SIGHTING OF UFO OVER RAF NEWTON

On Wednesday the 9th Dec 1987, around 1710 hrs I had just locked Bld 29, Supply Flt, and was carrying out an external security check. While carrying out my check, on the barrack stores side of supply, my attention was drawn to a large formation of lights in the sky.

The lights were in two lines. The front line being larger than the rear line. They were about a mile apart, the rear line being slightly off set. I would estimate that there was between 12 to 16 lights in the front and 8 to 10 in the rear, outside lights being red, inside lights white, all being of equal distance from each other. They appeared in the north west and headed towards the south east.

I noted that there was too many lights for a large transport aircraft and moving too slow for fast jets. The speed of the formation was slow, more of a glide, when the formation was directly above me I heard jet engine noise, but not very loud, if there was a number of aircraft involved.

Two or three minutes later I noticed a second large formation. I thought it was odd seeing two large formations, one after the other.

The formation was smaller than the first, but with the same sequence of lights, the outside being red and inside white. I counted these lights - 8 in the front line and 4 in the rear line. The rear lights not so off set as in the first formation. The lights were also of equal distance apart, same speed and heading in the same direction. There was also jet engine noise when the formation was directly above me. A minute or so later the formation banked to the east keeping perfect formation.

I did not think any more about what I saw because of the engine noise, thinking it was a large formation of aircraft. I mentioned it to my wife when I got home and on Thursday morning I mentioned it to Cpl. who was in the Guardroom on Wednesday evening who said that the Nottingham Police had rang asking if we had any aircraft flying at the time, because of reports of UFOs from the Public.

It plummeted earthwards and dropped out of view behind the horizon. It was within his view for 10/20 seconds. Section 40 has drawn a sketch plan identifying the location.

The second informant is a Section 40 who is also a Section 40 (at the same premises as Section 40 of Section 40 Section 40 Almondbury, Huddersfield, who was waiting on foot in Southfield Road, Almondbury, when he saw a very bright round white light. It was moving when he saw it but not creating any noise and was only in view for 2/3 seconds.

Weather conditions were good in that it was a clear sky with dawn breaking although it was cold and frosty.

The incident was not reported at the time but statements have now been obtained and I ask that they be forwarded to General Administration at Headquarters for onward transmission to the Ministry of Defence, Duty Controller, Aeronautical Information Services (Military) R.A.F., West Drayton.

I would say that the 'object' was some 1 or 2 miles away from me and appeared about 200/300 feet above the distant hill line, the hill line I refer to is the hills at Farnley Tyas which are to the right of Castle Hill as I was looking at it. I continued to drive down the road at a slow speed, keeping my eyes on the object. A few seconds later I saw the object begin to very slowly move to the right in a horizontal plane and then it suddenly accelerated at a tremendous speed in the same direction This created a pinky orange firetail which filled as before. the length of my windscreen. I am also certain that it wasn't a shooting star.

Castle Hill, I could see this clearly also.

I feel quite sure having seen it that it wasn't just an inanimate object. It must have had some programming or intelligence to make it move in the way it did.

I cannot describe it further from where I was other than a ball of light, and in no way whatsoever was it an aeroplane.

The time in question when I saw the object was a very clear cold frosty morning with dawn just breaking. The sky was a very pale blue.

Having thought about the matter since, I feel that I ought to mention a felling I have had concerning the object and its possible reason for its stationary position when I first saw it and that is it appeared to be almost directly between the paths of two Transmitter masts. The first being the large Emley Moor mast and the second one is a small booster mast located in a field just right of Upperhag Road.

To assist I have drawn a rough sketch of the scene and area I have stated. I have signed the sketch at the bottom right hand corner.

I was looking down Southfield Road, my friend drives up when he collects me, and over towards Lepton Edge which against the sky line forms the nearest horizon.

My eye was suddenly caught by a very bright round object, having the intensity of white light of a car about 50/100 yards away, shining white in colour. It travelled from my left towards my right in front of me and seemed to dip to the right as it went over the horizon. The horizon at this point I know to be about one mile distant from where I was stood. Altogether I saw the object about 3/4 seconds before it disappeared from sight.

It actually appeared to have been travelling in a line from somewhere over and above and behind my left shoulder to a point above and in front of my right shoulder as I was looking out, it travelling left to right but away from me at the same time.

There was no sound at all all as it passed or anything else other than it being a bright round white light. From where I was stood it was only just clearing the houses on the horizon left to right before it disappeared over the horizon.

The height of the object would be similar, I would guess to that of a light aircraft rather than a jet, perhaps 1/2 mile up.

The object had a steady constant speed as it moved across the sky. When I first saw the object appear at my left hand side field of view, I would say it was half way towards the near horizon, say about half a mile away, I only noticed it looking down the road, it looked as though it would have come into view from behind houses to my left hand side and out into the open sky. The weather conditions at the time were clear, I could see other stars in the sky against the darker background with dawn still not breaking.

The only real landmarks around Huddersfield area, or near Almondbury, would be the Emley Moor TV Mast. The object would be heading somewhere to the left hand side of Emley Moor Mast (Wakefield side) and it passed.


