



Reference is made to a letter from Knoxville Office dated October 7, 1948 entitled "Orgonon". Project, Security Matter-X, and to Sureau letter dated June 28, 1947 directed to Clark-Babbitt Industries, Inc.,

75 Federal Street, Boston 10, Massachusetts, concerning the Organon Project.

advised that his office had conducted an investigation concerning Orgonon Project and all members connected with the Project, but his office was never able to ascertain anything of a subwersive nature concerning this Project.

advised that he recently received a letter from from Kingfield, Maine, advising him that she was of the impression that they were working on the atomic bomb at the Orgonon Project.

Kingfield, Maine, advised that is employed as a chemist at the Oak Ridge, Tennessee, Atomic Energy Commission, and she was under the impression that some of the products used at the Oak Ridge Plant were also used at the Orgonon Project. However, she stated that she had no facts to substantiate the above information and it was purely supposition on her part. Advised that she understood that a Dr. AEICH and his wife were in charge of the Orgonon Project at Rangeley Lakes, Maine. Further, that Dr. NORCE, who is a chemist at the Project, originally came from Norway, along with Dr. TROLL, and his Secretary, Miss TISON, who have both returned to Norway. She stated that a local woman by the name of Mrs. RACHER SMITH, who formerly operated overnight cabins and camps near the Project, married a German from the Project and they both are presently residing in Boston, Mass.

advised that she had no information concerning any of the people at the Project, but that she was suspicious because so many foreigners gathered together.

Rangeley, Maine, edvised that the Organon Project has been in effect for the past four or time years and is supposed to be a cancer research Laboratory operated by Dr. WILHELM REICH, who gave his address as 9906 69th Avenue, Forest Hills, long Island, New York, and his wife's name is Dr. ILSE CLIENDORFF. Their address at Rangeley, Maine, is lost Office Box 327.

stated that another person who appeared to be connected with the Project was WILLIAM R. AMASHINGTON, colored, believed to be the same person mentioned in referenced letter from Knoxville and whose addresses are 200 Norfolk Street, Cambridge, Massachusetts, and Rolling Hill Farm, Post Office Box 593, Rangeley, Maine. He stated that Rolling Hill Farm at Rangeley, Maine, is owned by MYRON and BERTHARCHARF, who list their address as 75 Hancock Street, Cambridge 38, Massachusetts He stated that they are also connected with Organon Project.

advised that Mr. and Mrs. ROBERD SCHARAF of 50 Holland Avenue, Brookline, Massachusetts, are also connected with the Organon Project.

Also connected with the Project is JAMES WILLE, M.D., Box 315, Rangeley, Maine, and who gives his legal address as 232 Dover Road, Manhasset, Long Island, New York, and a Dr. THEODOR WOLF, whose only address is Orgonon Project, Rangeley, Maine.

continued to state that Mr. THOMAS E ROSS is caretaker of ORGONON Project, and that he might possibly be able to furnish the writer with additional information.

Mr. THOMAS E. ROSS, caretaker of Orgonon Project, advised that he was hired by Dr. WILHELM REICH, and that he received his check from the Corn Exchange Bank & Trust Company, Forest Hills Branch, New York; that he believes Dr. WILLE and Dr. REICH are now head of Orgonon Project, but that formerly Dr. WOLF was connected with the Orgonon Project. Mr. ROSS advised that in September, 1948, a meeting was held at the Project and around thirty-four people attended, but that from his observation, he has never seen anything of a subversive nature, and that he has never known any of the Doctors connected with the Project to try to conceal any of the information of the experiments they were making.

Mr. ROSS further stated that the contractor who had formerly built the Organon Project and was presently constructing a new laboratory, is Mr. VERNON COLLINS of Mangeley, Maine.

Mr. V. COLLINS, contractor, Rangeley, Maine, advised that he was hired by Dr. REICH and his wife to construct the Organon Project, which is a cancer research laboratory. He advised that he had never had any reason to suspect anyone connected with this Project, and he believes that all of the people connected with the Project are loyal americans.

Wr. COLLINS continued that a number of local people have visited the Project and had the occasion to view the work being conducted, and he personally never knew of anything secretive being conducted at the Project, which excluded himself, or any of his men working at the Project.

No further investigation is contemplated in this case in view of the fact that no derogatory information was developed, and this case is being referred upon completion to the office of origin.

ENCIVILIE RGCHON PROJECT, alex Organe Institute CURITY MATTER - I Reference is made to Boston letter to the Director dated The original information in this matter was received from . MERICARD W. MERKE, Chief, Security Division, USAEC, Ock Ridge, Tennessee. His letter stated briefly that an unidentified confidential source had expressed suspicion concerning the Organon Project and members of its staff. Due to the allegations contained therein and as they expressed a desire to be advised of the results of investigation, the Boston Office was requested to make a preliminary check. Referenced letter was the result of this investigation by the Boston Office. As information contained in referenced letter did not indicate that the Orgonon Project or its staff members were engaged in subversive activities or in violation of any statute within the jurisdiction of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, this office did not deem it necessary to conduct further investigation. Accordingly, the Security Division, USAEC, was notified by letter on January 20, 1949 of the lack of derogatory information developed concerning this project by our Boston Office and that no further investigation was being conducted. It was requested of the Security Division that this office be notified should it be found that the Organon Project was utilizing radioactive materials as furnished by the Atomic Energy Commission. Ho reply has been received from them to date and it is, therefore, assumed that such was not found to be the case. Accordingly, no further action is being taken in this matter.

This information is being furnished to the Bureau and to the Boston Office for whatever action it deems appropriate.

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

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



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Orgonon Official Explain Work at Rangeley Labor

RANGELEY - Gates and "no trespassing" signs were erected at Organon Institute here solely to Organon solely guarantee peace and quiet for intensive scientific non-political research, which could not be carried on successfully with constant inter-ruptions, Dr. Eisworth F. Baker, member of the board of trustees of Wilhelm Reich Foundation, has announced,

Far from being a secret, the work of Reich, the science of cos-mic orgone energy is today widey known throughout the world, Dr. Baker explained. The foundation was incorporated as a teaching and research institution in Maine. The American Association for Medical Organomy with more than a score of physicians was formed in 1948. or paysicians was formed in 1946.
Reich has taught at University of Oalo, Norway, and was associate professor of medical psychology at the New School for Social Research, New York City. There are co-workers in organomy in many other countries.

Plans are underway, Dr. Baker said, to set up various kinds of med-ical clinics in this region, an infant research center, a children's hospital, an orgone energy accumulator factory, and finally a university of organomy on the 280-acre sile in Rangeley.

Reich, according to Baker, found in the 1920's in doing paychiatric work with emotionally sick patients there was a disturbance in the flow of energy. The blocked flow of this energy he found to be the core of emotional disease. This formed the basis of many diseases, including cancer, Dr. Baker continued.

It was emphasized that while Reich claims to have understood the cancer problem in its essentials, he does not claim he has a cure. Orgone-therapeutic treatment can do much in the early stages through the Reich blood tests and the use of the energy accumulator but in later stages cannot radically change the patient's condition although it may prolong life and alleviate pain. This type of research, Baker declared, is not opposed to other kinds of cancer research but, on the contrary, uses fruitfui results of the work of others.

The emphasis in orgonomy is pri-marily on prevention rather than

The observatory was constructed here in 1948 and 1949 for astrophysical research with which Reich is now primarily concerned. There is great hope, Dr. Baker said, that in orgone energy an effective counter measure has been found against ill effects of nuclear atomic radiation upon the organism such as burns destruction of tissue and blood.

Reference is made to the enclosed report of SA in the instant case dated October 13, 1950.

This report has been made administrative because it has been prepared solely to consolidate in one serial the numerous non-specific allegations by residents in the area concerning the captioned group. The Boston Division is continuing to receive letters from such persons as which are non-specific in detail and lacking in even opinion as to what might constitute the subversive activities alleged.

Recent experience in Maine has indicated that the residents of rural areas in that State are particularly concerned about the current international situation and inclined to regard all persons residing in or passing through the area who are not lifelong residents with suspicion.

The enclosed report is obviously not prepared for dissemination.

Investigation failed to disclose any activity that would be contrary to the security of this country At Rangeley, Maine **计选项文件** On July 18, 1950, the Bureau directed a letter to the Boston Office enclsoing a letter from Rangeley, Maine, . which letter requested an interview with an agent of this Bureau were interviewed jointly and advised as follows: They have been suspicious of the ORGONON PROJECT because there seems to be na cloud of hystery sursomding the Albany (Info,) New York (Info.) They stated that there is a man on the Orgopon grounds who walks around at might and when anyone approaches him he covers his face so that they cannot see him. They further advised that at Rangeley, Maine, told thom that while he was talking to WILHELPAREICH in his office he saw a revolver under some papers on Mr. REICH'S desk. They continued to state that a private airport was under construction at Phillips, Maine, approximately twenty to thirty miles from the ORGONON PROJECT, and they believe it may have some connection with the project. They were unable to see any reason why the project should be interested in keeping records of wind velocity. They stated they were informed by at Rangeley, Maine, that while he was working at the project they used exceptionally heavy wire in wiring up the laboratories of the project and advised that Mr. REICH, the President of the foundation, informed him that they were working on the Atomic Energy Project. Both said they !! had no specific evidence of any disloyal acts or activities pertaining to anyone connected with the REICH FOUNDATION but they felt that if anyone at the project was engaged in any activities detrimental to 🗻 our national security they should be investigated.

On July 17, 1950, the Bureau directed a letter to the Boston Office under the caption, RANGETRY TAKES, MATNE", enclosing a letter from guét 2, 1950, reporting a foreign clement at the ORGONON INSTITUTE. was interviewed by the writer and advised he owned property adjacent to the REICH FOUNDATION, which is alow known as the ORGONON PROJECT, and although he has never noticed anything that was inimical to our national security there were a number of foreign-speaking people who worked at and visited the REICH FOUNDATION. He said that on one occasion he noticed an amber light that was shining from the ROLLING ACRES towards the REICH FOUNDATION. The ROLLING ACRES is approximately: two miles from the REICH FOUNDATION and is *alleged to be a nudist said he knew of nothing of a disloyal nature pertaining to the REICH FOUNDATION but because of the foreign element at the foundation he thought it best to report this information to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Special agent on July 8, 1950, that he had received information from one whom he considered to be reliable, to the effect that soveral families were vacationing on a mountain top at Rangeley, Maine, and that these persons openly discussed Communism and displayed strong sympathies both for Russia and for Communism. That he received his information through one residing at Rangeley, Maine.

advised that he worked at the ORGONON PROJECT during the Spring of 1949 and that he helped wire the new laboratory. He stated he did all the electrical work in all their other buildings and while working at the ORGONON PROJECT he had never witnessed or heard anyone at the project make any disloyal remarks. He advised they are carrying on cancer research study at the laboratories of the project, as well as treating patients for cancer and other diseases. He stated they have a specially built box lined inside with galvanized iron and on the outside with celotex. He stated a person sits in this box for a period of two hours and breathes the air from the inside of the box through a tube. He stated there has been considerable talk in Rangeley, Maine pertaining to the personnel of the project but he believes it is all hearsay and there wis no evidence that anyone at the project has been in any way disloyal to the United States.

On July 2h, 1950, the Bureau directed a letter to the Boston Office under the caption, WMR. O. R. ROWE, Town Manager, Rangeley, Maine", enclosing a letter from Mr. ROWE dated July 15, 1950, requesting an interview with an Agent of this Bureau. Mr. OLIN ROWE stated he had been contacted by some of the townspeople who wanted him to report the WIIHELM REICH FOUNDATION because "It appeared suspicious to them." He stated he could not furnish any information of a disloyal nature other than the fact most of the townspeople are suspicious of the foundation because of the foreign element connected with the foundation.

Mr. ROWE said that WILHELM REICH has written several articles on the treatment of cancer and that in these writings he has advocated early sexual relations for children in the treatment of cancer. He stated REICH's publications have caused considerable comment in Rangeley, Maine, and that they were barred from the public library in Rangeley because of this theory. Mr. ROWE said that a Miss McGINTY from the REICH FOUNDATION has applied for a teacher's position at Rangeley, Maine, and a Mrs. WYLEY, whose husband is a doctor at the foundation, has applied for a position with the Department of Child Welfare, State House, Augusta, Maine, and the local residents are wondering why these two individuals are seeking these positions. Mr. ROWE continued to state that the REICH FOUNDATION was registered with the Registrar of Deed's Office in Farmington, Maine, and has also been incorporated under four different names in New York. Mr. ROWE described WILHELM

Mr. ROWE advised he believes REICH has an older daughter by a previous marriage.

advised he has visited the REICH FOUNDATION on business and has been shown all through their property. He stated from his observation he neither saw or heard anything that could be considered disloyal to the United States. He said while he was talking to Dr. REICH in the doctor's office he saw a revolver on the top of Dr. REICH's desk that was concealed under some papers. However, he stated this did not arouse his suspicions in view of the fact many of the local residents at Rangeley, Maine, have several different types of firearms that they use for hunting year round. Stated that the REICH FOUND TION has been open to the public for inspection on several occasions and that the local townspeople have been invited to visit Rangeley, Maine, to hear lectures that have been given by the personnel at the foundation. Could furnish no information of a disloyal nature pertaining to anyone connected with the project.

at Rangeley, Maine, advised that he is personally acquainted with at the REICH at the REICH FOUNDATION. He stated he has never heard mention anything of a disloyal nature pertaining to anyone connected with the project and that he personally has never known anything that could be considered disloyal as far as the project was concerned.

advised that several women connected with the REICH FOUNDATION are her steady customers and from her observation and discussion with the personnel at the REICH FOUNDATION she has never witnessed or heard anything of a disloyal nature pertaining to the REICH FOUNDATION. She stated that the REICH FOUNDATION has had

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open house on swerel occasions wherein several of the local people from Rangeley, Maine, have had occasion to witness the personnel as well as the grounds and buildings of the REICH FOUNDATION and to her knowledge she has never known anyone that witnessed anything that could be considered inimical to the security of the United States.

said that he has sold considerable merchandise to Dr. REICH and the REICH FOUNDATION. He stated when they first came to Rangeley Dr. REICH outlined his program which was to take place at the REICH FOUNDATION and also instructed the town officials at Rangeley, Maine, that he intended to set p laboratories and a hospital. Stated that he has seen patients being treated for cancer at the REICH FOUNDATION and that while he was at the foundation no one ever tried to conceal any information or restrict him from seeing any activities at the leboratory. He has nover seen anything of a suspicious nature at the project. He advised that ORGONON has been in existence from ten to twelve years, and he believes that this is the only laboratory of its type in the world.

A sheck was made with the Secretary of State's Office, State House, Augusta, Maine, and no record was found wherein the REICH FOUNDATION was incorporated.

Farmington, Maine, exhibited the records pertaining to the REICH FOUNDATION, which records disclosed that the WILHELM REICH FOUNDATION at Organica, Rangeley, Maine, was incorporated October 15, 1949. The number of officer listed astwelve.

of the corporation were as follows:

- 1.) To conduct research and teach cosmic organs energy.
- 2.) To establish, operate and maintain a laboratory for observation and scientific purposes.
- 3.) To establish and maintain clinics and hospitals for organic medical research and medical organic therapy.
- 4.) To establish and operate educational institutions.
- 5.) To establish, operate and maintain bio-energetic research in organia.
- 6.) To acquire and preserve the instruments, library and archives of WILHELM REICH.
- 7.) To preserve the discoveries of WILHELM REICH and preserve them for posterity by the establishment of an institution of learning.
- 8.) To publish any material concerning the discoveries and work of WILHELM REICH and further works of the corporation.
- 9., To raise funds for the above purposes and carry on the work of the corporation.
- 10.) That the above corporation be a non-profitable organization.

The writer contacted Judge PETER MILLS who was listed as Secretary of the corporation. Judge MILLS is Judge of the Municipal Court in Farmington, Maine, and he advised that he is clerk of the corporation. He has attended several corporation meetings and from his association with all the members and personnel at the REICH FOUNDATION he has never witnessed anything which could be considered detrimental to the national security of our country. He said that he had been requested by Or. REICH to either take civil or criminal action against a WILLIAM FULLER of Rangeley, Maine, for disseminating information of a disloyal nature pertaining to the personnel of the REICH FOUNDATION. Judge

VILLS advised that he personally "could give the RRICH FOUNDATION"
that he was worried over the theory of Dr. REICH concerning the sex
treatment of cancer. Judge IMHIAS stated that ARTHUR GARFIELD HAYES,
a prominent attorney in New York City handled all the business for
the REICH FOUNDATION in New York where they also maintain a laboratory.

A confidential report dated August 19, 1949, entitled "WALTER J. KOWALSKI, Acting Director, Security Division, COO" disclosed that available directories of educational institutions in the United States do not list an ORGONE or ORGONON INSTITUTION nor do they show any educational facilities at Rangeley, Maine. The names ORGONE INSTITUTE, ORGONON INSTITUTE were checked against the indiges of the Security Office, AEC, Chicage, with negative results.

On August 22, 1949, MYRON SHARAF, who was connected with the Institute, advised that the proper name of the institute is THE ORGONE INSTITUTE, Organon, Rangeley, Maine. He stated Organon is the name of the property on which the institute is located. SHARAF continued to state that the institute is "an institute of research on organe energy" whose director is Dr. WILHELM REICH. SHARAF stated that he was an assistant at the institute.

Inasmuch as the foregoing investigation revealed no indication that the personnel of the WILHELM REICH FOUNDATION are engaged in any violations of law, this case is being closed.

Copies of this report are being designated for New York and Albany Offices because instant organization is a New York Corporation and maintains personnel and a laboratory in New York City.
