Regarding: strange lights at night in Morfa Nefyn on August 12, 2009

Dear Sir.

My name is Section 40 I am German and I have been living in the UK since Section 40 I work for a software company in Maidenhead. I studied History and Sociology and used to work as a historian in Germany.

I went with a friend of mine for some days to Llanberis, and we also went for one night to Morfa Nefyn, where we arrived on Wednesday, the August 12. We stayed at a Bed&Breakfast, called Llys Olwen Country Guest House, Lon Tan y Bryn, Morfa Nefyn, Pwllheli, LL53 6BT.

We got a room in the first floor and the view from the window leaded to the coast. The windows itself began about 60 cm from the ground. The bed is opposite to the windows and has had a similar high of 50 cm.

About at 10 p.m., when went to bed. I had set the alarm clock, because we wanted to leave Morfa Nefyn the next day. We had opened the window. It was quiet, because there is no road.

I couldn't sleep, but I had my eyes closed. It was 3 minutes after 11 p.m., when a bright light shown through the window. At first, I thought it could be a car or a spotlight. However, it didn't move.

This light was very bright and went twice off for a very short moment and came back. Because I have to wear glasses (- 4.5 dioptres), I couldn't recognise what it was, only that the light was very glaring so that I had to hold my hand in front of my eyes. I was wondering why it didn't move - if it were a car or if it were a spotlight where does it come from and who is making a joke to wake up the B&B's guests?

I put on my glasses, got up and went to the window.

I saw more than 3 lights about 70 meters far. Because it was night, I can't give you a correct distance. I attached a picture, please look at the end.

These lights moved very fast so that I couldn't count them. Each of them had a size of a basketball (approximate, perhaps a bit bigger). Some of them looked like a translucent bowl, other like a ball made from translucent glass where light came out. They moved repeatedly up and down and rotated repeatedly on their own axis with a speed which I have never seen before. One light stood still in a height of about 1 meter over the ground. Light shown down to the ground and turned up to the sky, so that I saw the light beam shown up into the sky, then it turned again on its own axis, moved up and down. The maximum height was approximate 1.50 meters from the ground.

Suddenly, 2 or 3 of these lights moved to the left with a speed of 1 second or less. The distance was about 10 meters. I was very surprised, because I couldn't see any rail construction or something like that and a movement like this is not possible for objects, normally. And again, the lights began to move repeatedly up and down. There, where the other lights were before (Position1 at my picture) was nothing suddenly.

About 20 seconds later, 1 light (it was shining weakly) moved again to the left behind bushes with the same speed and vanished.

After the last light had vanished, I went to bed. It was 7 past 11 p.m.

The time between when I was laying in the bed and I saw the light through the window and when I stood on the window was about 1 minute.

While looking at these lights from the window, it seemed to me that each of them lost its power after about 30 seconds and vanished into the air.

That friend of mine slept very deep and while standing on the window, I called her and wanted to wake up her however, she didn't wake up. Because I was fascinated by that what I saw, I didn't want to spent time waking up her, but looking at these lights.

I took a look out of the window the next morning to see the area where the lights had been shown in the night. I didn't see any construction or material there.

When I told my friend what I had seen, she believed me because she knows that I am a scientist (although I don't work as an historian here in the UK, but my job here is still the same: analyzing) and I don't believe in UFOs and similar stories.

Since then, I try to find a logical explanation for that what I saw:

- It was material, because I saw the light
- It wasn't laser light
- There was no sound or noise
- There were no rails or any other kind of construction
- Because the bowls/balls were bigger, it is not possible to move these with a remote control.
- What could have moved these lights up/down, rotated and moved to the left with a speed, which I haven't seen before and which can be created only in a computer simulation, in my opinion? Even if I show the movements with my hand, my arm is too slow to reproduce a movement like this.
- Where have the bowls/balls gone after vanishing/going off?





We saw a light in the sky, bright orange/red, travelling from East to West in a straight line. Thinking about it, I would say it was moving at 20-50mph at a height of 500-1000 feet. The light took several minutes before it began to dim, indicating a low altitude and slow speed. Its path was very straight and steady, indicating perhaps powered flight. We would have paid little attention to it, but it was completely silent, no sound at all. The evening was calm, virtually no wind, and the sky was clear.

I and my friend are sober people of mature years, and neither of us have any interest in "ufos".

I would be very interested in your interpretation of this report.





I live in Greenfield, Saddleworth. My husband and I have just witnessed at least 8 unidentified objects in the sky travelling at speed from the direction of Ashton Under Lyne, Greater Manchester in the direction of Holmfirth in West Yorkshire. It is 4 September and the objects were seen at approx 11.15pm.

The night sky is very cloudy, there is no moon visible and no wind, the objects were low enough to be below the cloud cover. They were orange in colour and shone very brightly. The objects came across the sky one by one with approx. 20 seconds between them, they stopped over the reservoir outside the village and then changed direction at approx a 90 degree angle towards Holmfirth. Subject: Sighting with UK airspace

Good morning,

On the evening of Saturday, 6th of September at approximately 10.35pm, I witnessed 3 unidentified objects within UK airspace that did not harbour the characteristics of any commercial, military or privately owned aircraft that I have encountered. Neither utilised navagational lighting, neither produced any sound.

The objects appeared to be composed of fiery orange light and a symetrical vertical diamond shape. The Objects did appear 3 dimensional. The objects each had an identical flight path, entering visabilty from the North, and then arcing slowly to the East and travelling at speeds comparible to that of a commercial aircraft at high altitude. The actual altitude of the objects were that of a police issue helicopter. I would estimate the size of the objects to be that of a large sized transit van at the perceived altitude.

The first object arced from the north to the east, and travelled off eastwards at the speed mentioned previously, strangely, the object changed direction and travelled back westwards, eventually holding its position for approximately 45 seconds until the second, similar object appeared.

The first object then moved off eastwards as the second object completed its eastwards arc slowly, before heading off in to the distance with considerable speed in relation to it's arcing movement.

By the time I had fetched my neighbour, only my wife and I witnessed the event. On showing my neighbour in which direction the objects moved off, a third object, again similar in design to the 2 previous objects mirrored the manouver of it's predecessors and travelled to the east before disappearing into the distance. The objects appeared to be travelling below cloud cover during the entirety of the distance in which they were visible within our sight range. All 3 objects followed the same flightpath throughout with the exception of the first object as mention earlier.

Now, I am not claiming that these objects were of little green men design, but if your radar for the region picked up 3 unidentified signals each about 3 - 4 minutes apart from entering my line of sight from the north and heading eastwards from the East Kilbride, South Lanarkshire region, then what I have reported to you is a description of what the blips were, if they were indeed monitored.

The only reason why I am reporting this is because whilst googling the event to see if anyone else witnessed something similar, I encountered a posting on site from a resident of East Kilbride, their report mirroring my own experience... from 3 years ago, yet was at the exact same time in the evening. <cue spooky music>

It is probably nothing but some strange atmospheric phenomenon, but you are the military and your department is designed to receive this kind of information for a reason. I hope it is of some kind of help. I am sorry, but we did not manage to capture the objects on any kind of visual recording medium.

I would be obliged if you could inform me if you have received similar reports from Saturday evening as it would add greatly to the fun element of this experience for those of us that witnessed it. An explanation would also be appreciated if you know what the objects were if for some reason, the objects did appear on radar and were intercepted by aircraft from RAF Leuchars. It would sure beat chasing ageing Russian aircraft skirting our airspace away.

Hi

I would like to report a UFO sighting.



I organised a BBQ for some friends on 11th July 2009 at my parents home in palmers green, North london (n13). We live in a small row of terraced houses just off the A406, on a busy dual carriageway.

The weather was pretty drizzly that evening but as i had planned it for some time, decided to go ahead. At the time of the sighting (think it was between 8 -9 pm) i was in the garden with 2 friends when i saw an orange fireball about to crash 2 gardens away (about 50m away).

My initial thought was it was a plane on fire about to crash. but it wasnt travelling fast enough as a crashing plane, more like a slow motion crash as we had time to comment on the trajectory. We all waited for the 'bang' but nothing. One of my friends ran upstairs to see if she could see it from the bathroom... She called as it was now very high in the sky about 1/2 a mile away.

We all went back into the garden and discussed what it was, we soon realised it was not any of the following

- aeroplane/ helicopter no noise
- flare / firework no smoke and it aslo moved from a 30 degree gradient about to crash, to moving very high in the sky.
- air balloon- as it was very close we could see it was a pure ball of fire, also again the movement.

Upon being in the garden, again another object passed by about 3-5 minutes after seeing the first one. This time it did not follow the 30 degree 'crashing' trajectory but flew past a little higher but along the same path, 2 gardens away.

This time we all ran upstairs to the bathroom to get a better- further look at where it was going. Again it went up very high about half mile away. I ran to get my digital SLR camera with telescopic lense, but the camera refused to take a picture... just zooming in and out.

again we returned to the garden, discussing what we had seen.

For the third time another object flew overhead, we dashed upstairs again, again grabbing my camera, again unable to take a picture, so instead i grabbed my small digital camera. I managed to capture an image of this one but not as close as i would have liked.

This object seemed to have something protruding from the main body. Almost like it was a spherical object on fire, but with a leg protruding from it, also on fire, but with a visible gap between the body and the leg, yet they moved together in unison as if they were attached.





- distance of 25 50 metres.





I took these pictures from the corner of Chapel Street and Station Avenue and I would estimate that it was hovering above the Belle Vue Crescent area.



Dear Sir/Madam

My name is Section 40 I live in the village of Hildenborough Kent adjacent to Tonbridge. I live with my parents and have lived here for almost my entire life. I work locally in a large shop part-time but I am also a highly experienced professional artist with a full working knowledge of light and shadow, perspective, and colour. The back of our house faces the direction of Gatwick international Airport and our house is directly on the flight line of aircraft flying towards the Gatwick Runway. The Planes sometimes fly towards our house from Tunbridge Wells and then over Tonbridge area turn left in a half circle towards Gatwick. Also when I was a teenager { I am now 44) I was in The Air Training Corps for 5 years and so I have always maintained an interest and knowledge of aircraft!

On Monday the 31st August 2009 this week, the weather was perfect clear blue sky with virtually no cloud at all. The time was sometime late in the afternoon nearer 5pm, I was sitting in our back garden having a break, and to my amazement flying towards our village from the direction of Tonbridge Wells was something very strange. If it were a plane heading towards Gatwick it should have turned by then. It was not a light plane or a helicopter or a glider nor was it a microlight nor was it a balloon. There was no sound coming from the flying object.

I called my father who also witnessed it. Section 40. This is what we saw: I saw it as it was coming towards us, by the time my father saw it he had a different view. The object in the sky as I saw it, looked like a vertical cylinder (like a tin can) of a silvery colour which I could only see as it passed over our house. My father also saw its silvery colour and cylindrical shape. Underneath the cylinder as it passed over our road was a great bright Yellow Fiery Glow. I rushed inside the house and got my binoculars. Both myself and my father saw this object through the binoculars. Unfortunately I had no film in my camera to use with my Zoom lens. However I watched this object with my binoculars for about 20minutes as it headed towards the Thames Estuary. As it moved further away I could see that it was Gyrating in what appeared to be in an anticlockwise elliptical manner as it did so a very bright yellow light pulsated which could have been the light we saw underneath if it was gyrating It seemed also to separate into a rainbow shape arc of several lights at least twice but then returned to the gyrating movement again with the pulsating light. Also as it Gyrated there was a definite dark shadow appearing and disappearing which was almost certainly in my mind as an artist created by the sun shining on a solid object. On top of this object was also what seemed to be a smaller light which seemed to be there also as it gyrated but much less powerful than the fiery furnace glow beneath that myself and my father saw. The cylinder had no bottom to it only the circular glow. I have looked at thousands of planes fly over our house during my lifetime and have a pretty good idea of how high the object was, I would say that it was above 5000feet anything up to 10,000feet so to take a middle estimate maybe 7000-8000 feet. If this estimate is accurate it must have been very large. It was definitely travelling a lot slower than a commercial jet as I was able to see it for about 20 minutes as opposed to only a much shorter time for commercial jets. It is also worth noting that the object changed direction slightly veering left but not dramatically. It was definitely heading towards the Thames Estuary.

I contacted Nick Pope who used to work for you and he suggested that I contacted you.






hi,i saw these balls of light appearing and floating slowly up then disappearing then one or two more would appear at around 500 to 800 feet and follow the same line of flight.



Just informing you of what my friends and I just witnessed. Approx 10 orange lights flying over Ashingdon Heights in Essex. The first 8 were going at a steady slow rate (3 of which merged into a triangle formation and separated again) and then disappeared. Not over the horizon or behind the roof of a house, more seemingly just off into blackness (I guess it could have been cloud cover but the orange dots got smaller rather than just vanshing suddenly- as if they were moving away). Then 2 others appeared about a minute or so behind these others and were travelling obviously faster than the others were and disappeared at the same area in the sky.

There was a plane in the area when we first noticed them (we could hear it and then saw the typcial flashing lights of an aircraft off to the left hand side of the lights we witnessed). These orange lights were neither flashing and produced no sound like the aircraft did.





txtrequest: Hi, this evening both myself and my mother spotted a low-flying aircraft over the fields at the bottom of our road. We are used to seeing aircraft fly over our house, and very often see military aircraft flying overhead, so are used to the lights, and sounds, of each type of aircraft. However tonight, we noticed this particular aircraft, as it was emitting a large, bright orange light, much larger than normal lights on a plane/helicopter. It appeared to us to be travelling in an arc, so automatically we assumed it was a helicopter, due to its trajectory and speed, however as it got closer, we noticed that there was no sound coming from it, not even a distant hum that some helicopters/planes emit. It then levelled out and slowly flew across the fields, seemingly hesitating and stopping every so often, again, unlike a helicopter, as no sound was heard from it. After about 10 minutes of this, the light on the aircraft became dimmer, and it appeared as though it was gaining in height, as the light was now about the size of a normal aircraft light, when suddenly it disappeared.

The night sky tonight, as you may be aware, is completely clear, and we initially noticed the large amount of stars we were able to see, until this aircraft came into view.

We have a train line running across our fields at the bottom of our garden, but no workmen or any train went across the line at that time, indeed a maintenance train went past at around 11.30 towards stratford, and in any event, the aircraft was too high for there to be any interference from the track.

As I've mentioned, we are on a flight path in Wythall, but having lived here for over 27 years, know that this aircraft was on no flight path, in fact there were at least 3 or 4 other aircraft on the horizon while this incident was occurring, so it may be reported elsewhere by those aircraft.

I am aware that you must get alot of people contacting you about unidentified objects in the sky, especially after you publish UFO Reports like the one recently published, and I am also aware that many of these incidents can probably be explained away.

However, I am currently training to be a lawyer, and do not believe I have been mistaken, however I cannot find any logical understanding to what I saw, and have a 2nd witness, my mother, to confirm the sighting, who is also of sound mind.

I would be grateful if you could look into this matter, and provide some explanation as to what occured this evening.




To whom it may concern, I would like to describe a strange white light seen in the sky over Harrow Road area, W9 area of Westminster, London around 0010 to 0100 on the morning of 11th January 2009. After a fire brigade truck had left the area (with its lights on) I was shutting the sky roof window in the bathroom which faces upwards towards the south, when I clocked a very low flying white light over neighbouring streets, I looked at it for a minute thinking it was a plane, but then it got too big as it got closer, when I moved my hand to shut the window it noticed my presence and quickly did a Uturn and shoot up 200-300m into the sky, where it instantly went smaller in size and changed to a green light.
