base. The length of time objects were observed to hover was estimated to be approximately thirty (30) seconds. It was stated that one object seemingly closer to the observer was considerably brighter than the other two. The brightest object was observed to proceed at a great rate of speed (unable to estimate exact speed) in an esterly direction, finally dissappearing from sight. As this object moved across the sky there was no visible trail left by object. No sounds were audible in connection with objects. While attention was focused to dissappearing brightest object the other two apparently dissappeared, however, their direction of departure was not observed.
- b. Airmen JOHNSON, ELLISTON, ROBBINS, HALL and LANDIS, all members of the Tempelhof Air Base Fire Department were collectively interviewed on 12 August 1952 and described objects observed to be the same type as described above (par. l.a.). Time of observation was established to be at 2300 hours, 11 August 1952. In addition to the above description it was stated that objects appeared possibly be the result of search lights projecting light on the clouds. Airman LANDIS stated that they looked exactly like searchlights on the clouds except for the fact that there were no visible beams eminating from the ground.

- c. 1st LT KELLEY, 1946th AACS Squadron, was interviewed 14 August 1952 relative to Radar indications of unidentified objects at 2300 hours, 11 August 1952.
 KELLEY stated that he had been Duty Officer at CPS-5 (Radar) Tempelhof Air Base at 2300 hours, 11 August 1952, and that alleged unidentified objects were not noticed on the Eader Screen at 2300 hours. KELLEY further stated that a possibility exists that any indications might not have been seen because objects might be too near to the Tempelhof Air Base Radar Station and furthermore even if "Blips" were present they might have gone unnoticed since unidentified "Blips" are a very common occurance. These unidentified "Blips" are usually assumed to be Soviet Aircraft, which are in most cases impossible to positively identify. KELLEY mentioned that the only search light familiar to Control Tower, Tempelhof Air Base, having any proximity to unidentified objects, is the beacon at Schoenefeld Air Field (Soviet Zone) 5223N/1331E). In the opinion of KELLEY, this beacon light could not have had any relationship to the lights eminating from alleged unidentified objects.
- d. Review of the files kept in the Weather Forecasters Office at Tempelhof Air Base revealed that the weather at 2300 hours, 11 August 1952 was as follows: Wind six (6) knots per hour from 270 degrees.

- 1. Forwarded herein is a report of unidentified flying objects as obtained by the 1946th AACS Squadron, S-2, officer Capt. Frederick A. Boswell, AO-2044539, 12 August 1952.
 - a. About 2300 hours local on 11 August the Fire Department called the Control Tower and asked if we would look to the south of the tower and if we could see any strange sights in the sky. When I looked I saw three objects or lights in the sky. One was a lot plainer than the other two. It seemed to be some kind of spinning mass. The edges seemed rough and trailed along the side to give it a spinning effect. It seemed to be flat. It was standing in one spot spinning for few seconds and then disappeared to the left and down with great speed. (Given by A/3c. James C. Pay, AF14403680.)
 - b. Following was given by A/3c. James Christodolou, AF15471733. At approximately 2115 hours local on Monday night (11 August) I noticed a bright oval shaped object which was located on the south side of the field. The object seemed to be spinning with a great amount of speed and it left a slight path. The object moved toward the east and then disappeared. The object could not have been over 5,000 feet for the weather report was one-eight at five thousand.
 - c. Following was given by A/2c. Robert J. Verch, AF12322180, tower trick chief. At approximately 2300 hours local on 11 August the tower was notified by the Fire Department that they saw approximately three to four glowing objects approximately south to southwest of the field. I looked and saw three oval shaped bright objects that seemed to be spinning around. They disappeared at around 2301 local.
- 2. Also, attached hereto is a statement as received by a member of this office on 14 August 1952 from A/3c. Francis J. Wenzel, AF13353732, assigned to the Base Fire Department, 7350th Base Complement Squadron.
