

Recently our organization received a report of an incident which occured in Sept. 1977 involving a commercial aircraft and an "unknown aerial object" at Goondiwindi airport at (app) 03.00 prs.

The exact date was either 10TH OR 17TH SEPTEMBER 77 a Saturday. I have enclosed part eopy of the report, as you will see the reporter is an aircraft engineer. There were at least 6 witnesses total including 2 pilots (one as passenger)

The aircraft involved aborted its Final approach " as the "unknown"

appeared to bee on a collision course with it.

The reporter said that the incident was never reported to authorities

in D.O.T. or the Racef. .

Duration of the sighting was probably more than the 30 mins STATED. We feel your office may be able to kelp us in our investigation of this report, to which the most plausable explanation seems to be that of a helicopter.

The witness stated however that Bris/ Sydney air Traffic Control confirmed no other traffic in the area at the time, also that he heard no

chopping sound associated with the unknown object.

We have a mounted "Universe" telescope fitted with lens strength 20%.

Upon inspection I could see these two lights were satellites or U.F.O's. I kept observing from time to time until they disappeared below the horizon at about 8 p.m. We live on Slade Point itself, a vantage point 100' above sea level overlooking the ocean with a 3600 view.

The object on the left was the smaller of the two and appeared to have two ropes or rays of some kind extending fromit. The object on the right was much larger and twards the end of the observation (the last 1 hours was clearly seen to be painted red. There was also a smaller light below and to the right of the larger object not visible to the naked eye. This was reported to Townsville R.A.A.F. on Tuesday 30th May, 1978 to and "Pegasus".





SIGHTING: Miss Lorrain Gusmeroli and Mr. Arthur Sprowat were walking to a friends house shortly before 11.30pm. While passing through a park on Sheridah Street they sat on the double swings for a moment. About a minute after doing this they both noticed something strange appearing in the sky to the north-east. At the same time both witnesses spotted a huge black cross appearing in the sky.

The object appeared slacly (i.e. faded in) and was described as a black cross whigh seemed superimposed on a hazy glowing background, roughly circular. The two witnesses watched this for about a minute, ofter which it began to fade away until nothing could be seen. Both witnesses were highly upset at seeing this occurence.

INVESTIGATION: Anyone reading the press release (see attached) of this occurrence may have doubts ou the witnesses eanity, but the two people involved seemed quite sensible and to be relating a real occurrence. It is thought by the investigator that if this in fact was connected with the UFO phenomena, it seems religiously orientated. (i.e. the bh shape of the object and the fact that the sighting occurred just before Easter). It seems possible that this was not an object in the sense of the word, but some sort of projection. The object was described as a large black cross (crucifix) shape in the & centra of a soft white haze (such as that : which surrounds the moon at times) roughly circular. The object itself was not glowing, the lighted area seemed behind the cross and not surrounding ite (the cross seemed superimposed). At the time of the sighting winds were _ very calm below, aloft averaging about 2 - 3 knots south-east. Cloud was approximately 12,000ft. very light (stratus cloud). Miss Guameroli noticed that the object did not affect this cloud. (There was cloud to eather side of, or above the object.) Thursday night was a busy night at the Cairns eirport with several turnaround flights, but there were no sircraft around the time of the sighting. The object was above or north of the airport. After observing the object the two witnesses went on to their friends, and the next day both visited Father Lizzie at St. Monicas church (Mr. Sprowat is a ____ Catholic) and described the event to him.

CONCLUSIONS: Even under the guise of a UFO this eighting . . seems unusual.

Introduction

1. On 11-12 March 1978 several phonecalls were received by the Orderly Officer at RAAF Base Townsville of an unusual aerial sighting in the Mellish Park - Mt Isa area of western Queensland. Most of these calls were from duty personnel at the Royal Flying Doctor Service (RFDS) at Mt Isa. One call was from the Mt Isa police. The RFDS reports indicated that they had received approximately twenty transmissions from outback homesteads by two-way radio. These reports were spread out over an extensive area including Burketown, Mornington Island, Gregory Downs and Documdgre Mission.

2. The Captain of Luthansa flight 693 overhead Alice Springs at 35,000 feet also reported this sighting.

Description of Sighting

3. All reports indicate that the object was sighted between 1830K and 1845K hours on the 11 March 1978. Observers state that they saw a bright flaming orange light with a greyish smoke trial. There were reports of six to eight explosions and people at Doomadgee Mission reported ground



vibrations. The object travelled from north to south. Weather conditions at the time were clear with 3/8 cumulus at 8000°, visibility 40 km, surface winds as light to variable with South Ensterlies at high levels.

Observer Reports

4. Charver reports required by HoCC AST 3/A/5 have not been requested in this instance. All of the reports were received by two-way radio and the RFDS have advised that the remoteness of the area is such that mail delivery and pick up to outback stations takes up to three months. A verbal report over the telephone with the RFDS and Police in therefore the basis for this information.

Public Interest

5. The sighting of this object created considerable interest within the North Queensland Area. Considerable coverage over radio and other media outlets was generated. The Division of Meteorology of the CSIRO in Sydney expressed an interest in this matter. Dr R. Binns (Telephone 02-6881666) represented the CSIRO and indicated that he had received information that movie film of the object had been taken by a property owner. If this is true it will be the first such film of this nature.

Possible Explanation

6. The most probable explanation, as agreed by the CSIRO, is the entry and probable landing of a meteorite.

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

Report for 1977, May -- January 1978.

1977: May 1977 saw the official formation of UFO Research (FNQ), and since that month we have had some changes in the organisations' committee. Our original Co-Ordinator, Mr. Max Dickson moved back to Sydney, and our Lisison Officer and founder Mrs. Di Van Wijk, left for a short period in the Solomons but has now returned to Cairns.

Membership: At the start of January 1978, UFOR(FNQ) had a membership of 19. We hope with continued support of our existing and future members to issue a newsletter regularly in the near future, and we remind our members that many people are interested in 'UFOs' and if you know someone who is, 'sign em up'.

In line with other member organisations in the Australian Co-Ordination Section (ACOS), we have a continuing co-operation from Government Departments and Local Media. The RAAF, Dept. of Transport, Meteorology Dept., Weapons Research, and Local Police all give assistance on investigations which is essential in sorting out the IFOs from the UFOs. And the local Media have proved more than helpful on several occasions relating to sightings.

U.F.D.R.(F.N.Q.) is now represented in Cairns, Babinda, and Cardwell, and it is hoped more members will join from other centres.

The year 1977 and January 1978 have proved that UFOs are present in North Queensland and probably more numerous than we realise. It has been the experience of the Investigators of UFOR(FNQ), that many more sightings occurred and were not reported to us for various reasons, some relating to the possibility of ridicule, which on occasions still rears its head when it comes to UFOs.

During the period of May 1977 to January 1978, UFDR(FNQ) recieved 20 reports of 'Unidentified Flying Objects'.

Six of these were sightings up to two to three years old, most of which are very interesting but past proper investigation.

Of the remaining cases, a large majority of which are Nocturnal Light reports, four are still being investigated. These came from Innisfail, and Holloways Beach , from which there were three sightings within a month. QB 77002 (NL) -- 7:12:75. In the early hours of Sunday morning, Mr. and Mr. A. Bell were driving north to Cairns from Townsville, when approximately 65 miles south of Cairns they noticed a glowing yellow-white light to their right travelling parallel to them up the coast. On several occassions the object passed behind mountains along the coast to the east. After arriving in Cairns (60 minutes later), they noticed the object was still to the east and had changed shape; it had flattened out and widened and was now a greenish colour. When the couple arrived at their house, Mr. Bell watched for another five minutes, while the object seemingly hovered just south of Cairns airport. After this he went to bed and did not see the object again. QB 77014 (NL) On monday 10/10/77, two. Swiss girls hollidaying at Misson Beach, were lying on their backs watching the stars when they noticed a starlike light move across the sky in an arc. The light approached erraticly from the north-east - west, at about 90° above the horizon it suddenly turned and flew to the east, dissapearing soon after at approximately 45 to the horizon. They had another sighting that night, which was identified as a s satellite.

QB 78001. 21.50hrs, 24/12/77 (CE1). Georgetown: On Christmas Eve Mrs. Hughes and her two daughters, plus two other children from next door watched a bright orange light surrounded by a blueish haze hover over a gum tree 100yds. away from their yard. After watching it for about three minutes, they said the object rose vertically then headed away to the northwest passing the witnesses. Mrs. Hughes said, as the object moved away km the shape changed to an oblong shape with the orange light at the front. In another report a family at Bramston Beach saw an object make a close





approach and a possible landing; other reports came from Palmeston Highway, Babinda, South Gordonvale, Kamerunga, and Holloways Beach. Several other x reports came as rumours and through the Media, these could not be traced. Many sightings have not come to our attention because of the Publics' lack of knowledge of our existence, and that relitively new thought that many people treat the sighting of a U.F.O. as a common and everyday occurrence.

As expected, reports of UFOs received by UFOR(FNQ) have been very much the same as those reported form other parts of Australia.

Contact International, in addition to UFO Research F.N.Q., has a representative investigator for the British UFO Organisation Contact International in Cairns. He is Mr. Charles Winter and may be contacted through UFORFNQ.

All reports received by UFOR(FNQ) are being entered on the ACOS computer file from which patterns should emerge, enlarging our knowledge of UFOs, and it is hoped that in the future we can contribute the Mata needed, and our ideas on the subject of UFOs.

Any readers who have observed anything unusual in the sky or on land or sea are asked to contact UFO Reasearch, Far North Queensland through P.O. Box 1585, Cairns. Information will be kept confidential if required.



Relative to: - Sightings by persons within the Burketown Police Division of Unidentified Flying Objects.

Sir,

I have to report with reference to the above that on the 25.12.77, a fisherman by the name of Rudolph BEIER came into the Burketown Police Station and reported to me Regional that while on a fishing expedition in the company of another Superintendent, fisherman, Barry TAYLOR he saw an Unidentified Flying Object.

Northern Police Region, TOWNSVILLE.

He stated to me that on the 24.12.77 at about 9.40pm as he was coming down the Albert River just near the

Landsborough Channel when he saw a bright light coming

your information from the east, as the light drew closer it became clearer.

He stated that it was probably the size of a house, it was a white colour, completely round with mist coming from the under side of the object. In the mist he could see a powerful bright light.

The object came in their direction and when it was about two miles away it appeared as if it was going to land. Then it suddenly took off up into the sky at a tremendous speed to a height where it could only be seen as a cloud in the night sky. The bright light could still be seen in the cloud. The object then disapeared into the Western sky. BETER stated that he saw this object for at least ½ and hour and at one stage was only approxiametally 20,000 metres away. He stated that at no time did the objectnemit any noise.

Barry TAYLOR who accompanied BEIER on the fishing trip was interviewed but stated that he was in the wheel house for most of the sighting and only came out when his partner called out to him. He stated that when he came out of the wheelhouse the light was just going up into the air. He stated that it appeared to be a bright light with a haze around it. When he saw it it was a long way into the air. It went into the air and just faded out. He said it didn't look like a plane or any natural phenomenon that he knew of. It appeared to be one light inside another. It made no sound that he could hear.

Both fisherman were sober at the time and stated that they had had no alcohol to drink in the preceding twenty-four hours to the sighting of the object.

On the 30.12.77, I was contacted by Doomadgee Mission on frequency 5110 of the Royal Flying Doctor radio. The aboriginal Police Sergeant stated to me that at about 9.30pm on the 23.12.77, himself and most of the aboriginal community at the doomadgee Mission saw an object which he described as a fire cloud in the sky shaped like a football.

Inspector of Police MOUNT ISA DISTRICT.

He said that the object came from the south at a very low altitude as if it was about to land. The object suddenly sped off to the north like a satilite seen at night. He went on to describe it as being a bright light with a greyish cloud around it. The object made no noise and was seen at a distance of about one mile from the observers. As the object travelled it seemed to follow the course of the river.

As no alcohol is allowed on Doomadgee Mission it is impossible to explain this sighting to alcohol. As I personally know the Aboriginal Police Sergeant, Michael DIAMOND to be an honest person and not the type of person to make up such a story.

On both occassions during these sightings the witnesses noticed no atmospheric changes before, during of after the sightings.



- 1. With regard to Reference A, Mr Griesberg of ACOS had a meeting with Mr H.R. Rayner, Director of Public Relations, and DAFI-ILO on 8 March 1976. Mr Griesberg appeared to be a fairly common sense sort of character who did not believe in little green men in flying saucers, and his organization seemed to be making a genuine effort to investigate 'UFOs' with the aim of providing a rational explanation.
- 2. Having spent some time impressing on Mr Griesberg that the RAAF did not confiscate photographs or classify investigations Top Secret, it would have been pointless to then turn around and refuse to co-operate at all with ACOS. Therefore, as part of this public relations exercise, it was agreed that, work load and time permitting, if ACOS did forward any reports to the nearest RAAF Base then they would be informed of the results of the RAAF's investigation. It was emphasised that the RAAF would not enter into any discussion with regard to the results of an investigation.
- 3. Whilst this policy may create a little more work at both Air Force Office and Formations, it is felt that in the long run it could make life a lot easier.
- 4. In your reply to Miss Goriss we suggest that you enclose the report forms she has requested, and reiterate the relevant parts of paragraph 2 of this letter concerning work load and non-discussion of findings.

This letter is to inform you of the formation of UFO RESEARCH - FAR NORTH QUEENSLAND (UFOR-FNQ) in Cairns.

We are a civilian organisation investigating and researching unusual aerial sightings (UFOs) and are a member organisation of the AUSTRALIAN CO-ORDINATION SECTION (ACOS) of the CENTRE FOR UFO STUDIES (USA). Attached please find a circular informing you of the function of ACOS and its member organisations.

We mainly function as a body to which members of the public can report sightings of UFOs to, and then set out to investigate them and find a natural explanation if one is possible. As you are well aware, approximately 85 - 90% of all sightings can be identified as being such common items as planes, weather balloons, planets, meteors, birds etc.

The reason for this letter is to ask for your co-operation in investigating such reports, by us supplying you with details of any reports we receive and you advising us of any outcome of your investigations, as we will advise you should we find an explanation to any report forwarded to you.

One of the Co-Ordinators of ACOS, Harry Griesberg, had a meeting with Mr. H. R. Rayner, Director of Public Relations RAAF at the Russell Offices in Camberra early last year, and it was agreed that the RAAF would co-operate with UFO organisations affiliated with ACOS in this way.

Would you therefore, kindly forward a supply of RAAF report forms which witnesses to Unusual Aerial sightings could fill out and which we would then forward on to you for your investigations.

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

THE AUSTRALIAN CO-ORDINATION SECTION (A.C.O.S.)

ACOS was established in November 1974, at the request of Professor Dr. J. Allen Hynek, who is the Director of the Center for U.F.O. Studies in Illinois U.S.A.

Some of our main functions include to act as a 'Clearing Point', to which all Australiam UFO reports are sent by the major UFO organisations throughout Australia, as well as several independent investigators, to represent the Australian organisations whenever necessary, to organise national conferences, and to disseminate information to all the organisations.

Several hundred reports of unusual aerial sightings are received by each of the organisations annually, which are thoroughly investigated from all scientific aspects. Approximately 85 - 90% of the reports received, can be explained in natural terms by the investigators of these organisations as being such common items as satellites, meteors, stars, planets, aeroplanes, weather balloons etc. It is the remaining 10 - 15% which are unidentifiable, and are therefore referred to as UFO reports. It is these reports which are then forwarded to ACOS. One copy of these is forwarded to the Center for UFO Studies in the United States, and one copy is retained by ACOS to form a central Australian library of UFO reports, as well as being coded into an Australian Computer File for research and study purposes. This UFO library is open to all the participating organisations and individuals.

A Bulletin is published by ACOS every three months, and besides being sent to our member organisations who pass the information contained therein on to their public members, this Bulletin is now available for public subscription for \$3 (Australia) and \$4 (overseas) annually. The Bulletin contains news from the Center, news from around Australia, latest developments in the field, upo reports etc.

The Center for UFO Studies, as mentioned previously, is directed by eminent astronomer, Dr. Hynek, who for 20 years has been the astronomical Dr. Hynek has become one of the United States Air Force. Over these years, Together with other eminent scientists, Engineers, Faculty members, Technicians and several hundred investigators throughout the United States, reports are studied in detail from all over the world. All the reports received by the Dr. David Saunders.

The Center also has the full co-operation of Police Departments, F.B.I., Airline Pilots Associations, as well as institutions such as Universities, and the Smithsonian Institution.

Australia therefore, is playing its part in contributing information to this phenomenon which has been puzzling mankind over the centuries, so that one day, science can possibly find the solution. It is estimated that approximately 20% of all actual UFO sightings are actually reported to the organisations in Australia. One of the main reasons being that the majority of the Australian public do not know to whom to report their experiences.

We therefore, ask you, the reader of this article, to assist us by contacting your nearest UFO organisation (a list of which is attached to this article) and notifying them of any sighting made by someone you know or heard of, no matter whether it was a recent sighting or years old.

The Center for UFO Studies' definition of a UFO is as follows:

"A UFO is the reported perception of an object or light, seen in the sky or upon the land, the appearance, trajectory, and general dynamic and luminescent behaviour of which do not suggest a logical, conventional explanation and which is not only mystifying to the original percipients, but remains unidentified after close scrutiny of all available evidence by persons who are technically capable of making a common sense identification, if one is possible."

So far, Australia has seen three conferences, the first, UFOCON ONE was held in Terrigal N.S.W., UFOCON TWO in Mount Gambier South Australia, and UFOCON THREE in Surfer's Paradise Queensland, at which representatives of all organisations and our scientific consultants have met over three days to discuss standard procedures in investigation and research, exchange ideas and information, and set plans for future projects and co-operation.

For further information, please feel free to contact A.C.O.S. or any of the organisations listed herein at any time. Furthermore, should you be aware of any sighting, please notify your nearest UFO organisation, and be assured that names and addresses of witnesses will be treated strictly confidential if so desired.

I was the co-pilot of a Neptune transiting up the Queensland coast on the 30AUG75. The aircraft was at 3,000ft flying straight and level. The weather was scattered cloud with occasional rain showers. At 1233Z the Captain, FLTLT Ware, drew my attention to a group of lights. They were readily identified and consisted of three lights grouped as shown in the following diagram. The lights appeared to be the size of one of the planets, eg Verms, but not as bright.

They were white/yellow lights and shone steadily. They appeared to be level with the aircraft and moving on a course of 080 (approx) with a high angular velocity. A diagram of their apparent movement is contained at the bottom of the page.

The captain commenced a left turn believing a midair collision to be imminent. The lights passed down the starboard side of the aircraft. As the lights approached the two o'clock position relative to the aircraft they dissappeared as though they were switched out or flew into very heavy cloud. The lights changed position gradually till they were in the following position when they dissappeared. Duration of the observation was approx 10-15 seconds.

- On 30AUG75 I was the captain of a Neptune aircraft which was returning to Townsville from seawards. Weather at the time was sky clear above and some cloud(EU/SC) below. The aircraft was occasionally running through the tops of the EU/SC. I was in the left pilot seat.
- 2. At 301233Z, aircraft heading 290 M position 2036S 15110E, I saw three white lights, two in the same horizontal plane, and one positioned halfway between and above the plane(see Fig 1).

The lights were about the same intensity as average stars, and were moving horizontally just above the horizon the horizon was visible as the horizontal limit of visible stars).


- 3. When just sighted the lights appeared to be at the aircraft height, 12.30 relative to the aircraft and moving left to right. My first reaction was to exclaim "look" and the co-pilot immediately confirmed the sighting.
- 4. The lights continued to move to the right of the aircraft, and to close the aircraft. At that point I banked left and commenced climbing as the lights passed down the starboard side of the aircraft. The lights appeared to dissappear into cloud abeam the cockpit.

 - b. Initially at an angular velocity of 20 degrees per second accelerating as they passed down the starboard side of the aircraft.



- 1. Mr Cattoni senior, was contacted on 9 July 1975 and asked to confirm his son's report. He stated that the object appeared to be approximately the size of a marble to the naked eye when it was overhead. He said that the smaller object appeared to be the same colour as the larger object (son says "clive green") and was not a jet aircraft like a Mirage.
- 2. No reports of an unusual object in the area were made by Mirage Pilots flying in the area at the time of the alleged sighting.
- 3. The investigating officer is unable to offer an explanation to the observers' of the possible cause of this sighting.





Investigating Officer's Comments

- 1. The investigating officer is not completely satisfied that the object described by Mr Simich, the pilot, was the planet Saturn, but there is a possibility that the light described by the ground observer, Mr Lucas, may have been that planet.
- 2. The times of observation by both observers and their descriptions of the sighting discount the possibility of the light being caused by a known aircraft in flight.

Details of Aircraft Movements

- 1. At 1919K 4APR75 a DC3 enroute from Groote Eylandt was at 6000 ft passing over BIBOOHRA (143-25E 16-555). The aircraft continued along the 049 radial from that station to intercept the Cairns 330 radial at Buchan Point (145-42E 16-45S) 10DME Cairns at 1930K. The aircraft turned onto the landing heading and landed at approximately 1940K.
- 2. A Friendship from Weipa joined the Cairns 330 radial direct at 30 miles DME, passed over Buchan Point at 3700 feet, and landed at 1945K.
- The Heron aircraft piloted by one of the observers to this sighting, passed over BIBOOHRA at approximately 1948K and flew along the 049 radial from that station to Buchan Point where it joined the lading heading and landed at approximately 2010K.

impacted areas at the site were not made as a result of back-hoe operations because:

- the size and shape of the impacted areas are not consistent with the size and shape of the back-hoe employed at this site, nor are the dimensions between centres of the impacted areas consistent with the dimensions between centres of the back-hoe's feet;
- the operator states that he did not work the gravel heap adjacent to the objects alleged position when he was last in the area on the 14 March, nor did he use the stabilizing pads on that occasion.

Previous Sightings in This Area

Our 5/40/Air Pt2(82) of 19 April 1974 described an unusual aerial sighting on 24 February 1974 by observers at Iffley station. Iffley station is approximately 8 miles NNW of the position of this sighting, and it's co-ordinates are 22-158 148-26E. (Our report erroneously gave the co-ordinates of another Iffley station further north when it was submitted.) The object sighted on 24 February 1974 was reported by observers to be positioned "about the Beef Road boundary, some 8 miles away", but due east of Iffley, which would place it about 7 miles north of this sighting.

Investigating Officer's Findings

The investigating officer is unable to explain the nature of the alleged object, or the cause of the unusual ground markings which may or may not have been associated with the sighting.

- of heavy truck/plant movements. All of these vehicle tracks appeared weathered where they crossed the grey loam covering of the area, and where they passed through the accesses over the table drain. The unusual markings in the area of interest, with the exception of the rectangular shaped area, did not appear to have been made by vehicles.
- 11. Cattle Hoofprints. There were numerous cattle hoofprints throughout the storage area and the surrounding area. These prints were well dried out, and were probably made by a mob of cattle which, according to construction workers on the road, passed through the area on or about the 21st March. None of the unusual impacted areas were consistent with them being made by cattle hooves.

Weather

12. The last rain prior to the sighting was on 18 March. Both Mr Kreher and road workers independently reported that heavy rain had fallen on the 18th but no rain had fallen in the district between then and the afternoon of the 25 March. Heavy rain began falling just as the investigating officer had completed his inspection of the area on 25 March.

Details of Interview with Construction Workers

- 13. On 25 March the investigating officer interviewed two members of the construction gang working on the beef road. Both of these men live at a camp about 10 miles south of the storage area where the sighting took place, and they were interviewed out of the hearing of Mr Kreher.
- 14. Mr Ken Smith stated that late on the evening of 22 March he was relaxing with a few friends at the camp when a vehicle containing Mr Kreher, another man, and three girls, drove into the camp. They told him that they had seen a strange object with lights on it about 10 miles back along the road in the gravel storage area. Mr Kreher and the other man asked him if he would come back with them to have a look. The girls insisted on staying at the camp. Mr Smith said they appeared to be quite frightened, and insisted that they did not want to return to the site. He returned to the site with the two men but they saw nothing. Mr Kreher then drove Mr Smith back to the camp, picked up the girls, and as far as he knows, they then continued on home to Batheaston Station about 6 miles away.
- 15. Mr Smith said that all the occupants of the car appeared to be sober. The description of the object given to Mr Smith by the witnesses agrees in detail with that submitted by Mr Kreher in his report.
- 16. Mr Vic Palmer, foreman of the construction gang, was not present at the camp on the evening in question. When asked about vehicle movements/work in the gravel storage area, he said that to his knowledge the only vehicle that had operated on the site recently was a back-hoe, and that was about two weeks ago.

Back Hoe Operation in Storage Area

17. A small Massey Ferguson back-hoe/front end loader had last operated in the storage area on the 14 March, four days prior to the heavy rain of 18 March, but the driver states that he did not work the gravel heap adjacent to the spot where the object is alleged to have been, nor at any time did he use the stabilizing pads on the rear of the tractor.

5. The investigating officer was accompanied to the area by a RAAF photographer as it was claimed that there were unusually shaped indentations in the ground at the spot where the object was sighted. Photographs of the area of interest are enclosed.

Gravel Storage Area

- 6. Location. The gravel storage area where the sighting is alleged to have taken place is situated on the right hand side of the new Mt Flora to Dingo beef road, 32% miles from the turn off from the Peak Downs Highway. It's approximate co-ordinates are 22-22S 148-30E. (See enclosed map. Route of new beef road is not marked on map.)
- General Description. The storage area is a rectangular shaped prepared area about 100 yards long x 50 yards wide. A layer of grey sandy loam 2 to 3 inches thick has been spread over the red subsoil and this was covered in places with 3/8 inch screened gravel. The depth of these screenings, probably the remains of previous stock piles, ranged in depth from 0 2 inches over the grey loam base. A number of large heaps of crushed cover aggregate/5/5 then nominal for read surfacing were piled about the prepared area as shown at Annex A. A large stockpile of sand was located at the southern most end of the area.
- 8. Area of Interest. The area where the object is alleged to have been sighted is in the largest clear area on the southern end of the storage site adjacent to one of the large heaps of 5/8 aggregate, above an area covered by the probable remains of a 3/8 aggregate stock pile. Depth of the 3/8 aggregate was Ø to about 2 inches.

Ground Markings

Unusual Markings. The unusual marks on the ground consisted of: three oval shaped areas; one roughly circular area; and a rectangular area. Detailed dimensions of the marks, and approximate distances between centres are shown in plan form at Annex B. The shaded areas shown in the plan indicate areas where gravel had been impacted into the softer subsoil by a heavy weight, or pressure. The impacting appeared to be very recent with no weathering of the particular areas in question. Some gravel in the areas, particularly areas one, two and four, on plan at Annex B, was freshly fragmented in the areas defined as "deep sides". This was quite obvious to the eye as the bright colours of the unweathered exposed centres of the gravel, stood out among the surrounding weathered stones in the immediate vicinity. Samples of these crushed stones were removed from the impacted areas, along with a sample of stones from the surrounding area for comparison and to obtain other opinions on their appearance. A number of RAAF officers were asked to view the samples on the investigating officer's return to Townsville, and without exception all agreed that the stones appeared to be freshy broken when compared with the weathered sample from the surrounding areas. Samples of the stones are enclosed with this report. The gravel area was photographed from various angles as was each individual area numbered one, two, three and four. (See photographs and Annex B). No test for residual radiation was conducted at the site. The police constable from Nebo also measured the distances between centres of the ground markings. His measurements with the exception of distance 2-3 agree with the investigating officer's measurements. His report on the alleged sighting is enclosed.

INVESTIGATING OFFICER'S REPORT OF UNUSUAL SIGHTING ON MT FLORA TO DINGO BEEF ROAD - QUEENSLAND

- 1. A report of an unusual sighting in a gravel storage area beside the new Dingo to Mt Flora beef road on 22 March 1975 was received at this Headquarters on 23 March via Department of Transport, Air Transport Group (DOT, ATG) channels in Mackay. The alleged sighting was reported to DOT Mackay by a Mr M.R. Kreher of 'Batheaston' station (22-285 148-47E) and passed by telephone to the Orderly Officer.
- 2. Mr Kreher also reported the incident to the police constable at Eton, near Mackay, who advised him to report the sighting to DOT Mackay; and to the constable at Nebo, 68 miles south west of Mackay. The constable from Nebo visited the scene of the sighting with some of the witnesses on 23 March. His report is enclosed.
- Mr Kreher stated that there were five witnesses to the sighting. Only Mr Kreher was interviewed personally by the investigating officer as the other witnesses were not in the area during the officer's visit. Both of Mr Kreher's sisters submitted their report by mail, but the remaining two witnesses have to date failed to submit their account of the sighting.
- been mainly limited to rural affairs. He was educated to 6th grade (2nd year high school NSW). He appeared to be genuinely concerned by the alleged sighting, and went to great pains to bring it to the attention of the authorities and the RAAF. His account of the sighting was always the same when related to the various individuals concerned, and his sisters accounts; although these may not be considered to be wholly independent accounts under the circumstances, to corroborate his story. He does not belong to any UFO organization, but believes that there may be other intelligence in the Universe. The police constable from Nebo knows the family, and in his opinion Mr Kreher is a reasonable person and a well behaved member of the community. The investigating officer gained the impression that Mr Kreher was not publicity or attention seeking, and felt that his story was related with sincerity.

INFORMATION PRO-FORMA

The investigation of reports of unusual aerial sightings in Australia is carried out by the Royal Australian Air Force. Preliminary investigation of the reports is conducted at the nearest Royal Australian Air Force base. The reports are then forwarded to the Department of Defence (Air Office) where an investigating team completes the investigation.

Between January 1960 and December 1973 815 sightings were reported to the Royal Australian Air Force. 90 per cent of the sightings were attributed to causes which included aircraft, satellites, meteors, space debris re-entry, meteorological balloons, stars and planets. Seven per cent of reports were either received too late or did not provide sufficient information to permit proper analysis and evaluation. Three per cent of reports were attributed to unknown causes.

The United Hingdom Air Hinistry has stated that on an average, 90 per cent of the sightings it investigates are explainable by causes ranging from meteorological balloons and meteors to aircraft lights. The other 10 per cent probably remain unexplained because of lack of reliable information.

The University of Colorado, under contract to the USAF, spent two years processing and investigating all American reports. The findings were published in 1968, by Bantam Books, as the 'Condon Report'. The general conclusion was that 'nothing has come from the study of UFOs in the past 21 years that has added to scientific knowledge' and that 'further extensive study of UFOs probably cannot be justified in the expectation that science will be advanced thereby'. A panel of eminent scientists, chosen by the US National Academy of Sciences, has examined and endorsed the Condon Report.

The USAF 'Project Blue Book' investigation of unidentified aerial objects between 1953 and 1965 analysed 7,641 UFO reports. The conclusions were:

- a. 80 per cent of sightings were natural phenomena, hoaxes, birds or man-made objects;
- b. 17 per cent of sightings provided insufficient data to permit thorough analysis and evaluation; and
- c. three per cent were unidentified.

United States and Soviet space exploration has found no evidence to support the theory of life on planets in our solar system. The Mariner series of space exploration to Mars appears to have proved it a 'dead' planet. The only other source of extra-terrestrial life, therefore, would have to be in another solar system. The nearest visible star to Earth is Alpha Centauri which is about 25 million million miles away. Even if life forms existed there and were capable of space travel at speeds currently known to man ie about 25,000 mph they would take about 115,000 years to reach Earth. Consequently, the probability of extra-terrestrial life forms visiting Earth is extremely remote.

Dear Sir,

Your report of an unusual aerial sighting on 23rd February, 1974 has been received and the investigating team considers that two separate light sources were sighted.

The initial sighting was probably the star Rigel Kentaurus which was visible with a magnitude of 0 at an elevation of about 60° on a bearing of about 165°. The second sighting was probably the planet Venus which was visible with a magnitude of -4 at an elevation of about 20° on a bearing of about 95°. Two factors are considered to have caused the apparent movement of the light sources. Firstly, whilst travelling in a car, the relative position of the lights, because of their distance from you, would not change when compared with much closer objects, thus creating the illusion of movement. Secondly a phenomenon known as atmospheric scintillation, caused by changes in atmospheric density, can produce apparent rapid movement of stars and planets, and can also cause increased magnitude of such light sources.

The disappearance of the two lights was probably due to either cloud or natural objects obscuring them from view.

We regret the delay in replying and trust that this explanation is satisfactory.
