The informant has previous military service having served in the R.A.F. 1954-58. He states that he was a corporal and [REDACTED] served with aircraft crash rescue. During his R.A.F. service he says that he saw U.F.O's on Salisbury Plain.

The object was seen somewhere above the I.C.I. Chemical works

in Huddersfield. The complex lies
near the main Huddersfield Road from
Huddersfield which itself is located
in the valley of the River Colne,
which runs in a north easterly
direction from the town centre. The
east side of its valley rises
sheepishly from the valley floor to
height of about 800' above it. The
valley side lies immediately to the

with that of a medium sized passenger aircraft.

After first sighting this object I immediately went and got my binoculars which I always keep next to the chair. I then went out of the front door and took a position up about halfway down the garden path.

I was now able to use the binoculars to gain a more detailed view of object. I could now see that it was in fact a wedge shape with the thicker end towards Huddersfield town centre and tapering to a point which was facing towards the I.C.I. chemical works on Leeds Road. The white lights which I had seen earlier had now apparently changed position. Their positioning now was as follows two on the underside at the pointed end and one light above.

Immediately behind the two underneath lights were 3 red lights which I could describe as being of high intensity and possibly of a fluorescent type, these were smaller than the white lights but I would say that they larger than an aircraft's navigation lights. Further behind these 3 red lights was another white light and a fifth white light was located on the upper side of the wedge approximately mid-way along its length. I was also able to gain some idea of its colour and would describe it as being a shiny blue/grey metal colour.

The object also maintained its altitude and at no time did I hear any engine or other noise coming from it.

I then came back into the front sitting room and watched this object from my sitting window. I was now looking in a south-easterly direction.

My wife and daughter now returned to the sitting room but I remained outside and kept the object in view. The object now veered towards the south-east and its speed increased. It headed off in at a steady speed towards Cooper Bridge and appeared to me to be following the electricity transmission lines. As I watched the object seemed to fade away into the distance until eventually lost sight of it.

UFO SIGHTING.

A report was received from **Section 40** [REDACTED] aged 17 years **Section 40** [REDACTED] regarding the sighting of an unidentified flying object at 3.15 a.m. on Tuesday 12th April 1988.

Section 40 [REDACTED] The informant who suffers from [REDACTED] was unable to sleep and was spending the night on the sofa in the lounge of her home. At 3.15 a.m. the family dog became agitated and began barking. A sound could be heard which she described as being like a railway locomotive only yards away. The nearest railway line running from Huddersfield to Wakefield is approximately 1 mile away. There were no vehicles in sight outside the house which is in a small quiet cul-de-sac.

On looking through the lounge window the informant saw an object in the sky some distance away, probably between the Rectory Park and Combs Road area. She could not describe a shape but saw that it displayed a round red and a round white light, similar to those displayed by aircraft. The object was observed for several minutes and did not move. Her angle of sight from the lounge window was between 30 and 40 degrees. Stars could clearly be seen as the sky was clear.

When the informant closed the curtains after several minutes the lights were still visible and had not moved, the sound was still continuing. She was sure that the sound was with the lights. The sound continued for at least 30 minutes before she fell asleep.

The object was observed from indoors and by the naked eye only. There are no large buildings nearby but other dwellings are on higher levels than the informants home.

Section 40 [REDACTED] was the only person to see the object but next door neighbour **Section 40** [REDACTED] of **Section 40** [REDACTED] heard what she described as a humming noise above the houses at 3.15 a.m. the same morning. She was awoken by the noise but on looking outside could see nothing. She will verify that the noise continued for some 15 or more minutes, and could clearly be heard indoors, **Section 40** [REDACTED] works for the **Section 40** [REDACTED] but has made no mention of the incident at work.

Section 40 [REDACTED] has made no mention to the press. She has not had any involvement with any of the armed services or with any UFO agency. She did however ring Leeds/Bradford Airport and was told that a similar report had been received from Leeds that morning.

I am **Section 40** [REDACTED] of the above address. I work as a taxi driver for **Section 40** [REDACTED] **Section 40** who are based at **Section 40** [REDACTED] Hemsworth.

At 11:50 pm on Thursday 24th of March 1988 I was driving a taxi on the Birsty Road towards Great Houghton on the way to pick up a fair at Middlecliffe.

I was about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile out of Great Houghton travelling at about 25 miles per hour as I was in no rush. As I looked in my wing mirror a bright light caught my eye off to my right. As I looked up to my right I noticed a very bright white green light. At first I thought it was an aeroplane in trouble as it looked to be very low in the sky and I noticed two red lights to the side of the big light. I then slowed down to gain a better view of it at this point I could see a vague outline and more lights became visible.

At this point the lights had caused enough curiosity for me to stop the car and wind down my window to gain a better view. I turned off the engine and switched off my lights by this time it was virtually level with me so I got out of the car at this point I'd say what I saw was about 60 yards away from me travelling in the direction of Thurnscoe, South Yorkshire. As I watched the craft hover past me I made a diagram on a piece of scrap note pad I had with me.

The craft was a silver/green metallic colour and was in my sight for about 10 minutes before fading away. The sky was clear with a slight breeze. I could hear a very slight low toned humming sound which faded as the craft passed over me.

The next day on Friday 25th of March 1988 I was back at taxi base on Lansfield crescent Hencworth. At about 8.50 pm that night I went out to my car to pick up a friend.

As I went out the car the same bright white green light caught my eye again. I looked up and watched it for about 2 or 3 minutes as it grew larger.

At this point I went inside the house and got my car key [REDACTED] out to look at what I'd seen. About 2 minutes later I came outside and saw about $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile away on a form of elongated spanning top about the size of 3 times the size of a hot air balloon at this point my car key in hand inside the house and I observed it for a further 10 minutes taking again a faded away over towards South Mendip. I am a full time store supervisor working at **Section 40** at Ackworth.

At 8.50 pm on Friday 25 March 1988, I was inside my house at **Section 40** Hemsworth, when I heard my nephew **Section 40** shouting loudly for me to come outside. When I went outside, he said "Look up in the sky". I looked up into the sky in the direction of Hemsworth High School and I saw a brilliant white light in the sky, the light was slightly higher than an electricity pylon from the ground, although I was not able to estimate how far away the light was.

After watching the light for approximately two minutes, during which time the light appeared to be floating, I went into the house to phone up my sister, **Section 40** who lives just around the corner, to tell her to look at the light.

Approximately one minute later, I went outside to see the light still in the same position in the sky, at this time I noticed that the light appeared to be attached to the base of a round object which was just visible below the level of the clouds, the object appeared to make no noise at all and the light did not throw a beam in any direction. I am unable to state the colour of the body of the object.

I watched the object hover in the sky for a further 2 or 3 seconds whereupon the object appeared to drop slightly down in the sky before the object climbed higher into the sky before disappearing from my sight in the direction of Hemsworth High School.

I can say that at the time of the incident, the night was cold and clear, there was a slight breeze, and the cloud base was quite low, there was no obstruction in my line of sight of the object, and I observed the object for a total of approximately


10.8 minutes, during which time the object did not move and was not obstructed in any way. It is very difficult to estimate the size of the object, but I would say that the part of it I saw was very big.

2. You may wish to know that I have been approached by a local newspaper, The Rotherham Advertiser, who have received 3 other reports appearing to refer to the same incident. All 3 sightings made to the newspaper occurred on 30 Mar 88 between 0530 and 0535. The reports were as follows:
 - a. [Section 40] reported seeing a large, white light travelling very fast at 0530 at Brecks, near Rotherham.
 - b. [Section 40] reported seeing a white light the size of a football which landed outside his house at [Section 40] near Maltby at 0535. The object fizzled away on impact with the ground and left no mark or debris.
 - c. [Section 40], reported seeing a UFO at 0530 over Rotherham whilst she was travelling to work.

FO SIGHTING

Sub Divisional Officer, Bradford Central

At 1930 hours on Thursday, 18 February 1988 I was off duty with my wife and 8 year old daughter. We were travelling in my vehicle along Toller Lane, Bradford towards Bingley.

When approximately at the junction with Leylands Lane, my daughter remarked that she could see a star that was moving. My wife looked at the object and said that it looked like a line of shining white lights and was going in the same direction as ourselves. I leant across the car and saw the object myself. It appeared to be fairly high in the sky. I could see a line of white lights travelling at the usual speed of an aeroplane.

My family requested that I stop to look more closely and I decided to stop in Thorne Lane off Bingley Road. This road overlooks the whole area and judging by the speed of the object I thought I would get there before it did.

However, as I passed the junction with Haworth Road, my wife who had watched the object continually, remarked that it suddenly turned left and accelerated quickly away.

When I stopped in Thorne Lane some seconds later the object was nowhere in sight.

During the period whilst it was in sight I glanced at it on three occasions. It was the size of a small passenger plane and it was difficult to judge its shape. The line of lights suggested it was long and thin.

I could hear no noise over the car noise. It was observed with the naked eye and no photographs were taken.

The weather was dry and windy, there were a few clouds in the sky that were moving quite fast with the wind. The object flew over a housing estate the only large buildings would be the Bradford Royal Infirmary and Sharpe's Printers.


On first seeing the object it could have been an aeroplane even though we could not see any coloured lights but when the object changed direction suddenly and accelerated we were sure it was not.
