Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 29 May 2008 asking why information in paragraph 6 of the background briefing note to PQ0047 and PQ0048 had been redacted and for the background note to be released to you without that redaction. Additionally, you asked whether there was any correspondence between the MoD and the Defence Radiological Protection Service (DRPS) regarding the Rendlesham Incident during the period 1991-94. I assume by MoD, that you mean Sec(AS), as the DRPS was itself an integral part of the MoD. If this is incorrect, please let me know.

Firstly, the information redacted from paragraph 6 of the background note was withheld under exemption s.40 (Personal Information) as it related to an official's private activities outside their duties at the MoD. This remains the case and therefore I can see no grounds for releasing the information. I should point out for future reference that I believe the relevant PQ numbers were actually 0861i and 0862i.

The DAS and DIS UFO files for this period are due for transfer to The National Archives and therefore, as provided by exemption s.22 (Information intended for future publication) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, the MoD is not obliged to comply with this part of your request. However, I have checked with the Defence Science and Technology Laboratory, who now hold the relevant DRPS files, but they can find no correspondence between them and Sec(AS) during the period 1991-94 on the subject of Rendlesham. They were approached by a member of Sec(AS), but this was by telephone only, although they believe that a note of the conversation was made by Sec (AS).

DECLARATION: I have satisfied myself that the following answer and background note are in accordance with the Government's policy on answering PQs, Departmental instructions (DCI [To Be Confirmed]), and the Open Government Code (DCI GEN 48/97).

BACKGROUND NOTE:

- 1. Lord Hill-Norton has a long-standing interest in "UFOs", was a member of the (new defunct) House of Lords All-Party "UFO" Study Group, and has written forewords for two books on the subject. He has previously written to Ministers supporting individual "ufologist" causes.
- 2. The MOD position on "UFO" sightings is that we examine any reports received solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the UK Air Defence Region might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorized foreign military activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential military threat, and to date no "unidentified flying object" sighting has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each reported incident.
- 3. The alleged incidents referred to in the 1981 memorandum occurred between 27-29 December 1980 when unusual lights were seen by USAF personnel, including the Deputy Base Commander, outside RAF Woodbridge. A report of the sighting written some two weeks after the events (copy attached) was forwarded to the MOD by the RAF Liaison Officer at RAF Bentwaters. The report was examined by the Department at the time and no evidence of any matter of defence significance was found. This is of course the Department's only interest in such sightings.
- 4. This incident is regularly quoted by the media and 'ufologists' as evidence of "UFOS" penetrating the UK Air Defence Region. However, all available evidence was examined at the time and nothing of defence concern was judged to have occurred in the location on the nights in question. No additional information has come to light over the last 164 years which calls the original judgement into question.

- 5. It was then, and continues to be the case that witnesses are not routinely contacted following receipt of a "UFO" report. It would only have been necessary to contact Lt Col Halt (or any other witness) had there been any indication that the sighting was of defence relevance and further information was required.
- 6. The POs may have been prompted by the publication of two books, one on "UFOs" and the other on "Alien Abductions" by a former member of Sec(AS), Mr Nicholas Pope. The incident is discussed in Mr Pope's first book. He states that the radiation readings taken by USAF personnel at the site were unusually high. There is, however, no evidence that any analysis of the radiation readings reported at the site was undertaken at the time. It can only be assumed now that in view of the assessment made at the time by the relevant air defence experts that the UK air defence region had not been compromised, no analysis of the reported readings was judged necessary.



You will recall from our previous correspondence (Refs B and C) that in my original discussions with Mr Pope I did indeed state that the readings were around 10 times normal background levels, provided that the instrument was appropriate for measuring background radiation (at the time of our discussions he could not state what the instrument was), calibrated and being used/interpreted correctly.

I share the NRPB view that the use of a high-range survey instrument to measure (accurately) environmental levels of radiation is somewhat questionable and this must throw some doubt on the validity of the data reported.

I hope this is of use to you.



This can be accessed via the internet at: http://www.mod.uk/DefenceInternet/FreedomofInformation/PublicationScheme, by searching under "UFO Reports". Reports for the year 2008 will be published in the same place in January 2009 and therefore, as provided by exemption s.22 (Information intended for future publication) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, the MoD are not obliged to comply with this part of your request.

The MoD examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorized foreign military activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external military source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

Many members of the public believe the MoD has a whole department or branch that deals with UFOs, and, I suspect, have the impression of a large organisation within the MoD dedicated to research into UFO matters and extra-terrestrials. Actually, there are only two posts within the MoD (including mine) that are dedicated to UFO matters. Both posts (DAS-FOI and DAS-FOI1) are part of the Directorate of Air Staff (DAS), that deals with a wide range of air defence matters, of which UFOs is a minor part. DAS-FOI is at D Grade, which is the most junior management grade within the MoD, whilst DAS-FOI1 is at E1 Grade, which is at clerical level. Although the overwhelming majority of the UFO work in these two posts involves (and has for decades) answering correspondence from the public or recording sightings reported to the MoD, we do on occasion investigate reports. This usually involves liaising with air defence specialists (e.g. radar specialists) on perhaps half a dozen reports per year. These will generally be sightings made by aircrew, members of the armed forces or the police. We do not do field investigations. The notion that the MoD has ever maintained a dedicated team of UFO investigators along the lines of *The X-Files* is, I am afraid, a fiction. Both posts also have a responsibility for advising other DAS staff on Freedom of Information matters - hence the *FOI* in the post titles.

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 3 September 2008 asking for details of the two Ministry of Defence (MoD) posts specifically tasked with dealing with UFO matters.

There are currently two posts within the MoD that are dedicated to UFO matters. My own (DAS-FOI) is at D Grade, which is the most junior management level within the Ministry and the second (DAS-FOI1) is at E1 grade which is at non managerial level. Whilst it would be inappropriate to provide individual salary details, the pay range for D grade posts is £19,315-£26,626 and for E1 grade posts £14,271-£23,534. They also attract standard London weightings for the grade. Both these posts are part of a branch based in MoD Main Building in London called the Directorate of Air Staff (DAS). This branch deals with a wide range of air defence related matters of which UFOs is a minor part. Although the overwhelming majority of the UFO work in these two posts involves (and has for decades) answering correspondence from the public or recording sightings reported to the MoD, we do on occasion investigate reports. This usually involves liaising with air defence experts (such as radar specialists) on, perhaps, half a dozen reports per year. These will generally be sightings made by aircrew, members of the armed forces or the police. I think I should make it clear that we do not do field investigations. The notion that the MoD has ever maintained a dedicated team of UFO investigators along the lines of *The X-Files* is, I am afraid, a fiction. Additionally, we answer Freedom of information (FOI) requests such as yours from the public and have responsibility for answering parliamentary correspondence. Both posts also have responsibility for providing advice to other staff within DAS on FOI matters.

The two posts require general office skills, with a preference for strong drafting abilities. When either of them becomes vacant, they are filled by internal competition. There is no requirement for any particular educational qualification beyond those normally required to gain entrance to the civil service. Specifically, there is no requirement for scientific qualifications or for any previous knowledge of, or interest in, UFO matters. Individuals occupying these posts are required to act in accordance with MoD policy on this subject and keep an open mind on UFO matters.

As requested, I enclose copies of correspondence over the last two years regarding these posts. You will note that some personal information such as names, addresses, telephone numbers etc has been withheld as it is not relevant to the information you requested.



Thank you for your e-mail to Secretary of State for Defence, Des Browne, asking for details of how to apply for positions in the MoD's *UFO department*. It has been passed to this office to deal with as we have responsibility for answering questions relating to UFOs.

Firstly, I think it would be helpful if I gave you some background about the MoD role in UFO matters. Despite what many people think, the Ministry of Defence (MoD) does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial lifeforms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena. The MoD examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorized foreign military activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external military source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The term UFO "department" is actually rather misleading. I suspect it gives the impression of a large organisation within the MoD dedicated to research into UFO matters and extra-terrestrials. In fact, there are two posts within the MoD that are dedicated to UFO matters. One (DAS-FOI) is at D Grade, which is the most junior management level within the Ministry and the second (DAS-FOI1) is at E1 grade which is at non managerial level. Both these posts are part of a branch based in London called the Directorate of Air Staff. This branch deals with a wide range of air defence related matters of which UFOs is a minor part. Although the overwhelming majority of the UFO work in these two posts involves (and has for decades) answering correspondence from the public or recording sightings reported to the MoD, we do on occasion investigate reports. This usually involves liaising with air defence experts (such as radar specialists) on perhaps half a dozen reports per year. These will generally be sightings made by aircrew, members of the armed forces or the police. I think I should make it clear that we do not do field investigations.

The two posts require general office skills, with a preference for strong drafting abilities. When either of them becomes vacant, they are filled by internal competition. If you wanted to take up one of these posts, you would therefore first need to join the MoD, and then once you had established yourself, apply for the posts as and when they become vacant.

Thank you for your e-mail of 19 March 2008 asking for help in your desire for a job with the MoD related to UFO research and enquiries.

There are two posts within the MoD that are directly related to UFO matters. Both these posts, which are civilian rather than military, are within the Directorate of Air Staff (DAS) and form part of its secretariat function. This means that their primary role is the answering of correspondence from both the public and parliament. The two posts dealing with UFO matters are tasked with answering correspondence, and since 2005, Freedom of Information requests. Additionally, they are tasked with recording UFO sightings reported to the MoD, details of which are placed on the MoD internet site at the end of the year. Very occasionally, they receive a UFO sighting report that they believe may justify further follow up and they will liaise with air defence experts. I would estimate that 95% of both jobs are UFO related, with the remainder being related to administering and providing guidance to colleagues within DAS on Freedom of Information matters.

However, despite what many members of the ufology community believe, the MoD examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen may have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

Staff who fill these two posts are recruited from within the MoD amongst its normal administrative staff and despite rumours to the contrary, these posts are not Top Secret and do not require security clearance beyond the norm for civil servants in the MoD. Therefore, if you were interested in undertaking this work, you would need to join the Ministry of Defence and, once you had established yourself, apply for one of them as and when they became vacant.







At 0239 hrs on Thursday 17th October 2002 a member of the public contacted Humberside Police to report seeing a UFO. The adult male caller wished to remain anonymous but it is believed he lives in Hull (eastern area of the City). Whilst making the report the caller stated he could see two lit objects in the sky - one over the the Eastern Cemetary, Preston Road, Hull and the other one over B.P. Saltend. He stated the objects appeared to be 'communicating' with each other. He described one of the objects as having a blue light in the middle, a white light and two green lights with a red light going around the top. The object was spinning around and hovering. The caller was looking through binoculars.

Local Police Officers were alerted and sighted what they believed to be the object being reported by the caller. The below report is from two Police Officers rather than from the initial caller who was reluctant to become involved. Other officers also saw the 'object'.

- g) Angular elevation of approx 45 degrees
- n) Distance from observers is difficult to estimate (but not near to them)

- i) The object appeared to move fast and then stop it stopped and started on a couple of pocasions and repeatedly changed its colour/shape, fading and also becoming brighter at

k) A chemical plant is nearby and also the River Humber with industrial/chemical plants on the south bank at Killingholme/immingham

I) The Humberside Police Helicopter attended the area and perceived the object to be a star or satellite and the colour changes being an optical effect due to possible gasses emmitted from the nearby industrial plants. It has to be said however that the above officers were not convinced of this explanation.



Thank you for your prompt reply and for addressing my questions; specifically the MoD appears to not consider UAPs a threat to national security unless an external 'military' source can be evidenced, your responses were indeed helpful.

You indicated that it would be helpful for me to identify where I got the 95% statistic from, you mentioned that you have heard this statistic in the media and on the Internet and I can confirm that this is indeed where I was drawing the statistics from, as I believed it was common knowledge. I have not been privy to any form of statistical analysis from the MoD themselves and would therefore apologies if my questions led you to believe otherwise. However, you state with a degree of certainty that based on experience this figure would appear to be reasonably accurate so I would ask that of the 5% that may have been investigated by the MoD, is there any instances of similarity between them and my own account and, if so, would there be any evidence of misidentified 'military' craft that appear so unusual as to provoke wild claims but which may have a distinctly terrestrial source?

With regard to my second question, you asked if the sighting mentioned in my initial email was hypothetical. May I take this opportunity to state that this was an actual sighting witnessed by myself and my son in July/August 2005 in East Kilbride, Glasgow, Scotland. I did consider this sighting highly unusual and given the nature of the craft, metallic and able to hover against the wind, I assumed, maybe incorrectly, that it was military in nature although there was absolutely no sound of engines or any other form of propulsion. I was unable to capture any evidence of the craft such as photographs, although I am a reasonably intelligent person I was able to reproduce a model of the craft with 3D modelling software, and should such an image be helpful in identification I can, if required, forward you a copy of the image.

Since the sighting I had conducted my own rudimentary investigation, querying blimp and balloon suppliers in the UK, however in conclusion I was overwhelmingly left with the impression by these businesses that noiseless blimps are not capable of hovering un-tethered in the wind, although only 2 out of 3 of the suppliers I contacted responded to my queries.

Given the above account I'm not sure as to whether I should consider the incident a threat, and given that the MoD may not be able to control the behaviour of this and other similar types of unknown craft it may be prudent to consider it a threat and it is from this point of view I was initially seeking clarification from the MoD.

Thank you for your e-mail of 3 August 2008. You raised a number of issues that I will deal with in order.

Firstly, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace

might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorized foreign military activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external military source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

It would be helpful if you would identify where the statistic that "95% of sightings are mundane misidentifications" came from. Although I have seen this statistic mentioned in the media and on the internet, I am unaware of any MoD survey or statistical analysis that came to this conclusion. It would however, be reasonable to state, albeit based on experience rather than statistical analysis, that something in the region of 95% of UFO sightings reported to the MoD are simply never investigated and therefore no conclusions can be drawn from them.

Turning to your second question regarding (I assume a hypothetical?) sighting of a "metallic UAP" some 500ft in the air with associated missing time and memories of strange beings, is that given the above policy, it is not necessarily the MoD's function to investigate the matter or, indeed, to make any conclusion as to whether it was a threat to the individual that saw it.

Finally, you asked what specifically would constitute a threat to UK national security from a UAP. It is not possible to provide you with an all encompassing definition of what constitutes a threat to national security from a UAP. If we were to investigate an incident, it would have to be judged on a case by case basis.

Although the overwhelming majority of the UFO work in these two posts involves (and has for decades) answering correspondence from the public or recording sightings reported to the MoD, we do on occasion investigate reports. This usually involves liaising with air defence specialists (e.g. radar specialists) on perhaps half a dozen reports per year. These will generally be

rightings made by aircrew, members of the armed forces or the police. We do not do field investigations.

The MoD file on this matter, D/Sec(AS)/12/7 Part A, is one of the files the MoD will be transferring to The National Archives as part of a programme to transfer some 160 files covering the period 1978-2007. It is not possible to state when the file will actually be transferred, but it is expected it will be within the next 12 months. Therefore, under exemption s.22 (Information Intended for Future Publication) the MoD is not obliged to provide you with the information you requested.

This is not the end of the matter, of course; section 22 is a qualified exemption, meaning that the MOD must assess the balance of public interest in release of the information.

Whilst there is undoubtedly public interest in this file being released to the public as it will enable them to have a more informed view of the MoD's role in this incident, there is no overriding reason why the public should have the information immediately. Indeed it could be argued, that by releasing files in chronological order, the public will be able to follow the role of the MoD in a more logical and orderly fashion, and to view actions in their correct historical perspective.

It is part of effective administration of government that the publication of information is planned and managed within the department responsible. The release of this file will undermine this release process, and delay the release of other files (which other members of the public may be waiting for) as work on them would necessarily have to be put off.

The MoD file on this matter, D/Sec(AS)/12/7 Part A, is one of the files the MoD will be transferring to The National Archives as part of a programme to transfer some 160 files covering the period 1978-2007. It is not possible to state when the file will actually be transferred, but it is expected it will be within the next 12 months. Therefore, under exemption s.22 (Information Intended for Future Publication) the MoD is not obliged to provide you with the information you requested.

This is not the end of the matter, of course; section 22 is a qualified exemption, meaning that the MOD must assess the balance of public interest in release of the information.

Whilst there is undoubtedly public interest in this file being released to the public as it will enable them to have a more informed view of the MoD's role in this incident, there is no overriding reason why the public should have the information immediately. Indeed it could be argued, that by releasing files in chronological order, the public will be able to follow the role of the MoD in a more logical and orderly fashion, and to view actions in their correct historical perspective.

It is part of effective administration of government that the publication of information is planned and managed within the department responsible. The release of this file will undermine this release process, and delay the release of other files (which other members of the public may be waiting for) as work on them would necessarily have to be put off.

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 14 July 2008 asking to see our files on UFO sightings and paranormal incidents that have been reported to the MoD over the last 12 months.

Firstly, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence has no expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or to the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. The MOD examines any reports of sightings solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance. The MOD's only concern therefore, is to establish whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorized foreign military activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external military source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

Details of UFO sightings reported to the MoD for the period 1997-2007 are available for viewing on the MoD website at www.mod.uk by searching under UFO Reports. Reports for the year 2008 will be published in the same place in January 2009 and therefore, as provided by exemption s.22 (Information intended for future publication) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, the MoD are not obliged to comply with this part of your request.

This is not the end of the matter however, of course; exemption 22 is a qualified exemption, meaning that the MoD must assess the balance of the public interest in release of the information which is outlined below.

Whilst there is undoubtedly public interest in details of sightings being released to the public, there is no overriding reason why the public should have that information immediately. With regard to your particular observation, I can confirm that we received two other reports of UFO sightings for the 7 June 2008. One was from South Norwood in London and the other from Heathrow in Middlesex. We are satisfied that there is no corroborating evidence to suggest that the United Kingdom's airspace was breached by unauthorised aircraft.

The Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorized foreign military activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external military source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

Given the reports of the nearby hotel setting off Chinese Lanterns around the time of the sighting at Tern Hill and the above policy, I do not intend to investigate the matter any further.

I should however, be grateful if you would pass this decision on to the soldier that reported the sighting. I assume he has retained a copy of the video. If not, I shall return my copy to him, otherwise, it will be destroyed.

The Sun has reported a UFO sighting over Ternhill Barracks in Shropshire at about 11pm on 7 June 2008, It appears that a number of soldiers saw lights in the sky and made a video which they have passed to the newspaper. They have not made a formal written report on the matter, although they did inform their superiors.

The MoD in London became involved when the press office was contacted by the newspaper on 24th June. On 25th June I requested a copy of the video from Media Ops at HQ 5 Div where it had been passed by the unit concerned. It shows a number of lights in the sky. As reported in the paper, the lights change colour and appear square, but this looks like the pixels showing up as the photographer zoomed in. They do not appear to be moving very quickly.

The BBC has reported that at the same time as the alleged incident, a local hotel was letting off Chinese lanterns and, apparently, the hotel manager thinks the whole UFO story is "highly hilarious".

I do not intend to investigate any further as I think we have our answer and, as I suspect there might be copyright issues surrounding the video, do not intend to retain a copy on our files.

I will inform the soldiers of my decision through their 2ic.

I am writing concerning your Freedom of Information request asking if we could release any information/reports relating to either the 15% of sightings occurring in North Yorkshire and the information/reports on the 33 sightings in and around Selby in 2004.

First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity. Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

With regards to information/reports relating to UFO sighting in North Yorkshire, the Ministry of Defence Freedom of Information website has a database which contains information on UFO sighting reports from the year 1997 up to 2007. This can be accessed via the internet at: http://www.mod.uk/DefenceInternet/FreedomofInformation/PublicationScheme, by searching under 'UFO' Reports.

Finally, you may also wish to know that the MOD has already released a great deal of information about UFOs available for public viewing. MOD files were routinely destroyed until 1967, when they were generally preserved for The National Archives. A few have survived before 1967 and these together with records up to 1987 are now available for public viewing. I don't have all the details/timings but what I do have is the following:
 Soldier is Cpl who the phone belongs to – he was accompanied by Pte who also witnessed the "UFOs". The footage was taken on 7 June at 23.03hrs – with a 5 megapixel camera on the phone. 2IC rear party says the video images are very good. The Sun has reported a UFO sighting over Ternhill Barracks in Shropshire at about 11pm on 7 June 2008. It appears that a number of soldiers saw lights in the sky and made a video which they have passed to the newspaper. They have not made a formal written report on the matter, although they did inform their superiors.

The MoD in London became involved when the press office was contacted by the newspaper on 24th June. On 25th June I requested a copy of the video from Media Ops at HQ 5 Div where it had been passed by the unit concerned. It shows a number of lights in the sky. As reported in the paper, the lights change colour and appear square, but this looks like the pixels showing up as the photographer zoomed in. They do not appear to be moving very quickly.

The BBC has reported that at the same time as the alleged incident, a local hotel was letting off Chinese lanterns and, apparently, the hotel manager thinks the whole UFO story is "highly hilarious".

I do not intend to investigate any further as I think we have our answer and, as I suspect there might be copyright issues surrounding the video, do not intend to retain a copy on our files.

I will inform the soldiers of my decision through their 2ic.
