(2) On 12 April 1948, Reverend [REDACTED], Pastor [REDACTED]
[REDACTED], Delaware, Ohio was

interviewed and stated in substance:

On Thursday, 8 April 1948, at approximately 2:30PM, Mrs. [REDACTED]
our next door neighbor, came to the door and told us to come out and see
the strange phenomenon in the sky. We went into the backyard and saw this
strange object in the sky, a little south of west from our house. There
was only one object and main part seemed to be spherical with a small
protrusion above it, like vapor streaks. It was very white and looked like
a concentrated bit of cloud except it was clearly outlined. The weather
was clear, the sun was shining, and there were no clouds near the object
although there was a bank of clouds to the south of us at quite a distance.
I would judge the object was up several thousand feet but I cannot be sure
because I could not tell whether it was above or below cloud level. I
also could not determine its size as I could not tell whether it was
a small object near us or a large object far away, as I had nothing to
compare it with. I would judge, however, that it could not have been less
than 5 feet in width. The wind was blowing the trees and clouds from a
westerly direction and the object was traveling away from us, not too fast,
almost due west into the wind. It traveled in a straight line and did not
maneuver. I could not hear any sound from it and I could not see any
exhaust trail of any kind. We watched it for at least ten minutes until it
disappeared from our view behind the trees.

- (3) On 12 April 1948, Mrs. ██████████ housewife, ██████████ ██████████ ██████████, Delaware, Ohio was interviewed and substantiated all the facts as given by her husband in the above interview (par 2), and added the following:

The peculiar object in the sky looked to me like a spherical "blob" with streaks above it. By "blob" I mean like stiff batter or dough dropped from a spoon. It was white and clearly outlined but it did not look like a balloon. The sky around the object was completely clear of clouds. The object was traveling against the wind in a southwesterly direction. I called the Perkins Observatory three or four minutes after I first saw the object and I talked to Mrs. ██████████, Dr. ██████████ secretary, and told her about it. We called back later but they had not been able to sight the object. During the time I went into the house to telephone, the object did not seem to change shape, nor did its altitude change. I heard planes flying over our house at some time prior to the time Mrs. ██████████ called us but I did not see any planes. I do not know whether or not they had any connection with the object.

- (4) On 12 April 1948, Reverend ██████████ Pastor ██████████ ██████████ ██████████, ██████████, Delaware, Ohio was interviewed and stated in substance:

At approximately 2:30 PM on Thursday 8 April 1948, I heard a plane passing over our house. It seemed rather low and made a lot of noise but I did not go outside to look at it. Shortly after this I was called outside by my wife to see an unusual shape in the sky. My first reaction was that it was a plane on fire as it seemed to be an object surrounded by a vaporous substance. After studying it for a few seconds it became clearly outlined

From the descriptions given by the various observers -- notably that the object seen appeared like a clearly-outlined, cloud, was fleecy white, moved slowly and maintained shape, was a long vertical cylinder -- one can surmise that there is a strong possibility that the object was nothing more than a short, vertical, daytime meteor trail. These trails are known to persist for half an hour or more, and to drift with prevailing winds aloft. The fact that one observer stated that at first the cylinder resembled sky writing is excellent corroboration for the above explanation.

and looked like a vertical cylinder, larger at the bottom and narrow at the top with streamers or streaks of vapor attached to it. It gave the appearance of a white cloud but it did not behave like a cloud as it retained its shape and maintained a steady movement on a straight course against the wind. The weather was clear and there were no clouds in the sky around the object. It was moving rather slowly in a southwesterly direction and did not maneuver in any way. It did not make any noise that I could hear. I can not estimate its size or the altitude at which it was traveling as I did not have anything to compare it with. I do not have any idea what it was. I called the Delaware Airport, which is southwest of Delaware on route 42, approximately ten minutes after I saw the object and told them to watch for it. I called them again about a half hour later but they had not seen it.

(5) On 12 April 1948, Mrs. [REDACTED], housewife, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Delaware, Ohio was interviewed and substantiated all the facts given by her husband in paragraph 4, and added the following:

On 8 April 1948 at approximately 2:50 PM I happened to look out of my kitchen window and was attracted by an object in the sky with an unusual shape. I did not hear any airplanes but I went outside to look at this object. It was very white and there were no shadows on it, and it was so unusual that I called to my husband to come out and see it. It was cylindrical in shape and seemed to have vapor around it at the top. When I first saw it it appeared to be leaning at an angle and then it seemed to right itself and moved along perpendicular to the ground. It did not appear to be moving at first but after watching it closely we could see that it was moving slowly in a southwesterly direction. It did not make any sound and it did not maneuver. It seemed to remain at the same altitude and it did not leave any exhaust

trails. The weather was clear and there were no clouds around the object. It seemed very large to me, about the size of a full moon in height but much smaller in width. Of course, I cannot be sure of its size as I did not have anything to compare it with.

(6) On 12 April 1948, Mrs. [REDACTED], newspaper reporter, [REDACTED] [REDACTED], Ashley, Ohio was interviewed and stated in substance:

On Thursday afternoon 8 April 1948, I heard an airplane go over my house somewhere between 2:00 and 2:30 PM. It sounded like it was flying low and seemed to make an exceptionally loud roaring noise. I am interested in planes so I went outside to see it. It was a large plane and was headed south. About this time I saw a strange object in the sky travelling slowly in a southwesterly direction. At first I thought it was sky writing as it looked like a streak but it stayed so long and was so clearly outlined that I knew I was mistaken. It seemed to be a long cylindrical body like a stick of firewood. The sun was shining on it and it looked opalescent like Mother of Pearl. The plane was flying low and the object seemed quite high - much higher than the plane - and it was quite a bit smaller than the plane. The plane disappeared but the object kept drifting slowly along. It maintained the same altitude and did not maneuver at all. I did not see any exhaust streaks of any kind and I could not hear any sound from it. The weather was clear and there were a few clouds in the sky but none around the object. I do not recall which direction the wind was blowing. The object may have been drifting with the wind. Shortly after I first saw the object, I telephoned my neighbors across the street and told them about it. I watched the object altogether for about five minutes then returned to the house. Delaware Gazette about this strange object after I read where people in Delaware, Ohio had seen it. I do not have any idea what it was.

(7) On 12 April 1948, Miss [REDACTED], assistant bank cashier, and Mrs. [REDACTED] [REDACTED], housekeeper, both of [REDACTED], Ahsley, Ohio were interviewed and stated in substance:

On 8 April 1948, at approximately 2:00 to 2:30 PM, we heard a plane fly over the house. It sounded as if it was flying low and seemed to make an unusual amount of noise. A few minutes later Mrs. [REDACTED] called on the telephone and told us there was a strange object in the sky. We went outside and the plane was gone but we saw the object in the sky. It was an oblong shape, long and narrow, and looked like a silver streak. It was clearly outlined and was moving slowly in a southwesterly direction. It was parallel to the ground and was moving steadily on its way without changing direction. It did not manuever and I could not see any exhaust streaks or hear any sound from it. The weather was clear and there were no clouds in the sky near the object. The wind was blowing from the west and the object was moving into the wind. We could not estimate the altitude nor the size of the object as it was quite a distance from us and there was nothing to compare it with. We do not know what it was.
