

None whatever; (I relied upon my judgment as an Observation) ex "OPOA" in Field Artillery during 1939-45.)

Where was object first observed, eg, overhead, coming from behind a hill, over the horizon, etc; Rising above roof of house next door to the South, when an approx. bearing would be  $175^{\circ}$ . To me, it could have come out of the bay; it rose to my left (heading for about 10 o'clock on my imaginary clockface)
10. What first attracted observer's attention, eg, light or noise.  
I thought I heard hissing (but many cars produce the same noise on Beach Rd) - I peered out and saw an illuminated frame work as per sketch)
11. Did object appear as a light or as a definite object?  
Definite object (series of frames - as per sketch - end on end; framework, incldg. cross-members; wholly outlined in orange-coloured emissions (like a child's fireworks "Sparkler pencil", but trailing backwards along the
12. If there was more than one object, how many were there and what frame was their formation?  
Only one, but this appeared to be in two main box-frames; the lower one appeared to have two side legs. The whole combination reminded me of the under-side outline of two Lancaster Bombers used in New Guinea during the War.
13. What was the colour of the light or object?  
I said orange above, but it varied between orange and light yellow...
14. What was its apparent shape? Two hollow frames joined; the last having 2 side legs. (Like the last two rungs of a ladder; plus the two feet)
15. Was any detail of structure observable?  
Not to justify a positive opinion
16. Was any method of propulsion obvious? No. (the emissions referred to in (11) above appeared to be more profuse at the crossmembers)
17. Was there any sound? No engine or explosive sound. The hissing in (10) was similar to that heard upon the firing of a firework's "flower-pot"
18. Height, or angle of elevation. See diagram: Varied from  $30^{\circ}$  at 1st sight to  $60^{\circ}$  at end sighting, when it had moved about  $30^{\circ}$  left, in 10 secs
19. Speed, or angular velocity. My calculation might mislead you; it climbed (in my opinion) at the climbing speed of a modern fighter plane.
20. Was the object stationary?  
Never at any time during my sighting.
21. What was the direction of flight with reference to landmarks or points of the compass? See diagram. It seemed to come from the bay off "Quiet Corner", climbed up & veered to the left. After 10 seconds, it appeared to be overhead at 10 o'clock. Roughly, SW to SE direction; or (on a clockface) started at 5 o'clock & went straight through to 10 o'clock - there was a slight flatterring of trajectory at the top.

- 22. Did the object remain on a straight path, deviate or manoeuvre at all? ~~Yes~~; the climb was steady, regular & unfaltering. At the end of my 10-second sighting, it appeared to begin to flatten out but my house obstructed my view & I do not know what zenith was reached.
- 23. Was any trail of exhaust, vapour or light seen? No, but the "legs" I mentioned in (12) could have been fading emissions from the framework.
- 24. Where did object disappear, eg in mid-air, behind a hill, over the horizon? It disappeared from my view behind my roof-top but was still as bright as when I first sighted it 10 seconds earlier. (I ran to the front street but the street lights & trees prevented my picking it up again)



There are several puzzling aspects about this reported sighting. On first examination it appears highly probable that the sighting could be accounted for as a meteorological device suspended by parachute or a large low pressure plastic balloon. If the first explanation were true, the device should have descended slightly during the period of observation - and if the second were true it should have ascended slightly. In either case, wind conditions as checked by WLM Met. did not support movement from East to West. Winds at the time were from the SW to 7000' and from the S from 7000 upward.

There is a slim possibility that the sighting could be explained as light reflection from gas, steam or cloud from BHP as large light intensities are generated from the oxygen/steel process during insertion and retraction of the oxygen lance and during pouring off from the crucibles.

No other explanation can be thought of.





REPORT ON THE SIGHTING OF AN UNUSUAL AERIAL OBJECT

On Tuesday night, 26th November I left my office in Parkville at 7.30 p.m. (I have to sign off attendance book with name and time we leave).

I arrived home at 6 Craiggrossie Ave., Coburg at 8.15 p.m.; took off my coat, washed my hands in the kitchensink and went outside to collect 2 towels from the washingline. As I still had to cook my tea I looked at the clock when I went outside. It was then 8.25 p.m.

Outside it was a mild night with half a moon shining and stars in a clear sky. No clouds anywhere. I went to the line and reached up to take the pegs off. I was facing North and could see the moon out of the left corner of my eye. I had only a quick look at the sky because I was already late and wanted to get on with cooking my tea. Somehow I became aware of some movement near the moon so I took a closer look at the moon and to my amazement I saw what I thought looked like a star moving at the periphery of the dark side of the moon. It made 3 parabolic jumps against the edge of the moon, like a pingpong ball bouncing, then lingered for a second and then started to travel away from the moon in an Eastward direction. Although it looked like a star it was not a star, it looked more like a luminous sphere with a pinkish glow and while travelling it gave off red and green sparks. According to my judgement this thing was travelling not in our atmosphere but way out in outer space, as far as the stars. I could easily follow it while it travelled through the heavens and although it did not show speed it seemed to me that it was covering tremendous distances and therefore must have a terrific speed. It travelled quite smoothly and it did not give the impression that it was a dead object but that it was steered choosing its course through the heavens to some definite point in space.

I closed and opened my eyes twice to make sure that I was not just seeing things, because I found it becoming a bit eerie.

After it had travelled a tremendous distance in the heavens eastward it suddenly started to zig-zag up and down with the speed of lightning, it did this a couple of times and then travelled on quietly again going south-east. After a little while I could not follow it any more because that part of the sky was obscured by the foliage of trees growing on the east side of the property where my flat is.

While watching it and finding it all so strange I wanted to call my landlady who lives in the house in front of my flat, but I feared that the thing would then have gone and I wanted to see where it would go.

After it had disappeared behind the trees I thought I would go and tell my landlady anyway but to make sure that it was not too late to pay her a visit I went inside to see how late it was and it was about 5 minutes to 9. In my idea I had been watching only between 5 to ten minutes, but it must have been longer than that going by the clock. My landlady had 2 visitors and we went all outside but we did not see anything strange any more.

I did not expect anybody to believe my story but I thought I would tell it anyway the next morning at the office and everybody thought I had seen an aeroplane. Although that part of the sky is the way the aeroplanes come and go from Essendon I am very sure it was not an aeroplane because I see them every night going over. I have seen aeroplanes at night, I have seen shooting stars, I have seen satellites going over but this definitely did not look like anything like it. I rang the Bureau of Meteorology to report it and they gave me a number at the RAAF to call which I did.



1. In reply to your letter and report dated 18th August 1968, I must inform you that this department investigates such reports only from the aspect of national security.
2. We have not received any other reports on this incident and have checked Melbourne Radars and D.C.A. with no result. As there were no pilot reports or unexplained radar signals, we are satisfied that there was no threat to Australian security.
3. From your description of the speed, direction and duration of the sighting, the most likely explanation is that a meteorite was entering the earths atmosphere or it was possibly an earth satellite breaking up on entering the atmosphere.





Report on Sighting of U.F.O.s, Zanthus Area, 22nd August, 1968.  
By Capt. Gordon W. Smith, Pilot for Murchison Air Services - Southern  
Airlines of W.A.

Captain Walter Gardin and myself were returning from Adelaide to Perth on a Charter Flight. The aircraft was an 8 place Piper Navajo, registration VH-RTO, and were returning empty from Adelaide. At the first sighting I was asleep in the cabin, Walter was at the controls. We were cruising at 8000' with a true airspeed of 190-195 knots, tracking 270° Magnetic.

At 0940 G.M.T. (1740 W.S.T.) Walter abruptly woke me up in great excitement and asked me to come into the cockpit quickly. I did so, and he asked me if I could see what he was looking at. At first I didn't because I was still suffering from the effect of sleep, however after about 30 seconds I could see what he was excited about.

Some distance ahead at the same level, and about 50° to my right (I was in the right seat) I saw, a formation of aircraft. In the middle was a larger aircraft, and formed to the right and left and above, were 4 or 5 smaller aircraft. We were on a track of 270° (M) and these aircraft appeared to be maintaining station with us.

Because we hadn't been notified of this traffic, I radioed Kalgoorlie D.C.A. communications centre asking them what traffic they or RAAF had in our area. The answer was none. So I then notified Kalgoorlie that we had this formation in sight, and they in turn notified some Eastbound traffic of the danger of unidentified traffic 130 NM East of Kalgoorlie.

At about this time we lost communications with Kalgoorlie on all frequencies. We were getting Kalgoorlie carrier wave with no voice propagation, only a hash and static. In the next 10 minutes I transmitted about 7 times and I believe Walter did about 5 times with no results. Also at about this time we noticed that the main ship split into two sections still maintaining the same level, and the smaller aircraft then flew out left and right, but staying at the same level, and coming back to the two main halves of the bigger ship. At this time there appeared to be about 6 smaller aircraft taking turns of going out and coming back and forming on the two halves.

Sometimes the two halves joined and split, and the whole cycle continued for 10 minutes.

The shape of the main ship seemed to have the ability to change, not drastically, but a change from say, spheroid to a slightly elongated form with the colour maintaining a constant dark grey to black.

However the smaller craft had a constant cigar shape, and were of a very dark colour. Their travel out and back had a peculiarity not associated with normal aircraft in that they appeared to travel out and come back without actually turning like a normal aeroplane would have to.

At 0950 G.M.T. the whole formation joined together as if at a single command, then departed at a tremendous speed. Not disappeared as say, gas would, but departed in about 3 or 4 seconds, diminishing in size till out of sight.

The weather at the time of the sighting was fine, with no haze above 5000' and about 2/8 alto stratus cloud to the south of us and the other aircraft.

Notes on U.F.O.

1. The distance from our aircraft of the U.F.O. would be impossible to gauge, because the prerequisites to establishing distance is to know size, and the size of these objects are unknown. However, for comparative size, the main ship compared with that of a Boeing 707 from about 10 miles.
2. Immediately after the departure of the U.F.O. radio communications were restored.
3. Neither Walter nor myself had the presence of mind to check if any deviation existed in our magnetic compass or Automatic Direction Finding Equipment whilst in the proximity of the U.F.O.s.
4. The whole formation maintained the same distance and bearing from our aircraft during the whole time of the sighting.

Capt. Gardin and myself discussed the sighting at length during and after and came to these conclusions:-

Whether the U.F.O.s were

- (a) Balloons
- (b) Gases
- (c) Trick of Lights
- (d) Aircraft

(a) If the sighting were balloons we considered it impossible to see these balloons from 30 miles, because this would have been the distance covered by the aircraft from the first sighting to the disappearance.

The U.F.O.s maintained the same distance throughout, whereas a free balloon would have a closure rate with us of 105 kts. our (True Airspeed) and would have at least passed us.

(b) The same argument as above.

(c) If it were a trick of light, the colour of the U.F.O. should have changed at sometime or another, because the sun had had a considerable traverse, coupled with our westward travel during this time. Also due to the last two facts any refracted light would have changed form drastically, whereas the U.F.O. had very little change of shape or colour.

(d) We concluded that the U.F.O.s were in fact aircraft with the solidity of aircraft except perhaps for the fact of the larger U.F.O. ability to split and change shape slightly.
