#### DearSection 40

Thank you for your e-mail of 7 July 2009 asking for all Northern Ireland UFO sightings in 1998/1999.

Firstly, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence (MoD) examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

Details of UFO sightings for the period 1997-2008 can be found on the MoD website <a href="www.mod.uk">www.mod.uk</a> by searching under "UFO Reports". For the current year until the 30 June, the MoD has recorded 240 reports relating to 2009, a further 8 relating to 2008 which were not received in time to appear on the website and 1 for 2007. Details of sightings for 2009 will be placed on the MoD website in early 2010.

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 3 August 2009 asking for details of UFO sightings for York and North Yorkshire for the period April 1999 to April 2009 and asking what the Ministry of Defence (MoD) policy on UFOs was.

Firstly, it may be helpful if I explain that the MoD examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. The MoD investigates only a handful of UFO sightings per year, (usually from aircrew, air traffic controllers, the police or military personnel) and to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

To state with certainty which sightings had been the subject of some form of MoD investigation would far exceed the £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending 3 and a half working days in determining whether the Department holds the information, and locating, retrieving and extracting the information. Under the terms of Section 12 of the FOI Act, this means that we are not obliged to comply with this element of your request at this time

Details of UFO sightings reported to the MoD for the period 1997-2008 are available for viewing on the MoD website www.mod.uk by searching under "UFO Reports". I attach a spreadsheet containing details of sightings received during the current year for Yorkshire until 30 July 2009. You will note that for two of this years sightings we only have the month, not the date, of the sighting.

You might also be interested to know that the MOD has already released a great deal of information about UFOs which is available for public viewing. MOD files were routinely destroyed after being held for five years until 1967, when they were generally preserved for The National Archives. A few have survived before 1967 and these together with records up to 1992 are now available for public viewing. They can be contacted at Ruskin Avenue, Richmond, Kew, Surrey TW9 4DU or telephone, 020 8876 3444. The National Archives also have a website giving information about the records they hold and how to access them. This can be found on the internet at www.nationalarchives.gov.uk.

Additionally, we are part way through a three year programme to release UFO files from the

Directorate of Air Staff and the Defence Intelligence Staff covering the period from the late 1970's to 2007. You may wish to consider contacting The National Archives press office for details of when the next release is due.



Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 29 June 2009 asking for details of any flares launched by military establishments in Kent, specifically on 9 and 21 June 2009. Additionally you asked for details of military exercises that could account for several bright lights seen in the Brenzett area on the nights in question. I have also received your e mail of 24 July in which you express your dissatisfaction with the fact you had not received a response to your request of 29 June. Whilst under the provisions of the FOI Act we are required to respond within 20 working days of receipt of a request for information, as we have in this case, we always try to respond as quickly as we can. However, it is inevitable that some requests take longer than others for very good reasons. In order to respond to your specific enquiry, we needed to contact a number of areas within MOD to obtain the requested information, as you will appreciate, this takes time. Consequently, the need for these enquiries meant that the time taken to respond to you took longer than it otherwise would have done but I hope the information provided is still helpful.

Firstly, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence (MoD) examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

On the nights of both 9 and 21 June 2009 the Army carried out night exercises at the Lydd ranges which are some 3.5 miles away from Brenzett. Over 100 flares were fired on each night as part of the exercises. The flares used were parachute flares, which launch to a height of about 500ft. It is therefore possible that this may account for the lights seen. The nearest other military establishments in Kent are in the Chatham area, some 50 miles away.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Head of Corporate Information, 6th Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed. Thank you for your e-mail of 4 July 2009 concerning your sighting of a UFO near Newby, Scarborough in North Yorkshire.

Firstly, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence (MoD) examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

However, I have checked with the appropriate agencies and I can confirm that we have no record of any military flying activity at or around the area you reported your sighting.

I hope this is helpful.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. 





#### INCIDENT 163/09 (UFO SIGHTING) -- FURTHER RADAR WORK

There was a Local / Zulu error with the first observations. They were done from 2345 to 0015 Zulu, which is actually 0045 to 0115 Local.

I have now done further observations, also using Claxby and Clee Hill radars. These were done from 2245 to 2315 Zulu, which is 2345 to 0015 Local. Though again, nothing was seen on radar at or around the reported location.

Additionally, to prove what can be seen in that particular area, I carried out observations from 0900 to 0930 Zulu, which is 1000 to 1030 Local. A variety of tracks were seen on radar around the reported location, with their heights ranging between 900ft and 36000ft.

If there was something there and it did not show on radar, there could be 2 reasons why.

- 1. The item was very low and was underneath the radar coverage of that area...did the individual reporting it state a height?
- 2. The shape of the item and its construction material could mean that it does not provide a good radar signature (in a similar way to military stealth aircraft).

#### Note:

You have probably considered this already.

The time of the report was midnight local on 03 Jul...entering into 04 Jul. Could it have been fireworks etc being used by Americans working/living at the Fylingdales complex.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so. That having been said, we do occasionally investigate sightings reported to the MoD. This usually involves liaising with air defence specialists(e.g. radar experts) on perhaps half a dozen sightings per year. These will generally be sightings made by aircrew, members of the armed forces or the police.

Details of UFO sightings reported to the MoD for the period 1997-2008 are available for viewing on the MoD website www.mod.uk by searching under "UFO Reports". I attach a spreadsheet containing details of sightings received during the current year until 30 June 2009. In the main, these sightings would have resulted in a response to the individual that sets out the MoD policy regarding UFOs outlined above.

I should add that to date the MOD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of extraterrestrial life. We therefore have no plans relating to contact with aliens. I am not aware of any meetings being held where this matter was discussed.

Thank you for your e-mail of 26 June 2009 asking how much money has been spent by the Ministry of Defence (MoD) investigating UFO sightings for each of the years 2008 and 2009. Additionally, you asked how many UFO reports there had been for each of those years.

Firstly, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence (MoD) examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

The Ministry of Defence does not record the costs of investigating UFO sightings, (of which it carries out a handful per year) and I am therefore unable to provide you with this element of the information you requested. However, you may be interested to know that the MoD, which has the lead across government in dealing with UFO matters, employs one fulltime civil servant (myself) dedicated to dealing with the subject of UFOs. The post is at D grade, which is the most junior management level within the Ministry. Whilst it would be inappropriate to provide individual salary details, the pay range for D grade posts is £20,815-£27,159 per year.

In addition to my post, I receive some administrative support from an E1 Grade civil servant and my civil service line manager has oversight of my work. Approximately 20% of the E1's and C1's time is spent on UFO related matters. The annual pay range for an E1 is £15,847-£20,074 and for the C1 it is £32,623-£41,325. All three posts attract a standard local recruitment and retention allowance for RAF High Wycombe of £2000 per year. As a rough guide therefore, based on the highest annual salary, total costs are in the order of £40,000 per year.

Details of UFO sightings for the period 1997-2008 can be found on the MoD website www.mod.uk by searching under "UFO Reports". For the current year until the 30 June, the MoD has recorded 240 reports relating to 2009, a further 8 relating to 2008 which were not received in time to appear on the website and 1 for 2007. Details of sightings for 2009 will be placed on the MoD website in early 2010.

I hope this is helpful.



The MoD has over 170 UFO files and the costs of searching for and preparing the information you request for release, would far exceed the £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending 3 and a half working days in determining whether the Department holds the information, and locating, retrieving and extracting the information. Under the terms of Section 12 of the FOI Act, this means that we are not obliged to comply with your request.

However, you may wish to be aware that the MOD has already released a great deal of information about UFOs which is available for public viewing. MOD files were routinely destroyed after being held for five years until 1967, when they were generally preserved for The National Archives. A few have survived before 1967 and these together with records up to 1992 are now available for public viewing. Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 12 May 2009 asking for any files from 1945 onwards regarding communications between the UK and any other governments on UFO matters such as shared information on findings, reports, sightings etc. Additionally, you asked for details of any unexplained sightings of UFOs over nuclear or military installations.

Firstly, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence (MoD) examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to

each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these al leged phenomena.

Turning to the specifics of your request, the MoD has no files on the subject of inter governmental communication, discussion or sharing of information on UFOs. You might wish to consider contacting The National Archives at www.nationalarchives.gov.uk in case they have any such old files. However, should this be the case, other UFO researchers would probably have mentioned them by now. You may also wish to know that the MoD currently has a programme to release some 160 UFO files from the late 1970's up to 2007 to The National Archives by the close of 2010. Files for the period 1979-1992 have already been transferred and it is hoped those for 1992-2000 will be transferred by the end of the year and they will be made available for public viewing.

Alternatively, you could contact the Foreign and Commonwealth Office at www.fco.gov.uk to see if they have any such files.

I am however, aware that there was some discussion around 1978-79 regarding a UN debate on UFOs and that MoD had a limited number of documents on the subject.

The MoD has no central record of UFO sightings and their proximity to military or nuclear installations and it has been assessed that the costs for which we are permitted to charge in providing this information will exceed the appropriate limit. This appropriate limit is specified in regulations and for central government is set at £600. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending three and a half working days in determining whether the Department holds the information, and locating, retrieving and extracting the information. Under the terms of Section 12 of the FOI Act, this means that we are not obliged to comply with your request.

The MOD may be able to provide information requested if you reduce or=2 Orefine your request to bring the cost of compliance under the limit. Please contact me if you would like to refine your request or require advice on doing so. In the meantime, you may be interested to know that details of UFO reports received by the MoD for the period 1997-2008 are available for viewing on the MoD website at www.mod.uk by searching under "UFO Reports", but in collating this information, no specific regard was taken of proximity to military or nuclear installations.

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 14 May 2009 asking to view documents containing the names of 12 specific individuals and the phrases MJ-12 and Blue Book. I have checked the names on the internet and they appear to be associated with the alleged incident at Roswell and The Majestic 12. I assume this is what MJ-12 refers to. If this is incorrect, please let me know.

The MoD has over 170 UFO files and the costs of searching for and preparing the information you request for release, would far exceed the £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending 3 and a half working days in determining whether the Department holds the information, and locating, retrieving and extracting the information. Under the terms of Section 12 of the FOI Act, this means that they are not obliged to comply with your request. 





I am led to believe that in a radio programme, some months ago on world sightings of U.F.O's it was reported that the only time that a sighting was made by British radar was in 1953.

In 1952/53 I was a National Service radar operator based at the station built into Beachy Head near Eastbourne. We were equipped with a new type of American radar gear, with a centimetric wavelength which I believe was designated FPS 3.


After fifty five years my memory is somewhat vague but on two occasions in the summer of 1953 I do remember being sitting at a radar set and reporting a 'Blip' on my screen passing down the English Channel from west to east flying at a speed which was at least four times the normal aircraft speed at that time.

After all these years, as I was very much involved, I would be interested to know of there was any reported or recorded follow-up on this sighting.

I have visited the radar site only once in recent years and was disappointed to find that it had been completely sealed up. It could be made into a very interesting visitor centre if it was re-opened as a working Radar Museum.

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 24 April 2009 asking for Military Airforce exercise records for the nights of 6-7 July 1996 and whether any reports were logged specifically relating to crop circles near Stonehenge.

Given the length of time that has passed, I can find no central records for an exercise on 6-7 July 1996. It may be possible to identify if military aircraft were flying over the area in question over the time period you refer to, but we would need to approach each of some 30 remaining flying stations in the UK to check their records and it has been assessed that the costs for which we are permitted to charge in providing this information will exceed the appropriate limit. This appropriate limit is specified in regulations and for central government is set at £600. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending 3 and a half working days in determining whether the Department holds the information, and locating, retrieving and extracting the information. Under the terms of Section 12 of the FOI Act, this means that they are not obliged to comply with your request.

That having been said, it is possible that mention of the crop circle appearing is contained on our UFO files for that period as crop circles are often associated by the public with UFOs. I have requested the appropriate files from archive and will write to you again to confirm if they contain anything relevant.

I hope this is helpful.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

Turning to the specifics of your request, the MoD has no files on the subject of inter governmental communication, discussion or sharing of information on UFOs. You might wish to consider contacting The National Archives at www.nationalarchives.gov.uk in case they have any such old files. However, should this be the case, other UFO researchers would probably have mentioned them by now. Likewise, we have no record of any military exercise taking place, other than a group from the Exeter University Officer Training Corps hill walking near Kingussie and they would not have been issued with flares. It is, of course, always possible that you saw a police or even a private helicopter.

Turning to your other question about bright "landing lights" I can confirm that the military do use "nightsun" which, in effect, is a very bright spotlight that can be used to illuminate landing areas or by search and rescue to look for casualties. It could be this is what you noticed.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally

open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

With regard to your particular observation, I can confirm that we have received no other similar reports from the Strathspey area for 14 April 2009 and have no record of any military aircraft operating in the UK Low Flying System in the area at the time in question. Likewise, we have no record of any military exercise taking place, other than a group from the Exeter University Officer Training Corps hill walking near Kingussie and they would not have been issued with flares. It is, of course, always possible that you saw a police or even a private helicopter.

Turning to your other question about bright "landing lights" I can confirm that the military do use "nightsun" which, in effect, is a very bright spotlight that can be used to illuminate landing areas or by search and rescue to look for casualties. It could be this is what you noticed.

I hope this is helpful.

Dear Sir,

I wonder if you may assist me as to whether there was any low flying activity (probably helicopter) in the Strathspey area at around 21.45 Tuesday 14th April? The reason for this request is perhaps to explain several sightings by residents of the Nethybridge area that evening of extremely unusual brilliant aerial lights seen at that time. A brilliant orange light (similar to the intensity of an aircraft landing light) was noted approaching the village at fairly low altitude from the east, which then remained stationary for around 10 minutes, turning to bright red. It was moving and stopping as if a helicopter, but no sound was heard or other navigation lights seen. It would be interesting to know if there was any exercise underway, or perhaps the use of some sort of flare to explain this if you are able to provide this information.

It was seen by myself as well as a local farmer and other resident, and none of us can come to any conclusion other than perhaps military activity?

I realise that this does seem to enter in to the realms of a report of a UFO, but that is exactly what it remains. At least if we know there was no aircraft activity at that time we can consider other possibilities and perhaps try and find an explanation. Obviously there are many other possibilities, though as the night was cloudy this eliminates most astronomical ones.

If you do have any suggestions as to it's source they would be welcome.

By coincidence, I do note that there is a fair amount of flying activity currently this evening in the area. I was intrigued watching the planes as they circle that sporadically they do illuminate very bright "landing" lights on and off, is this usual in night flying as I hadn't noticed it before? I don't think it explains the above as there was no noise but was interested, as it looks quite spectacular and may well account for some "lights" people are reporting?

The MoD has over 170 UFO files and the costs of preparing them for release would far exceed the £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act and, as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the Ministry of Defence is not obliged to comply with your request.

However, you may wish to be aware that the MOD has already released a great deal of information about UFOs which is available for public viewing. MOD files were routinely destroyed after being held for five years until 1967, when they were generally preserved for The National Archives. A few have survived before 1967 and these together with records up to 1992 are now available for public viewing. They can be contacted at Ruskin Avenue, Richmond, Kew, Surrey TW9 4DU or telephone, 020 8876 3444. The National Archives also have a website giving information about the records they hold and how to access them. 



Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 13 April 2009 asking for information relating to UFO sightings for the period 1950-2008, together with a number of UFO related questions.

To provide you with copies of all UFO reports from 1950-2005 alone would be very expensive. The MoD has over 170 UFO files dating back to the early 1990's and the costs of preparing them for release would far exceed the £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act and, as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the Ministry of Defence is not obliged to comply with your request.

However, it may be helpful if I explain the MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

You may also wish to be aware that the MOD has already released a great deal of information about UFOs which is available for public viewing. MOD files were routinely destroyed after five years until 1967 when they were generally preserved for The National Archives. A few have survived before 1967 and these together with records up to 1992 are now available for public viewing. They can be contacted at Ruskin Avenue, Richmond, Kew, Surrey TW9 4DU or telephone, 020 8876 3444. The National Archives also have a website giving information about the records they hold and how to access them. The Ministry of Defence (MoD) has no files on the above three named incidents/projects. As far as I can tell from the internet, they all appear to be matters for the US authorities and you might like to consider contacting them.

Additionally, you asked for any documentation relating to activity in Lancashire. I am assuming that you are referring to UFO activity, but if this is incorrect, please let me know.
